- Heroin concealed inside red chili jars to evade detection.

- Brown sugar concealed in soap cases inside a commercial vehicle.
- Suspected narcotics hidden inside 35 small containers concealed under a scooter seat.

Key Trends

- Continued dominance of interstate trafficking networks, particularly along the Odisha–Andhra Pradesh–Telangana–Maharashtra–Uttar Pradesh corridor.
- Northeastern states remain a major hotspot, with repeated seizures of heroin, Yaba tablets, brown sugar and opium, indicating sustained trafficking linked to the Indo-Myanmar region.
- Large-scale cannabis trafficking increasingly involves commercial transport vehicles with concealed compartments and coordinated logistics.
- Enforcement agencies are increasingly targeting financial assets derived from narcotics trafficking through property attachment.
- Strong focus on synthetic drugs continues, with significant MDMA and mephedrone seizures alongside ongoing anti-drug awareness campaigns across several states.

Afghan police smash drug-processing lab in southern region

Kabul: The counter-narcotics police in the fight against illegal drugs have discovered and destroyed a drug-processing lab in Helmand province south of Afghanistan, said a statement of provincial directorate for Information and Culture on Tuesday.

The illegal laboratory was spotted in Baghran district on Monday, the statement said, adding that police also seized a huge quantity of illegal objects that were used in making illegal drugs from the site of operations.

No one has been arrested and efforts are underway by police to arrest and bring to justice those involved in the black business, the statement emphasised, Xinhua News Agency reported.

Earlier, police also reported the demolition of 400 acres of poppy farms in the western Farah province a couple of days ago.

On June 8, Afghanistan's Ministry for Interior Affairs said that Afghan police in the drive against illegal drugs have discovered illegal drugs and also destroyed drug processing labs in the southern Uruzgan and western Farah provinces of the country.

A total of 21 kg of illegal drugs and 273 stimulant tablets (locally known as Tablet K) have been seized. Police also destroyed drug processing labs along with around 1,000 kg of objects used in manufacturing heroin in Uruzgan and Farah provinces, the statement posted on the ministry's social platform X asserted.

Police have also taken into custody five individuals on charges of involvement in the black business, the statement went on to say.

Without providing more details, the statement noted that the counter-narcotics police would continue the war against illegal drugs until Afghanistan gets rid of the drug menace.

Earlier in May, Afghan counter-narcotics forces have seized a substantial quantity of narcotics and drug-processing materials during ongoing operations in southern Helmand province, the state-run Bakhtar News Agency reported.

According to the report, authorities confiscated approximately 8,170 kg of heroin, along with materials used in the processing and production of illegal drugs. The seizure is part of continued efforts to combat drug trafficking and dismantle criminal networks involved in the production and distribution of narcotics.

Similarly, security forces confiscated 55 kg of methamphetamine in Nimroz province in western Afghanistan.

World Cup Cocaine Surge: A Tale of Supply and Demand

Two significant cocaine seizures in Mexico highlight a potential link between cartel activities and increased demand due to the World Cup. Experts suggest that increased drug availability in warehouses near Mexico City is aimed at meeting this surge, although no official link has been confirmed.

- Two significant cocaine seizures in Mexico indicate cartels are responding to increased demand linked to the World Cup.
- On June 22, three metric tons of cocaine were seized in Guerrero and Tlaxcala, raising concerns about unusual trafficking patterns.
- Security expert Andrés Sumano suggests that drug traffickers are stockpiling to meet the anticipated demand during the tournament.
- While officials have not directly connected the seizures to the World Cup, researchers theorize it reflects a strategic supply move near Mexico City.


In a turn of events highlighting international sporting influence on local crime, two substantial cocaine seizures in Mexico suggest cartels are responding to spike demand from the World Cup. On June 22, three metric tons were seized in Guerrero and Tlaxcala, raising questions about these unusual trafficking patterns.

Security expert Andrés Sumano points to the expected World Cup demand increase as influencing cartel operations. As Sumano noted, similar to businesses prepping for massive events, drug traffickers stockpile to cater to heightened client needs. Dealers in Mexico City reported a noticeable uptick in demand coinciding with the tournament.

Despite the seizures, officials have not directly linked them to the World Cup. Tlaxcala authorities assert no connection between the bust and organized crime operations in the area. However, researchers, including Vicente Sánchez, theorize the large stash suggests a strategic supply move close to the Mexican capital.

Guwahati police arrest suspected drug peddler, seize narcotics

GUWAHATI: A suspected narcotics trafficker was arrested during a late-night operation on Zoo Road in Guwahati after police recovered a sizeable quantity of [suspected contraband](#) concealed inside a scooter.

Acting on specific intelligence, police launched a targeted operation near the HDFC Bank branch on Zoo Road, where they intercepted the two-wheeler and apprehended the rider. The accused was identified as Hasmat Ali.

During the search, officers recovered 35 containers containing suspected narcotic substances from the under-seat storage compartment of the scooter bearing registration number AS 25 K 7690. The contraband, along with the vehicle, was seized as evidence.

Cachar (Assam) [India], July 1 (ANI): In a major blow to drug cartels operating in the Northeast, Assam Rifles Srikona Battalion, in a joint operation with Cachar Police, intercepted a massive consignment of narcotics near Tollengram, Cachar, on June 30. Acting on specific intelligence, the forces recovered 30,000 [Yaba tablets](#) and 535 grams of Heroin No. 4, with a combined street value estimated at Rs 9.5 Crores. The contraband was concealed inside jars holding red chillies, a desperate attempt to evade detection that was foiled by the alertness of Assam Rifles troops. Two women hailing from Tollen Village, Tamenglong District, were apprehended at the spot and taken into custody for further investigation. The seizure underscores the relentless efforts of security forces to choke narcotic supply chains in the region. This operation caps a series of successful strikes against illegal trade in the last 48 hours. Just a day earlier, contraband [Yaba tablets](#) and heroin worth Rs 5 Crore were recovered, followed by the seizure of illegal foreign cigarettes valued at Rs 2.8 Crore earlier today. The back-to-back operations highlight the unwavering vigil maintained along vulnerable routes. The success demonstrated great synergy between the Assam Rifles, Cachar Police, and the Customs Department. Assam Rifles remains committed to the nation's fight against drugs and smuggling, standing as the Sentinels of the Northeast to safeguard society and secure the future of our youth. (ANI)

Arunachal: Itanagar Capital Police Arrest 22-Year-Old With 38.8 Grams Of Heroin In Chimpu

Continuing its drive against narcotics, Capital Police Itanagar arrested a 22 year old man from BN Colony, Chimpu, Monday and recovered 38.8 grams of suspected heroin from his possession.

The accused, Bicky Nidak Tamin alias Biki Tamin, 22, was stopped by the Special Action Team (SAT) while riding a scooter in BN Colony. The team operated under DySP (HQ) Shri Chamrak Arun, APPS, with SI Padam Padi leading officers HC Jerry Romin, Ct. Rinchin Tsering, Ct. Passang Norbu, and Ct. Tasso Tasser. SDPO Itanagar Shri Chera Saban and Chimpu PS OC Shri Niraj Nishant were also present.

To follow NDPS Act procedure, Assistant Commissioner (Executive Magistrate) Shri Tamo Dada was called to the spot. In his presence, police searched the accused and found three plastic vials of suspected heroin, commonly called brown sugar, in his right pocket.

On questioning, the accused revealed he had hidden more narcotics at home. The team then searched his BN Colony residence with the Executive Magistrate and independent witnesses present. Five plastic containers with suspected heroin were seized from the house and adjacent garden.

Police recovered a total of 38.8 grams of suspected heroin. Other items taken into custody include, ₹22,600 cash, believed to be drug money, One Apple iPhone 13, Yamaha Ray ZR scooter, Reg. No. AR-01T-8237, said to be used in the crime

Initial questioning revealed the accused allegedly bought the heroin using an online payment. Police are verifying this lead and working to identify other members of the supply network.

Chimpu Police Station has registered Case No. 57/2026 under Sections 21(b), 27A, and 29 of the NDPS Act, 1985. Investigators are now working to break up the wider network and track financial transactions linked to the case.

SP Capital Itanagar Shri Jummar Basar, who supervised the operation, said Capital Police remain committed to dismantling drug networks and ensuring a drug-free Capital Region. He added that strict action will continue to shield youth from narcotics.

Capital Police reiterated their resolve to pursue drug traffickers and protect citizens from the drug menace.

Manipur woman held with heroin worth Rs 1.13 crore in Aizawl

Aizawl: A joint team of the Assam Rifles and Mizoram Police seized heroin worth Rs 1.13 crore and arrested a woman from Manipur during an intelligence-based operation at Seling in Mizoram's [Aizawl district](#).

The operation was launched on Monday following specific intelligence inputs regarding the movement of narcotics through the area, the paramilitary force said in a statement.

Personnel of the Assam Rifles, in coordination with Mizoram Police at the Seling check post, carried out a search operation during which they recovered 150.97 grams of heroin valued at Rs 1.13 crore.

The accused, a woman from [Chandel district](#) in Manipur, was allegedly transporting the narcotic substance illegally, the statement said. One mobile phone was also seized from her possession.

The seized heroin, the mobile phone and the accused were handed over to the state police on the same day for further investigation and legal proceedings.

The Assam Rifles said the operation reflected its continued coordination with the Mizoram Police and other law enforcement agencies in efforts to curb narcotics trafficking in the state.

The force also reiterated its commitment to strengthening security along the Indo-Myanmar border and preventing the movement of illegal drugs.

Security Forces Seize Brown Sugar and Arrest Two in Senapati

Imphal: Security forces pulled over a Tata Yodha vehicle at the T. Khullen Naka Check Point in Senapati district on Sunday morning. Officers found 42 soap cases stuffed with suspected brown sugar hidden inside. The load weighed 530 grams.

A combined team from the Senapati Police Special Operation Team, Women Police Station, and two CRPF battalions conducted the stop. They arrested Helkho Kipgen, 45, and Hatneiling Kipgen, 40, both from Kangpokpi district. Police took the suspects into custody after completing legal formalities.

