Emerging Modus Operandi


- Concealment in commercial transport: Ganja hidden beneath truck container floors and inside truck cabins.
- Vehicle identity manipulation: Drug courier used tampered registration plates while transporting ganja from the AOB region to Maharashtra.
- Rail parcel concealment: Codeine cough syrup concealed inside iron drums transported as general goods via railway parcel service.
- Air route smuggling: Hydroponic marijuana concealed inside food packets in checked baggage of an international passenger arriving from Bangkok.
- Urban synthetic drug distribution: Delhi module used local couriers (including an auto-rickshaw) while operating under the direction of a foreign-based kingpin.

Key Trends

- Northeast India continues to dominate major seizures involving heroin, Yaba and pharmaceutical narcotics, with sustained enforcement focus on the Myanmar corridor.
- Interstate ganja trafficking from the Andhra-Odisha Border towards western and central India remains prominent.
- Agencies are increasingly targeting drug proceeds and trafficking infrastructure through property attachment and financial disruption measures.
- Interstate trafficking continues through road, rail and air routes using concealed consignments and tampered vehicles.

Imphal, Jul 1 (PTI) Manipur Chief Minister Y Khemchand Singh on Wednesday said his government remains firmly committed to eliminating the drug menace.

Singh's remarks came after he held a meeting with top officials of the Narcotics Control Bureau at the state secretariat here.

In a post on X, Singh said, "Called on by R. Sudhakar, IPS, Deputy Director General (NER), NCB, and P K Mishra, Additional Director, NCB, at the Secretariat." He also said, "The government remains firmly committed to eliminating the drug menace through coordinated and sustained efforts." During the meeting, they focused on "strengthening intelligence gathering, enhancing coordination with the state and international agencies, and ensuring effective enforcement of the NDPS Act, 1985, to combat drug trafficking", Singh said. State-wise data leaves unanswered questions over Nagaland's synthetic drug data

Nagaland has been identified among India's frontline states in an evolving narcotics landscape, with the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) highlighting that the country's North-East frontier is witnessing increasing trafficking pressure from the Golden Triangle amid a major shift in regional drug production, trafficking routes and political developments.

In its Annual Report 2025, the NCB designated Nagaland, Manipur and Mizoram, as states "bearing the sharpest frontline exposure" to narcotics trafficking originating from Myanmar.

Alongside the Western corridor along the Indo-Pak border, the Eastern gateway along the Indo-Myanmar border, including Arunachal Pradesh, has been designated a "High Risk Frontier Zone" and marked as an "immediate priority" due to its role as a key entry point for methamphetamine and heroin.

The porous borders and the erstwhile Free Movement Regime (FMR) have transformed these states from "peripheral transit zones" into "active staging grounds" for distribution into the Indian hinterland, it noted.

The report further stated that Myanmar has emerged as the world's leading source of illicit opium following Afghanistan's 2022 poppy cultivation ban, with illicit cultivation rising by about 56 per cent from 30,200 hectares in 2021 to 47,100 hectares in 2023. Shan State accounts for 88 per cent of the country's cultivation.

This expansion was attributed to Myanmar's prolonged political instability and economic collapse.

The NCB further noted that the trafficking corridor from Myanmar passes directly through India's NE states, posing not only a narcotics challenge but broader security concerns, including financing of armed activities and smuggling.

The increasing drug availability, the affordability of synthetic drugs and limited treatment infrastructure, it maintained, are creating conditions for drugs intended for transit to spill over into local consumption markets.

The report also identified synthetic drugs as the fastest-growing challenge noting a 140 per cent increase in Amphetamine-Type Stimulant (ATS) seizures in India between 2020 and 2025, describing it as the clearest indicator of the rapidly escalating threat from the eastern corridor.

Injectable and tablets lead Nagaland's seizure profile Despite frontline exposure tag, the state-wise annexure of seizure by DLEAS reflected a mixed picture for Nagaland.





One notable feature is the volume of pharmaceutical and other preparations with Nagaland accounting for 5.4 per cent of the 2,22,762 injectable preparations seized nationwide in 2025.

Further, a total of 3,336 CBCS (Codeine-Based Cough Syrups) bottles and 88,878 tablets (all types, number) were recovered.

Among conventional narcotics, the reported noted seizures of 577 kg of ganja, 22.01 kg of heroin and 16 kg of opium.

No seizures are recorded under the ATS (representing board categories of synthetic stimulants), hashish, hashish oil, cocaine, codeine, ketamine, morphine, mephedrone, mescaline or methaqualone categories as well as poppy husk or poppy straw.

Drug Law Enforcement Agencies (DLEAs) registered 158 NDPS cases in Nagaland during 2025, resulting in 255 arrests.

	HEROIN A highly addictive opioid derived from morphine, processed from poppy plants, typically injected, snorted, or smoked. Causes intense euphoria, respiratory depression, sedation, nausea, collapsed veins, organ failure, and severe physical dependence, with overdose frequently resulting in death.
	COCAINE A powerful stimulant alkaloid extracted from <i>Erythroxylum coca</i> leaves, typically snorted, injected, or smoked. Causes intense euphoria, elevated heart rate, hypertension, constricted blood vessels, paranoia, stroke risk, cardiac arrest, severe psychological dependence, and nasal tissue destruction with chronic use.
	ATS (Amphetamine-Type Stimulants) A broad category of synthetic stimulants including amphetamine, methamphetamine, and MDMA, typically ingested, smoked, or injected. Causes intense euphoria, hyperactivity, insomnia, aggression, hyperthermia, cardiovascular damage, severe neurotoxicity, psychosis, and strong physical and psychological dependence with prolonged abuse.
	MEPHEDRONE A synthetic cathinone stimulant classified as a designer drug, commonly snorted or ingested. Causes euphoria, increased energy, elevated heart rate, hyperthermia, hallucinations, paranoia, serotonin syndrome, severe cardiovascular stress, and strong psychological dependence with repeated use.

Regional comparison Among the NE states, the State recorded fewer cases than Assam (3,361), Mizoram (762) and Tripura (539), Arunachal Pradesh (291), and Manipur (214), but more than Meghalaya (102) and Sikkim (84).

While Nagaland recorded no ATS seizures, neighbouring Mizoram reported 1,477 kg, Manipur 535 kg, Assam 152 kg, Tripura 129 kg and Meghalaya 25 kg.

Similarly, Nagaland's 22.01 kg heroin seizure was considerably lower than Manipur (129.11 kg), Mizoram (117.23 kg) and Assam (117.04 kg).

On the other hand, Nagaland reported one of the region's highest figures for injectable preparations (12,098), far exceeding negligible numbers (0-1) in other NE States.

Recovery of 88,878 tablets is third in NE after Assam (29.57 lakh) and Tripura (24.19 lakh).

Questions over classification One aspect of the report warranting further clarification is the presentation of synthetic drug data.

Despite the ‘frontline exposure’ status to the expanding methamphetamine trade from the Golden Triangle, Nagaland recorded no ATS (in kgs) seizures from the State.

Moreover, while tablet and injectable seizures were substantial, no tablets by weight were recorded, and the report does not explain their composition or classification.

This makes direct comparison with other official datasets less straightforward.

For instance, the Annual Administrative Report 2025–26 (AAR) of the Home Department informed that synthetic drug seizures by Nagaland Police increased from approximately 80,496 units in 2024 to 104,470 units in 2025, reflecting a rise of around 30% while other agencies also report periodic seizures.

It is unclear whether such seizures are reflected in the state-wise annexure.

Incidentally, the NCB’s Annual Report 2024 recorded 0.69 kg of ATS seizures from Nagaland.

Nationally, the NCB reported highest-ever enforcement output during 2025 with 12,409 quintals of narcotic drugs seized across the country. Nationally, DLEAs registered 148,063 cases and made 183,675 arrests.

INDIA'S VULNERABILITY AREAS: AT A GLANCE

High-Risk Frontier Zones (Immediate Priority)

- **India-Pakistan border (3,323 km):** A persistent heroin trafficking corridor due to its proximity to Afghanistan. The report also flags increasing use of drones for smuggling narcotics, arms and counterfeit currency across Punjab.

- **India-Myanmar border (1,643 km):** Identified as a major gateway for methamphetamine and heroin from the Golden Triangle. Myanmar's illicit opium cultivation has expanded significantly, while methamphetamine (Yaba) flows through the India-Myanmar corridor continue to intensify.
- Porous terrain and the erstwhile Free Movement Regime (FMR) make Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh particularly vulnerable.

