- Digital drug distribution: International charas network relied on WhatsApp orders, digital payments and deletion of chat/call records after every transaction.
- Railway-based pharmaceutical smuggling: Large consignments of codeine cough syrup moved through the rail network in the Northeast.

Key Trends

- Interstate trafficking continues to dominate, with Odisha remaining a major source for ganja destined for Telangana, Maharashtra and Gujarat.
- Courier and postal channels, alongside rail transport, are increasingly being exploited for narcotics movement.
- Digital platforms continue to facilitate narcotics supply chains while reducing physical contact between traffickers.
- Enforcement agencies are placing greater emphasis on backward/forward linkages, preventive detention under PIT NDPS, and targeting organised criminal networks.
- Several states conducted large-scale destruction of seized narcotics, reflecting continued focus on disposal of NDPS case property alongside enforcement.

Gujarat: Three convicted in ganja trafficking case, sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment

Surat, July 3 (IANS) Three men have been sentenced to 10 years' rigorous imprisonment each by a special court in Surat after being convicted in a ganja trafficking case involving the seizure of more than 562 kg of the narcotic, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) said on Friday.

According to the NCB's Ahmedabad Zonal Unit, the case stemmed from an operation carried out on May 4 and 5, 2020, when officers, acting on specific and reliable intelligence, intercepted three persons at Krishna Industry in Surat's Kim area.

The operation resulted in the seizure of 562.55 kg of ganja, which investigators said had been transported illegally from Odisha to Gujarat.

The agency said its investigation established a well-organised criminal conspiracy to transport a commercial quantity of ganja across state lines for illicit sale.

The contraband was recovered from the conscious possession of the accused, following which a case was registered under Sections 8(c), 20(b)(ii)(C) and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985.

The NCB filed a complaint before the Special NDPS Court in Surat City in October 2020.

Following the trial before the Court of the 11th Additional District Judge, Surat City, the court delivered its judgment on July 2.

The three convicted persons were identified as Kalu Charan Behra, a resident of Bilipara, Phasi, Kodala in Odisha's Ganjam district; Sudhir Kumar Swain, a resident of Makrapoli, Gangapur, Ganjam district; and Mithun Pradhan, a resident of Bartulu, Jamuni, also in Ganjam district.

The court sentenced each of the three convicts to 10 years' rigorous imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs one lakh on each.

The NCB said the seized contraband had already been disposed of on a pre-trial basis in accordance with the prescribed procedure.

In a statement, the NCB said, "This conviction reinforces NCB's commitment to dismantling drug supply chains and ensures that those exploiting inter-state transport channels for narcotics trafficking face the full force of the law."

The agency also reiterated its commitment to the national vision of a "Drug-Free India (Nasha Mukh Bharat)" and urged the public to share information related to drug trafficking through the MANAS National Narcotics Helpline on the toll-free number, stating that the identity of informants would

Three years after fleeing, Kerala drug haul accused held in Abu Dhabi on Interpol red notice

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: After being three years on the run, a Thiruvananthapuram native, against whom the Interpol had issued a red corner notice in connection with a massive drug haul case registered in Thiruvananthapuram, was detained at Abu Dhabi airport this week.

Sources in the state police's crime branch confirmed that they had received official intimation about the detention of Shaun Sunil Bert, who had fled the state before being booked by the excise in July 2023 in the seizure of 155 kg of ganja and 60g of MDMA from a rented house in Thumba.

A resident of Valiya Veli, Shaun fled the country after the excise arrested four of his accomplices. Crime branch sources said they have informed the police headquarters and the excise department of the detention.


"The government will now form a team of police and excise officials to bring the detainee back," said a source. The excise, through the police's crime branch wing, had moved the documents required to issue the red corner notice to the CBI, the nodal agency for the Interpol.

As per sources, Shaun could have been detained much earlier had the department concerned government not been lethargic in releasing the `28,000 required to translate the case's documents, spanning around 250 pages, to Arabic. Translating the documents is the established procedure with the UAE courts, and only after a local court orders arrest can an accused be brought to India.

Though the excise department had requested sanctioning the amount to get Shaun, a key member of a drug cartel, extradited from the UAE, it was kept in cold storage for two years by taxes department.

TNIE had earlier reported about the bureaucratic procrastination following which the government directed the department to release the fund.

A Thai Airways flight attendant's arrest in Australia for smuggling heroin has exposed a growing trend of international drug syndicates attempting to recruit airline crew members through social media.

Early in the morning on June 18, an unsolicited message slipped into the TikTok inbox of a thirty-year-old flight attendant based in Bangkok. Sending a series of direct enquiries, an unknown account asked if she was flying to Australia, if she participated in carry-for-hire services and what her financial rate would be. Flying for a regional budget carrier and well-aware of strict industry safety regulations, she chose to ignore and forget the interaction.

The reality of that close encounter only set in days later when a fellow flight attendant from the national carrier, Thai Airways, was charged with importing over one kilogram of heroin into Australia, hidden cleverly inside the linings of several tote bags.

