महाराजगंज में भारत-नेपाल सीमा पर सोनौली बॉर्डर पर एसएसबी और नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो (एनसीबी) की संयुक्त टीम ने बड़ी कार्रवाई की। शनिवार रात करीब 9 बजे लगभग 2.5 किलोग्राम मेथाकॉलोन ड्रग्स बरामद की गई। यह ड्रग्स एक ट्रॉली बैग में गुप्त रूप से कार्बन पेपर से लपेटकर छिपाई गई थी। इस मामले में मणिपुर की एक महिला को गिरफ्तार किया गया है।

यह कार्रवाई 22वीं वाहिनी एसएसबी के कमांडेंट शक्ति सिंह के निर्देश पर की गई। सहायक कमांडेंट प्रिया यादव के नेतृत्व में एसएसबी की 'बी' समवाय सोनौली और नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो, गोरखपुर की संयुक्त टीम ने इसे अंजाम दिया। टीम सीमा स्तंभ संख्या 517/2 के पास नेपाल से भारत आने वाले यात्रियों की नियमित जांच कर रही थी।

जांच के दौरान, नेपाल से भारत में प्रवेश कर रही एक महिला के ट्रॉली बैग को बैग स्कैनर से चेक किया गया। स्कैनिंग में संदिग्ध वस्तु दिखने पर सुरक्षाकर्मियों ने बैग की गहन तलाशी ली। तलाशी में बैग के अंदर बने विशेष खांचे से कार्बन पेपर में लिपटे पैकेट मिले। ड्रग डिटेक्शन किट से पुष्टि हुई कि यह पदार्थ मेथाकॉलोन ड्रग्स था, जिसका वजन लगभग 2.5 किलोग्राम था।

गिरफ्तार महिला की पहचान मणिपुर के ग्राम पचाई निवासी टी. संग मार्गहिंग (30 वर्ष) के रूप में हुई है। सुरक्षा एजेंसियों ने मादक पदार्थ जब्त कर महिला के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत कानूनी कार्रवाई शुरू कर दी है। यह भी जांच की जा रही है कि यह खेप किस तस्कर गिरोह से संबंधित है और इसकी आपूर्ति का गंतव्य क्या था।

एसएसबी अधिकारियों के अनुसार, भारत-नेपाल सीमा पर मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी रोकने के लिए लगातार संयुक्त अभियान चलाए जा रहे हैं। सीमा पर निगरानी बढ़ा दी गई है और संदिग्ध गतिविधियों पर विशेष नजर रखी जा रही है, ताकि तस्करी के प्रयासों को समय रहते विफल किया जा सके।

Cops in Canada stopped a car for dangerous driving, found a gun, drugs and Indian-origin criminal inside

Safaldeep Singh was arrested in Canada for suspected ties to an international criminal network.

A complaint of dangerous driving singled out a car that the patrol officers stopped in Edmonton, Canada. As the traffic cops searched the car, they found drugs, a gun, and a wanted man inside. Indian-origin Safaldeep Singh, wanted on a Canada-wide warrant for conspiracy to commit murder and extortion, was arrested by the Edmonton Police Service. Singh has suspected ties to the "For Brothers" gang, an organized criminal network linked to shootings and extortion targeting South Asian business owners and community members across Canada and the United States. The incident took place in May. 22-year-old Safaldeep Singh, 28-year-old Sandeep Singh and 22-year-old Divianshu Divianshu were arrested and charged with several [drug trafficking](#) and firearms-related offences. They were released on bail. Two search warrants conducted at Safaldeep Singh's residence on May 28 and June 23, 2026, resulted in the seizure of evidence consistent with vehicle re-vinning operations linked to extortion-related crimes and Safaldeep was again arrested on June 23 with charges of trafficking in property obtained by crime, possession of stolen property and unauthorized possession of a firearm, all in addition to his charges under the Canada-wide warrants. After Singh was processed on the EPS charges in Edmonton, he was transferred to Ontario to face the charges on his Canada-wide warrants. "We've been investigating extortion networks and their multi-jurisdictional linkages in Canada for some time now, and we have established a coordinated approach with a focus on effective intelligence collection, sharing, and enforcement action across provinces," says Staff Sergeant Eric Stewart, EPS Investigations Branch. "In this investigation, we're especially grateful to Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) and the Peel Regional Police for their close collaboration, which led to Singh's arrest and the connection to violent occurrences on the other side of the country." "Extortion and targeted violence have had a profound impact on victims, families,