Medium-Risk Transit Corridors (Immediate Priority)

- **India-Nepal:** Open-border dynamics facilitate trafficking of cannabis, hashish and pharmaceutical drugs into northern and eastern India.
- **India-Bangladesh:** A significant route for codeine-based cough syrups (Phensedyl) and ecstasy tablets, with eastern states serving as key transit and distribution nodes.
- Illicit cultivation patterns are evolving, with poppy and cannabis cultivation gradually shifting towards northeastern border areas and certain coastal regions, signalling a decentralisation of domestic supply sources.

Urban Distribution Hubs• Delhi NCR, Mumbai and Bengaluru remain the principal consumption centres, particularly for synthetic drugs and cocaine, reflecting rising urban demand.

Maritime Risk Areas• Trafficking networks are increasingly exploiting sea routes via Sri Lanka and the Maldives, with India's coastline from Gujarat to West Bengal serving as an important entry and exit corridor. In 2025, four maritime operations seized more than 390 kg of narcotics.

MAJOR DRUG TRAFFICKING ROUTES INTO INDIA

GOLDEN CRESCENT (Afghanistan–Pakistan–Iran)• The world's primary opiate trafficking corridor, sustained by an estimated 13,200 tonnes of pre-ban Afghan opium stockpiles.

- Land route: Heroin and other narcotics enter India through the Punjab and Rajasthan border with Pakistan.
- Maritime route: Trafficking also occurs along the Gujarat and Maharashtra coastlines, using fishing vessels and small coastal craft that often evade conventional maritime surveillance.
- The NCB notes that traditional heroin routes are increasingly being used to traffic Amphetamine-Type Stimulants (ATS) as well.

GOLDEN TRIANGLE (Myanmar–Thailand–Laos)• Now the world's leading methamphetamine hub and a major opium-producing region, centred on Myanmar's Shan State.

- **Primary land route:** Heroin and methamphetamine enter India through the Manipur corridor, traversed by National Highway-102.
- **Secondary land route:** Drugs also enter through Champhai (Mizoram) and move via Silchar to Guwahati, before being distributed across mainland India.

- The NCB identifies Manipur, Mizoram and Nagaland as states facing the "sharpest frontline exposure", citing porous borders and the erstwhile Free Movement Regime (FMR).
- Emerging maritime route: The Bay of Bengal and the Andaman Sea are becoming important trafficking corridors. The report cites the 6,000 kg methamphetamine seizure in the Andaman Sea in 2024, warning that traffickers are increasingly exploiting uninhabited islands and deep-sea routes.

Authorities Uncover Massive Cocaine Smuggling Operation in St. Petersburg Port

Saint Petersburg, July 1 (IANS) Russia's Federal Security Service (FSB) said Wednesday that it had seized about 500 kg of cocaine concealed inside frozen tuna imported from Ecuador at the port of St. Petersburg.

The cocaine was discovered in a cargo container carrying legally imported frozen whole tuna at a container terminal in the port, said the FSB.

It said the shipment route is part of a trafficking net used to smuggle large quantities of cocaine from Latin America into Russia for distribution, Xinhua news agency reported.

A Russian citizen suspected of organising international smuggling has been detained, according to the service.

While searching the suspect's residence, authorities also seized digital storage devices containing cryptocurrency wallets with electronic assets of about 613,000 US dollars, 13 luxury watches valued at more than 1.3 million dollars, and five luxury vehicles worth at least 1.65 million dollars.

Investigators have opened a criminal case over the attempted trafficking of narcotic drugs on an especially large scale.

Meanwhile, police officers in the Kizlyar District of Dagestan disrupted a trafficking route for illegally harvested aquatic biological resources, seizing more than 230 kg of sturgeon, Russia's leading Tass news agency reported citing the regional State Traffic Inspectorate.

"State Traffic Inspectorate officers stopped a Gazelle van driven by a 39-year-old resident of the Babayurt district for inspection. During an inspection of the luggage compartment, police discovered 233 kg of sturgeon," read a statement from the regional State Traffic Inspectorate, Tass reported.

It noted that, according to the results of the examination, among the seized fish was Russian sturgeon, listed in the Red Book of the Russian Federation. "A comprehensive investigation is currently underway into this incident, and all the circumstances of the incident are being established," the republic's State Traffic Inspectorate stated.

Kangpokpi administration launches a 10-point action plan to curb drug trafficking and eradicate illicit poppy cultivation.

Imphal: The [Kangpokpi](#) district administration has intensified its campaign against drug trafficking and illicit poppy cultivation by adopting a comprehensive 10-point action plan aimed at strengthening enforcement, prevention and rehabilitation efforts across the district.

The strategy was finalised during a coordination meeting chaired by Deputy Commissioner and NCORD Chairperson Mahesh Chaudhari, IAS, bringing officials from the district administration, [Manipur Police](#), Border Security Force (BSF), Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and other concerned departments.

The action plan focuses on coordinated efforts to curb narcotics-related activities through enhanced surveillance, community participation and inter-agency cooperation.

Under the plan, police and the Narcotics and Affairs of Border (NAB) will identify and map drug trafficking hotspots to facilitate targeted enforcement operations. Joint teams will also step up efforts to detect and destroy illegal poppy cultivation in vulnerable areas.

Recognising the role of local communities, the administration has decided to involve village authorities in preventive measures against drug abuse. Awareness campaigns will be conducted in schools, colleges and rural areas through Information, Education and Communication (IEC) programmes to educate people, particularly young individuals, about the dangers of substance abuse.


The district administration will also tighten monitoring of pharmaceutical outlets to prevent the misuse and illegal diversion of prescription medicines. At the same time, greater emphasis will be placed on strengthening treatment and rehabilitation facilities for individuals affected by drug addiction.

To address the socio-economic factors contributing to illicit cultivation, the administration plans to promote alternative livelihood opportunities by extending agricultural support to vulnerable communities.

The framework also calls for regular review meetings among all stakeholder agencies to assess progress and ensure effective implementation of anti-drug initiatives, while security forces will continue strict enforcement against drug-related offences.

Speaking during the meeting, Deputy Commissioner Mahesh Chaudhari commended the efforts of security agencies and stressed the need for sustained collaboration between law enforcement authorities and local communities to build a drug-free [Kangpokpi](#).

Guwahati, July 1: Assam's relentless crackdown on narcotics yielded another major success as police forces in the Barak Valley seized drugs valued at nearly ₹13 crore and arrested six individuals suspected of trafficking.

Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma announced the development on Wednesday, noting that joint teams from Sribhumi Police and Cachar Police recovered 49,800 Yaba tablets along with 535 grams of heroin during the operation. The contraband, concealed for transport, was intercepted before it could be distributed further.

Sarma emphasized that the state government remains unwavering in its mission to eradicate the drug menace, pledging that enforcement agencies will continue to pursue traffickers with full force. The arrests mark another significant step in Assam's ongoing campaign against narcotics, which has seen a series of high-value seizures in recent months.

In a major anti-narcotics operation, security agencies seized over two kilograms of suspected heroin and arrested two individuals in Manipur's Imphal East district on Tuesday, July 1.



In a major anti-narcotics operation, security agencies seized over two kilograms of suspected heroin and arrested two individuals in Manipur's Imphal East district on Tuesday, July 1.

According to police, the operation was conducted on July 1 following specific intelligence inputs by a joint team comprising the Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF), Imphal East; Youth Against Drugs and Alcohol Manipur (YADAM); M&N Sector Quick Action Team (QAT); Range Imphal QAT; and the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF). The operation was carried out in the area between Kongpal Chingangbam and Khurai Lamlong under Porompat Police Station.

The operation was led by Assistant Sub-Inspector M Rinash Meitei after obtaining due authorization from the competent authority. It was supervised by Additional Superintendent of Police (Law and Order), Imphal East, Ak Sadananda Singh, MPS, under the overall supervision of Superintendent of Police, Imphal East, Shivanand Surve, IPS.

During the operation, the joint team intercepted a Mahindra Bolero bearing registration number MN03P-5733 at Kongpal Chingangbam Road after its occupants allegedly attempted to evade police presence.

The two occupants were identified as Bigyan Baniya (21), a resident of Tuilangphai in Kangpokpi district, and Manoj Chettry (27), a resident of Kohima Sadar in Nagaland.

A detailed search of the vehicle led to the recovery of 168 soap cases containing suspected Heroin No. 4, weighing approximately 7.051 kilograms (gross weight including packaging).

The suspected narcotic substance, along with the vehicle, was seized and both individuals were arrested at the scene. They were subsequently handed over to Porompat Police Station for registration of a case and further legal proceedings.

Police stated that further investigation is underway to determine the source of the seized contraband and identify other persons linked to the alleged drug trafficking network.

Officials of the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) seized 55,626 bottles (100 ml each) of codeine-based E-SKuf and Fairdyl cough syrup, valued at approximately Rs 6.54 crore, from a railway parcel van at Agartala Railway Station. One person has been arrested in connection with the case.