The rare and highly publicised detention of a national airline staff member has triggered widespread alarm across Thailand, raising urgent questions about the efficacy of airport security protocols. There is growing concern that sophisticated international drug trafficking networks are now systematically targeting commercial air crews to slip high-value illicit substances into lucrative foreign markets.

During a high-level meeting of the national anti-drug committee, Thai Prime Minister Anutin Charnvirakul expressed deep distress over the trend, noting that at least six individuals travelling from Thailand had already been charged with commercial drug trafficking in the first half of the year alone.

"According to reports, in the first half of this year, there have already been at least six cases of people travelling from Thailand who were charged with commercial drug trafficking," Thai Prime Minister Charnvirakul. "This is considered a high number... and it damages the country's image," he added.

In response to the growing crisis, the Thai government has pledged immediate and sweeping reforms to aviation security. A government spokesperson announced that the country's primary airport operator will radically improve baggage screening and physical inspections, specifically expanding these strict checks to include all flight crew members.

Concurrently, commercial airlines are moving to enforce severe disciplinary actions against any staff found carrying or accepting items on behalf of third parties. While industry veterans reiterate that the "no carry-for-hire" policy is a fundamental, universally understood rule among personnel, the allure of benefits continues to pose a vulnerability.

Investigations led by Thailand's Office of the Narcotics Control Board have peeled back the layers of this digital recruitment strategy. The anonymous TikTok account that initiated contact in June operated under a Thai alias translating to "Powder is Powder" and was directly linked to a syndicate creating fake social media personas to scout for international couriers.

In the case of the arrested Thai Airways employee, authorities discovered she had initially posted in a social media group catering to paid overseas transport. A Facebook user operating under the pseudonym "Rose Rose" subsequently contacted her and the two ultimately settled on a courier fee of just 8,800 baht, just above Rs 25,000. For that money, the employee took a risk on a package that the Australian Federal Police later valued at an estimated street market price of USD 347,150 (Rs 3.31 crore).

This aggressive recruitment pivot by syndicates coincides with a massive surge in drug production just beyond Thailand's borders. According to data from the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, opium poppy cultivation in neighbouring Myanmar reached a decade-long high following significant supply drops in Afghanistan.

Plagued by civil conflict and severe economic hardship, farmers in Myanmar have increasingly turned to the illicit trade, turning the war-torn nation into the world's primary source of illicit opium. Because these massive production facilities are landlocked, trafficking networks rely on concealing the refined heroin inside everyday export items like clothing, coffee packets and vases to move them through Thailand to the rest of the world.

While the arrest in Australia exposed a critical vulnerability in aviation staffing, it also allowed law enforcement to disrupt a much larger smuggling operation. Police Major Suriya Singhakamol, Secretary-General of the narcotics board, revealed that the same network had finalised plans to ship five additional drug-laden packages from Bangkok to Australia and Taiwan over the turn of July.

Alert authorities managed to intercept the cargo, seizing an additional 24.38 kilograms of heroin meticulously hidden inside winter jackets, traditional silk clothing and coffee sachets.

As Thai agencies coordinate with Australian and Taiwanese counter-narcotics units to trace the international destination cells, local police have already arrested a Thai man and his Laotian wife under suspicion of running the domestic pipeline that funnelled these parcels from the border provinces straight into the capital.

The Kohima District NCORD meeting reviewed anti-drug initiatives, pharmacy inspections and enforcement actions.

DIMAPUR — The District Committee for the Narco Coordination Centre (NCORD) held a meeting under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner, Kohima, B Henok Buchem, in his office chamber on Friday to review the district's efforts in combating drug abuse and illicit trafficking.

According to a DIPR report, the deputy commissioner reviewed the action taken since the last meeting, including inspections of pharmacies, and urged all concerned departments to strengthen coordinated efforts in addressing drug-related issues in the district.

The drug inspector informed the meeting that audits and surveys of pharmacies are being carried out across the district.

Inspection of 15 retail pharmacies and five wholesale establishments found them compliant with the prescribed norms.

The meeting was informed that Kohima district has seven registered wholesalers and around 70 registered retailers.

During inspections, invoices, storage conditions, disposal of expired medicines, availability of Schedule H1 drugs and CCTV records are being verified.

The Police department presented the district's enforcement activities, informing that four persons had been arrested in recent drug-related cases.

The department also highlighted the activation of Drug Intervention Programmes (DIPs) in all colonies and ongoing implementation of drug-free zone initiatives.

Concern was expressed over the increasing prevalence of drug use among school students and the need for stronger preventive measures and awareness programmes in educational institutions.

During the discussion, the deputy commissioner sought information on available techniques and tools for detecting drugs in schools.

The drug inspector stated that testing largely depends on the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL), where reports often take several months due to limited resources, affecting timely investigation.

The meeting also deliberated on the changing methods adopted by drug traffickers and the legal procedures to be followed while acting on credible information.