The haul did not stop at the drugs. Officials seized the Tata Yodha vehicle, a green sack, two mobile phones, an Aadhaar card, and a purse holding 5,000 rupees. Senapati Police Station now holds the case. Authorities stated, "Further investigation and legal proceedings are underway."

Three arrested, 5 kg opium seized in Jiribam

Imphal: Three alleged drug smugglers were arrested and 5 kg of opium seized during a joint operation by security forces and police near the Manipur-Assam border.

The operation was carried out in the early hours of June 29 following specific intelligence inputs about the movement of narcotics along National Highway-37 in Manipur's [Jiribam district](#).

A joint team comprising central security forces, Jiribam Police and the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) intercepted a silver-grey Hyundai i20 (registration number GJ-27BL-0847) at Leingangpokpi village and recovered 5 kg of opium along with Rs 50,000 in cash during a search of the vehicle.

Two occupants of the vehicle, identified as Dhanraj Prajapat (46) and Buddha Ram (44), both natives of Rajasthan, were arrested on the spot.

Follow-up investigation and interrogation led police to a third suspect, who was subsequently arrested during a raid at Thanga Khunjem Leikai in [Bishnupur district](#).

The three accused, the seized contraband, cash and the vehicle have been handed over to the concerned police station for further legal action.

Police have registered a case and launched an investigation to trace the source of the seized opium and identify others allegedly linked to the inter-state narcotics network.

Nagaland Intensifies Fight Against Illegal Drugs

Kohima: Nagaland officials are cracking down on drug abuse. The Social Welfare Department recently wrapped up its Nasha Mukta Bharat Abhiyaan campaign in Meluri. Simultaneously, the Niuland District Administration kicked off a 10-day initiative to curb addiction. Both programs aim to shield families from the growing threat of illegal substances.

Meluri sits near the Indo-Myanmar border. EAC Zuchibemo Ezung warned that this proximity makes the area a target for opium and ganja traffickers. Ezung called for local vigilance and support for those struggling with addiction. He urged the community to stop isolating victims, stating, "NMBA should not remain a mere formal programme but must be translated into meaningful action through active participation of every individual."


Events in Meluri included a marathon and a student poster competition. Officials also administered a public pledge to stay drug-free. In Niuland, Deputy Commissioner T.L. Kiusumong Tikhir labeled addiction a major barrier to economic development. He called on churches, village councils, and parents to join the fight.

The Niuland launch featured a testimony from a recovering addict. Participants viewed a slideshow covering planned activities for the 10-day drive. Leaders across both districts are now pushing for long-term commitment. They want citizens to act as ambassadors for healthy, clean lifestyles.

The Article pertaining to “**ANTI-NARCOTICS DRIVE IN KERALA – RECOVERY OF SYNTHETIC DRUGS FROM A WOMAN’S PRIVATE PART – THE APPLICABILITY OF SECTION 50 OF THE NDPS ACT, 1985**” is written by Shri SRINIVASAN GOPAL, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR(RETD.), NATIONAL ACADEMY OF CUSTOMS INDIRECT TAXES AND NARCOTICS, PALASAMUDRAM.

The article analyses the recovery of MDMA concealed in a woman’s vaginal cavity during Kerala Police’s Operation Toofan, examines the applicability of Section 50 of the NDPS Act alongside the constitutional rights embedded under Article 21, and lays down a procedure to be followed to build a foolproof case and secure conviction.

It has been widely reported in various newspapers, including The Hindu, The Hindustan Times, and Deccan Herald¹, that during an anti-narcotics drive by the District Anti-Narcotic Special Action Force (DANSAF) of the Kerala Police, a case was reported involving the recovery and seizure of 2 grams of MDMA (with 10 grams or more constituting a commercial quantity under the NDPS Act) from one of the two women occupants of a car intercepted at a checkpoint in Thrissur. The DANSAF team found the behaviour of the occupants suspicious, and under these circumstances, 2 grams of MDMA were recovered from the private parts (vaginal cavity) of the accused woman. It was further stated in the article that a female officer was involved in the search. In this case, cumulatively 308 grams—30 times the commercial quantity—were recovered, and there can be no dispute regarding the recovery or the splendid job the Kerala Police has been doing under Operation Toofan.

Unlike other criminal statutes, the NDPS Act operates on a different footing and this being an exception to the normal criminal jurisprudence, the Legislature in its wisdom has introduced the concept of reverse burden. Under the NDPS Act, it is for the accused to prove and establish that he or she has not indulged in illicit drug trafficking upon the prosecution proving the foundational facts of recovery. In terms of Section 35 of the NDPS Act, there is a presumption of guilt, which is rebuttable in nature under Section 54 of the NDPS Act. The primary reason for having the reverse burden jurisprudence for the NDPS Act is because of the damage it causes to the society and the requirement for diversion of resources for allied functions, including rehabilitation. The reverse burden under NDPS Act is akin to the smuggling of goods i.e. gold, silver, fire crackers, cigarettes, etc, notified under Section 123 of the Customs Act, 1962

The Statutory Safeguards Under Section 50 of the NDPS Act

In a case of this kind wherein a woman hides drugs (mainly MDMA) in her private parts, it is essential to understand as how the provisions of Section 50 of the NDPS Act operates.

A woman suspect (she is a suspect before recovery) must be served with a Notice under Section 50 apprising her of the legal rights to be searched before the nearest Gazetted Officer (of the empowered departments) or the nearest Magistrate. The Notice *ibid* should be served in the language known to the suspect lest she take a diametrically opposite view in the remand or trial proceedings. Failure to extend this option completely vitiates the recovery of that specific contraband.

A reading of Section 50 in a wholesome manner reveals that Section 50(1) reveals that

*“When any officer duly authorised under section 42 is about to **search any person** under the provisions of section 41, section 42 or section 43..”, it is only an empowered officer who can effect a search of a suspect , albeit after issuing a Notice, as discussed in para *Supra*.*

Section 50(4) specifically deals with the search of a female. Under other criminal Acts, another female officer can conduct the search. Since the provisions of BNSS, 2023 have been made applicable to the NDPS Act by virtue of Section 51, provided they are not inconsistent, and as the provisions of BNSS, 2023 are inconsistent with Section 50 of the NDPS Act, they are inapplicable. Hence, empowered officers should remember that only an empowered female officer of and above the rank of Head Constable is eligible to carry out the search. Needless to mention here that the empowerment at the State level depends upon the situation and the consequent Notification issued by the respective State Governments. In formations under CBIC, except CBN, the empowerment starts of the rank of Inspector and known by different names by virtue of the place of posting. In NCB and CBN, the empowerment starts at the level of sub-Inspector.

The Critical Distinction: “Search” vs. “Extraction”

Section 50 of the NDPS Act is restrictive in nature in as much it is used for search of a person – be it a man/woman suspected of concealing drugs on his/her person. Physical Search, after issuance of a Notice under Section 50 is required to be understood between external search and “extraction”. Search generally includes the external examination of a person’s outer attire, pat-downs, or checking pockets and undergarments. Section 50 perfectly fits in at this operational stage. In contrast, extraction does involve the removal of the drug (in this case MDMA) from the biological bodily concealment. When contraband is inserted inside a biological body cavity, the process ceases to be a mere “search.” As envisaged under Section 50 of the NDPS Act. Extraction shifts into an invasive medical zone that directly threatens the suspect’s guaranteed constitutional protections under Article 21 (Right to Life, Dignity, and Bodily Integrity). It is a fact that empowered officers functioning under the Central Government or State Governments do not possess skill having not undergone any clinical training, to execute physical extractions from inside a human body, particularly the female body.

Difference between Male Private Parts vs. Vaginal Cavity

The physical nature of concealment varies extensively by gender, creating distinct legal and medical ramifications. Insofar as a male is concerned and having hidden drugs in his private, we refer to the judgment dated 24 March 2021 in the case of ²**NCB v. Micheal Webuda (in JC) decided by the Ld.**

Special Judge (NDPS), Patiala House Courts, New Delhi in Case No. SC/9512/2016. Micheal Webuda hid contraband externally within his undergarments or taped near his groin area. In such instances, the contraband remains *outside* the body structure. Uncovering it simply requires an external search of the clothing and underwear, which remains safely within the boundaries of a standard Section 50 personal search. However, in respect of secreting drugs in the vaginal cavity, it is required to be remembered that the vagina is an internal biological organ. It is highly sensitive and prone to severe trauma if improperly handled. Improper handling may lead to tearing and associated risks. Compounding the problem is the availability of female witnesses.

Assuming but admitting that the personal search under Section 50 extends to extraction, it is always advisable to get it 'extracted' through medical procedure. It is always required to be kept in mind that the health and safety of the suspect (since not recovered) is of utmost and a duty has been cast on the empowered officers, under Section 56 of BNSS, 2023, to take care of them notwithstanding the fact that the likely offence would entail a punishment of minimum of 10 years in commercial quantity cases.

Forcible internal probing by an empowered officer—even by a female officer who is legally empowered—presents huge risks, including infection. Hence, keeping in view the fact that the disadvantages outweigh advantages, the female empowered officer should always prefer the medical route.

Conversely, it may also be case wherein a female suspect is searched and drugs (here also MDMA, being the recovered and seized by the empowered officers continuously in Kerala) being initially recovered from the bag being carried. During medical procedure, the attending doctor recovers from the vaginal concealment commercial quantity of the female accused. A Government doctor is not an empowered officer under the NDPS Act and the recovery being made in the absence of the empowered female officer, the validity of the recovery can be legally challenged. The case of **Anila Raveendran v. State of Kerala – Neutral Citation 2025:KER:71680** refers in this regard. It is of utmost importance to note what has been recorded by the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in Para 9 of the bail order under this Neutral Citation:

*“9. In the instant case, on a perusal of the case diary, it is noticed that the grounds for arrest have been communicated to the petitioner as per the arrest memo, wherein there is specific reference to the petitioner being in possession of 36.86 grams of MDMA, which was recovered from her handbag. However, the final report alleges that she was in possession of 77.30 grams of MDMA. **The excess quantity mentioned in the final report was 40.44 grams of MDMA, which was recovered from her vagina during her medical examination.”***

In a situation where MDMA recovered from the handbag is less than 10 grams and the vaginal recovery being contested as recovery at the back of the female empowered officer (the point being not pressed in this case), the case would be decided on the recovery of MDMA from the hand bag,

which is an intermediate quantity. Consequently, the offence becomes bailable and the proceedings of Chapter VA of the NDPS become statutorily inapplicable until the Ld. Court imposes the maximum sentence of 10 years for intermediate quantity.