In a major crackdown on the illegal trafficking of narcotic substances, officials of the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) seized 55,626 bottles (100 ml each) of codeine-based E-SKuf and Fairdyl cough syrup, valued at approximately Rs 6.54 crore, from a railway parcel van at Agartala Railway Station. One person has been arrested in connection with the case.

An intelligence source told India Today NE that the contraband was recovered from VPH No. NR 094527, which had been booked from Katihar to Agartala as general goods under PW Bill No. 198284 dated June 25, 2026. The parcel van arrived at Agartala Railway Station on June 30 and was later placed on Line No. 13 for unloading.

"Acting on specific intelligence received from the Senior Intelligence Officer of the DRI, Agartala Regional Unit, a joint examination of the consignment was carried out on July 1 in the presence of officials from the DRI, Railway Protection Force (RPF), SIB, RPSF, Assam Rifles and railway authorities," said an official.

During the unloading process, officials found the parcel van carrying general goods along with 89 iron drums. Upon inspection, 80 drums were found to contain white-coloured powder concealing 55,626 bottles of codeine-based E-SKuf and Fairdyl cough syrup, while the remaining nine drums contained only the white powder. The search, counting and seizure operation continued through the night and concluded at around 7 a.m. on July 2.

The DRI arrested Subrata Deb, 34, manager of B.K. Enterprise, Agartala, who had allegedly arrived at the railway station to receive the consignment. He is a resident of Bathakha village under Kalyanpur Police Station in Tripura's Khowai district.

Officials said the consignment had been booked from Katihar by a consignor identified in the parcel records in the name of Chandan Verman of Agartala.

The seized cough syrup is estimated to be worth Rs 6,54,43,989 in the illicit market. The DRI, Agartala Regional Unit, has registered a case, and further investigation is underway to trace the network involved in the trafficking of the contraband.

World No Drug Day observed in Mokokchung

World No Drug Day 2026 was observed in Mokokchung, with a Youth Awareness & Wellness Programme on the theme “Drug Abuse Prevention & Value-Based Living” at Hantry Hall, Assam Rifles ground Mokokchung on June 30.

The programme was organised by Rajyoga Education & Research Foundation (RERF), a sister organisation of Brahma Kumaris, in collaboration with the Medical Wing, Education Wing, Youth Wing and 12 Assam Rifles, Mokokchung. Civil societies including representatives from Watsü Mungdang, Ao Students’ Conference (AKM), students from various schools attended the rally.

Dr Swapan Gupta, Senior Neurologist and Narcotics Specialist, New Delhi speaking as the resource person highlighted the growing concern of drug abuse and its impact on individuals, families and society.

Dr Gupta pointed out that substance abuse remains a serious issue, particularly in Northeast India. Referring to data on substance use, he said that smoking, smokeless tobacco, alcohol and other substances are reported to be higher in the region.

He said that among the northeastern states, Manipur and Mizoram have reported higher levels of drug-related problems, while Nagaland stands in the middle range. He informed that drug addiction often begins during adolescence, especially between the ages of 15 to 19 years, which he described as a critical period when young people are more exposed to substance use.

Explaining the health consequences of drug abuse, Dr Gupta said addiction is not only a physical problem but also a mental, social and economic issue. He stated that substance abuse can affect the liver, blood system and increase the risk of diseases such as hepatitis B and C. It can also lead to lung damage, brain-related problems, depression, anxiety, psychosis and, in severe cases, suicide.

He added that drug abuse can lead individuals towards antisocial activities due to impaired judgement and reduced ability to think rationally. He said addiction also affects productivity as individuals may lose focus and struggle to contribute positively to society.

Explaining why people continue to use drugs despite knowing the harmful effects, Dr Gupta said substances affect the system of the brain. He explained that drugs release large amounts of dopamine, creating intense pleasure, which makes the brain develop a strong liking towards the substance.

He said repeated use causes changes in the brain, particularly affecting the prefrontal cortex, the part responsible for intelligence, memory, concentration, judgement and rational thinking. Over time, the brain’s ability to control impulses becomes weaker, leading to dependence and compulsive drug use.

Dr Gupta explained that addiction involves tolerance, where a person requires increasing amounts of a substance to experience the same pleasure, and dependence, where the person develops a strong compulsion to continue using it.

He stressed that addiction should not only be approached through suppression but through transformation. He said people often use substances to cope with stress, anxiety and emotional difficulties, and therefore emotional support and positive changes are important.

Using cigarette addiction as an example, he explained that repeated thoughts and actions create strong patterns in the brain. He said the principle of “neurons that fire together, wire together” explains how habits are formed. According to him, creating awareness, positive thinking and repeated practice of healthier habits can help form new patterns.

Dr Gupta highlighted three important steps in overcoming addiction, creating the right awareness, transforming thoughts through positive affirmations and meditation, and building a strong support system.

He said awareness among young people is important because many are influenced by misconceptions that smoking or drug use is fashionable or harmless. He stressed that the reality is that these substances are harmful and should not be normalised.

He also spoke about the role of meditation and positive habits in replacing harmful pleasures with healthier sources of happiness. He referred to Anandamide, a naturally occurring chemical in the brain, which is associated with feelings of happiness and wellbeing.

Dr Gupta further emphasised the importance of emotional support for individuals struggling with addiction. He said family members and society should focus not only on correcting behaviour but also understanding emotional needs and helping individuals strengthen their mental resilience.

Concluding his speech, Dr Gupta said addiction is a challenge of the mind and requires awareness, value-based learning and emotional support. He stressed that education alone is not enough unless it is supported by values such as honesty, sincerity, compassion and responsibility.

He stated that individuals should recognise themselves as human beings first before their professional roles and that strengthening values can help people make better choices in life.

Deputy Commissioner Mokokchung, Ajit Kumar Verma, while addressing the programme, appreciated the organisers, particularly the Brahma Kumaris, for initiating discussions on drug abuse and social well-being. He stated that such initiatives are timely and relevant, especially when the country is working towards development and social progress.

Verma highlighted that drug abuse remains a major challenge not only for Nagaland but across the world. Referring to the presentation by resource person Dr. Swapan Gupta, he said the session provided valuable insights into the psychological, neurological and social dimensions of addiction, which should be disseminated among students and the wider public.

He stressed that addiction cannot be viewed solely as an individual's fault, as multiple social and environmental factors contribute to substance abuse. Citing a key takeaway from the programme, he remarked that suppression is not a solution and that transformation can only be achieved through collective efforts involving families, educational institutions, community organisations and government agencies.

The DC emphasised the crucial role of parents and families in preventing drug abuse. He said parents must spend quality time with their children, understand their emotional and mental well-being, and provide guidance during their formative years. He added that personal growth, emotional stability and mental health should receive as much attention as academic performance.

Verma also underscored the responsibility of schools, colleges and the community in shaping the younger generation. He noted that educational institutions and social surroundings significantly influence the mental well-being and behaviour of young people.

Speaking on government interventions, he referred to preventive initiatives such as the *Nasha Mukta Bharat Abhiyan* and awareness campaigns being carried out by churches, civil society organisations and various departments. He said these efforts must be strengthened to reduce the demand for drugs, observing that while enforcement agencies can attempt to curb supply, eliminating demand requires collective commitment from society.

He informed that counselling and de-addiction services are available through government health facilities and that affected individuals can seek professional assistance. He also pointed out the need for a government-funded rehabilitation centre, stating that addiction should be treated as a social and health issue rather than solely as a law-and-order problem. According to him, sending addicts to jail without rehabilitation reflects a failure of society to address the root causes of addiction.

Verma further stated that value based living, clear life goals and strong moral foundations are essential in preventing young people from falling into addiction. He observed that a sense of purpose and commitment can help individuals resist harmful influences and make responsible choices.

Linking the issue to national development, he said the vision of a developed India depends on the productive participation of its youth. He cautioned that widespread substance abuse could adversely affect the country's demographic dividend and developmental aspirations.

The DC also highlighted the availability of counselling facilities for adolescents and youth in *Mokokchung*, encouraging students to seek guidance on health, emotional and personal issues whenever required.

Concluding his address, Verma appealed to all stakeholders, including parents, teachers, community leaders and government departments, to work together in addressing the drug menace and promoting a healthy and responsible society. He expressed hope that sustained collective efforts would bring positive and lasting change.

Rajyogini BK Sister Rupa, Director, Brahma Kumaris, Kohima, delivered the welcome address and introduced Brahma Kumaris and the Rajyoga Education & Research Foundation (RERF).


The programme also witnessed a special performance by Assam Rifles School children, followed by a special address from Ajit Kumar Verma, Deputy Commissioner, Mokokchung. Colonel Bhanoo Pathak of 12 Assam Rifles also addressed the gathering.