The School Education department informed the meeting that students found using drugs are provided counselling, while strict measures are enforced against tobacco sales near educational institutions in accordance with existing regulations.

The meeting also discussed the need for suitable drug detection mechanisms and strengthening rehabilitation efforts.

Manipur Police on July 2 arrested three residents of Churachandpur district from their respective residences under Churachandpur Police Station in connection with a narcotics case.

Contraband and other incriminating items were recovered during the operation.

The arrested individuals have been identified as Zamngaihlian Tombing (48) of Zion Veng, New Lamka, Niangngaihching (43) of Pangzawl, and Manglunsang Tawtak (36) of Pangzawl.

During the operation, police seized 186 soap cases containing suspected brown sugar weighing approximately 2.5 kg, cash amounting to ₹31,43,500, a white Bolero vehicle (registration number MN-06LX-5142), and a cash-counting machine. Police said further

investigation into the case is underway.

Assam Rifles Seize 55,000 Illegal Codeine Cough Syrup bottles at Tripura's Agartala Railway Station

Assam Rifles Seize 55,000 Illegal Codeine Cough Syrup bottles

GUWAHATI: In a major crackdown on narcotics trafficking in the Northeast, Assam Rifles under Spear Corps, acting jointly with the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) Agartala, seized 55,626 bottles of illegal Codeine-based cough syrup worth approximately ₹1.27 crore at Agartala Railway Station in Tripura.

The operation was launched after Assam Rifles received credible intelligence about the movement of contraband through the railway network. Acting swiftly, the joint team intercepted a suspicious consignment and conducted a thorough search, uncovering the large cache of Codeine-based substances that had been concealed for illegal transportation.


The recovered contraband has since been handed over to the DRI, Agartala, for further investigation and legal proceedings.

In a related but separate operation conducted in Gossaipur, Udharbond area of Assam's Cachar district, Assam Rifles teamed up with Cachar Police to apprehend two smugglers. The joint team recovered 2,500 bottles (21 boxes) of Codeine Phosphate valued at approximately ₹7.25 lakh from the accused.

The seized contraband and the two apprehended individuals have been handed over to the concerned agencies for further legal action.

Toofan gathers 'special' force; Kerala to step up interstate anti-drug drive

KOCHI: Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala on Friday announced the formation of a special task force (STF) under the direct leadership of the state police chief to strengthen Operation Toofan, the state's flagship anti-drug campaign. The STF will coordinate anti-narcotics operations across Kerala and spearhead efforts to dismantle interstate drug-trafficking networks.

Launching 'Toofan Jagaran' at Perumbavoor in Ernakulam district as part of the second phase of Operation Toofan: The Narco Hunt, Chennithala said additional police personnel would also be deployed in Perumbavoor to intensify anti-drug enforcement.

The minister said 5,260 drug cases have been registered and 5,634 persons arrested since the launch of Operation Toofan. He also announced that Kerala will host a meeting of the directors general of police of neighbouring states on July 8 to strengthen intelligence sharing and coordinate action against the flow of narcotics into the state.

"Drug syndicates operate across state borders. We will share intelligence and conduct joint operations to dismantle these networks," Chennithala said.

Describing Perumbavoor as the "plywood capital of Asia", the minister said drug syndicates had attempted to misuse the town's large migrant worker population to expand their operations. He said Operation Toofan was aimed at restoring Perumbavoor's identity and eliminating organised drug trafficking through sustained enforcement and public participation.

State Police Chief Ravada Chandrasekhar issued a stern warning to drug traffickers, saying they were not only breaking the law but also destroying Kerala's future.

Ignoring intermittent rain, hundreds of students, traders, migrant workers, and members of the public joined Home Minister Chennithala, the DGP Chandrasekhar, senior police officers, and public representatives in the anti-drug rally and public meeting, reflecting widespread support for the campaign.

The programme featured an anti-drug pledge, mass rally, hoisting of the Operation Toofan flag, release of anti-drug balloons, and an interaction with representatives of the trade and industrial sectors.

After the public meeting, Chennithala visited Bhai Colony, where he interacted with migrant workers and local residents. He presented 'Toofan Warrior' badges to representatives of migrant workers and administered the anti-drug pledge in Hindi.

Speaking at the function, Chalakudy MP Benny Behanan said he would raise the need to address shortcomings in the NDPS Act when Parliament reconvenes. Perumbavoor MLA Manoj Moothedan, who presided over the function, described the campaign as the beginning of Perumbavoor's journey towards becoming a drug-free town. Kunnathunadu MLA V P Sajeendran called for rewarding officers who detect the highest number of drug cases and urged the public not to extend support to those involved in narcotics offences.

Operation Toofan Nodal Officer Putta Vimaladitya, Ernakulam Rural SP K S Sudarshan, Perumbavoor ASP Hardik Meena, and other senior police officers were among those present.

Man arrested for supplying illegal prescription drugs, vials and syringes

COIMBATORE: The Coimbatore city police on Friday arrested a 25-year-old man on charges peddling prescription drugs, intoxicating pills, vials and syringes.