Nevertheless, the accused was also detained under [PITNDPS Act, 1988](#) and the Detention Order was not quashed or set aside by the Hon'ble High Court as per reported decision in the case of **Sanilkumar v. State of Kerala -Neutral Citation 2026:KER:583 refers.**


Considering the above, the importance of proper recovery need not be over emphasized.

The Best Practice: Protocol for Cavity Recoveries

To avoid severe physical harm to the accused and to prevent the legal case from collapsing during trial due to procedural illegality, the empowered officer must implement a rigorous, sequentially sound standard operating procedure. The following steps can be put into practice to withstand legal scrutiny:

By ensuring that cases are handled strictly as a **court-ordered medical procedure rather than a routine search**, the empowered department/officer instill confidence in adopting a fair, transparent and just court-monitored method to rule out foul play. It also simultaneously exhibits the empowered department to the constitutional safeguards enshrined under Article 21.

A 25-year-old man who allegedly projected himself as the state president of an anti-drug organisation has been arrested after police recovered 1.590 grams of MDMA and drug-use paraphernalia from his house in Kerala, officials said on Tuesday.

The accused, identified as Sharfin Sebastian, was arrested during a joint operation by the District DANSAF team and the Ranni Sub-Division DANSAF team under "Operation Toofan", the state government's anti-drug crackdown.

Police said Sharfin, a resident of Pathanamthitta district, had been under surveillance for several days after receiving specific intelligence that he was storing MDMA at his residence.

According to officials, when the police team reached his house on Sunday, Sharfin tried to divert the officers by leading them to a different room instead of his own.

However, a thorough search led to the recovery of 1.590 grams of MDMA concealed inside a secret compartment among books.

During the search, police also recovered an identity card identifying Sharfin as the state president of the Youth Movement of the Anti Drugs Movement In Nation (ADMIN), along with a glass bubbler, L-shaped pipes used to heat and inhale MDMA, plastic smoking pipes and other drug-use paraphernalia.

"The youth who claimed to be the state leader of an anti-drug organisation and projected himself as leading anti-drug activities in the locality is now under arrest," a police officer said.

Further investigation revealed that Sharfin is also an accused in narcotics cases registered at Palarivattom and Ernakulam Town police stations, besides two criminal cases at Koipuram police station, including one involving the alleged assault of women, police said.

The accused was produced before a court and remanded to judicial custody.

Cocaine seized from Kenyan woman at airport

Chennai: A Kenyan woman, found carrying 850gm of cocaine, valued at about ₹15 crore, was arrested by the directorate of revenue intelligence (DRI) sleuths at the Chennai airport on Tuesday. She tried to smuggle the contraband by swallowing capsules containing the drug. Officials suspect she is part of an international drug-trafficking syndicate.

A DRI team maintained surveillance at the airport after receiving a specific tip-off that a foreign national would arrive carrying narcotics on an Ethiopian Airlines flight from Addis Ababa.

The flight landed at about 8.30am on Tuesday. Officials intercepted the woman who travelled from Kenya via Ethiopia on a tourist visa. A search of her baggage did not reveal any contraband. But as suspicion lingered, she was then taken to the airport hospital, where a body scan showed multiple capsules inside her stomach. With the assistance of a medical team, officials recovered about 70 capsules from her body.

The capsules contained 850gm of high-grade cocaine with an estimated international market value of ₹15 crore. The DRI seized the narcotics and arrested the woman.

GRP, Secunderabad, Destroys 735 Kg Ganja Worth ₹3.22 Crore

KHAMMAM: A minor boy was among four drug peddlers nabbed during a joint operation by EAGLE Force's Khammam Regional Narcotics Control Cell (RNCC) and Bhadradi Kothagudem district police near the west gate of the ITC Paper Boards Company at Sarapaka, close to Bhadrachalam, on Tuesday. They also seized 525 kg of ganja worth about `2.62 crore, the container lorry used to transport the contraband, a Bajaj Pulsar motorcycle used as an escort vehicle, five mobile phones and `10,570 in cash.

Police arrested Sahadev Hantal (20) of Malkangiri district, Odisha, Dogri Trinath (38) of Somireddypalem in Alluri Sitharama Raju district, Andhra Pradesh, Kuldeep Sharma (27) of Bijapur, Uttar Pradesh, and the juvenile.

According to SP B Rohith Raju, the prime accused, Sahadev, procured the ganja from the Allurikota forest area in Odisha. Labourers were allegedly hired to transport the contraband from the forest to Mothugudem-Tulasipaka in Andhra Pradesh, where it was loaded into a container lorry owned by Mohammed Saif and Firoz Bhai.


The SP said the smugglers had fabricated a concealed chamber inside the container to hide the ganja bags and evade police detection.

The consignment was allegedly being transported from Tulasipaka through Bhadrachalam, Khammam, Warangal and Adilabad to Maharashtra before its final destination in Uttar Pradesh. Acting on credible intelligence, Eagle Force and Bhadradi police tracked the movements of the

container lorry and the escort motorcycle before intercepting them at Sarapaka. Eagle Force said four other suspects — Mohammed Saif, Firoz Bhai, Raja Mishra and Mohammed Imran — are absconding and efforts are on to trace them.

Official data reveals that an average of 40 students were booked in narcotics-related cases monthly across Telangana in 2026. Highlighting the growing threat of drug abuse, EAGLE officials expressed concern over the increasing number of youth and students falling victim to narcotics, leading to criminal activity and other anti-social behaviour. SP Rohith Raju urged young people and students to stay away from drugs and appealed to parents to closely monitor their children's activities to prevent substance abuse.

Asifabad police burn 414 kg of ganja worth Rs 1.70 crore

Chennai: In a first-of-its-kind drive, a panel of experts comprising a lawyer, a police officer, an educationist, a social worker and a doctor will visit more than 100 schools and colleges in the city to promote awareness against drug use through presentations, plays, motivational sessions and interactive activities.

Spearheaded by the Greater Chennai Police and Tamil Nadu Volunteers, a non-profit working in the field of sustainability and youth empowerment, this initiative is aimed at covering more than 40,000 students from July 1 to 15. They plan to organise street plays, pamphlet distribution and administration of pledges. The expert panel to present at schools and colleges is being identified by TN Volunteers and police personnel.

“Every police station should reach out to a college, a school and the public in their jurisdiction. More than 300 campaigns are being planned in collaboration with 104 police stations,” said Thamilarasan, a volunteer. In a circular dated June 25, Chennai commissioner A Amalraj has ordered officers to ensure police participation and support for the programme.

The outreach also has a digital segment, where students and members of the public can take part in a social media campaign, N Hari Krishnan, chief-coordinator, TN Volunteers, said.

“Our volunteers encourage students, youth, educational institutions, NGOs and the public to post photos, videos and awareness messages supporting a Drug Free Society on social media platforms tagging the chief minister, the police and our platform. Participants will be provided with a certificate,” he added.

The campaign was launched in other districts in coordination with respective district superintendents of police on June 26, in line with the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. The aim is to reach more than 1,00,000 students through 500 campaigns.

Beda Bro: Karnataka govt reaches out to students against drugs

Bengaluru: In a crackdown on narcotics and a simultaneous push to curb drug abuse among youngsters, state govt Tuesday launched two key anti-drug campaigns, Operation RISE (Refuse, Inform, Support, Empower)' and Beda Bro (Let's Refuse, Bro) initiative. It also announced plans to destroy 4,276.4 kg of seized drugs valued at Rs 97.9 crore soon.

Over 8.3 lakh students across the state took part in the programme, both online and offline, to mark International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, making it one of the largest awareness drives in the state.

Operation RISE aims to tackle drug abuse through a structured, multi-level approach, combining awareness, reporting mechanisms and rehabilitation support. Chief minister DK Shivakumar called for collective responsibility in tackling drug abuse and urged families, institutions and society to act without hesitation. Emphasising early intervention, he said, "The longer you hide your children's addiction, the more you destroy their future."

Home minister Priyank Kharge stressed the importance of resisting peer pressure and making conscious choices.

He urged students to “say no, even if friends insist,” and encouraged them to report suspicious activities to authorities, teachers or parents. He also highlighted that addiction should be treated with empathy, not stigma, noting that those affected need support to recover.

NDPS court tells 3 Swedes to face charges in Rs 2.6cr drug bust

Panaji: An NDPS court has directed three Swedish nationals — Andreas Lorenzo Calic, Sami Antero Hilden Tanskanen, and Joel Emmanuel Caristrom — to face charges under the NDPS Act in connection with a Rs 2.6 crore narcotics raid conducted at Arambol in June last year.

The ANC recovered LSD liquid, LSD papers, ketamine liquid, and ketamine powder from a rented premises. The court dismissed the trio's discharge plea, noting that the seized substances tested positive for LSD and ketamine on a drug detection kit. The court held this was sufficient at this stage to frame charges and that there is prima facie material against the accused individuals.

The court discharged the fourth accused, Siddhesh Dabholkar, a pharmacist whom the Swedish nationals allegedly told the investigating officer they had procured the contraband from. The court noted that a separate FDA raid on the pharmacy found medicines being sold to a decoy customer without a valid prescription, leading to suspension of the licence, but that no LSD or ketamine was found or seized in that raid. Additional sessions judge-2 (FTC-2) at Merces, Shilpa Pandit, said the FDA raid did not aid the prosecution in the NDPS case. The court also recorded that there was no scientific/forensic evidence, including call detail records, to show communication between accused 1 to 3 and accused 4, and held there was no material to frame charges against Dabholkar.