A Nasha Mukti Pledge was administered during the programme, encouraging participants to stand against drug abuse and work towards building a drug free society.

After the programme, an awareness rally was flagged off by Deputy Commissioner Ajit Kumar Verma. The rally commenced from Assam Rifles Ground, Mokokchung, and proceeded towards Police Point near Ao Baptist Church, Mokokchung, spreading the message "Say No to Drugs, Choose Life."

'VIP' security for seized drugs: Tight police guard until destruction

PATHANAMTHITTA: Drugs seized from smugglers and sellers are kept under heavy police security until they are destroyed. The destruction process is carried out in the presence of senior officials. Special procedures are followed for storing and destroying seized narcotic substances to prevent their theft or illegal disposal.

The seized drugs are stored in special strong rooms at Armed Reserve (AR) camps. Armed police personnel guard these facilities. The authority to destroy the seized substances rests with the District Drug Disposal Committee headed by the District Police Chief. The decision to destroy the drugs is taken after a meeting of the committee. The action is carried out under Section 52A of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985.

The destruction is conducted under the direct supervision of the District Police Chief in the presence of senior police officials, a representative of the magistrate, public representatives and media representatives. The seized substances are usually destroyed by burning. On Wednesday, 26.228 kg of cannabis and 10.755 grams of MDMA were destroyed at the AR Camp ground in Pathanamthitta. The seized drugs were worth around Rs 2 lakh. These were among the substances seized after the launch of Operation Toofan.

Destroyed only after testing After a case is registered, three samples of cannabis and five samples of substances such as MDMA are sent to the government chemical laboratory in Thiruvananthapuram for testing. The test reports are submitted to the police station that registered the case and to the court.

After the testing process, officials verify that the weight of the seized substances stored in the strong room is the same as the weight recorded at the time of seizure. The drugs are then burned in an open ground or furnace. Senior officials, including the District Police Chief, leave only after ensuring that the substances are completely destroyed.

Police alleged that the duo supplied drugs to people associated with the film industry as well as to medical practitioners in Kochi.

Officials said both the accused had previously been involved in narcotics cases and were under police surveillance.

Police have seized the mobile phones of the accused and are identifying those who allegedly purchased drugs from them.

A case has been registered at the Cheranalloor police station and the arrests have been recorded.

The accused will be produced before a court as part of the remand proceedings, officials added. PTI TBA TBA KH

Sikkim Tattoo Artist Arrested for Illegal Tramadol Possession at Kerala's Palakkad Junction

A joint operation by the Excise Department and Railway Protection Force led to the arrest of tattoo artist Sashi Hang Subba at Palakkad Junction in Kerala. Subba, found with unauthorized Tramadol tablets, claims they were for his clients. The case highlights Kerala's intensified crackdowns on illegal drug possession.

- Sashi Hang Subba, a tattoo artist from Sikkim, was arrested at Palakkad Junction for possessing illegal Tramadol tablets.
- Subba claimed the tablets were for managing pain for his tattoo clients and had obtained them from Bengaluru.
- The possession of Tramadol, a prescription medication, violates psychotropic substance regulations.
- This arrest is part of Kerala's 'Operation Toofan', aimed at combating narcotic crimes in the region.


In a significant drug enforcement operation, officials from the Excise Department and the Railway Protection Force arrested Sashi Hang Subba, a tattoo artist from Sikkim, at Palakkad Junction Railway Station on Wednesday. He was found in possession of Tramadol tablets without valid authorization, raising serious legal issues.

Subba, who hails from Lingchom, Tikjyo, in Sikkim, was reportedly traveling to Kochi to visit a spa where his brother is employed. Upon interception and questioning, Subba claimed that the Tramadol tablets were intended for managing the pain of his tattoo clients. Subba added that he had procured the medication from Bengaluru.

The illegal possession of Tramadol, known for its narcotic-like effects and classified as a prescription medication, poses a violation under psychotropic substance regulations. Following the discovery, the Excise Department has commenced legal proceedings and launched an investigation into the supply chain of the medication.

This arrest is part of Kerala's 'Operation Toofan', a robust anti-drug initiative emphasizing vigilance against narcotic crimes. The campaign has led to significant busts, including the seizure of narcotics worth crores and thousands of arrests. Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala has reaffirmed the state's zero-tolerance policy toward drug trafficking.

Telangana STF seizes 102 kg ganja worth Rs 10 Lakh, arrests one

Hyderabad: The Telangana Excise State Task Force (STF) seized 102 kg of ganja valued at around Rs. 10 lakh and arrested a drug courier during an operation near Pedda [Amberpet](#) on the Outer Ring Road (ORR) on Tuesday, June 30.

The accused, identified as Rajesh Sirsat, aged 27, was transporting the contraband from the Andhra-Odisha Border (AOB) region to Pune in a car when he was intercepted by the STF teams acting on specific intelligence.

According to the officials, the accused had allegedly changed the vehicle's registration number plates to match the state. In an attempt to evade police surveillance, he used the tampered plates, travelling through [Odisha](#), Andhra Pradesh, and Telangana before heading towards Maharashtra.

Accused intercepted as vehicle entered ORR

The STF teams, led by Excise State Task Force Circle Inspectors Venkateshwarlu and Nagaraju, along with Sub-Inspector Jyothi and other personnel, intercepted the car while it was entering the ORR near Pedda Amberpet. A search of the vehicle led to the seizure of 102 kg of [ganja](#)


concealed inside.

During interrogation, Rajesh reportedly confessed that he was transporting the consignment from the AOB region to Pune. Officials are now trying to identify and trace the supplier who handed over the ganja to him in the AOB area.

The accused, the seized ganja and the vehicle were handed over to the Pedda Amberpet Excise Police Station for further legal action. Further investigation is underway.

Shivamogga: In a shocking incident, a 28-year-old man allegedly murdered his own grandmother by dropping a stone on her head while under the influence of ganja in Anand Rao Layout of the city on Wednesday (July 1).

The deceased has been identified as Sushilamma (55). The accused grandson has been identified as Kishore (28).

According to reports, Kishore was allegedly addicted to ganja and had previously been involved in cases related to ganja peddling and consumption. He was reportedly known for creating disturbances at home while under the influence of the drug.

On Wednesday, he allegedly picked a quarrel with his grandmother as he had done on several earlier occasions. Upset by his behaviour, Sushilamma reportedly told him that she would file a police complaint against him and left the house.

Enraged by this, Kishore allegedly followed her and pushed her from behind while she was walking on the road. As she fell to the ground, he allegedly picked up a large stone lying nearby and smashed it on her head, killing her on the spot.

Shivamogga Superintendent of Police B. Nikhil visited the scene and conducted an inspection.


The body of Sushilamma has been shifted to the mortuary of Meggan Hospital for post-mortem examination.

A case has been registered at the Doddapete Police Station. Police have formed two special teams to trace and arrest the accused Kishore, who is currently absconding.

The Anti-Narcotics Cell of the Mira Bhayandar-Vasai Virar police in Maharashtra has destroyed seized drugs valued at nearly ₹238 crore at a waste management facility in Taloja, Navi Mumbai, officials said on Wednesday.

Gujarat court sentences 19 Pak, Afghan nationals to 20 years in jail for drug smuggling

Bhuj, Jul 1 (PTI) A special NDPS court here on Wednesday sentenced 19 people — 18 Pakistani nationals and an Afghan citizen — to 20-year rigorous imprisonment in three cases of smuggling heroin worth Rs 575 crore through the coastal area of Gujarat's Kutch district between 2020-2022.

The court, after evaluating the evidence presented by the prosecution, concluded that the accused were involved in targeting Indian youth and pushing them into drug addiction, and such an act cannot be called ordinary.

They were part of a well-planned conspiracy to weaken the nation's fabric by supplying large quantities of narcotics, noted the court in Bhuj, the headquarters of Kutch district, while also imposing a Rs 2 lakh fine on each of them.

Additional Sessions and Special NDPS Court Judge V A Buddha found all the 19 accused guilty of the offence under Section 8(c) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act and sentenced them to rigorous imprisonment for 20 years.

The section makes the production, manufacture, possession, sale, purchase, transport, or use of any narcotic drug or psychotropic substance a criminal offence.

The problem of narcotics does not remain at the individual level but also becomes a national problem as it directly affects the internal security of the country, the court noted.

The court delivered its verdict in three separate cases that were registered by the Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) and involved drugs being smuggled from Pakistan via the Arabian sea route and unloaded in the coastal part of Jakhau in Kutch district.

Acting on intelligence that a boat from Pakistan loaded with contraband drugs was on its way to the Jakhau coast, the ATS teamed up with the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) and intercepted a suspicious boat on January 6, 2020, with five people onboard, all citizens of the neighbouring country.