The arrested has been identified as B Abdul Rahman of Kottaimedu in Ukkadam. Police seized 1,200 medicinal vials, 100 psychotropic tablets and 30 syringes from his possession.

According to police, the breakthrough came during routine anti-narcotics patrolling in Ukkadam. Acting on intelligence gathered from a few detained users, police successfully tracked the distribution chain back to Abdul Rahman, who was actively operating in the Kottaimedu area. Subsequent interrogations

revealed that his primary consumer base comprised local youth, students and low-income daily wage workers looking for cheap synthetic drugs.

Speaking on the operational breakthrough, Ukkadam police inspector Gomathi stated, "By tracking the active consumers of these intoxicating pills and syringes, we were able to reverse-engineer the network and nab the primary seller. We are currently tracking the larger suppliers who smuggled these pharmaceutical drugs to him. We are monitoring individuals using these substances. We strongly advise the youth not to ruin their future and ruin their lives by engaging in such destructive activities."

Hyderabad: The Telangana Police destroyed seized narcotic substances worth more than Rs 11.77 crore on Friday, July 3.

The action was taken as part of the Nationwide Special Drive Programme that is being conducted from June 26 to July 10.

The drug disposal programme was carried out under the guidance of the Director of the EAGLE Force. The Drug Disposal Committee, led by Chairman and SP East R. Giridhar, IPS, along with Additional SP P. Krishna Murthy and DSP N. Buchaiah, supervised the operation.

The contraband disposed of included 2,118.850 kg ganja valued at around Rs 10.59 crore, 135 grams cocaine valued at Rs 67.50 lakh, 488 grams ecstasy pills valued at Rs 48.80 lakh, and 160 grams OG Kush weed valued at Rs 1.60 lakh.

The total estimated value of the destroyed drugs was Rs 11.77 crore.

Belagavi: The CCB team of the Belagavi City Police has arrested two people and seized 24.80 grams of heroin worth Rs 4.96 lakh during a raid near the APMC Fruit Market complex in Belagavi. A woman from Mumbai alleged to have supplied the contraband has also been booked.

The operation was carried out by a team led by CCB Police Inspector Manjunath Nayak, along with PSI Manjunath Bhajantri and other personnel.

The arrested have been identified as Mahadev Gajanan Patil (28) of Patil Galli and Vinayak Balu Khandale (25) of Ramdev Galli.


According to police, the duo was allegedly found possessing and transporting heroin near the staircase of the APMC Fruit Market complex for sale when a CCB team conducted the raid on Thursday.

The APMC Police registered a case under Sections 8(c) and 21(b) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

The police also named a woman 'Amma' from Mumbai, alleging that she had supplied the heroin to the accused for distribution.

CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu was among 21 States where a Jharkhand-based drug syndicate allegedly supplied ganja through Speed Post, with Hyderabad police arresting the alleged kingpin who is accused of operating the racket for the past five years.

Hyderabad Police Commissioner CV Anand said the accused, Satyam Mishra, allegedly used India Post's Speed Post service to dispatch ganja parcels to distributors across Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Maharashtra and several other States.

Police said the racket operated from the forested areas of Nimiaghat in Jharkhand's Giridih district. Satyam Mishra, along with his brother Shubham Mishra and associates Sachin Mishra, Rahul Jha and Santosh Pandit, allegedly cultivated ganja and shipped it through post offices at Isri Bazar in Giridih and Phusro Bazar in Bokaro district.

According to investigators, the gang packed ganja in small boxes and declared them as medicines while booking them through Speed Post. Orders were allegedly received through WhatsApp and the parcels were delivered to distributors in 21 States.

Police estimate that the syndicate earned more than Rs 20 crore over the past five years through the illegal trade.

The racket came to light after Hyderabad police detected suspicious ganja parcels sent from Isri Bazar to Gudimalkapur and from Phusro Bazar to SR Nagar. Two alleged recipients, identified as Sushant Vyas and Laddu, were arrested during the investigation.

Based on information gathered from them, a Hyderabad Special Task Force tracked the source of the parcels. After keeping surveillance near the post offices for about 20 days, the police arrested Satyam Mishra.

Police said the remaining accused are absconding and efforts are under way to trace them.

Hyderabad: In a major crackdown, the Bhavani Nagar Police, alongside the Charminar Zone Task Force, arrested two ganja peddlers and seized 2.334 kilograms of ganja during a joint operation in the Old City.

The arrested persons were identified as Mohd Naseer alias Chaku Naseer alias Choti Chaku, a resident of Talabkatta, and Mohd Mehraj Ali alias Amer, a resident of Yakutpura. Both accused were produced before a court and remanded to judicial custody.

A special team conducted a targeted raid beside the railway track at Talabkatta on July 2 at 4:10 pm. Officers intercepted a red Honda Activa operating without a registration number plate carrying two men. The duo attempted to flee after spotting the police but was swiftly apprehended.