Seizures attached during the house search included LSD liquid (24.8g) worth Rs 2.5 crore, 70 LSD paper pieces

(0.6g) worth Rs 7 lakh, ketamine liquid (49.3g) worth Rs 2.5 lakh, and ketamine powder (1.5g) worth Rs 15,000. Counsel for the three Swedish accused argued they are law-abiding Swedish citizens who entered India legally, are responsible persons and fathers, and overstayed due to circumstances for which they have already been convicted and have served the sentence. The defence also argued that ketamine is a licensed pharmaceutical, the quantity was below “small quantity”, and there was no scientific identification of the substances.

Two Odisha men held with ganja worth Rs 10 lakh in Surat; Gujarat Police trace supply chain

Surat, July 1 (IANS) The Special Operations Group (SOG) of Surat City Police has arrested two men from Odisha and seized 20 kilograms of ganja valued at Rs 10 lakh during a raid at a residential premises in the Ved Road area of Gujarat's Surat as part of an ongoing drive against narcotics trafficking in the city, officials said on Wednesday.

Acting on specific intelligence, an SOG team raided Room No. 2 on the second floor of House No. 48 in Meena Nagar Co-operative Housing Society, opposite Akhand Anand College in the Chok Bazar area.

The police arrested Kalucharan Mahanti, 31, and Jitu Pradhan, 21, both employed as zari workers and originally from Ganjam district of Odisha.

Police said they recovered 20kg of prohibited plant-based ganja worth Rs 10 lakh from the premises.

Two mobile phones valued at Rs 25,000 were also seized, taking the total value of the confiscated property to Rs 10.25 lakh.

According to Surat Police, the operation was carried out under the directions of Police Commissioner Anupam Singh Gehlot as part of the city's "No Drugs in Surat City" campaign, which targets the illegal movement of narcotics into Surat from other states and aims to curb drug distribution among young people.

During questioning, the accused allegedly told investigators that they had obtained the ganja from a wanted suspect and were on their way to deliver the consignment to another wanted accused when they were intercepted by the SOG team.

A case has been registered at Chok Bazar Police Station under Sections 8(c), 20(b)(ii)(C) and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

Police said further investigation is underway to identify and apprehend the absconding members of the alleged supply network.

The seizure is the second significant ganja haul reported in Surat within two days. In a separate operation in the Mahidharpura area, police seized more than 20 kg of ganja from another accused who was allegedly transporting the contraband for delivery, taking the total quantity recovered in the two operations to over 40 kg.

The latest action also follows other recent anti-narcotics operations in Gujarat, including the seizure of 12 kg of hybrid ganja by Ahmedabad's Vatva police and an SOG operation in Himmatnagar in Sabarkantha district in which hybrid ganja was recovered, and two suspects were arrested, highlighting continued enforcement efforts against drug trafficking across the state.

Ramification | Synthetic drugs, strategic risk: India's frontline in the global narcotics war

The struggle against narcotics is no longer confined to fields of poppy and coca; it is increasingly being fought in supply chains and digital networks

Unlike traditional narcotics that depend on specific geographic conditions for cultivation, synthetic drugs can be produced anywhere with access to precursor chemicals and basic laboratory equipment. (AI image)

The world's drug problem used to have a geography. Heroin came from the poppy fields of Afghanistan, cocaine came from the coca plantations of Colombia, and cannabis grew where the climate allowed. For decades, drug enforcement meant controlling land, intercepting shipments at borders and pressuring governments to eradicate crops. The problem was vast and entrenched, but at the very least it was legible.

However, the world is witnessing the emergence of a new generation of synthetic narcotics that are cheaper to produce without climatic restraints and easier to traffick. These substances are collectively referred to as New Psychoactive Substances (NPS). The transition from agricultural drug production to laboratory-based manufacturing represents one of the most significant developments in international narcotics trafficking since the rise of methamphetamine in the late twentieth century.

Unlike traditional narcotics that depend on specific geographic conditions for cultivation, synthetic drugs can be produced anywhere with access to precursor chemicals and basic laboratory equipment. This has resulted in criminal organisations shifting towards synthetic production models and creating a more decentralised global narcotics ecosystem. The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) has identified synthetic drugs and new psychoactive substances as among the fastest-growing threats in the global drug market.

NPS are synthetic or semi-synthetic compounds designed to mimic the effects of controlled drugs while avoiding existing legal restrictions. As a result, thousands of new compounds have appeared over the last decade. By October 2025, UNODC had recorded nearly 1400 individual NPS worldwide. These included substances like synthetic cannabinoids, synthetic cathinones, novelopioids, designer benzodiazepines, dissociative drugs and hallucinogens. Telling us a story of the extraordinary pace of innovation within the illicit drug markets and consequently the constant challenge it creates for law enforcement agencies.

Among emerging narcotics, nitazenes represent perhaps the most dangerous development. Originally synthesised in the 1950s as potential pharmaceutical painkillers, they were abandoned because of their extreme addictiveness. They have now gone underground and have found illicit

markets across North America, Europe, Australia, and other places. Nitazenes are often more potent than heroin and in some cases stronger than fentanyl. They are increasingly detected in counterfeit pharmaceuticals, heroin substitutes, cocaine mixtures and recreational drugs. Their potency makes accidental overdoses highly likely while standard toxicology screening frequently fails to detect them. For example, a hospital treating an overdose patient may run standard opioid tests, come back negative and miss the actual cause entirely. The strategic significance of nitazenes lies not merely in their lethality but in their economic efficiency. A small quantity can generate enormous profits while remaining easy to transport and conceal. This makes them highly attractive to transnational criminal organisations.

Synthetic cannabinoids constitute another rapidly growing category of narcotics. These substances are chemically engineered to imitate the effects of cannabis but produce far stronger and more unpredictable reactions. They are increasingly appearing in vaping products, edible products and herbal mixtures sold through illicit channels. Recent trends indicate growing availability of semi-synthetic cannabinoids such as THC derivatives manufactured through chemical processing rather than traditional cultivation. Because many users perceive these products as safer alternatives to conventional drugs. However, the consequences are severe. In Sierra Leone in 2024 mass burials had been conducted for dozens of young people killed by a synthetic cannabinoid known locally as “Kush”. In New York City public health data showed at least nine synthetic cannabinoid overdose deaths from January 2024 to August 2025, with emergency department visits running well above historical norms.

While not new, methamphetamine also continues to evolve through increasingly industrialised production methods. Southeast Asia’s Golden Triangle has become the world’s largest synthetic drug-manufacturing hub producing unprecedented quantities of methamphetamine and related stimulants. Large-scale criminal enterprises now operate sophisticated production networks that resemble industrial manufacturing systems rather than traditional clandestine laboratories. These organisations exploit conflict zones and porous borders to maintain production.

According to a UNODC report released in May 2025, synthetic drug production and trafficking from the Golden Triangle have grown exponentially. Methamphetamine seizures across East and Southeast Asia reached 236 tonnes in 2024, which is a 24 per cent increase from the year before. Thailand alone seized one billion yaba tablets, methamphetamine pills, in 2024, while Cambodia recorded its largest methamphetamine seizure in history. The Indian Coast Guard intercepted the largest haul of methamphetamines in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands in 2024, valued at \$4.3 billion. Myanmar’s Shan State, where armed groups, criminal syndicates and corrupt officials operate in overlapping networks amid ongoing civil conflict, has emerged as the world’s largest synthetic drug manufacturing zone.

For countries such as India the implications are particularly significant. The Golden Triangle remains a major source of methamphetamine and synthetic drugs entering South Asia. Simultaneously, the expansion of online drug markets and international precursor networks increases the possibility of

domestic synthetic drug manufacturing. Emerging synthetic opioids could also create new public health crises similar to those witnessed in North America and Europe.


The emergence of these new narcotics requires a corresponding transformation in international responses. Governments must move beyond traditional eradication approaches toward enhanced chemical monitoring, forensic intelligence, cyber surveillance, international information sharing and public health preparedness. The struggle against narcotics is no longer confined to fields of poppy and coca; it is increasingly being fought in supply chains and digital networks. The countries that adapt most rapidly to this reality will be best positioned to manage the evolving threats posed by the next generation of drugs.

India's anti-narcotics framework has matured considerably under the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). The four-tier NCORD mechanism, established in 2016 and strengthened in 2019, coordinates efforts from district to apex level while dedicated anti-narcotics task forces now operate in every state and union territory. Initiatives like the MANAS helpline, the NIDAAN portal for tracking offenders, canine detection squads and fast-track NDPS courts reflect a genuine institutional push toward Prime Minister Modi's goal of a drug-free India by 2047. Enforcement has translated into real outcomes, and major drug busts have led to quick convictions.

India has also extended this expertise abroad. NCB has partnered with the US DEA on joint operations, including ketamine lab busts, controlled deliveries and ephedrine/methamphetamine investigations targeting trafficking networks bound for Myanmar, while India assists foreign authorities and international organisations to harmonise global counter-narcotics measures.

However, no nation can solve this alone. The world needs synchronised real-time intelligence sharing between agencies like the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and UNODC as well as unified pressure on source countries like China to enforce accountability. But what has been true since India declared war against drugs is that this is not a fight that can be fought half-heartedly. From the Home Minister Amit Shah's direct oversight of NCORD to the Narcotics Control Bureau's expanding international partnerships, India is demonstrating through action, not just intent, that it is prepared to serve as a frontline force against the global synthetic drug menace. But importantly, the challenge is transnational, and unless other nations follow India's example, criminal networks will continue to exploit the weakest links in the international enforcement chain.

Jammu, Jun 30 (PTI) Police on Tuesday attached properties worth Rs 3.32 crore belonging to three alleged drug peddlers in two cases registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act in Jammu and Kashmir's Udhampur, officials said.