From their possession, 35kg of heroin worth Rs 175 crore was recovered. Accordingly, an FIR was registered and a chargesheet filed by the ATS.

One of the accused died during trial.

In second and third cases, the ATS acted on a similar tip-off and teamed up with the ICG to intercept boats with the accused persons carrying narcotics worth crores of rupees.

In the second case, the ATS and the ICG intercepted a suspicious boat on April 15, 2021, with eight Pakistani citizens on board and seized 30kg of heroin worth Rs 150 crore.

In the third case, the agencies intercepted a boat mid-sea on October 8, 2022, with six Pakistani citizens and an Afghan national on board and seized 50kg of the narcotic substance worth Rs 250 crore.

All the three cases were clubbed into one and the accused are currently lodged in jails. PTI KA PD RSY

Bangkok returnee arrested with 4.2kg ganja at Ahmedabad airport

Ahmedabad: A flyer was arrested with 4.2kg of hydroponic marijuana (ganja) in his baggage on Wednesday, making this the second seizure of hydroponic weed within four days.

“Based on passenger profiling, officers of the air intelligence unit (AIU) and the Ahmedabad customs team intercepted a male passenger who had arrived from Bangkok. An examination of the passenger’s checked-in trolley bag led to the recovery of 22 packets wrapped in transparent polythene and concealed inside food packages,” a department release stated.


The passenger was identified as a 40-year-old man from Ulhasnagar in Maharashtra. It was his first visit to Ahmedabad

airport.

“A field test on the recovered substance showed a positive result for hydroponic marijuana. The contraband has been seized under the provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985,” the release stated.

A source in the customs department said, "Passengers acting as carriers often come from Southeast Asian countries and conceal the contraband in checked-in luggage under other goods. The carriers are often first-timers who smuggle the package for cash or other rewards."

50 kg ganja seized from truck on Nagpur-Bhandara Highway

Nagpur: The Anti-Narcotics Squad of the Nagpur Crime Branch foiled an alleged interstate drug smuggling operation by seizing over 50 kg of ganja concealed inside a goods truck on the Nagpur-Bhandara National Highway and arresting its driver. Police suspect the contraband was being transported as part of a wider narcotics supply network.

The operation was conducted on Tuesday between 2.40 pm and 7.10 pm near the Forest Produce Check-post (Van Upaj Naka) opposite Umiya Complex, under the jurisdiction of Pardi Police Station.

According to the Crime Branch, the Anti-Narcotics Squad was carrying out routine surveillance when officers noticed the suspicious movements of the truck driver. Acting on suspicion, the team intercepted the Ashok Leyland six-wheeler truck and conducted a thorough search in the presence of two independent panch witnesses, following the mandatory procedures laid down under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

During the search, police discovered 50.56 kg of ganja carefully concealed inside the truck's cabin. The narcotic substance, along with the truck used for transportation and an Oppo mobile phone, was seized. The total value of the seized contraband and other confiscated property has been estimated at Rs 27.79 lakh.

The arrested accused has been identified as Mohammad Alauddin Mohammad Jamaluddin Sharafat Ali Malik (40), a resident of MHADA Quarters under the limits of Kapilnagar Police Station in Nagpur.

Police have also registered an offence against an unidentified suspect from Sambalpur, Odisha, who is believed to be linked to the consignment and is currently absconding. Efforts are underway to trace and apprehend the wanted accused.

A case has been registered at Pardi Police Station under Sections 8(c), 20(b) and other relevant provisions of the NDPS Act. Investigators are now probing the source of the contraband, its intended destination and whether the accused is part of a larger interstate drug trafficking syndicate.

The operation was carried out under the supervision of Deputy Commissioner of Police (Detection) Deepak Agrawal, with Police Inspector Sarang Mirashi and the Anti-Narcotics Squad executing the raid. Further investigation is in progress.

CHANDIGARH, July 1 : With the ongoing decisive war against drugs 'Yudh Nashian Virudh' launched on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann has completed 16 months, Punjab Police has registered 50,656 first information reports (FIRs) and arrested 70,871 drug smugglers leading to the recovery of 3125 kg heroin since March 1, 2025.

Since the launch of this anti-drug drive, Punjab Police, under the directions of Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav, has been conducting operations daily simultaneously in all the 28 Police districts of the state.

Apart from the recovery of 3125 kg haul of heroin, Special DGP Law and Order Praveen Sinha said that police have also seized 842 kg opium, 675 quintals poppy husk, 85 kg charas, 1022 kg ganja, 58 kg ICE, 59 lakh intoxicant pills/tablets, and ₹19.40 crore drug money.

Ambala range inspector general of police (IG) Pankaj Nain on Wednesday said that 164 drug smugglers were arrested and 95 cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985 were registered in Ambala, Kurukshetra and Yamunanagar districts during one month of Operation Maidan 2.0.

The special anti-drug drive was conducted from May 28 to June 30, aiming to curb the drug trade in the districts falling under the Ambala range.

While concluding the campaign, Nain said that a total of 95 cases were registered and 164 drug smugglers were arrested across the range.

“Various types of narcotics were recovered from the arrested accused. Additionally, special surveillance was maintained on the activities of previously arrested drug smugglers released on bail,” he said.

He said that 255 drug-affected individuals received treatment and counselling during the period, while 31 individuals suffering from severe addiction were admitted to hospitals for advanced medical care and rehabilitation.

He claimed that during the campaign, the police recovered over 2.867kg of heroin, 8g of charas, 1.852kg of opium, over 512kg of poppy husk, nearly 23kg cannabis, 33.670gm of smack and 7,326 intoxicating capsules/tablets.

He also claimed that 200 litres of lahan (hooch) and 730 bottles of illicit liquor were seized.

Moreover, one truck, 14 motorcycles and five cars were seized; and cash amounting to ₹11.54 lakh was also recovered from the possession of the accused, he added.

Police in Anantnag on Wednesday said they have registered 345 cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and arrested 372 alleged drug peddlers during the first six months of 2026 as part of an intensified campaign against drug trafficking and substance abuse.

According to the police, more than 440 kilograms of narcotic substances were seized in multiple operations conducted across the district, while cash amounting to Rs 27.53 lakh, believed to be proceeds from the illicit drug trade, was recovered from the accused.

As part of the action against assets linked to narcotics trafficking, properties worth nearly Rs 50 crore were attached in 30 cases under relevant legal provisions. In addition, 20 illegally acquired properties valued at around Rs 20 crore were demolished for their alleged links to proceeds from the drug trade.

Police also destroyed around 2,000 kilograms of seized narcotic substances after completing the required legal formalities. Illegal cultivation of narcotic crops spread over more than 260 marlas of land was eradicated during the period.

Officials further said that over 260 marlas of government land allegedly encroached upon by drug peddlers were retrieved. Several special enforcement actions were also taken, including the arrest of female drug peddlers and seven women allegedly involved in illegal narcotic cultivation. Legal proceedings were initiated against seven government employees found involved in drug-related cases.

Under preventive measures, six alleged drug peddlers were detained under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT NDPS) Act. Authorities also cancelled 24 driving licences and 16 vehicle registration certificates in connection with narcotics-related offences.


Vehicle Codes & Driving Laws

To strengthen enforcement, police conducted 203 Narco-Cordon and Search Operations (Narco-CASOs) across the district. A joint inspection of 214 medical shops was also carried out with the concerned departments, during which 17 violations were detected and legal action was initiated.

Police said 96 investigating officers handling NDPS cases were trained at the District Police Office, Anantnag, to enhance their knowledge of legal procedures and evidence handling.

Reiterating its commitment to eliminating the drug menace, Anantnag Police appealed to the public, particularly the youth, to cooperate by reporting drug-related activities, saying community participation remains crucial in the fight against narcotics.

SRINAGAR, July 1: Anantnag Police attached properties worth around Rs 50 crore, demolished 20 illegal structures linked to narcotics proceeds and destroyed 2,000 kilograms of contraband during the first six months of 2026 as part of an intensified crackdown on drug trafficking in the district, officials said today.

The presentations highlighted awareness programmes organised across Panchayats, educational institutions and urban local bodies, besides initiatives aimed at prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and community participation.

Reviewing the awareness activities being conducted in Panchayats, the Deputy Commissioner directed the Assistant Commissioner Panchayat to further intensify Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activities and organise multiple awareness programmes at different locations within Panchayats to ensure maximum outreach and community participation.

The Chief Executive Officer, Municipal Council Pulwama, briefed the meeting on the awareness programmes being organised in urban areas under the campaign. The Deputy Commissioner directed that awareness initiatives be conducted regularly in markets, public spaces and educational institutions to ensure wider public outreach.