and businesses, particularly within the South Asian community. Bringing those responsible to justice requires seamless collaboration across jurisdictions, and this investigation is a testament to what can be achieved when police services and our law enforcement partners work together toward a common goal. We thank the Edmonton Police Service for their exceptional collaboration and remain committed to pursuing those who seek to intimidate and harm our communities," said deputy chief Nick Milinovich, Peel Regional Police.

Two held with suspected heroin in Assam's Goalpara Police's anti-drug operation

Goalpara Police arrested two suspected drug peddlers and seized suspected heroin, cash and mobile phones in a targeted operation. The case is now being investigated to trace the source, map the network and identify any wider links.



Assam's Goalpara Police arrested two suspected drug peddlers during an anti-drug operation and seized suspected heroin, mobile phones and cash from their possession.

The arrested accused have been identified as Ilias Ansari and Basirul Islam.

According to police, the duo was apprehended during a targeted operation against drug trafficking in the district. Suspected heroin was recovered from their possession, along with mobile phones and cash believed to be linked to the alleged illegal trade.

Police have launched a detailed investigation to ascertain the source of the seized narcotics, identify the supply network and determine whether more individuals are involved in the case. Officials said further details are awaited as the investigation progresses.

The latest seizure comes amid Assam Police's sustained crackdown on narcotics across the state. In recent months, police have regularly busted drug trafficking networks, leading to multiple seizures of heroin, yaba tablets and other contraband, along with the arrest of several alleged traffickers. A 41-year-old man was arrested after police seized 40 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup allegedly being transported illegally in a taxi in Sikkim's Namchi district, officials said on Saturday, July 4.



A 41-year-old man was arrested after police seized 40 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup allegedly being transported illegally in a taxi in Sikkim's Namchi district, officials said on Saturday, July 4.

The accused was travelling in a Siliguri–Yangang service taxi when he was intercepted by police at Yangang following a tip-off.

During a search of the vehicle, police recovered and seized 40 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup, a prescription medicine that is often misused as a narcotic substance.

The accused was arrested under the provisions of the Sikkim Anti-Drugs Act, police said.

Officials said the operation was carried out based on specific intelligence inputs regarding the illegal transportation of controlled substances.

Police added that surveillance has been intensified along the Siliguri corridor, which is frequently used by traffickers attempting to smuggle narcotic and controlled substances into Sikkim.

Further investigation is underway to ascertain the source of the consignment and identify others who may be involved in the illegal trade.

NCORD Kohima reviews drug control measures; stresses awareness in schools

DIMAPUR: A meeting of the District Committee for the Narco Coordination Centre (NCORD) was held under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner B. Henok Buchem at his office chamber on July 3 to review Kohima district's efforts in combating drug abuse and illicit trafficking. According to DIPR report, chairing the meeting, the DC reviewed action taken since the last sitting, including inspections of pharmacies, and urged all departments to strengthen coordinated efforts against drug related issues. The Drug Inspector informed that audits and surveys of pharmacies were being carried out across the district. Inspections of 15 retail pharmacies and five wholesale establishments found them compliant with prescribed norms. Kohima district currently has seven registered wholesalers and around 70 registered retailers. During inspections, invoices, storage conditions, disposal of expired medicines, availability of Schedule H1 drugs and CCTV records were verified. The Police Department reported enforcement activities, including the arrest of four persons in recent drug related cases. It also highlighted the activation of Drug Intervention Programmes (DIPs) in all colonies and ongoing implementation of drug free zone initiatives. Concern was expressed over rising drug use among school students, with emphasis on stronger preventive measures and awareness programmes in educational institutions. The DC sought information on drug detection techniques in schools. The Drug Inspector explained that testing largely depends on the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL), where limited resources often delay reports, affecting timely investigation. The meeting also deliberated on evolving methods adopted by traffickers and the legal procedures to be followed when acting on credible information. The School Education Department informed that students found using drugs are provided counselling, while strict measures are enforced against tobacco sales near educational institutions. The meeting further discussed strengthening rehabilitation efforts and exploring suitable drug detection mechanisms.

