SIGNIFICANT INTERDICTIONS AND SEIZURES

NCB Bangalore Dismantles International Drug Cartel Linking Thailand, Sri Lanka, and India

Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Bangalore Zonal Unit, successfully busted an international drug cartel operating between Thailand, Sri Lanka, and India. With credible input, on 09.10.25 the NCB Bangalore team apprehended two Indian nationals while carrying narcotic substances en route from Colombo, Sri Lanka, to Kempegowda International Airport (KIA), Bangalore.

Subsequent interrogation of the apprehended individuals led to the identification and interception of a third person, a Sri Lankan national, who was travelling on a separate flight. All three accused were found in possession of hydroponic Ganja and Psilocybin mushrooms, indicating sophisticated trafficking operations involving high-potency narcotics smuggled from Thailand via Colombo into Bangalore, and destined for further distribution in Tamil Nadu. In total, NCB officials seized 45.4 kg Ganja and 6 kg of Psilocybin mushrooms from the possession of three apprehended individuals.

Multi-Agency Operation 'Crystal Fortress' Cracks Major Drug Syndicate

In a Joint operation under "Crystal Fortress", teams of NCB & Delhi Police seized 328 kg of methamphetamine worth Rs. 262 crore in New Delhi with arrest of two persons. Both the arrested persons were wanted in the case related to 82.5kg cocaine of last year. The operation was a brilliant example of seamless multi-agency coordination.

Destruction of Illicit Cannabis Cultivation in Uttarakhand

A coordinated operation by NCB Dehradun, Uttarakhand Police, and the State Forest Department from 08.10.25 to 13.10.25, led to the destruction of 155.989 acres of illicit cannabis cultivation in the districts of Bageshwar and Champawat. The operation underscores effective inter-agency coordination and reflects sustained enforcement efforts to curb illegal drug cultivation in remote and forested regions of the state.



NCB Indore Busts Clandestine Alprazolam Manufacturing Unit in Ratlam

The NCB Indore Zonal Unit dismantled a clandestine laboratory on 19.10.25 involved in the illegal manufacture of Alprazolam near IPCA Laboratory, Gram Sejawata, Ratlam, Madhya Pradesh. The operation resulted in the seizure of 13.762 kg of Alprazolam, valued at approximately ₹3.44 crore in the illicit



market, along with substantial quantities of precursor chemicals and laboratory equipment

Two accused were arrested, including a B.Tech graduate and former pharmaceutical firm operator (on bail in an NDPS case) and a B.Pharma graduate. The accused misused their pharmaceutical knowledge to run the illegal laboratory from a hired warehouse in Ratlam, which had been operational since January 2025. The case highlights the growing trend of misdirected educated professionals exploiting technical expertise for illicit drug manufacturing for guide monetary gains.



NCB Jodhpur and Rajasthan Police Bust Clandestine Mephedrone Lab in Sirohi

The NCB Jodhpur Zonal Unit, in joint action with the Rajasthan Police, dismantled a clandestine drug manufacturing laboratory in Sirohi district, Rajasthan on 05.11.25. The operation led to the seizure of 100 kg of Mephedrone chemical, valued at approximately ₹40 crore in the illicit market. The kingpin (mastermind) along with four other accused were arrested, dealing a major blow to the illegal synthetic drug network operating in the region.

NCB Srinagar Busts Narcotics Supply Module in Baramulla–Pulwama Belt

The NCB Srinagar Zone, on 20.11.25, successfully dismantled an active narcotics supply module operating in the

Baramulla–Pulwama belt. The operation resulted in the seizure of 2.730 kg of charas and the arrest of three accused persons, including the main supplier, dealing a significant blow to the regional drug distribution network.

NCB Guwahati Busts Major Transnational Drug Network in Riverine Operation

The NCB Guwahati Zonal Unit, on 02.12.25, dismantled a major transnational drug trafficking network through swift intelligence-led action. A riverine operation conducted along the river bank led to the seizure of 6.149 kg of heroin (530 soap cases) from a boat and the arrest of two traffickers. The consignment had originated in Myanmar and was being transported to Silchar via forest and riverine routes to evade road checkpoints. The operation was carried out with the support of CRPF 147 Battalion and Silchar Police.