The Chair was also apprised of the awareness programmes being organised in schools across the district. Stressing the importance of preventive education, the Deputy Commissioner directed the Education Department to organise regular awareness sessions, debates, seminars, counselling programmes and sports activities in educational institutions to raise awareness about the ill effects of drug abuse.

Furthermore, the functioning of the Addiction Treatment Facility (ATF), Pulwama, and the Drug De-Addiction Centre, Tral, was reviewed in detail. Dr. Qayoom sought details from the concerned officers regarding treatment facilities, patient admissions, counselling services and rehabilitation measures, and directed them to ensure effective counselling, timely treatment, proper follow-up of recovered individuals and their integration with skill development and livelihood opportunities.

Reviewing the measures taken against illicit poppy cultivation and wild cannabis, the Assistant Commissioner Revenue presented the action taken report on destruction drives being conducted across the district. The Deputy Commissioner directed all concerned departments to maintain strict surveillance, intensify field inspections and ensure the complete eradication of illicit cultivation and wild cannabis across the district.

Later, the meeting also reviewed the status of NDPS cases registered across the district. The Deputy Director Prosecution presented a detailed overview of cases under investigation, prosecution and trial.

The Deputy Commissioner emphasised the need for close coordination among the Police, Prosecution and other concerned agencies to ensure expeditious investigation and effective prosecution, with a view to improving conviction rates and strengthening deterrence.

Concluding the meeting, the Deputy Commissioner called for intensifying the campaign and stressed inter-departmental coordination, community participation and sustained enforcement to effectively combat the menace of drug abuse and narcotics trafficking in the district.

Among others, the meeting was attended by SSP Pulwama, Tanushree; Additional Deputy Commissioners of Pulwama, Awantipora and Tral; Assistant Commissioner Revenue; Assistant Commissioner Panchayat; Additional SP Awantipora, Deputy Director Prosecution; besides other members of the committee and other district and sectoral officers.

Synthetic drugs cartel busted, 2 held, hunt on for foreigner kingpin

New Delhi: The arrest of an auto driver near Tagore Garden metro station has uncovered a synthetic drug cartel operating across the city. Police said they had seized commercial quantities of narcotics, including MDMA, cocaine and Ecstasy, and also arrested another man allegedly involved in distributing drugs in south Delhi's Vasant Kunj and Vasant Vihar.

The auto, allegedly used for peddling drugs, has also been seized. Police have launched a manhunt for a foreigner, Stanley, who is suspected to be the kingpin of the racket.

During the raid near the metro station on June 22, Ram Kumar was arrested and police found 6.6 grams of MDMA on him. The contraband, along with the vehicle, was immediately seized. Deputy commissioner of police (west) Hareshwar V Swami said Kumar revealed that he had procured the MDMA from Stanley, based in Vasant Kunj, and was supplying the drugs on his instructions.

Kumar's disclosure led police to Sandeep (37), who told investigators that he, too, was working for Stanley and was tasked with delivering narcotics to customers across the city.

Further searches led to the seizure of 11.6 grams of MDMA, classified as commercial quantity, 10 grams of cocaine, and nine Ecstasy tablets weighing 6.7 grams.

Fatehabad police arrest 2 drug peddlers with 13kg opium

Hisar: In a major anti-drug crackdown, Fatehabad police arrested two alleged interstate traffickers, including a woman, with over 13 kg opium worth Rs 70 lakh, and separately froze Rs 30 lakh property linked to drug proceeds.

Addressing a news conference on Tuesday, ASP Divyanshi Singla said acting on a tip-off, a CIA Ratia team intercepted a car near Dhangar bridge on NH-9 and apprehended the occupants — Ishwar Lal Patidar of Neemuch district in Madhya Pradesh and Sona Prajapati of Raisen district in Madhya Pradesh. While searching the vehicle, police allegedly recovered 13.06 kg of opium worth nearly Rs 70 lakh.

Police suspect that the accused were transporting the contraband from Madhya Pradesh for supply across Haryana and Punjab. The vehicle used in the operation was also seized. Investigators said the car carried stickers bearing the name of a newspaper publication on both the front and rear windscreens.

A case under relevant sections of the NDPS Act has been registered at Sadar Fatehabad police station.

Preliminary investigation has also indicated that the main accused was previously booked under the NDPS Act in Punjab's Bathinda district.

Cops seize property worth Rs 30L

In a separate action, police froze residential property worth nearly Rs 30 lakh belonging to an alleged drug trafficker, Suresh alias Shesha, from Tohana under provisions of the NDPS Act. Officials said the move was part of a strategy aimed at dismantling the financial backbone of narcotics networks. Police said action has so far been initiated against the properties of 34 alleged drug traffickers in the district.

Police apprehends two drug peddlers in Anantnag

Srinagar: Police in Anantnag apprehended two drug peddlers in separate operations and recovered more than 6 kilograms of poppy straw, besides cash believed to be linked to the illicit trade, a police spokesman said Wednesday.

In the first operation, a police party at Sangam was conducting naka checking on the Sangam–Halmulla axis when one individual was intercepted for checking. During search, 3.054 kilograms of poppy straw were recovered. The accused was identified as Shah Hussain Mattoo son of Mohammad Ibrahim Mattoo resident of Shalina, Budgam. Police also recovered ₹23,600 in cash from his possession.

In another successful operation, a police party established a checkpoint at Tulkhan Bijbehara near Bridge. During checking, an Alto vehicle bearing Registration No. JK13J-6032 was intercepted. During search, police team recovered 3.158 kilograms of poppy straw along with ₹50,000 from the possession of the driver, identified as Suheel Ahmad Bhat son of Fida Hussain Bhat, resident of Balhama, Srinagar. The vehicle used in the commission of the offence was also seized.

Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered and further investigation is in progress, he said.

One drug trader held, over 8,000 codeine cough syrup bottles seized in UP's Bahraich

In a crackdown on illegal drug trade, officials on Thursday seized over 8,000 bottles of regulated codeine-based cough syrup from a warehouse in Bahraich and arrested a trader under the NDPS Act.

District Drug Inspector Vinay Krishn said the recovery was made during a joint raid conducted on Wednesday by the Drug Department and police teams from the Dargah Sharif and Rupaideha police areas.

Acting on a tip-off, the team raided an illegal warehouse in Parsaura village under the Dargah Sharif police station limits, where the cough syrup bottles were found stored in cartons, he said.

The accused, Ajay Kumar Yadav, was booked under Section 8/21 of the NDPS Act, arrested and sent to jail, the officer said.

According to the drug inspector, Yadav held a licence to sell medicines at a different address, but had no valid licence for the warehouse where the regulated codeine-based cough syrup was allegedly being stored.

Krishn said the district administration was continuing its drive against the illegal trade in narcotic and regulated medicines.

He said that two days earlier, a joint raid at an Ayurvedic medicine store in the Rupaideha area along the India-Nepal border had led to the seizure of more than 2,000 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup and other regulated medicines.

The store operator, Aditya Kumar Mishra, was also arrested under the NDPS Act and sent to jail.

The drug inspector said police and the Drug Department were investigating the forward and backward linkages in both cases to identify the entire supply and distribution network involved in the illegal trade of regulated medicines.

Codeine racket: Process to extradite kingpin Shubham Jaiswal intensifies

Varanasi: The police are ramping up efforts to extradite Shubham Jaiswal, the alleged mastermind behind the codeine cough syrup smuggling racket, as investigations gather pace with chargesheets filed, arrests made, and illicit assets seized.

Police commissioner Mohit Agrawal on Tuesday said the process of issuing a Red Corner Notice against Shubham, the fugitive kingpin, has been completed. The request has been sent to Interpol through the CBI to locate and provisionally arrest him for extradition.

Police initiated this action after it became clear that Shubham left India in Nov 2025 and took shelter in Dubai. After attaching properties of Shubham's jailed father Bhola Prasad, his other family and gang members, the cops are also gearing up to attach the properties and freeze bank accounts in his name.

ACP, Kotwali, Vijay Pratap Singh said they have uploaded a 60-page chargesheet against Shaili Traders proprietor Bhola and his son Shubham, and the hard copy will be filed before the court concerned soon. The chargesheet against the duo includes solid evidence, witness statements and important documents related to financial transactions. A detailed chargesheet against 18 other accused had already been submitted before the court in March.

Since the lodging of an FIR with Kotwali police in Nov 2025, 30 accused have been arrested and property worth Rs 45 crore has been seized, said the ACP.

Shubham and his accomplices, including Bhola, have FIRs lodged against them at Rohaniya and Sarnath police stations. He has already been declared a fugitive in these cases.

20 kg ganja seized from unclaimed bags on Saryu Yamuna Exp

Amritsar: A drug de-addiction centre operator and a man wanted in a drug case have been arrested for alleged involvement in a cross-border arms smuggling module, with seven pistols seized from them, Amritsar police said on Wednesday.