Police recovered 2.334 kilograms of ganja, including five small packets ready for sale, alongside six empty zip-lock covers, Rs 6,000 in cash, the Honda Activa, a keypad phone, and a Samsung S22 Ultra mobile phone.

The seized ganja is estimated to be worth around Rs 54,900. During interrogation, the accused confessed that they had procured the contraband from a supplier in Nagpur, Maharashtra, and transported it to Hyderabad to sell in small packets to local customers for illegal profits.

Charminar DCP Kiran Khare Prabhakar stated that Naseer is a rowdy sheeter of Bhavani Nagar Police Station with a lengthy criminal history involving more than 20 cases, including several under the NDPS Act, Arms Act, and property offences. Mehraj Ali was also found to have been previously booked in NDPS-related cases.

In a separate enforcement operation, the Charminar Zone Task Force team, along with Abids police, apprehended four interstate ganja transporters from Maharashtra near Haj House in Nampally, seizing 23 kilograms of dry ganja. The arrested persons are Amit Achutrao Kale, Seema Nitin Potbhare, Arthi Maruthi Khandare, and one juvenile.

Police stated that Amit and Seema are habituated to transporting ganja from Odisha and Andhra Pradesh to Maharashtra with the assistance of Arthi and the juvenile on a commission basis.

For the past six months, they have been procuring and transporting contraband from agency areas to Maharashtra via Hyderabad. Task Force Additional DCP Ande Srinivasa Rao stated that on Thursday they alighted at Secunderabad Railway Station, engaged an auto to Haj House, and waited for a private bus before being apprehended.

Interstate narcotics supply intercepted

Telangana's EAGLE Force and Khammam Police arrested the transporter and foiled what officials described as an interstate narcotics supply operation.

The seizure was made by the Regional Narcotics Control Cell (RNCC), Khammam, in coordination with Khammam Police during a vehicle check near the Primary Agricultural Cooperative Society at Rejarla in Sathupally, Khammam District.

Officials intercepted a Toyota Etios and found 180 kg of ganja concealed inside the vehicle.

Consignment sourced from Odisha

Police identified the arrested accused as Prabin Bhatra (31), a labourer from Malkangiri district of Odisha. Preliminary investigation revealed that the ganja had been procured from Malkangiri and was being transported to Hyderabad for illegal sale and distribution.

Investigators said the accused had agreed to transport the consignment after being promised Rs 10,000 for the delivery. He was allegedly instructed to contact the receiver upon reaching Hyderabad, but the operation was thwarted before the drugs could enter the city.

Two accused are on the run

Police have launched a search for two absconding accused.

They have been identified as Bhikari alias Rohan, a resident of Chittrakonda in Odisha, who allegedly arranged the transportation, and Nageshwar, a resident of Nandyal in Andhra Pradesh, and the owner of the Toyota Etios used in the offence.

Repeat offender

Officials said Prabin Bhatra has a criminal background. He was previously arrested in a ganja trafficking case registered at Makavarapalem Police Station in Andhra Pradesh's Anakapalli district in 2023 and had served nearly 10 months in Visakhapatnam Central Jail before his release.

Vehicle and mobile phone seized

Police seized the 180 kg of ganja, the Toyota Etios used for transportation and a mobile phone from the accused. The seized property and the accused were handed over to Sathupally Police Station, where a case has been registered under the NDPS Act.

Further investigation is in progress to trace the absconding accused and identify others linked to the interstate drug network.

Public asked to be vigilant about drug abuse

Reiterating its commitment to a drug-free Telangana, the EAGLE Force appealed to citizens, particularly parents, to remain vigilant against drug abuse among youth and students.

The agency urged the public to report information related to narcotics trafficking through its toll-free helpline or WhatsApp, assuring confidentiality for informants.

Int'l charas network busted, drugs worth ₹9 crore seized

New Delhi: Delhi Police have busted an alleged international drug trafficking network with the arrest of three Nepalese nationals and the seizure of 8.598 kg of high-grade charas, valued at around Rs 9 crore in the international illicit market.


The accused — Bharat Thapa (32), Govind Budha (32) and Jyoti Pun Magar (50), all residents of Kotla Mubarakpur — were arrested following a raid by the South district's Special Staff after receiving specific intelligence about a charas supply network operating in Delhi-NCR.

Police said the trio allegedly ran a supply chain linked to the Indo-Nepal border, using WhatsApp to receive orders, digital payment platforms to collect money and deleting chats and call records after every transaction to evade detection. Deliveries were allegedly made using auto-rickshaws and bike taxis.

During the raid conducted on June 29, police recovered 5.566 kg of charas from Jyoti Pun Magar, 1.552 kg from Bharat Thapa and 1.480 kg from Govind Budha. Investigators believe Jyoti was the principal supplier, allegedly sourcing the contraband from a Nepal-based contact near the Sonauli border before it was distributed across Delhi-NCR by the other two accused.