NCB Visakhapatnam and RPF Bust Inter-State Hashish Oil Trafficking Network

In a joint operation, the NCB Visakhapatnam Zonal Unit and the

Railway Protection Force (RPF), on 24.12.25, dismantled an inter-state hashish oil trafficking network at Duvada Railway Station. The operation led to the arrest of five traffickers, including three repeat offenders, and the seizure of 4 kg of hashish oil.

NCB Freezes ₹4.11 Crore Assets of Absconding Interstate Drug Kingpin

The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) has secured confirmation for the freezing of properties worth over ₹4.11 crore belonging to absconding drug kingpin Sunil Nagesh Bhandari. The action is linked to seizure of 53 kg of ganja, which was concealed in a specially fabricated cavity inside a vehicle intercepted in March 2025 at Patas Toll Plaza, Daund, Pune district. Investigations have identified Sunil Nagesh Bhandari, a resident of Badlapur, Maharashtra, as the kingpin of an interstate drug trafficking syndicate. A habitual offender, he has a criminal history involving six cases registered by local police including cases under the NDPS Act. In a further step to apprehend the absconder, NCB Mumbai has announced a reward of up to ₹1 lakh for any credible information leading to his whereabouts.

DRUG DISPOSAL AND ILLICIT CROP DESTRUCTION

Joint Operation Destroys Illicit Poppy Cultivation in Kangpokpi District

Security Forces, in collaboration with the Forest Department and the Narcotics Control Bureau, on 22.11.25, carried out a major operation in the hill ranges of Kotlen Village under Kangpokpi Police Station,

Kangpokpi District, resulting in the destruction of approximately 41 acres of illicit poppy cultivation. During the operation, 23 huts, 09 bags of fertilizers, 11 packets of herbicides, 04 bags of salt, and other cultivation-related equipment found at the plantation sites were also destroyed.



- A total of 955.562 kg of seized ganja was destroyed by the NCB Raipur Zonal Unit, on 16.09.25, at M/s SMS Water Grace Enviroprotect Pvt. Ltd., Raipur.
- A total of 1,835 kg of mephedrone and 341 kg of precursor chemicals were disposed of by the High-Level Drug Disposal Committee (HLDDC), comprising DDG (SWR), NCB, Additional Director, NCB Mumbai, and Additional Commissioner, Pune Police, on 14.11.25. The disposal was carried out through incineration at MEPL, Pune, Maharashtra.
- Approximately 25 kg of seized drugs, including cocaine, hydro-weed, and ganja gummies, were disposed of by the High-Level Drug Disposal Committee (HLDDC) comprising DDG (SWR), Additional Director, NCB Mumbai Zone, and Additional Director, DRI on 19.12.25. The disposal was carried out through incineration at MWML, Talaja.

IMPORTANT CONVICTIONS

Conviction in mephedrone & meth trafficking case of NCB Ahmedabad on 06.10.25

NCB Ahmedabad secured 15 years rigorous imprisonment & fine of Rs. 2 lakh to a drug trafficker involved in interstate drug trafficking. The case related to a seizure made on 03.09.2022. A Special NDPS Court, Ahmedabad convicted accused Samir Jamilbhai Sheikh in the seizure of 143 grams of Mephedrone & Methamphetamine from a car at Shah Alam Dargah, Ahmedabad.