Tripura Government Pursuing Zero-Tolerance Policy Against Drugs, Says CM Dr. Manik Saha

Agartala, July 04, 2026: Tripura Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha on Saturday asserted that the state government is pursuing a strict zero-tolerance policy against narcotics, emphasizing that law enforcement agencies have been given a free hand to act against drug traffickers without political interference.

Responding to questions from journalists on the recent seizure of narcotics transported by train, the Chief Minister said the interception of huge consignments reflected the vigilance and efficiency of the police rather than a failure of the anti-drug campaign.

“The fact that these consignments are being intercepted in huge quantities is a matter of satisfaction. Our police are active, and no one is being spared, irrespective of who they are. We are following the Union Home Minister’s zero-tolerance policy against drugs. However, arrests can only be made based on evidence and within the framework of the law,” Dr. Saha said.

He stated that several accused, including alleged kingpins, had been brought to Tripura from Delhi and other states and were currently in judicial custody. “We have given the police complete freedom to act, and the government does not interfere in investigations. Large quantities of narcotics worth crores of rupees are being seized and destroyed, making the illegal trade increasingly unprofitable,” he added.

On measures to strengthen border surveillance, the Chief Minister announced that the government would install advanced scanner machines despite their high cost. He said the scanners would help detect narcotics without disrupting the movement of commercial vehicles, in line with Ease of Doing

Business guidelines. He noted that Tripura often serves as a transit route for drugs originating in Myanmar and passing through Assam before reaching Bangladesh.

Replying to another question, Dr. Saha welcomed the enhancement of MGNREGA benefits, saying daily wages had been increased to Rs ₹300 while guaranteed employment had been expanded from 100 to 125 days. He said timelines for providing work and penalty provisions for delays would further strengthen rural employment and contribute to the socio-economic development of the state.

From Flyovers to Footpaths: Rising Drug Addiction in Guwahati Sparks Street Safety Alarm

Rising drug abuse is turning Guwahati into a city where public safety and rehabilitation remain under strain

Day by day, Guwahati has increasingly become a hub of drug abuse, and in turn, the growing number of addicts on the streets has become a threat to public safety.

From foot-over-bridges to footpaths, from alleys to beneath flyovers, from busy streets to secluded lanes, it has become increasingly common to encounter individuals struggling with drug addiction. Foot-over-bridges across Guwahati have become a permanent shelter for many drug addicts, creating a hazard to commuters, especially women and children, who use these bridges to cross busy roads.

Guwahati, which has long served as a transit point for drug traffickers, has in recent years also emerged as a centre of drug consumption. This shift is evident from the growing number of addicts visible on the city's streets, the increasing frequency of arrests of drug peddlers, and repeated seizures of narcotic substances by law enforcement agencies.

Khanapara, Garchuk, Jalukbari, Paltan Bazar, Chandmari, Noonmati, Six Mile, Bhangagarh and Ulubari, almost every part of Guwahati appears to be grappling with the common problem of drug abuse. The issue is no longer confined to a handful of localities, with residents across the city

increasingly reporting the presence of addicts in public spaces and raising concerns over its impact on safety and law and order.

In a recent incident, Assamese actor Irish Chettri alleged that she narrowly escaped a knife attack by a drug addict in broad daylight in the Sundarpur area while she was waiting to board a cab back to her residence.