An FIR has been registered under relevant provisions of the NDPS Act. Police said none of the accused has any previous criminal record. Investigators are now examining digital devices and financial transactions to identify other members of the network and trace the Nepal-based supplier.

अदालत ने 30 हजार रुपये का आर्थिक दंड भी लगाया संवाद न्यूज एजेंसी

Navya-Malik drug-case: रायपुर। राजधानी के चर्चित नव्या मलिक एमडीएमए ड्रग मामले की जांच अब विशेष जांच दल को सौंप दी गई है। मामले की गंभीरता को देखते हुए पुलिस ने एक सहायक पुलिस आयुक्त, दो निरीक्षकों सहित पांच सदस्यीय टीम का गठन किया है। एसआईटी पूरे ड्रग सिंडिकेट, सप्लाय नेटवर्क और आर्थिक लेनदेन की नए सिरे से जांच करेगी। वहीं, प्रवर्तन निदेशालय (Ed) भी मामले से जुड़े कथित मनी ट्रेल और अवैध कमाई की अलग जांच में जुटा है।

Navya-Malik drug-case: अगस्त 2025 में हुआ था खुलासा

यह मामला 23 अगस्त 2025 को सामने आया था, जब रायपुर पुलिस ने एमडीएमए ड्रग के साथ हर्ष आहूजा, मोनू बिश्रोई और दीप धनोरिया को गिरफ्तार किया था। पूछताछ के दौरान मिले इनपुट के आधार पर पुलिस ने मुंबई से नव्या मलिक को गिरफ्तार किया। जांच एजेंसियों का दावा है कि नव्या मलिक रायपुर की हाईप्रोफाइल पार्टियों, निजी आयोजनों और नाइट क्लबों में एमडीएमए की सप्लाय से जुड़ी हुई थी और कई आयोजनों में उसकी मौजूदगी भी सामने आई थी।

Navya-Malik drug-case: चार्जशीट में कई रसूखदारों के नाम

पुलिस की चार्जशीट के अनुसार, ड्रग तस्करी का नेटवर्क मोबाइल फोन और अन्य डिजिटल माध्यमों के जरिए संचालित किया जा रहा था। जांच में यह भी सामने आया कि आरोपी मोनू बिश्रोई के माध्यम से कई लोगों तक ड्रग पहुंचाई गई। चार्जशीट में ऋषिराज टंडन, विधि अग्रवाल सहित अन्य लोगों के नामों का भी उल्लेख किया गया है। वहीं, मोहित ईशरानी पर ड्रग सप्लाय के बदले भुगतान करने का आरोप भी जांच में दर्ज किया गया है।

Navya-Malik drug-case: हर पहलू की होगी दोबारा जांच

एसआईटी अब मामले के सभी पहलुओं की नए सिरे से पड़ताल करेगी। जांच का दायरा एमडीएमए के स्रोत, मुख्य सप्लायर की पहचान, रायपुर, मुंबई और अन्य राज्यों से जुड़े नेटवर्क, आरोपियों की भूमिका तथा बैंक खातों, यूपीआई ट्रांजैक्शन और नकद लेनदेन तक रहेगा। इसके अलावा मोबाइल फोन, लैपटॉप, कॉल डिटेल् रिकॉर्ड, व्हाट्सएप चैट और अन्य डिजिटल साक्ष्यों का फॉरेंसिक विश्लेषण भी कराया जाएगा।

Navya-Malik drug-case: हाईप्रोफाइल पार्टियां भी जांच के दायरे में

जांच एजेंसियां निजी पार्टियों, क्लबों, पब और कथित टेक्नो पार्टियों में ड्रग सप्लाय के आरोपों की भी जांच करेंगी। चार्जशीट में जिन लोगों के नाम सामने आए हैं, उनके अलावा ड्रग खरीदने वालों और पूरे नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य व्यक्तियों की भूमिका भी खंगाली जाएगी। साथ ही यह भी पता लगाया जाएगा कि इस गिरोह के तार दूसरे राज्यों या पहले दर्ज एनडीपीएस मामलों से जुड़े हैं या नहीं।

Navya-Malik drug-case: ईडी करेगी वित्तीय लेनदेन की जांच

ड्रग नेटवर्क से जुड़ी कथित अवैध कमाई की जांच भी तेज कर दी गई है। ईडी बैंक खातों, संपत्तियों, वित्तीय लेनदेन और मनी ट्रेल की जांच कर रही है। एजेंसियां यह भी पता लगाने का प्रयास करेंगी कि इस नेटवर्क को किसी प्रभावशाली व्यक्ति, कारोबारी या अन्य लोगों का संरक्षण प्राप्त था या नहीं।