The properties were attached under section 68-F of the NDPS Act in connection with two cases registered at Majalta police station after investigations found that the assets had allegedly been acquired from proceeds of illicit narcotics trafficking, they said.

The police attached properties worth around Rs 3.10 crore, including a Maruti Swift car and two residential houses belonging to Raiyan Mukhtar, a resident of Budshah Natipora in Srinagar, and Ubaid Ullah Lone, son of Iftikhar Ahmad Lone, a resident of Hanji Dantar in Anantnag, they said.

In another case, the police attached properties worth about Rs 22 lakh, including a residential house, two shops and a plinth belonging to Riyaz Ahmad Lone, son of Sonallah Lone, a resident of Badrah Payeen, Krala Gund in Kupwara district, they said.

The officials said the investigation established that the attached properties were purchased using proceeds generated through the illegal narcotics trade.

They said further legal proceedings are underway. PTI AB AB APL APL

Woman sentenced to 10yrs for drug peddling, fined ₹1 lakh

Rudrapur: Nearly six years after her arrest, a Rudrapur woman was convicted by a special NDPS court on Tuesday for trafficking prohibited narcotic injections and sentenced to 10 years' rigorous jail term along with a hefty Rs 1 lakh fine. The court stated an additional three months' imprisonment in case of default of payment.

According to the prosecution, Rampura outpost police received information in Feb 2020 that a woman was selling banned narcotic injections near Chand Masjid in the Khera area. A police team acted on the tip-off and apprehended the accused as she attempted to flee. She was 22 at the time. The police recovered 108 Buprenorphine injections, 108 Diazepam injections and 115 vials of Avil from her possession.

A case was subsequently registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, and a chargesheet was filed. The prosecution, represented by ADGC Deepak Kumar Arora, produced witnesses and evidence, after which Special Judge (NDPS) Deepali Sharma held the accused guilty.

The court rejected the defence's plea for leniency based on the convict's gender and childcare responsibilities. The court observed: "The quantity of contraband recovered was several times higher than the commercial quantity." The court added that such offences fuelled the illegal drug trade, endangered the youth and warranted stern punishment without leniency.

Chittor police arrest 20yrs old MP man with 1kg MDMA

Bhilwara: Chittorgarh's Kotwali police arrested a 20-year-old man and recovered more than 1 kg of MDMA (Molly powder) allegedly from his possession Tuesday. The arrest was part of the ongoing initiative 'Operation Trinetra', targeting the illegal trade of narcotic substances in the region.

Police identified the accused as Piyush Solanki, who hails from Hadji ka Piplia in Pratapgarh district. Solanki was tracked down while he was carrying a backpack along Bhilwara Road, near Inani Residency. Upon searching his bag, the policemen allegedly discovered 1kg and 8 grams of MDMA cleverly packed in four separate plastic bags.

According to Chittorgarh Superintendent of Police Dharmendra Singh, a police team, operating under Additional SP Mukul Sharma, has been vigilant in monitoring drug activities as part of 'Operation Trinetra'. Singh said this operation aims to disrupt the supply chain of narcotics in the district.

During preliminary questioning, Piyush allegedly confessed to transporting the illegal substance from Mandsaur in Madhya Pradesh to Bhilwara in Rajasthan. The authorities officially arrested Solanki, and further investigations are underway to uncover the broader network involved in the drug trade.

Heroin worth Rs 20 cr seized

Srinagar, June 30: Police today arrested an alleged inter-district drug smuggler and seized 2.613 kilograms of heroin, estimated to be worth around Rs 20 crore in the international market, in Anantnag district.

An official said that the accused was intercepted during a routine vehicle checking drive at Halmulla in Anantnag district, where police stopped a suspicious car for inspection.

During the search of the vehicle, police recovered four packets containing heroin, following which the driver was identified as Ishtiyak Ahmad Moghal, a resident of Prada area of Tangdar in Kupwara district.

A case under the NDPS Act was registered at the concerned police station and investigation was launched.

During the investigation, the accused was served notice under Section 50 of the NDPS Act and his personal search was conducted as per the prescribed legal procedure.

The official said another packet containing heroin was recovered from his possession, taking the total seizure to 2.613 kilograms.

"The accused has been arrested, while further investigation is underway to ascertain the source and intended destination of the contraband and to identify others involved in the alleged drug trafficking network," the official said.

Drone Carrying 5 Kg Heroin Bound for India Crashes Near Pakistan Border in Punjab

A **drone allegedly carrying illegal drugs** intended for smuggling into India crashed near the **India–Pakistan border** in Pakistan’s Punjab province, where police recovered around **5 kg of heroin** and seized the unmanned aerial vehicle, officials said on Monday. The incident, reported from **Narang Mandi near Lahore** , has triggered an investigation into **cross-border narcotics trafficking networks** operating in the region.

According to police, the drone went down on a house roof in **Mohalla Rafiqabad, Gali Plaza Wali in Narang Mandi** , approximately 70 km from Lahore and about 8 km from the India–Pakistan border, raising suspicions that it was being used for smuggling heroin into India. Senior police officer **Bilal Zafar Sheikh** said officers were alerted after the drone crashed, prompting a cordon-and-search operation.


Police said a **black drone** , around 3 feet in length, was recovered along with a packet wrapped in yellow tape fitted with reflective markers. The packet contained **5 kg of heroin** , which authorities believe was part of a cross-border smuggling attempt. The drone and narcotics have been seized for forensic examination, and an investigation is underway.

Officials further stated that **no suspect has been arrested so far** , while security has been tightened in border areas following the incident. The case adds to a pattern of **drone-enabled narcotics trafficking** across Punjab’s border districts, which have increasingly been flagged by security agencies as key corridors for **Pakistan-based drug syndicates** .

Recent enforcement assessments highlight that Punjab remains a major hub for **heroin trafficking into India** , with authorities noting increased reliance on **GPS-enabled drones** for low-altitude smuggling drops in border regions.

Investigators are also probing **financial and logistical links** , including suspected international routing of proceeds through offshore hubs such as **Dubai** , as part of wider narcotics networks operating across South Asia.

Busting an interstate syndicate allegedly involved in the supply of illegal firearms and heroin, Abohar police arrested 12 persons and seized four illegal pistols, six magazines, 47 live cartridges and 100 gm of heroin, officials said on Tuesday.

Abohar superintendent of police (SP) Aswant Singh said a team got a tip-off that the gang members had assembled at a salon on Fazilka Chungi Road in Abohar to facilitate the delivery of illegal weapons and narcotics, following which they were caught.

“The syndicate was being operated under the directions of kingpin Vishal Pachar of Sri Ganganagar in Rajasthan, who remains absconding. The owner of the premises where the raid was conducted and several other suspects are also on the run. Raids are being conducted to arrest them,” the SP said.

The arrested persons have been identified as Ajay Singh, alias Aju, Bobby, Amanpreet Singh, alias Bhindi, Aman Kumar, Vijay Kumar, Ajay Kumar, alias Rishi, Ghanaiya Kumar, Sumit Kumar, Prince Kumar, alias Kodi, Shiva, Shivam, alias Shubham Manja, and Navninder Singh, alias Lovepreet Singh, alias Pinni, residents of Abohar and nearby areas, police said.

“An FIR has been registered under the Arms Act, the NDPS Act and the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita. Further probe is underway,” the SP added.

भोपाल के जगदीशपुर इलाके में ड्रग्स निर्माण की एक अवैध फैक्ट्री के भंडाफोड़ से जुड़े अंतरराष्ट्रीय मेफेड्रोन (MD) तस्करी मामले में मध्य प्रदेश हाई कोर्ट ने आरोपियों को बड़ा झटका दिया है। जस्टिस प्रमोद कुमार अग्रवाल की एकल पीठ ने मामले के तीन प्रमुख आरोपियों—अंजलि सिंह राजपूत, महफूज खान और वीरन रजनीकांत शाह—की नियमित जमानत याचिकाएं खारिज कर दी हैं। अदालत ने अपने आदेश में स्पष्ट किया कि मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी समाज की नींव को खोखला कर रही है और आने वाली पीढ़ियों के भविष्य को अंधकार में धकेल रही है, ऐसे में इस अपराध की गंभीरता को देखते हुए जमानत नहीं दी जा सकती।

ऑपरेशन 'क्रिस्टल ब्रेक' और यह हुई बरामदगी

यह मामला 16 अगस्त 2025 का है, जब डायरेक्टरेट ऑफ रेवेन्यू इंटेलिजेंस (DRI) ने एक खुफिया ऑपरेशन 'क्रिस्टल ब्रेक' के तहत भोपाल के जगदीशपुर में चल रहे ड्रग निर्माण कारखाने पर छापा मारा था। इस कार्रवाई में एजेंसी ने 61.2 किलोग्राम लिक्विड मेफेड्रोन बरामद की थी, जिसकी अंतरराष्ट्रीय बाजार में अनुमानित कीमत 92 करोड़ रुपए आंकी गई थी। इस मामले में अब तक गिरोह के 7 मुख्य सदस्यों को गिरफ्तार किया जा चुका है, जबकि डीआरआई ने मध्य प्रदेश, महाराष्ट्र, गुजरात और उत्तर प्रदेश में भी व्यापक छापेमारी की है। अभियोजन पक्ष ने अदालत को बताया कि सूरत निवासी अंजलि सिंह राजपूत इस ड्रग सिंडिकेट की एक सक्रिय सदस्य है। जांच के दौरान आरोप लगा कि वह मुख्य सरगना के इशारे पर भोपाल पहुंची थी और उसने 12 लाख रुपए की हवाला राशि का लेनदेन किया था। अंजलि ने एक अज्ञात व्यक्ति से नकदी के बदले '2-Bromo-4-Methyl Propiophenone' नामक रसायन से भरा ट्रॉली बैग प्राप्त किया था, जो मेफेड्रोन बनाने का एक प्रमुख प्रीकर्सर है। यह बैग बाद में सह-आरोपी अब्दुल फैजल कुरैशी को सौंपा गया था।