Taking to social media, she raised a larger question: "Are Guwahati streets safe with so many drug addicts roaming freely and openly?" Soon after, many others echoed her concern, sharing similar experiences on social media.

Such allegations have once again drawn attention to the alarming issue of substance abuse among youth, and in many cases, children, in Guwahati's crowded and commercially active areas. Many police officials whom GPlus spoke to admitted that drug abuse has become a serious menace in Guwahati. However, they said taking immediate or sustained action is often difficult for various reasons, including concerns over any untoward incident occurring while addicts are in police custody.

Some police officials also said that identifying drug addicts on the streets, or taking them to de-addiction centres, is beyond the regular responsibilities of the police.

"We often pick up drug addicts and take them to de-addiction centres, or hand them over to personnel from rehabilitation centres. But generally speaking, it does not fall within our domain. It is beyond the normal policing duty," an Officer-in-Charge (OC) of a Guwahati-based police station said. He added that dealing with drug addicts essentially falls under the domain of the Department of Social Justice and Empowerment.

Another Officer-in-Charge of a Guwahati-based police station said that dealing with drug addicts has its own challenges, but the police always try to counsel them and admit them to de-addiction centres whenever possible.

"Frankly speaking, we also fear if anything untoward happens to a drug addict while he or she is in our custody, or if they cause a threat to the public in front of us," the officer said. Though not in as many words, he indicated that the possibility of custodial death remains a major concern.

"Yes, custodial death is one of our key concerns while dealing with drug addicts," another police personnel at a Guwahati-based police station stated.

GPlus also reached out to the Special Task Force (STF) of the Assam Police, whose responsibilities include tackling narcotics smuggling. A senior STF official said their primary job is to bust drug trafficking networks and seize contraband, while rehabilitating addicts, if at all, falls under the responsibility of the district police units.

On its part, the Government of India, through the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, has been implementing the National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR), under which financial assistance is provided to States and Union Territories (UTs) for preventive education,

awareness and rehabilitation initiatives.

During the five financial years between 2017–18 and 2021–22, the number of beneficiaries under the NAPDDR in Assam witnessed a sharp year-on-year increase. In 2017–18, according to government data, 2,952 beneficiaries from Assam received assistance under the scheme. The number rose to 9,807 in 2018–19 and further increased to 13,328 in 2019–20. The upward trend continued, reaching 15,995 in 2020–21 and 25,986 in 2021-22.

These government figures indicate that Assam has witnessed a significant rise in the number of people requiring assistance under the NAPDDR. Going by current trends, the figures for the years after 2021–22, which are yet to be made public by the Central Government, may present a similarly concerning picture. Although the number of beneficiaries has also increased in other States and Union Territories, the rise has not been as steep as that witnessed in Assam.

GPlus also spoke to a few private de-addiction centres in Guwahati to understand the overall situation. They highlighted about the risks involved and the financial burden associated with rehabilitation.

“Treating drug addicts have a risk factor attached to it. It also involves huge financial spending given de-addiction treatments tend to be costly,” the owner of a rehabilitation centre in Geetanagar said.

"Drug addicts need constant monitoring and it gets difficult for us to be available all the time. Leaving them unattended can be a threat to public safety. Also, there can be occasions when they would try to self-harm," he said.

He further asserted that Assam lacks an adequate number of government-funded de-addiction centres to effectively tackle the growing menace.

Even as the Assam Police and other central agencies continue to bust drug trafficking rackets and seize large quantities of narcotics from different parts of the state almost every day, one fundamental question remains unanswered: How are these drugs continuing to reach the hands of Assam's youth? Despite frequent crackdowns, arrests, and major drug seizures, the steady flow of narcotics into local communities suggests that the supply chain remains far from broken, raising serious concerns about the effectiveness of existing enforcement measures.