Police identified the accused as Surjit Singh alias Rana (33) and Gulbagh Singh alias Batth (26), who operates a de-addiction centre on Bhai Manj Singh Road in Sultanwind. The recovered weapons include a 9mm Glock pistol, a .30 bore Tisas Türkiye pistol, a .30 bore modified pistol and four other .30 bore pistols.

Commissioner of Police Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said preliminary investigation revealed the accused were in contact with foreign-based smugglers through social media apps and were receiving consignments of illegal weapons through cross-border routes for onward supply to criminal elements.

Verification of their antecedents showed Rana is wanted in a commercial quantity narcotics case registered at Bhikhiwind police station in Tarn Taran, indicating his alleged involvement in organised criminal activity, Bhullar said.

Police said further arrests and recoveries are expected as the investigation progresses.

A case has been registered under Sections 25(6), 25(7) and 25(8) of the Arms Act at Sultanwind police station.

पंजाब, महाराष्ट्र और दिल्ली के बाद अब तस्करों ने तराई क्षेत्र को नशे की सप्लाई का नया कॉरिडोर बना लिया है। अवैध प्रयोगशालाओं में रसायनों और प्रतिबंधित दवाओं के मिश्रण से तैयार डिजाइनर ड्रग्स तराई के रास्ते कुमाऊं में पहुंच रही है।



रसायनों के खतरनाक मिश्रण से अवैध प्रयोगशालाओं में तैयार हो रही डिजाइनर ड्रग्स भी तराई क्षेत्र के जरिए कुमाऊं में पहुंच रही है। पंजाब, महाराष्ट्र और दिल्ली के बाद अब तस्करों ने तराई को नशे की सप्लाई का नया कॉरिडोर बना लिया है। बीते दो वर्षों में जिले में करीब 15 करोड़ रुपये की डिजाइनर ड्रग्स पकड़ी जा चुकी है जबकि एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत 500 से अधिक मामले दर्ज किए गए हैं।

डिजाइनर ड्रग्स सामान्य नशीले पदार्थों से अलग होती है। इन्हें रसायनों और प्रतिबंधित दवाओं के मिश्रण से अवैध लैबों में तैयार किया जाता है। एमडीएमए (मैथिलिन डाईऑक्सी मेथमफेटामाइन), मेफेड्रोन, ट्रामाडोल और अल्प्रजोलम जैसी दवाओं व रसायनों के मिश्रण से तैयार यह नशा युवाओं को तेजी से अपनी गिरफ्त में ले रहा है।

पुलिस और एसटीएफ की जांच में सामने आया है कि यूपी, महाराष्ट्र, दिल्ली और पंजाब से आने वाली नशे की खेप तराई क्षेत्र से होते हुए पहाड़ों तक पहुंचाई जा रही है। तराई अब केवल सप्लाई रूट नहीं बल्कि तस्करों के नेटवर्क का अहम केंद्र बनता जा रहा है।

अब तक ये हुए बड़े खुलासे

-दिसंबर 2025 में काशीपुर पुलिस ने 1.32 करोड़ रुपये मूल्य के 43,950 नशीले इंजेक्शन बरामद किए थे। जांच में सामने आया था कि इंजेक्शन जालंधर से एक मेडिकल स्टोर के नाम पर बुक कराकर भेजे गए थे। इस मामले का मुख्य आरोपी अब तक पुलिस की पकड़ से बाहर है।

-जून 2025 में एसटीएफ ने नानकमत्ता से टनकपुर निवासी कुनाल राम कोहली को गिरफ्तार किया था। उसके पास से 126 लीटर प्रतिबंधित केमिकल और 28 किलो पाउडर बरामद हुआ था। जांच में पता चला कि बरामद कच्चे माल से करीब 12 किलो एमडीएमए तैयार की जा सकती थी, जिसकी कीमत करोड़ों रुपये बताई गई।

-गदरपुर में एसटीएफ ने हिस्ट्रीशीटर शाकिर अली उर्फ नकटा और उसकी पत्नी शाईन को भी गिरफ्तार किया था। आरोप है कि दोनों अपने नाबालिग बेटे के जरिए ड्रग्स की तस्करी करा रहे थे। पुलिस ने बेटे के पास से 33 लाख रुपये की हेरोइन बरामद की थी। शाकिर के खिलाफ नौ और शाईन के खिलाफ छह आपराधिक मामले दर्ज हैं।


डिजाइनर ड्रग्स शरीर के लिए खतरनाक

काशीपुर के चिकित्सक डॉ. अरविंद शर्मा ने बताया कि डिजाइनर ड्रग्स का सेवन शरीर के तापमान को असामान्य रूप से बढ़ा सकता है। इसके बाद लगातार पानी पीने से शरीर में सोडियम की मात्रा कम हो सकती है, जिससे डिहाइड्रेशन और हार्ट फेलियर का खतरा बढ़ जाता है। उन्होंने बताया कि लंबे समय तक सेवन से सेरोटोनिन सिस्टम प्रभावित हो सकता है, जिससे मस्तिष्क पर गंभीर असर पड़ सकता है। कई डिजाइनर ड्रग्स में मेथ, केटामिन और फेंटानिल जैसे खतरनाक पदार्थों की मिलावट पाई जाती है। फेंटानिल की बहुत कम मात्रा भी जानलेवा साबित हो सकती है।

ज्योति शर्मा, मथुरा: यूपी के मथुरा में पुलिस ने नशे के सौदागरों के खिलाफ बड़ी कामयाबी हासिल की है। पुलिस ने एक बंद दुकान पर छापा मारकर भारी मात्रा में अवैध गांजा बरामद किया है। बरामद किए गए गांजे का वजन करीब 129 किलोग्राम है, जिसकी अंतर्राष्ट्रीय बाजार में अनुमानित कीमत करीब 65 लाख रुपये बताई जा रही है। पुलिस दुकान मालिक को अरेस्ट कर उससे पूछताछ में जुटी है।

यह संयुक्त अभियान [आगरा एसटीएफ](#) और मथुरा की फरह थाना पुलिस ने चलाया। एसटीएफ आगरा फील्ड यूनिट के अपर पुलिस अधीक्षक राकेश कुमार और सीओ रिफाइनरी प्रवीण तिवारी को इनपुट मिला था कि फरह क्षेत्र में नशे की एक बड़ी खेप उतारी गई है। बुधवार शाम को जैसे ही संयुक्त टीम ने फरह हाईवे अंडरपास के समीप एक दुकान पर छापा मारा तो वहां का नजारा देखकर अधिकारियों के होश उड़ गए। दुकान के भीतर बोरेयों में भर कर रखा गया 129 किलो गांजा बरामद हुआ। पुलिस सूत्रों के मुताबिक, तस्कर इस माल को ब्रज क्षेत्र में स्थानीय स्तर पर छोटे-छोटे पेडलर्स के जरिए खपाने की फिराक में थे।

किराएदार की थ्योरी से उलझ मामला

एसपी के मुताबिक, इस मामले में दुकान स्वामी संजय शर्मा को गिरफ्तार किया गया है। हालांकि पुलिस की पूछताछ में एक नया मोड़ सामने आया है। संजय के पिता अशोक का दावा है कि उन्होंने यह दुकान में 3 महीने पहले ही फरह के ही रहने वाले बंटी नाम के युवक को किराए पर दी थी।

जांच में जुटी एसटीएफ पुलिस

एसटीएफ और स्थानीय पुलिस अब इस बात की तस्दीक कर रही है कि क्या दुकान वाकई किराए पर दी गई थी या यह कार्रवाई से बचने का कोई बहाना है। फिलहाल पुलिस बंटी की तलाश में दबिश दे रही है। यह पता लगाने का प्रयास किया जा रहा है कि इस सिंडिकेट के तार ओडिशा या आंध्र प्रदेश के किसी बड़े सप्लायर से तो नहीं जुड़े हैं।

Odisha Police to constitute Anti-Narcotics Task Force against drug trafficking

BHUBANESWAR: Odisha Police will soon form a special Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) headed by an additional DGP (ADGP) rank officer to crack down on drug trafficking and organised narcotics networks in the state.

Addressing a programme organised at Police Bhawan on Wednesday to mark the national-level pre-trial drug destruction special drive, DGP YB Khurania said the specialised task force will comprise 10 operational units and 19 dedicated intelligence units strategically deployed across the state to identify and dismantle interstate drug syndicates.

He said the ANTF will be mobilised to initiate stringent action against major drug mafia under the NDPS Act. At least 100 such mafia will be taken to task every year. The task force will also help identify drug hotspots across the state and act to neutralise them systematically.