Conviction in Ganja trafficking case of NCB Ranchi on 16.10.2025

NCB Ranchi, successfully secured the conviction of two accused in a 2021 Ganja Seizure case. The Court sentenced both the accused to 15 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh each. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 655 kgs of Ganja from both the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Cocaine/Mephedrone /Charas trafficking case of NCB Jaipur on 24.10.2025

NCB Jaipur, successfully secured the conviction of two accused in a 2023 Cocaine/Mephedrone/Charas Seizure case. The Court sentenced both the accused to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh each. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 257 gms of Cocaine, 14 gms of Mephedrone and 15 gms of charas from both the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Charas trafficking case of NCB Jammu on 31.10.2025

NCB Jammu, successfully secured the conviction of one accused in a 2022 Charas Seizure case. The Court sentenced accused Sahajan Tarafdar to 15 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 2.40 kgs of Charas from the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

NCB Lucknow secures conviction in charas and opium trafficking case on 05.11.25

NCB Lucknow secured sentence of 10-years rigorous imprisonment with a fine of ₹1 lakh against accused Md. Azad in two NDPS cases decided by the Special NDPS Court, Barabanki. The court convicted the accused in connection with the seizure of 2.7 kg charas on 18.11.2022 near the District Hospital, Barabanki. In a separate opium trafficking case (NCB Crime No. 29/22), the accused was also convicted and sentenced to 10 years RI along with a fine of ₹1 lakh.

Conviction in Heroin trafficking case of NCB Chandigarh on 07.11.2025

NCB Chandigarh, successfully secured the conviction of one accused in a 2021 Heroin Seizure case. The Court sentenced accused Gurpreet Singh to 12 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 5.928 kgs of Heroin from the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Ganja trafficking case of NCB Patna on 14.11.2025

NCB Patna, successfully secured the conviction of two accused in a 2021 Ganja Seizure case. The Court sentenced both the accused to 15 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1.5 lakh each. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 275 kgs of Ganja from both the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Ganja trafficking case of NCB Chennai on 17.11.2025

NCB Chennai, successfully secured the conviction of one accused in a 2022 Ganja Seizure case. The Court sentenced accused R.V.K. Sekar to 12 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 2.5 lakhs. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 369 kgs of Ganja from the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in 20 kg opium seizure case of NCB Bhubaneswar on 20.11.25

NCB Bhubaneswar secured conviction of three drug traffickers in a 2021 opium seizure case. The court sentenced accused to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and a fine of ₹1 lakh each. The case relates to the seizure of 20 kg of opium, which was concealed in a specially fabricated cavity inside the driver's cabin of a truck.

Conviction in Charas trafficking case of NCB Lucknow on 20.11.2025

NCB Lucknow, successfully secured the conviction of one accused in a 2023 Charas Seizure case. The Court sentenced the accused to 12 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh each. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 10.75 kgs of Ganja from the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Opium trafficking case of NCB Bhubaneswar on 20.11.2025

NCB Bhubaneswar, successfully secured the conviction of three accused in a 2021 Opium Seizure case. The Court sentenced the accused to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 20 kgs of opium from all the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in 4-MEC trafficking case of NCB Ahmedabad on 21.11.25

NCB Ahmedabad, successfully secured the conviction of two accused involved in inter state drug trafficking. The case pertains to the seizure of the commercial quantity of 4-MEC from the accused engaged in smuggling activities in Kheda district and Ahmedabad city. Both the accused were convicted & awarded each a sentence of 14 years of RI along with a fine of Rs.1 lakh each.

Conviction in 1,526 kg ganja trafficking case of NCB Indore on 28.11.25

NCB Indore secured conviction of five inter-state drug traffickers in the 2023 Mandla ganja recovery case. A Special NDPS Court, Mandla (Madhya Pradesh) awarded 17 years of rigorous imprisonment along with a fine of ₹1.5 lakh each to the convicted accused.

The case originated in March 2023, when NCB Indore intercepted a truck and a Maruti Brezza near Bundelkhand Dhaba on NH-30, Mandla, leading to the seizure of 1,526 kg of ganja concealed inside the vehicle. Investigations revealed that the contraband was sourced from Sambalpur, Odisha, and was intended for delivery in Lalitpur, Uttar Pradesh.