Cyberabad police destroy over 833 kg of seized narcotics worth Rs 5.02 crore

Cyberabad Police destroyed 833.118 kg of seized narcotics worth Rs 5.02 crore, linked to 101 NDPS Act cases. The contraband, including marijuana, MDMA, alprazolam and hashish oil, was incinerated under official supervision following environmental pollution control norms.



Hyderabad: The Cyberabad Police destroyed 833.118 kgs of seized narcotic substances worth Rs 5.02 crore as part of the disposal of contraband seized in NDPS Act cases, on Friday.

The destruction was carried out under the supervision of the Drug Disposal Committee, headed by DCP (Crimes & EOW) A Muthyam Reddy. The narcotics were incinerated at GJ Multiclave (India) Pvt Ltd in Edulapally village, Nandigama mandal, Ranga Reddy district, in accordance with environmental pollution control norms.

According to police, the destroyed contraband was linked to 101 NDPS Act cases and included 797.841 kgs of marijuana, 912.2 grams of ganja plants, 24.640 kg of marijuana chocolates, 0.005 grams of MDMA, 1.658 kg of hashish oil, 7.970 kg of alprazolam, and 92 grams of charas.

Officials said the disposal of seized drugs was a crucial step in preventing the recirculation of narcotics.

HC refuses to suspend sentence of history-sheeter in ganja case

Madurai: Courts are obligated to protect the rights of the accused but at the same time they are also answerable to the victims, [Madras high court](#) has observed. The court then dismissed a history-sheeter's application seeking suspension of sentence imposed by a trial court in a case for possession of ganja, after considering the fact that several cases including murder are pending against him. According to the prosecution, Saba alias Sabarathinam was arrested by the police for possession of 42kg ganja in a car in 2020. In 2024, the special court for NDPS Act cases, Madurai, convicted and sentenced him to 14 years rigorous imprisonment. Challenging the conviction, he preferred a criminal appeal along with an application seeking suspension of sentence. Justice B Pugalendhi observed that no doubt, the petitioner is in jail for nearly four years in this case and the appeal filed by him, though admitted by the court in June 2024, has not been taken up for final disposal. The petitioner's personal liberty has been curtailed to some extent. However, the judge took note of the fact that the petitioner is an A+ category history sheeter and a notorious gang leader in Madurai who is implicated in 23 other cases, out of which, seven murder cases are pending for trial. The judge observed that the existence of antecedents alone cannot be a ground to reject bail. However, it is also a settled position that prior antecedents is a relevant consideration along with other factors such as the nature and gravity of offence, the materials available as against the accused, the previous conduct of the accused and whether there is a strong and compelling reason for the grant of bail. The court is duty bound to consider all these factors while considering the application of the petitioner. Considering the overall factors such as the serious nature of allegations against the petitioner, his prior antecedents, his previous conduct of delaying trial in the other cases

pending against him, the court is not inclined to entertain the application for suspension of sentence, the judge observed and dismissed the petition.

CHENNAI: Police arrested two drug peddlers who allegedly engaged minors to distribute narcotic substances in and around Kannagi Nagar.

Based on a tip-off that ganja and narcotic tablets were being sold in the Puthupettai Canal area, a special team led by Inspector S Saravanan conducted a raid and arrested the accused, Sengottaiyan (30) and Karthi (24) - both residents of Kannagi Nagar.

Police seized 1.2 kg of ganja and 20 narcotic tablets. Probe revealed that the accused procured tablets from Mumbai and sold them to youths in resettlement neighbourhoods of Kannagi Nagar and Perumbakkam.

The accused have also recruited juveniles to distribute ganja and narcotic tablets. The minors were paid Rs 1,000 a day and also given a couple of painkiller tablets as a commission for selling the contraband.

Police also found that the accused procured ganja in bulk from suppliers in Chennai, repackaged it into small sachets and sold it in the locality through the network of minors.

The arrested persons were produced before a magistrate and remanded to judicial custody.