थाना सिटी-2 के प्रभारी सुखविंदर सिंह के नेतृत्व में पुलिस टीम फिरोजपुर रोड स्थित एक पेट्रोल पंप के पास संदिग्ध व्यक्तियों और वाहनों की जांच कर रही थी। इसी दौरान एक विश्वसनीय मुखबिर ने सूचना दी कि बलबीर बस्ती निवासी करण शर्मा अपने दो अज्ञात साथियों के साथ कार में भारी मात्रा में हेरोइन लेकर शहर में घूम रहा है। सूचना मिलते ही पुलिस ने तुरंत नाकाबंदी कर संबंधित कार को रोकने का प्रयास किया, लेकिन कार सवार तीनों आरोपी वाहन छोड़कर मौके से फरार हो गए। इसके बाद पुलिस ने कार की तलाशी ली, जिसमें से 1 किलो 20 ग्राम हेरोइन बरामद हुई।

तलाशी के दौरान कार से एक इलेक्ट्रॉनिक कांटा, 20 पारदर्शी प्लास्टिक के लिफाफे, एक आईफोन, एक पर्स, जिसमें 500 रुपये नकद, एक आधार कार्ड तथा कार से संबंधित दस्तावेज भी बरामद किए गए। पुलिस ने हेरोइन, कार और अन्य सामान को अपने कब्जे में ले लिया है। इस संबंध में डीएसपी तरलोचन सिंह ने बताया कि बरामद हेरोइन की मात्रा व्यावसायिक (कमर्शियल) श्रेणी में आती है। उन्होंने कहा कि आरोपियों की गिरफ्तारी के लिए विभिन्न स्थानों पर छापेमारी की जा रही है। साथ ही यह भी जांच की जा रही है कि आरोपी किस नशा तस्कर गिरोह से जुड़े हैं, हेरोइन की यह खेप कहां से लाई गई थी और इसकी सप्लाई कहां की जानी थी। डीएसपी ने कहा कि मामले की गहन जांच की जा रही है और इस अवैध कारोबार से जुड़े किसी भी व्यक्ति को बख्शा नहीं जाएगा।

तलाशी के दौरान आरोपी की जेब से 30 ग्राम हेरोइन और एक मोबाइल फोन बरामद किया गया। इसके बाद आरोपी के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज कर पूछताछ शुरू की गई।

डीसीपी क्राइम एवं ट्रैफिक अमरिंदर सिंह ने बताया कि पूछताछ में तुषार ने खुलासा किया कि वह यह हेरोइन हिमाचल प्रदेश निवासी हर्षित शर्मा के कहने पर सप्लाय करने आया था। आरोपी की निशानदेही पर पुलिस ने हर्षित शर्मा को भी गिरफ्तार कर लिया।

बता दें कि गत बुधवार रात स्पेशल डिटेक्शन टीम ने पड़गल इलाके में नाकाबंदी के दौरान पंजाब नंबर की एक स्कूटी पर सवार दो युवकों के कब्जे से 1 किलो 90.68 ग्राम चरस बरामद की थी। इस मामले में होशियारपुर (पंजाब) निवासी तरुण कुमार और मानव को गिरफ्तार कर थाना सदर में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज किया था। आरोपियों से हुई सख्त पूछताछ में उन्होंने कबूला कि चरस की यह खेप उन्हें कुल्लू से सप्लाय की गई थी।

आरोपियों से मिली जानकारी के आधार पर पुलिस ने मुख्य सप्लायर की पहचान शंभू राम (41) निवासी जच्छनी डाकघर एवं तहसील भुंतर व जिला कुल्लू के रूप में की। जानकारी पुख्ता होते ही थाना सदर बिलासपुर की टीम ने कुल्लू में दबिश दी और आरोपी शंभू राम को धर दबोचा। पुलिस अब शंभू राम से कड़ी पूछताछ कर रही है। यह पता लगाने का प्रयास किया जा रहा है कि वह कितने लंबे समय से इस कारोबार में सक्रिय है, उसके नेटवर्क में और कौन-कौन शामिल हैं और चरस की यह खेप किन-किन राज्यों में पहुंचाई जा रही थी। पुलिस का मानना है कि इस मुख्य सप्लायर की गिरफ्तारी से नशा तस्करी के एक बड़े और अंतर्राज्यीय नेटवर्क का भंडाफोड़ हो सकता है।

एसपी बिलासपुर अभिषेक धीमान ने मुख्य सप्लायर की गिरफ्तारी की पुष्टि की है। उन्होंने बताया कि पुलिस मामले के हर पहलू की गहनता से जांच कर रही है। हमारा मुख्य उद्देश्य इस पूरे सप्लाय नेटवर्क को जड़ से ध्वस्त करना है, ताकि नशे के इस कारोबार पर पूरी तरह लगाम लगाई जा सके।

Odisha Police Torch 64.8 MT Ganja in Drug-Free Drive

Odisha Police have marked a major milestone under the Nishamukta Abhiyan by destroying more than 64.8 metric tonnes (64,816.17 kg) of seized ganja till 2.7.2026 in the ongoing statewide narcotics disposal drive.

The exercise was carried out under the supervision of the State Task Force (STF) of the CID Crime Branch.