Conviction in Ganja trafficking case of NCB Chennai on 01.12.2025

NCB Chennai, successfully secured the conviction of two accused in a 2019 Ganja Seizure case. The Court sentenced both the accused to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh each. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 187.3 kgs of Ganja from both the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Charas trafficking case of NCB Patna on 05.12.2025

NCB Patna, successfully secured the conviction of two accused in a 2020 Ganja Seizure case. The Court sentenced both the accused to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh each. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 50 kgs of Charas from both the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Poppy Straw trafficking case of NCB Jaipur on 18.12.2025

NCB Jaipur, successfully secured the conviction of two accused in a 2020 Poppy Straw Seizure case. The Court sentenced both the accused to 14 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1.5 lakh each. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 1074.095 kgs of Poppy Straw from both the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Ganja trafficking case of NCB Ranchi on 20.12.2025

NCB Ranchi, successfully secured the conviction of one accused in a 2022 Ganja Seizure case. The Court sentenced the accused to 12 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 1 lakh. The case pertains to seizure of commercial quantity of 204 kgs of Ganja from the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

Conviction in Charas trafficking case of NCB Indore on 26.12.2025

NCB Indore, successfully secured the conviction of one accused in a 2024 Charas Seizure case. The Court sentenced accused Vivek Singh to 5 years of rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs. 50,000/-. The case pertains to seizure of 675 gms of Charas from the accused engaged in smuggling activities.

MOUs

NCB-RRU MoU on Counter-Narcotics capacity enhancement

The Narcotics Control Bureau and Rashtriya Raksha University on 08.10.25, signed a Memorandum of Understanding to strengthen cooperation in combating narcotics-related crimes, including cyber-enabled and darknet-based drug trafficking. The MoU aims to enhance capacity building, research, training and knowledge sharing in emerging areas of drug law enforcement. The agreement was signed by Sh. Anurag Garg, IPS, Director General, NCB and Prof. (Dr.) Bimal N. Patel, Vice-Chancellor, Rashtriya Raksha University.

NCB-NFSU Strategic Partnership

The Narcotics Control Bureau and the National Forensic Sciences University have signed a Memorandum of Understanding on 22.12.25, to further strengthen India's fight against narcotics and emerging challenges such as darknet-enabled drug trafficking.

The MoU envisages enhanced collaboration in advanced forensic research, capacity building, training, and application of cutting-edge scientific tools to support effective investigation, detection, and prosecution of drug-related offences. This strategic partnership marks a significant move towards integrating science, technology, and intelligence in narcotics law enforcement, reinforcing India's commitment to a robust, future-ready anti-drug framework.



STRENGTHENING INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY THROUGH STRUCTURED SKILL DEVELOPMENT

- An NDPS Act workshop was conducted by NCB Indore, on 15.10.25, for police personnel of the Indore Commissionerate. A total of 75 officers, ranging from ASI to Dy. SP, participated. The sessions covered search and seizure, sampling, investigation, disposal procedures, forensic interface and PIT-NDPS provisions.



- A 5-day training programme was organized at CENC from 13.10.2025 to 17.10.25, with participation of 86 officers from various states/UTs ANTFs and NCB. The training programme was about Precursor Diversion and Clandestine Laboratory Detection.



- The NCB Goa Zonal Unit, on 28–29.10.25, organized a two-day workshop for 50 Goa Police officers, ranging in rank from Sub-Inspector to Deputy Superintendent of Police. The workshop was attended by DIG & Head, ANTF, and SP, ANC, underscoring the importance

of capacity building and inter-agency coordination.

- A workshop-cum-training programme on “Narcotics Precursor Chemicals, Diversion & Investigation” was organized, on 06.11.25, in hybrid mode at the DGP Maharashtra Office, Mumbai. The programme was attended by around 100 participants, including the Special IG (Training), Commissioners of Police, and officers of the rank of SP and DySP from various districts.
- A training programme was conducted, on 12.11.25, by the Narcotics Control Bureau in collaboration with the Income Tax Department for police officers and other Drug Law Enforcement Officers (DLEOs) at PHQ, Naya Raipur. A total of 75 officers participated in the programme.