Tirupati: As part of a special drive against narcotics, Pakala police conducted a massive anti-drug awareness and screening programme at Damalacheruvu village on Saturday. Following directives from Tirupati District SP L Subba Rayudu, a team led by Pakala CI T Chinna Govindu assembled mango orchard workers, fruit traders, lorry drivers, and loading labourers at Mango Nagar.

MANAS: How India's digital anti-drug platform is empowering citizens against substance abuse and trafficking

The fight against drugs in India is no longer restricted to police action, border surveillance and anti-narcotics operations. As drug trafficking networks become more sophisticated and substance abuse continues to affect millions of people across the country, the government is increasingly turning to technology-driven solutions that place citizens at the centre of the battle against narcotics. One such initiative is MANAS (Madak Padarth Nishedh Asoochna Kendra), India's National Narcotics Helpline and digital anti-drug platform that seeks to combine technology, citizen participation and rehabilitation support under a single framework.

Launched on July 18, 2024, under the aegis of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Ministry of Home Affairs, in collaboration with the Digital India Corporation (DIC), MANAS was envisioned as a secure and accessible platform where citizens can report drug-related activities, seek counselling and access rehabilitation support. Available through the national helpline number 1933, a dedicated web portal, email and the UMANG application, the platform reflects the convergence of the government's Digital India initiative and its larger vision of a Nasha Mukta Bharat.

The growing drug challenge in India

The need for a platform like MANAS becomes clear when viewed against the scale of substance abuse in India. Drug addiction is not merely a law-and-order issue but a social, economic and public health challenge that affects individuals, families and entire communities. Addiction often results in declining health, loss of livelihood, family breakdown, criminal activity and social instability. It also places a significant burden on healthcare systems and law enforcement agencies.

The government's 2019 report titled Magnitude of Substance Abuse in India revealed the extent of the problem. According to the study, nearly 16 crore Indians consume alcohol, of whom more than 5.7 crore are severely affected. The report also estimated that around 3.1 crore people use cannabis, while approximately 2.26 crore consume opioids. Another 1.18 crore people use sedatives. Particularly alarming was the finding that nearly 2.8 crore individuals are dependent on opioids, including around 28 lakh people who require immediate treatment and intervention.

These numbers underscore the urgency of creating systems that not only help law enforcement agencies tackle trafficking networks but also support those struggling with addiction and their families.

Bringing citizens into fight against drugs

A key feature of MANAS is its effort to transform ordinary citizens from passive observers into active participants in anti-drug efforts. The government recognised that many people witness drug peddling, trafficking or substance abuse-related activities in their neighbourhoods, educational institutions or workplaces, but often hesitate to report them due to fear of retaliation or concerns about revealing their identity.

MANAS addresses this challenge by allowing citizens to confidentially share information about drug trafficking, peddling, illegal cultivation and related activities. Individuals can submit information without disclosing their identity, creating a safer environment for whistleblowers and concerned citizens. Officials believe that public participation is critical because law enforcement agencies cannot be present everywhere. Citizens often possess valuable information that can help authorities identify trafficking routes, dismantle drug networks and prevent the spread of narcotics within communities. By providing a secure channel for reporting, MANAS seeks to convert public vigilance into actionable intelligence.

More than a reporting platform

Unlike conventional complaint portals, MANAS has been designed as a comprehensive support ecosystem. While reporting drug-related activities remains one of its primary functions, the platform also serves as a bridge to counselling and rehabilitation services.

The initiative recognises that individuals trapped in addiction are often victims of a larger cycle of drug supply and demand. Rather than treating addiction solely as a criminal issue, the platform encourages a health-centred approach that focuses on recovery and reintegration.

People seeking assistance for substance abuse can access counselling through MANAS, with calls being transferred to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment's dedicated helpline, 14446. This ensures that individuals struggling with addiction receive professional guidance and support. The platform also promotes access to government de-addiction centres, counselling services, therapy and rehabilitation programmes. Officials stress that people battling addiction should be treated with dignity

and encouraged to seek professional help rather than face social stigma. Through counselling and awareness initiatives, MANAS aims to foster a more compassionate approach to substance abuse treatment.