तुर्की से संचालित हो रहा था ड्रग नेटवर्क

डीआरआई की जांच में एक चौंकाने वाला तथ्य सामने आया है कि इस पूरे अंतरराष्ट्रीय ड्रग नेटवर्क का मास्टरमाइंड सलीम डोला उर्फ 'अर्जुन सर' है। सलीम डोला फिलहाल फरार है और माना जा रहा है कि वह तुर्की में बैठकर भारत में ड्रग्स की तस्करी और निर्माण को संचालित कर रहा था। एजेंसी ने अदालत में पुख्ता सबूतों के तौर पर रेलवे टिकट, कॉल डिटेल रिकॉर्ड (CDR), व्हाट्सएप और टेलीग्राम चैट पेश किए, जिनसे यह साबित होता है कि आरोपी विदेशी नंबरों के जरिए निरंतर संपर्क में थे।

अदालत का कड़ा रुख: 'यह सामान्य मामला नहीं'

बचाव पक्ष के वकीलों ने तर्क दिया था कि अंजलि के पास से कोई प्रत्यक्ष नशीला पदार्थ बरामद नहीं हुआ है और उसे केवल अन्य आरोपियों के बयानों के आधार पर फंसाया गया है। हालांकि, हाई कोर्ट ने इन तर्कों को सिरे से खारिज कर दिया। अदालत ने कहा कि उपलब्ध इलेक्ट्रॉनिक साक्ष्य, वित्तीय लेनदेन के दस्तावेज और डिजिटल चैट प्रथम दृष्टया आरोपी का अंतरराष्ट्रीय ड्रग नेटवर्क से सीधा संबंध स्थापित करते हैं। कोर्ट ने टिप्पणी की कि यह केवल किसी व्यक्ति से मामूली मात्रा में ड्रग्स मिलने का मामला नहीं है, बल्कि एक सुनियोजित संगठित अपराध है, जिसमें फाइनेंसर, निर्माता और वितरक अपनी-अपनी भूमिका निभा रहे थे।

धर्मशाला। विशेष न्यायाधीश-सह-प्रधान न्यायाधीश (परिवार न्यायालय) धर्मशाला डॉ. अरविंद मल्होत्रा की अदालत ने एनडीपीएस अधिनियम के एक मामले में आरोपी महिला कल्पना देवी को दोषी करार दिया है। कोर्ट ने छत्री निवासी दोषी महिला को एक वर्ष के कठोर कारावास और 10 हजार रुपये जुर्माने की सजा सुनाई है। जुर्माना न चुकाने पर उसे एक माह का अतिरिक्त साधारण कारावास भुगतना होगा।

मामला 6 मई 2021 को पुलिस थाना इंदौरा के तहत मिलवां का है। यहां राष्ट्रीय राजमार्ग पर गश्त के दौरान पुलिस को देखकर एक महिला ने घबराकर अपने कपड़ों में छिपाया हुआ पॉलीथीन पैकेट सड़क किनारे फेंक दिया था। पुलिस ने महिला को पकड़कर जब पैकेट की जांच की, तो उससे 6.73 ग्राम हेरोइन (चिट्टा) बरामद हुई। अदालत ने साक्ष्यों और गवाहों के आधार पर महिला को एनडीपीएस अधिनियम की धारा 21 के तहत दोषी ठहराया।

अदालत ने आदेश में स्पष्ट किया कि महिला 6 मई 2021 से 3 मार्च 2023 तक कुल 667 दिन न्यायिक हिरासत में रह चुकी है। चूंकि यह अवधि कोर्ट द्वारा सुनाई गई एक वर्ष की सजा से अधिक है, इसलिए धारा 468 बीएनएसएस के तहत इस अवधि का समायोजन (सेट-ऑफ) कर दिया गया है। ऐसे में दोषी महिला को इस मामले में अब आगे हिरासत में रखने की आवश्यकता नहीं है।

उज्जैन। राघवी पुलिस ने सोमवार रात गरोठ 8-लेन छज्जूखेड़ी के पास से दो तस्कर को एमडी (मेफेड्रोन) ड्रग्स के साथ रंगेहाथों दबोचा। उनके पास से करीब 19 ग्राम एमडी ड्रग्स बरामद की गई है। राघवी पुलिस के मुताबिक टीम ने छज्जूखेड़ी से ईश्वर (22) पिता तूफानसिंह, निवासी टीपूखेड़ा (झारड़ा) को पकड़ा।

ईश्वर ने बताया वह यह खेप मुंबई के मलाड निवासी विनोद पिता रामकृष्ण सिरभाते को बेचने आया था। पुलिस ने घौंसला वाइन शॉप के सामने से विनोद को भी पकड़ लिया। पूछताछ में पता चला कि ईश्वर खुद ड्रग्स नहीं बनाता था बल्कि वह डग बड़ौद स्थित घाटाखेड़ी के मेहरबान नामक तस्कर से लाता था। ईश्वर ने नशेडिगों का बड़ा नेटवर्क बना रखा है। पुलिस अब मुख्य सप्लायर मेहरबान को दबोचने की तैयारी कर रही है।

ऑपरेशन त्रिनेत्र के तहत पुलिस ने पीपलखूंट-माही पुलिया रोड पर नाकाबंदी कर एम्बुलेंस से करीब 46 किलो अवैध मादक पदार्थ जब्त किया।

प्रतापगढ़ जिले में मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के विरुद्ध चलाए जा रहे 'ऑपरेशन त्रिनेत्र' के अंतर्गत पुलिस थाना पीपलखूंट और जिला स्पेशल टीम (डीएसटी) ने एक बड़ी कार्रवाई को अंजाम दिया है। पुलिस ने एम्बुलेंस के रूप में उपयोग की जा रही एक बोलेरो गाड़ी से 46 किलो 390 ग्राम अवैध अफीम डोडाचूरा बरामद किया है। इस तस्करी के आरोप में दो व्यक्तियों को गिरफ्तार किया गया है, जबकि परिवहन में प्रयुक्त एम्बुलेंस को भी जब्त कर लिया गया है। जब्त किए गए अवैध मादक पदार्थ की अनुमानित बाजार कीमत करीब 7 लाख रुपये आंकी गई है।

वाहन की गहन तलाशी लेने पर उसमें चार कट्टों में छिपाकर रखा गया 46 किलो 390 ग्राम अधकुचला अवैध अफीम डोडाचूरा बरामद हुआ। पुलिस ने मौके से मादक पदार्थ और एम्बुलेंस दोनों को जब्त कर लिया। इस मामले में चालक मुबारिक शाह (32), निवासी तलाई मोहल्ला, प्रतापगढ़ तथा उसके साथी मोहम्मद सलीम (42), निवासी आबकारी रोड, प्रतापगढ़ को गिरफ्तार किया गया है। गिरफ्तार आरोपियों के विरुद्ध पीपलखूंट थाने में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के अंतर्गत प्रकरण दर्ज कर अग्रिम अनुसंधान प्रारंभ कर दिया गया है। इस संपूर्ण कार्रवाई में पीपलखूंट थाना पुलिस, डीएसटी, साइबर सेल तथा क्यूआरटी टीम के अधिकारियों और जवानों ने महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई है, जिससे जिले में मादक पदार्थों के तस्करों के मंसूबों पर प्रभावी प्रहार हुआ है।

छोटीसादड़ी। जिला पुलिस अधीक्षक बी. आदित्य के निर्देशन में चलाए जा रहे 'ऑपरेशन त्रिनेत्र' के तहत स्थानीय थाना पुलिस ने मादक पदार्थ तस्करी के मामले में विगत तीन वर्षों से फरार चल रहे एक आरोपी को गिरफ्तार करने में बड़ी सफलता हासिल की है। अतिरिक्त पुलिस अधीक्षक गजेन्द्र सिंह जोधा एवं वृत्ताधिकारी रामेश्वर लाल के मार्गदर्शन में गठित पुलिस टीम ने तकनीकी साक्ष्यों के आधार पर इस वांछित अपराधी तक पहुँचकर उसे सलाखों के पीछे पहुँचाया है।

घटनाक्रम के अनुसार, 3 अगस्त 2023 को तत्कालीन थाना प्रभारी गोपाल सिंह को मुखबिर द्वारा सूचना प्राप्त हुई थी कि एक स्विफ्ट कार में दो व्यक्ति अवैध मादक पदार्थ अफीम की भारी खेप लेकर छोटीसादड़ी की ओर आ रहे हैं। इस सूचना पर पुलिस टीम ने गोमाना पुलिया के निकट नाकाबंदी की। कार्रवाई के दौरान पुलिस ने वाहन से बंटुलाल पिता उदयलाल लबाना, निवासी मानपुरा, थाना धमोतर और घनश्याम पिता गोवर्धन लाल सुथार, निवासी बगवास, थाना प्रतापगढ़ को पकड़ा। तलाशी लेने पर उनके कब्जे से 02 किलो 700 ग्राम अफीम बरामद हुई थी, जिसके बाद थाना छोटीसादड़ी में प्रकरण दर्ज कर दोनों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया था।

अनुसंधान के दौरान तकनीकी साक्ष्यों के आधार पर इस तस्करी में अनिल पिता रतन लाल लबाना, उम्र 29 वर्ष, निवासी टाण्डा, थाना धमोतर, जिला प्रतापगढ़ की संलिप्तता उजागर हुई थी। घटना के बाद से ही अनिल लगातार फरार चल रहा था और पुलिस उसकी सरगर्मी से तलाश कर रही थी। सीआई प्रवीण टांक ने बताया कि मंगलवार को पुलिस ने लंबी जद्दोजहद के बाद आरोपी अनिल को गिरफ्तार कर लिया है। पुलिस अब आरोपी से जब्तशुदा अफीम के स्रोत और इस तस्करी नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य पहलुओं के संबंध में गहन पूछताछ एवं अनुसंधान कर रही है। इस गिरफ्तारी से क्षेत्र में मादक पदार्थों के अवैध कारोबार में लिप्त अपराधियों के हौसले पस्त हुए हैं।