CHENNAI: Stepping up its focus on dismantling the financial backbone of drug trafficking networks, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Chennai Zone, froze illegally acquired assets worth 12.33 crore in 2025. This marks a shift from routine arrests to sustained financial investigations to cripple drug networks. In a press release, the Chennai zone said it prioritized tracking money trails in narcotics trade during the year. As part of this approach, a Dubai-based hawala operator involved in drug trafficking between India and Sri Lanka was arrested while attempting to flee the country. Following his arrest, assets worth 2 crore linked to him were identified and frozen in April 2025. On the enforcement front, the NCB Chennai Zone seized 2,362kg of narcotic drugs and 7.618 kg of cocaine during the year. Ganja accounted for the bulk of the seizures at 2,344kg, with 11 out of 15 cases ending in convictions. A major breakthrough came through a joint operation with the Customs Intelligence Directorate, which resulted in the seizure of 7.6kg of cocaine and the arrest of four persons as part of the operation.

GUWAHATI (Assam) [India], December 3 (ANI): In a major crackdown on cross-border narcotics smuggling, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) Guwahati Zonal Unit has busted an international drug trafficking network operating along the Myanmar-Manipur-Assam axis and seized 6.149 kg of heroin in a swift riverine operation. Acting on specific intelligence developed over a prolonged period, NCB officials tracked the movement of an illicit consignment transported through dense forest routes in Manipur and ferried on small motorboats along the Barak River to evade routine security checks, a release said. On Monday, an NCB team intercepted an indigenous motorboat on the Barak River near Silchar. It apprehended two persons identified as Jacob Hmar of Diger Fulertal, Lakhipur, and Melodi Hmar of Tupidar Forest, Lakhipur, both from Cachar district. A detailed search of the vessel led to the recovery of 6.149 kg of high-grade heroin packed in 530 soap cases and concealed beneath bamboo layers. The seized narcotics are estimated to be worth around Rs 12.5 crore. A detailed investigation suggests the contraband originated in Myanmar and was being routed towards the Hmarakhlaw and other points and security.

NCB Chennai freezes Rs 12.33 crore in drug-linked assets

CHENNAI: In a crackdown on the economic source of drug networks, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) Chennai Zone froze illegally acquired assets worth Rs 12.33 crore in 2025.

Moving beyond the routine arrests, the agency focused on the "money trail" to dismantle the financial strength of trafficking syndicates. According to an NCB press release, officials arrested a Dubai-based hawala operator who managed drug trade between India and Sri Lanka.

Following his arrest while trying to flee the country, his assets worth Rs 2 crore were identified and frozen in April 2025. During the year, the NCB seized 2,362.770 kg of narcotic drugs and arrested 46 persons. While Ganja made up the bulk of the haul at 2,344.470 kg, a joint operation with the Customs Intelligence Unit led to the seizure of 7.618 kg of cocaine as part of a pan-India operation. On the legal front, the zone recorded a conviction rate of 73.33%, with 11 out of 15 cases ending in convictions.

The agency also monitored the darknet, dismantling three major cartels since 2023, including a vendor named "KETAMELON" in Kochi. This enforcement comes amid the increasing use of darknet platforms and cryptocurrency by youngsters to procure illicit drugs.

विशेष खुफिया जानकारी के आधार पर कार्रवाई करते हुए एनसीबी की गुवाहाटी क्षेत्रीय इकाई ने केंद्रीय रिजर्व पुलिस बल (सीआरपीएफ) और असम पुलिस के साथ एक संयुक्त अभियान में मादक पदार्थ की खेप का पता लगाया। सुरक्षा जांच से बचने के लिए मणिपुर में जंगल के रास्ते के बजाय बराक नदी के किनारे छोटी नौका के माध्यम से यह खेप लाई जा रही थी। अधिकारी ने 'पीटीआई-भाषा' को बताया, 'एक दिसंबर को एनसीबी गुवाहाटी ने सिलचर (कछार जिला) के पास बराक नदी में एक नौका को रोका और दो व्यक्तियों को गिरफ्तार किया।'

उन्होंने बताया कि नौका की गहन तलाशी में 6.14 किलोग्राम हेरोइन बरामद हुई, जिसे 530 साबुन के डिब्बों में बांस की परतों के नीचे छिपाया गया था।