Technology at core of MANAS

At its heart, MANAS is a technology-driven initiative that seeks to improve both service delivery and enforcement outcomes. Every complaint or tip-off received through the platform is digitally recorded and processed through an integrated workflow system. This enables faster registration of information, streamlined communication between agencies and improved monitoring of responses.

The platform's digital architecture allows authorities to generate electronic tickets, assign cases to relevant agencies and track the progress of reports. Such digitised workflows help improve accountability, transparency and efficiency.

The use of technology also enables the platform to operate around the clock, ensuring that citizens can report information or seek help at any time, regardless of location. Whether through a phone call, online portal or mobile application, MANAS offers multiple access points to ensure nationwide reach.

Connecting citizens with enforcement agencies

One of MANAS's biggest strengths is its integration with India's anti-narcotics enforcement network. The platform directly links citizens with 30 Narcotics Control Bureau zonal units and 36 State and Union Territory Anti-Narcotics Task Forces (ANTFs).

This integrated system ensures that information received from the public reaches the appropriate enforcement agencies quickly and efficiently. Instead of complaints getting lost in bureaucratic processes, digital workflows facilitate prompt action and better coordination among stakeholders.

Officials believe that such seamless communication can significantly strengthen intelligence gathering and operational responses against drug trafficking networks.

The government is also working to make MANAS more inclusive and user-friendly. Several advanced features are being developed to improve accessibility and outreach. These include multilingual call support, Smart Interactive Voice Response Systems (IVRS), chatbot integration and assistance in regional languages. Such additions are expected to make the platform easier to use for citizens across diverse linguistic and geographical backgrounds.

The emphasis on regional language support is particularly important in a country as diverse as India, where language barriers often limit access to public services. By making MANAS available in multiple languages, authorities hope to increase participation from rural and remote areas.

Building awareness among youth

Prevention remains one of the most important aspects of the government's anti-drug strategy, and MANAS has been designed to support awareness generation alongside enforcement and rehabilitation.

Young people are among the most vulnerable groups when it comes to substance abuse. To address this challenge, the platform works with the MyGov portal to conduct various awareness campaigns aimed at students and youth. These include quizzes, poster-making competitions, reel-making contests and other interactive initiatives that encourage participation while spreading awareness about the dangers of drug abuse. Officials believe that educating young people about the risks associated with narcotics is critical to preventing addiction before it begins. Such campaigns also help create a broader culture of awareness and community involvement in anti-drug efforts.

Growing trust and expanding impact

Since its launch in 2024, MANAS has steadily expanded its outreach and strengthened public engagement. According to the government, the platform has improved access to counselling, rehabilitation and awareness services while also enhancing information-sharing between citizens and enforcement agencies.

Authorities note that increasing utilisation of counselling services indicates a growing willingness among people to seek help for substance abuse-related issues. At the same time, secure reporting channels have encouraged more citizens to share information about drug trafficking and peddling activities.

The fully digitised nature of the platform has also improved coordination between agencies, enabling faster responses and more efficient service delivery. Officials view these developments as signs of growing public trust in the system.

A Digital India success story

MANAS represents a practical example of how Digital Public Infrastructure can be used to address complex social challenges. By combining technology, citizen participation, counselling services, awareness campaigns and law enforcement coordination, the platform demonstrates how digital governance can extend beyond routine service delivery and contribute to public safety.

The platform aligns closely with the broader objectives of Digital India by making government services accessible, transparent and citizen-centric. At the same time, the data generated through MANAS can help authorities identify emerging trends, understand patterns of drug abuse and trafficking, and develop more targeted interventions. Such data-driven policymaking could play an increasingly important role as India seeks to tackle evolving narcotics challenges.