“Apart from ANTF, financial investigations are being prioritised to completely dismantle the economic backbone of drug syndicates in the state. Special emphasis is being placed on identifying the masterminds and financiers behind illegal cannabis cultivation,” Khurania said.

As part of the initiative, he said more than 63,720 acre of illegal cannabis cultivation, with an estimated value of Rs 1,911 crore, has been destroyed during the statewide enforcement drive conducted between July 2024 and March 2026.

During this period, 2,445 NDPS cases were registered, 421 tonne of cannabis valued at approximately Rs 2,106 crore were seized and 3,502 accused persons arrested in this connection.

Koraput district police achieved a significant breakthrough in the anti-narcotics campaign by raiding an illegal cannabis oil manufacturing unit and seizing around 1,800 litre of cannabis oil, valued at around `225 crore. Four key accused involved in the racket were arrested from Kerala, said the DGP.

Similarly, the Special Task Force (STF) has arrested two active members of an interstate drug trafficking gang operating across Kandhamal, Boudh, Sonepur and neighbouring states. “To expedite the trial of narcotics-related offences, the state government has also approved establishment of four dedicated NDPS courts at Bhubaneswar, Khurda, Angul and Sambalpur,” Khurania informed. He noted that the fight against drug trafficking, narcotics smuggling and drug mafia will be intensified in the coming days.

“There will be absolutely no leniency towards those who violate the law. Through coordinated enforcement, advanced technology, public participation and unwavering determination, Odisha Police remains firmly committed to building a drug-free, safe and empowered Odisha,” the DGP said.

Jaleswar: A Special Court in Jaleswar has sentenced a man to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment (RI) and imposed a fine of Rs 1 lakh after convicting him in a 2021 brown sugar trafficking case involving the seizure of 1.53 kg of the contraband by the Special Task Force (STF).

Special Court Judge Ajay Kumar Pradhan delivered the judgment on Tuesday found Munaf Hosen (33), a resident of Jhareswarpur under Jaleswar Municipality in Balasore district, guilty under the relevant provisions of the NDPS Act. In default of payment of the fine, he will have to undergo an additional one year of imprisonment.

According to the prosecution, an STF team, acting on specific intelligence, raided an area near a garage on Lakshmannath Road under Jaleswar police station on March 8, 2021, and seized 1,530 grams of brown sugar packed in a polythene packet from Hosen's possession.

Following a complaint lodged by STF Inspector Sarita Beuria, a case (No. 9/2021) was registered. The investigation was conducted by Inspector Sunita Pradhan.

Hosen has remained in judicial custody since his arrest. During the trial, the prosecution examined 13 witnesses.

Additional Public Prosecutor Deepti Hansda represented the prosecution.

6 Arrested, 1,200 Bottles Of Codeine Cough Syrup Seized In Sambalpur

Sambalpur: In a major crackdown on narcotics trafficking, Sambalpur Police arrested six persons and seized 1,200 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup during a special operation near Singhpali under the Ainthapali police station limits in Sambalpur district on Wednesday.

Acting on credible intelligence, police intercepted a vehicle and an unregistered electric scooter used for transporting the contraband, leading to the arrest of the accused, all of whom are residents of Sambalpur district.

The arrested persons have been identified as Chandan Behera (25) of Kumkapale under Jamankira police station, Deepak Thethuar (28) of Baijamunda under Burla police station, Suraj Munda (28) of Kumkupali under Jamankira police station, Pintu Munda (34) of Samapada under Jamankira police station, Kanha Behera (28) of Baijamunda under Burla police station, and Manas Besan (26) of Khulia under Sasan police station.

According to police, the operation was carried out on June 30, 2026, following specific information about the transportation of illegal cough syrup in the Singhpali area. A police team conducted a raid and intercepted the suspects while they were allegedly moving the contraband consignment.

During the search, police seized 1,200 bottles (100 ml each) of WINCEREX cough syrup containing codeine phosphate and triprolidine hydrochloride, packed in 10 cartons. They also recovered one SUV, one unregistered electric scooter, seven mobile phones, and Rs 5,540 in cash from their possession.

Preliminary investigation suggests that the consignment was procured from Kolkata and was being transported for illegal distribution in Sambalpur and adjoining areas. Police suspect the accused were part of an organised interstate network involved in the illicit supply of codeine-based cough syrup for intoxicating use.

Further investigation is underway to trace the wider supply chain, identify the source of procurement, and establish financial links and other members of the syndicate involved in the racket.

ब्राउन शुगर के साथ टोटो चालक गिरफ्तार

Jamtara : अवैध शराब व गांजा की तस्करी से जूझ रहे जामताड़ा जिले में अब ब्राउन शुगर जैसे खतरनाक नशे की भी एंट्री हो गई है. जिले में पहली बार ब्राउन शुगर तस्करी का मामला सामने आने के बाद पुलिस ने त्वरित कार्रवाई करते हुए एक टोटो चालक को गिरफ्तार किया है. उसके पास से चार पुड़िया ब्राउन शुगर बरामद की गई है.

गिरफ्तार आरोपी की पहचान जामताड़ा थाना क्षेत्र के कायस्थपाड़ा निवासी चंदन मंडल के रूप में हुई है. पुलिस जांच में सामने आया है कि वह टोटो चलाने की आड़ में बाहरी क्षेत्रों से ब्राउन शुगर लाकर जिले के युवाओं तक इसकी सप्लाई कर रहा था.

एसपी शंभु कुमार सिंह को मिली गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर एसडीपीओ वसीम राजा के नेतृत्व में विशेष टीम का गठन किया गया. टीम ने छापेमारी कर टोटो चालक चंदन मंडल को रंगे हाथ पकड़ लिया. तलाशी में उसके पास से चार पुड़िया ब्राउन शुगर बरामद की गई.

पुलिस ने उसके खिलाफ जामताड़ा थाना में कांड संख्या 87/26 के तहत मामला दर्ज किया है. कानूनी प्रक्रिया पूरी कर उस जेल भेज दिया गया. पुलिस यह पता लगाने में जुटी है कि ब्राउन शुगर की यह खेप जिले में कहां से लाई जा रही थी और इसके पीछे कौन-सा गिरोह सक्रिय है.

किशनगंज: सूखे नशे के खिलाफ किशनगंज पुलिस की एंटी नारकोटिक्स फोर्स की कार्रवाई लगातार जारी है। इसी क्रम में बुधवार को एसएसबी और एंटी नारकोटिक्स टास्क फोर्स की संयुक्त टीम ने भारत-नेपाल सीमा क्षेत्र में बड़ी कार्रवाई करते हुए एक संदिग्ध तस्कर को गिरफ्तार किया।

ब्राउन शुगर के साथ तस्कर गिरफ्तार

संयुक्त रेड पार्टी ने बुधवार सुबह 11:30 बजे भारत-नेपाल सीमा पर, सीमा स्तंभ संख्या 131/01 से लगभग 700 मीटर (भारत की ओर) 'ए' समवाय- मोहामारी क्षेत्र में छापेमारी की। इस कार्रवाई में 'ए'-समवाय मोहामारी, 'बी'-समवाय दिघलबैंक, दिघलबैंक थाना पुलिस तथा एंटी नारकोटिक्स टास्क फोर्स, किशनगंज शामिल थी। छापेमारी के दौरान दिघलबैंक थाना क्षेत्र के मोहरमारी खकवार टोला निवासी शाहनवाज हुसैन को गिरफ्तार किया गया।

80 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर जब्त

उसके कब्जे से **80 ग्राम संदिग्ध ब्राउन शुगर**, 23,47,900 रुपये की नेपाली मुद्रा, 30,550 रुपये की भारतीय मुद्रा, एक डिजिटल वजन मशीन तथा 6 स्मार्ट मोबाइल फोन बरामद किए गए। मिली जानकारी अनुसार एंटी नारकोटिक्स फोर्स और एसएसबी की टीम कई दिनों से शाहनवाज हुसैन की गतिविधियों पर नजर रख रही थी। पुख्ता सूचना मिलने के बाद संयुक्त टीम ने योजनाबद्ध तरीके से छापेमारी कर उसे रंगे हाथ गिरफ्तार कर लिया।

आरोपी से पूछताछ जारी

फिलहाल जब्त सभी सामग्री को **दिघलबैंक थाना में जमा कराने की प्रक्रिया चल** रही है। पुलिस यह भी जांच कर रही है कि प्रतिबंधित ब्राउन शुगर की तस्करी किस स्रोत से की जा रही थी और इस नेटवर्क में अन्य कौन-कौन लोग शामिल हैं। मामले में अग्रिम कानूनी कार्रवाई जारी है। एजेंसियां उससे पूछताछ कर रही हैं। पता लगाया जा रहा है कि वो आखिर किस मंशा के साथ भारत में प्रवेश कर रहा था।