छापेमारी की जानकारी


सोमवार को औषधि प्रशासन विभाग एवं थाना रुपईडीहा पुलिस की संयुक्त टीम ने अवैध रूप से संचालित मेडिकल स्टोरों पर छापेमारी की है। अभियान चलाकर थाना क्षेत्र रुपईडीहा में सघन चेकिंग की जा रहा थी। इसी दौरान आदर्श आयुर्वेदिक औषधि पसल (स्टोर), स्टेशन रोड कस्बा रुपईडीहा के संचालक आदित्य कुमार मिश्रा से बिना वैध लाइसेंस के आठ बोतलों में प्रतिबन्धित नशीली कफ सिरप बरामद हुआ। पुलिस के मुताबिक कुल आठ प्रकार की अवैध नशीली, नियंत्रित दवाइया एवं कफ सिरप बरामद किया गया है। अभियुक्त को गिरफ्तार कर न्यायालय रवाना किया गया ।

कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप 2349 शीशी, ट्रामाडोल 12,145 कैप्सूल, निट्राजेट पीएम-10 - लूज टैबलेट, निट्राजोहम 10 एसएम 698 टैबलेट निटकोर 10, 257 टैबलेट, एल्फ्राजोल 509 टैबलेट, चोको डीएक्स कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप 4 बोतल, एसपीएस वन 64 कैप्सूल शामिल है।

अभियुक्त का नाम आदित्य कुमार मिश्रा है।

जागरण संवाददाता, देहरादून। उत्तराखंड स्पेशल टास्क फोर्स (एसटीएफ) ने नशा तस्करों के खिलाफ अभियान के तहत हरिद्वार के कलियर क्षेत्र में बड़ी कार्रवाई करते हुए कॉस्मेटिक दुकान की आड़ में प्रतिबंधित नशीली दवाओं का कारोबार करने वाले आरोपी को गिरफ्तार किया है।

आरोपी के कब्जे से वाणिज्यिक मात्रा में करीब 3.9 किलोग्राम कोडीन सिरप और ट्रामाडोल कैप्सूल बरामद किए गए हैं। प्रारंभिक जांच में उसका संबंध एसटीएफ द्वारा पूर्व में बरामद किए गए 18 हजार ट्रामाडोल कैप्सूल के मामले से भी सामने आया है।

कई संदिग्ध स्थानों और गोदामों पर छापेमारी

एसटीएफ के अनुसार मुख्यमंत्री के "ड्रग्स फ्री देवभूमि" अभियान के तहत वरिष्ठ पुलिस अधीक्षक एसटीएफ अजय सिंह के निर्देशन में एंटी नारकोटिक्स टास्क फोर्स (एएनटीएफ) लगातार कार्रवाई कर रही है। इसी क्रम में कलियर क्षेत्र में ड्रग इंस्पेक्टर के साथ कई संदिग्ध स्थानों और गोदामों पर छापेमारी की गई।

छापेमारी के दौरान एहतिसाम कॉस्मेटिक जनरल स्टोर से संचालक अहतशाम उल हक पुत्र शहीद, निवासी बुड्ढा हैदी, थाना पथरी, हरिद्वार को गिरफ्तार किया गया। तलाशी में उसके कब्जे से वाणिज्यिक मात्रा में कोडीन सिरप और ट्रामाडोल कैप्सूल बरामद हुए। इसके बाद टीम ने आरोपी के अन्य संभावित ठिकानों पर भी दबिश दी, जहां से भी प्रतिबंधित दवाएं मिलीं।

पूछताछ में सामने आया कि आरोपी इन दवाओं को मूल कीमत से कई गुना अधिक दाम पर बेचकर अवैध मुनाफा कमा रहा था। एसटीएफ अब इस नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य लोगों और सप्लाय चैन की भी जांच कर रही है।

पुलिस के अनुसार आरोपी पूर्व में भी एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत नशीली दवाओं की तस्करी के मामलों में जेल जा चुका है। उसके खिलाफ वर्ष 2019 में दो मुकदमे दर्ज हैं।

वरिष्ठ पुलिस अधीक्षक एसटीएफ अजय सिंह ने लोगों से अपील की है कि नशे से दूर रहें और नशा तस्करी की सूचना तत्काल पुलिस या एसटीएफ-एएनटीएफ को दें। उन्होंने कहा कि उत्तराखंड को नशा मुक्त बनाने के लिए अभियान लगातार जारी रहेगा।

Drugs News इंदिरा गांधी अंतर्राष्ट्रीय आईजीआई एयरपोर्ट पर कस्टम्स की एयर इंटेलिजेंस यूनिट (एआईयू) ने बड़ी सफलता हासिल करते हुए 15.38 किलो हाइड्रोपोनिक गांजा/वीड तस्करी का प्रयास नाकाम कर दिया। कुआलालंपुर से आए 2 यात्रियों के सामान में लगे नए गीजरों के अंदर अत्याधुनिक तरीके से छिपाकर लाया जा रहा मादक पदार्थ बरामद हुआ। कस्टम्स अधिकारियों के अनुसार 7 जून 2026 को फ्लाइट नंबर D7-182 से कुआलालंपुर से पहुंचे दो यात्रियों को प्रोफाइलिंग और पुख्ता इंटेलिजेंस के आधार पर ग्रीन चैनल पार करने के बाद रोका गया।

जांच के दौरान अधिकारियों ने देखा कि यात्रियों के चेक-इन बैग के अलावा 2 नए गीजर भी थे। सघन पूछताछ और मोबाइल कम्युनिकेशन की जांच में संदेह गहरा होने पर गीजरों को एक्स-रे मशीन से स्कैन किया गया। एक्स-रे में गीजर के अंदरूनी हिस्से में छिपे सामान का शक हुआ। इसके बाद जब गीजर खोले गए तो अंदर एक अत्यधिक परिष्कृत छिपाने की व्यवस्था (हाईली सोफिस्टिकेटेड हाइड्रिंग मैकेनिज्म) सामने आया। अधिकारियों ने गीजर के अंदर से 145 वैक्यूम सील पैकेट बरामद किए। जांच में गांजा (हरा पत्तेदार पदार्थ हाइड्रोपोनिक वीड) पाया गया। कस्टम्स की टीम ने मादक पदार्थ जब्त कर दोनों यात्रियों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया है। दोनों से पूछताछ की जा रही है।

5.38 करोड़ की कीमत, एनडीपीएस एक्ट में केस

Drugs News बरामद मादक पदार्थ का कुल वजन 15.38 किलोग्राम है। कस्टम की टीम ने अंतर्राष्ट्रीय बाजार में इसकी अवैध कीमत लगभग 5.38 करोड़ रुपये आंकी है। कस्टम्स अधिकारियों ने बताया कि यात्रियों की गतिविधियों, प्रोफाइलिंग और खुफिया जानकारी के आधार पर की गई सतर्क निगरानी से यह बड़ी तस्करी पकड़ी गई। आईजीआई एयरपोर्ट पर एयर इंटेलिजेंस यूनिट लगातार ऐसी कोशिशों पर नजर रखे हुए है।

युद्ध नशे के विरुद्ध

मानस-2025 रिपोर्ट : हरियाणा से नशा तस्करी से जुड़ी 468 शिकायतें और सूचनाएं दर्ज, 715 लोगों को काउंसलिंग एवं पुनर्वास सहायता मिली

- नशा तस्करी की शिकायतें व सूचनाएं साझा करने में हरियाणा छठे स्थान पर

चण्डीगढ़। केंद्र सरकार के मानस-2025 पोर्टल की रिपोर्ट में नशे के खिलाफ मुहिम रंग लाती दिख रही है। रिपोर्ट के अनुसार नशा तस्करी से जुड़ी शिकायतें और गोपनीय सूचनाएं साझा करने के मामले में हरियाणा देश में छठे स्थान पर है। राज्य से 468 शिकायतें और सूचनाएं दर्ज की गई हैं जो दर्शाती हैं कि नशा तस्करी के खिलाफ लोगों की भागीदारी और सरकारी एजेंसियों की सक्रियता बढ़ी है। एनसीबी रिपोर्ट-2025 में यह तथ्य उजागर हुए हैं।

रिपोर्ट के मुताबिक इस श्रेणी में बिहार (1376 शिकायतें) पहले, उत्तर प्रदेश (1094) दूसरे, राजस्थान (621) तीसरे, दिल्ली (590) चौथे और महाराष्ट्र 517 शिकायतों के साथ पांचवें स्थान पर है। हरियाणा ने पंजाब, पश्चिम बंगाल, कर्नाटक और झारखंड को पीछे छोड़ दिया है। पड़ोसी राज्यों की तुलना करें तो राजस्थान के बाद हरियाणा दूसरे स्थान पर रहा, जबकि पंजाब उससे पीछे रहा है।

वहीं काउंसलिंग एवं रिहैबिलिटेशन के मामले में हरियाणा का प्रदर्शन और बेहतर रहा। 715 मामलों के साथ राज्य देश में तीसरे स्थान पर पहुंच गया। इस सूची में उत्तर प्रदेश (1115 मामलों के साथ पहले व दिल्ली (823) दूसरे स्थान पर हैं। हरियाणा ने बिहार, महाराष्ट्र, राजस्थान, पंजाब, झारखंड, पश्चिम बंगाल और कर्नाटक को पीछे छोड़ दिया है। इससे स्पष्ट है कि राज्य नशे के शिकार लोगों को इलाज, काउंसलिंग और पुनर्वास सेवाएं उपलब्ध कराने में भी बेहतर काम कर रहा है।

पिछले दो वर्षों में हरियाणा सरकार और पुलिस ने नशा मुक्त हरियाणा अभियान को तेज किया है। हरियाणा स्टेट नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो (एचएसएनसीबी) ने विशेष अभियान चलाकर नशा तस्करो के खिलाफ कार्रवाई बढ़ाई। नशा तस्करो की अवैध संपत्तियां जब्त की गईं। सीमावर्ती जिलों में विशेष नाकाबंदी की गई, स्कूलों और कॉलेजों में जागरूकता अभियान चलाए गए तथा मानस हेल्पलाइन के माध्यम से लोगों को गोपनीय तरीके से शिकायत और सूचना देने के लिए प्रोत्साहित किया गया। इसके साथ ही डी-एडिक्शन सेंटरों और पुनर्वास सेवाओं का भी विस्तार किया गया।

चुनौतियां बरकरार चुनौती अभी भी बनी हुई है। पंजाब और राजस्थान से लगती सीमाओं के जरिए तस्करी की कोशिशें, युवाओं में सिंथेटिक नशे का बढ़ता खतरा और नशा छोड़ चुके लोगों के दीर्घकालिक पुनर्वास की जरूरत सरकार के सामने बड़ी चुनौतियां हैं। विशेषज्ञों का मानना है कि जनभागीदारी, सख्त कार्रवाई और प्रभावी पुनर्वास व्यवस्था से ही नशे के खिलाफ इस लड़ाई को और मजबूत बनाया जा सकता है।

295 Kg Ganja Seized Inside Secret Chamber of Truck in Boudhagada

Excise Department achieved a major breakthrough by seizing 295 kilograms of ganja from a secret chamber inside an 18-wheeler truck during a raid at the Shulia area early Tuesday morning.