According to the latest district wise progress report, 78,600.68 kg of seized ganja was identified for destruction in in the special drive from 26.6.2026 to 10.7.2026

Of this, 64,816.17 kg has already been destroyed, till 2.7.2026. The remaining 13,784.22 kg will be destroyed by 10.7.2026.

The campaign witnessed significant contributions from districts across the state. Kandhamal led the drive by destroying 31,445.40 kg of seized ganja, followed by Boudh with 16,127 kg, Malkangiri with 8,969.94 kg, Gajapati with 3,116 kg and Bargarh with 1,306 kg. The performance of these districts played a key role in Odisha Police achieving the destruction of more than 64.8 metric tonnes of seized ganja during Phase 1 of the campaign.

Several districts have also achieved or exceeded their destruction targets, including Malkangiri, Gajapati, Koraput, Bolangir, Mayurbhanj, Bargarh, Balasore, Keonjhar, SRP Rourkela and Sundargarh. The progress reflects the sustained efforts of Odisha Police to eliminate seized narcotics and strengthen the fight against the illegal drug trade.

In this context, a programme on the National Level Pre Trial Drug Destruction Special Drive was held recently at Police Bhawan in Bhubaneswar. As per the directions of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Government of India, the nationwide drive is being conducted from June 26 to July 10, 2026 to accelerate the destruction of pre trial seized narcotic substances.

Director General of Police Yogesh Bahadur Khurania has accorded special priority to intensifying the fight against drug trafficking and the narcotics trade.

Reaffirming Odisha Police's unwavering commitment to a drug free state, he said, "Our fight against the illegal drug trade, smuggling and narcotics mafias will be intensified further in the days ahead. Odisha Police will maintain zero tolerance towards those who violate the law. Through coordinated enforcement, the use of advanced technology, active public participation and strong determination, we remain committed to building a drug free, safe and empowered Odisha."

STF busts interstate Ganja trafficking racket in Bhubaneswar, 4 arrested

The Odisha STF dismantled an interstate ganja trafficking network in Bhubaneswar, arresting four accused, including the alleged kingpin. Officials seized 50.5 kg of cannabis and launched a wider investigation into the syndicate.

Odisha Crime Branch's [Special Task Force \(STF\)](#) busted a major interstate Ganja trafficking network operating from Bhubaneswar, arresting four persons including alleged kingpin of the syndicate, on Friday.

The operation was carried out following intelligence inputs at a rented house in Pandav Nagar under Badagada police limits, which was allegedly being used as a warehouse for storing and dispatching commercial quantities of [Ganja \(cannabis\)](#).

During the raid, STF officials seized 50.5 kg of ganja packed in 25 packets along with four mobile phones believed to have been used in coordinating the illegal operation.

Police said the contraband was being transported from the warehouse to destinations including Kerala and Bengaluru as part of an organised interstate trafficking network.

According to the STF, the alleged kingpin has been identified as Mohammed Asif of Kerala. Another accused, Subhransu Sekhar Panda alias Bablu, allegedly managed the warehouse and supervised the transportation of ganja to different states.

The remaining two accused, Chandan Digal and Rashmi Ranjan Digal of Kandhamal district, are suspected to have supplied the contraband to the syndicate at the local level.


All four accused have been booked under the provisions of the [NDPS Act](#) and produced before a court. Officials said the investigation is continuing to identify other members of the syndicate and trace its financial network, including possible interstate links and the flow of funds connected to the illegal narcotics trade.

“Last night, based on intelligence, an operation was conducted where a syndicate was busted. We have arrested a total of four people, and their complete roles and profiles have been identified. Two of them are residents of Kandhamal district. Their names are Chandan Digal and Rashmi Ranjan Digal. Their role was to bring ganja from Kandhamal to Bhubaneswar and deliver it by coordinating with the other syndicate members,” STF DIG, Kanwar Vishal Singh, said.

“The third person, who is the kingpin, is named Mohammed Asif, a resident of Kerala. He is the kingpin, mastermind, or main person in charge of this syndicate. He was supplying this ganja in small quantities. Their modus operandi was to transport small quantities of Ganja via different trains, buses, or other means. According to our information, he was taking it to Kerala and Bangalore. He has also been arrested,” the STF DIG stated.

“Another person who has been arrested is Subhransu Panda, a resident of Balasore. He was the second-in-command of this syndicate. He was in charge of their temporary warehouse and coordinated it. He was the main supplier, and according to the information obtained so far, he was supplying to West Bengal and Jharkhand,” the senior cop added.

इस संबंध में मुफस्सिल थानाध्यक्ष अजित प्रसाद सिंह ने बताया कि बरामद मादक पदार्थ को जब्त कर आरोपी के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत प्राथमिकी दर्ज कर ली गई है। पूछताछ की प्रक्रिया पूरी होने के बाद उसे न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया गया है। वहीं पुलिस यह भी पता लगाने में जुटी है कि बरामद ब्राउन शुगर की आपूर्ति कहां से हुई और इसके नेटवर्क में अन्य कौन-कौन लोग शामिल हैं।