Officials intercepted the truck around 5 AM and discovered the contraband hidden in a specially designed chamber. The driver fled the scene, and authorities launched a manhunt to track him down. The seized ganja was measured and weighed in the presence of Executive Magistrate and Additional Tahsildar Dhananjay Karna.

The excise team, led by Kantamal Range Inspector Dillip Kumar Satapathy, carried out the operation with active participation from OIC Rahul Behera, IC Prasanna Jali, EC Sujit Sahu, Niranjana Mallik, Bijay Kumar Bagh, and Rajkishore Kanhar. Police and excise officials confirmed that a case numbered 57/2026–27 has been registered, and further investigation is underway.

Authorities stated that all aspects of the case are being probed, and legal steps are in progress to arrest the absconding driver.

जागरण संवाददाता, पूर्णिया। बिहार के पूर्णिया में पुलिस और एसटीएफ की संयुक्त टीम ने नशे के सौदागरों के खिलाफ अब तक की सबसे बड़ी कार्रवाई की है। टीम ने गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर छापेमारी करते हुए करीब दो किलोग्राम कीमती हेरोइन बरामद करने में सफलता हासिल की है। इस हाई-प्रोफाइल मामले में तीन अलग-अलग वाहनों पर सवार छह शातिर नशा तस्करों को रंगे हाथ दबोचा गया है।


बंगाल से आ रही थी नशे की खेप

शुरुआती जांच में यह बात सामने आई है कि हेरोइन की यह बड़ी खेप पश्चिम बंगाल से तस्करी कर पूर्णिया लाई जा रही थी। पुलिस को पहले ही इनपुट मिल चुका था कि तस्कर किसी बड़ी डील को अंजाम देने के लिए जिले की सीमा में दाखिल हो रहे हैं। इसके बाद एसटीएफ और स्थानीय पुलिस ने जाल बिछाकर घेराबंदी की और तस्करों को वाहनों समेत धर दबोचा।

बरामद ड्रग्स की कीमत 6 करोड़ रुपये

गिरफ्तारी के बाद पुलिस सभी आरोपियों को मुफ्फसिल थाना लेकर आई है, जहां उनसे गहन पूछताछ का सिलसिला जारी है। पुलिस अधिकारियों के मुताबिक, अंतरराष्ट्रीय बाजार में इस जब्त की गई हेरोइन की अनुमानित कीमत लगभग छह करोड़ रुपये आंकी गई है। पुलिस अब इस पूरे नेटवर्क के मुख्य सरगना और स्थानीय संपर्कों का पता लगाने में जुटी हुई है।

लकड़ी डेपो में पुलिस-एसएसबी का छापा, 543 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ पिता-पुत्र गिरफ्तार कर लिया है। पुलिस ने कहा कि

ठाकुरगंज। निज संवाददाता भारत-नेपाल सीमा से सटे गलगलिया थाना क्षेत्र के लकड़ी डीपो गांव में मंगलवार की सुबह पुलिस और सशस्त्र सीमा बल (एसएसबी) ने संयुक्त अभियान चलाकर मादक पदार्थ तस्करी के एक कथित नेटवर्क का पर्दाफाश किया। कार्रवाई के दौरान 543 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ पिता-पुत्र को गिरफ्तार किया गया। मौके से 1 लाख 90 हजार 930 रुपये नकद, 640 नेपाली रुपये तथा दो मोबाइल फोन भी बरामद किए गए हैं।

गिरफ्तारी का विवरण

प्राप्त जानकारी के अनुसार, एसडीपीओ-2 मनोज कुमार सिंह के नेतृत्व में गलगलिया थाना पुलिस एवं एसएसबी की 41वीं वाहिनी के भातगांव बीओपी के जवानों ने गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर लकड़ी डीपो गांव में छापेमारी की। तलाशी के दौरान मो. फारूक (46) और उसके पुत्र उमर (22) के कब्जे से भारी मात्रा में ब्राउन शुगर बरामद हुई। दोनों को मौके से गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया।

तस्करी संबंधी जांच

पुलिस के अनुसार, बरामद नेपाली मुद्रा से सीमा पार तस्करी नेटवर्क से संभावित संबंधों की आशंका जताई जा रही है। इस बिंदु पर भी गंभीरता से जांच की जा रही है कि मादक पदार्थ की आपूर्ति कहां से हो रही थी और इसकी खेप किन-किन क्षेत्रों तक पहुंचाई जाती थी।

संगठित मादक पदार्थों का कारोबार

एसडीपीओ-2 मनोज कुमार सिंह ने बताया कि यह कार्रवाई पूरी तरह गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर की गई। बरामद ब्राउन शुगर और नकदी से प्रथम दृष्टया संगठित स्तर पर मादक पदार्थों के कारोबार की संभावना प्रतीत होती है। जप्त किए गए दोनों मोबाइल फोन की तकनीकी जांच कराई जाएगी। कॉल डिटेल्, चैट और अन्य डिजिटल साक्ष्यों के माध्यम से गिरोह से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की पहचान की जाएगी।

पुलिस की आगे की योजना

उन्होंने बताया कि प्रारंभिक जांच में मामला किसी बड़े नेटवर्क से जुड़ा नजर आ रहा है। पुलिस पूरे गिरोह की गतिविधियों और इसके सीमा पार संपर्कों की पड़ताल में जुटी है। जांच में कई अहम खुलासे होने की संभावना है।


गलगलिया थाना में दोनों आरोपितों के विरुद्ध एनडीपीएस एक्ट की संबंधित धाराओं के तहत प्राथमिकी दर्ज कर ली गई है। आवश्यक कानूनी प्रक्रिया पूरी करने के बाद दोनों को न्यायिक हिरासत में भेजने की तैयारी की जा रही है। अभियान में गलगलिया थानाध्यक्ष राकेश कुमार सहित पुलिस बल एवं एसएसबी के जवान शामिल थे।

क्या कहते हैं एसडीपीओ-2

इस संबंध में एसडीपीओ 2 मनोज कुमार सिंह ने बताया कि ब्राउन शुगर के कारोबार में गुप्त सूचना यह भी मिली है कि उसके परिवार के और महिला सदस्यों की भी इसमें संलिप्त है। पुलिस इस पर कड़ी नजर रखे हुए हैं। सुराग मिलने पर कड़ी कार्रवाई की जाएगी।

543 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर बरामद किया गया।

किशनगंज, 30 जून (हि.स.)। जिले में अपराध एवं अवैध गतिविधियों पर अंकुश लगाने के उद्देश्य से पुलिस अधीक्षक संतोष कुमार के निर्देश पर किशनगंज पुलिस द्वारा चलाए जा रहे विशेष अभियान के तहत बीते एक सप्ताह में बड़ी कार्रवाई की गई।

22 जून से 28 जून 2026 तक चलाए गए अभियान के दौरान वांछित अपराधियों की गिरफ्तारी, अवैध बालू खनन, शराब तस्करी, मादक पदार्थों की बरामदगी, पशु तस्करी, गृहभेदन और वाहन चोरी के मामलों में लगातार छापेमारी की गई।

साथ ही यातायात नियमों का उल्लंघन करने वालों के खिलाफ भी सख्त कार्रवाई की गई। मंगलवार को पुलिस की ओर से जारी साप्ताहिक रिपोर्ट के अनुसार, इस अवधि में कुल 59 आरोपितों को गिरफ्तार किया गया।

वाहन जांच अभियान के दौरान यातायात नियमों का उल्लंघन करने वाले चालकों से 5 लाख 7 हजार रुपये शमन शुल्क के रूप में वसूले गए। विशेष अभियान के दौरान गृहभेदन (चोरी) के 5 आरोपितों तथा अंतरराज्यीय उड़ीसा गैंग के 2 सदस्यों को गिरफ्तार किया गया। मादक पदार्थों के खिलाफ कार्रवाई में 3.857 किलोग्राम स्मैक, ब्राउन शुगर एवं हेरोइन बरामद की गई, जिसकी अंतरराष्ट्रीय बाजार में अनुमानित कीमत करीब 7 करोड़ 70 लाख रुपये बताई गई है।

इसके अलावा 13.460 किलोग्राम गांजा भी जब्त किया गया, जिसकी कीमत लगभग 7 लाख रुपये आंकी गई है। अवैध शराब के विरुद्ध अभियान में पुलिस ने 1,933.38 लीटर विदेशी शराब तथा 15 लीटर देशी शराब बरामद की। कार्रवाई के दौरान अपराध में प्रयुक्त 2 कार, 1 पिकअप वाहन, 3 टेंपो, अवैध बालू लदे 3 ट्रैक्टर तथा 4 मोटरसाइकिल जब्त किए गए। इसके अलावा 8 मोबाइल फोन और 40,910 रुपये नकद भी बरामद किए गए।