Towards a Nasha Mukta Bharat

The government's vision of a Nasha Mukta Bharat cannot be achieved through enforcement alone. It requires a coordinated approach involving prevention, awareness, rehabilitation, treatment and community participation. MANAS seeks to bring all these elements together within a single digital ecosystem.

By empowering citizens to report suspicious activities, providing support to those struggling with addiction and strengthening coordination among enforcement agencies, the platform is gradually building a more comprehensive response to substance abuse and drug trafficking.

As its reach expands and new technological capabilities are added, MANAS is emerging as an important pillar of India's anti-drug strategy. More importantly, it reflects a broader shift in governance, one that sees citizens not merely as beneficiaries of government schemes but as active partners in solving national challenges. In that sense, MANAS is more than a helpline or digital platform. It is a model of how technology, public participation and social responsibility can come together to create safer communities and move India closer to the goal of a truly drug-free nation.

Foreigner among 3 held with MDMA worth Rs 14 lakh in Greater Noida

Noida: Three persons, including a Nigerian man, were arrested from the service road near Janata Flats in Sector Chi-IV, Greater Noida, for allegedly running an MDMA racket on Saturday. Police said they seized 143 g of MDMA, commonly known as ecstasy. It has an estimated international market value of around Rs 14 lakh.

Besides the narcotics, officers seized a scooter allegedly used for transportation, an electronic weighing machine and Rs 17,500 in cash believed to be linked to the illegal trade.

The cops were acting on a tip-off and they arrested Arun Kasana of Ghaziabad; [Atul Singh](#), a resident of Sampooram Society in Greater Noida; and Chidubem Stanley, a Nigerian national residing in Uttam Nagar.

Greater Noida DCP Ravi Shankar Nim said an initial investigation has suggested that the men procured the drug at comparatively lower prices and repackaged it into smaller sachets before selling it at higher rates in residential societies across Noida, Greater Noida and other parts of Delhi-NCR. The profits were allegedly shared among the members of the network.

Investigators suspect the gang deliberately targeted residential neighbourhoods and highrise societies, where synthetic party drugs are believed to have a steady demand. Police are now examining whether the accused supplied narcotics to local peddlers or directly to consumers.

Police also found that Chidubem Stanley had been previously arrested by the Delhi Police Crime Branch in 2025 under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act. Officers said he was out on bail and had allegedly resumed drug trafficking activities.

A case was registered against the three accused at Beta-II police station under relevant provisions of the NDPS Act. The Nigerian national was also booked under Section 14 of the Foreigners Act for alleged violations related to his stay in India, police said.

Investigators are now working to identify the source of the seized MDMA and uncover the larger supply chain behind the racket. Police are also trying to trace other associates, including suspected local contacts and financiers, who may have helped distribute the drugs across NCR.

Srinagar, July 4 (IANS) Police in Jammu and Kashmir's Bandipora district on Saturday said it has arrested three persons after recovering a huge quantity of 'Charas' (marijuana) from them.

A police statement said today that continuing its sustained drive against drug trafficking, police in Bandipora achieved a major success by apprehending three drug peddlers and recovering a substantial quantity of contraband during naka checking in the Hajin area.

Besides, police arrested a drug peddler in Sopore and recovered a contraband substance from his possession.

During a naka-checking at Madwan, a police party from Police Station Hajin noticed suspicious movement by three individuals who attempted to flee but were tactfully apprehended. During the search, 4.090 kg of a charas powder-like substance was

recovered from their possession.

They have been identified as Sayar Ahmad Malla, son of Abdul Rahim Malla, resident of Madwan; Mehraj Ud Din Hajam, son of Ghulam Mohammad Hajam, resident of Madwan; and Aamir Tariq Ganie, son of Tariq Ganie, resident of Bangar Mohalla, Hajin.

In this regard, Case FIR No. 87/2026 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Hajin. All three accused have been arrested, and the recovered contraband has been seized in accordance with legal procedure.

Further investigation is underway.

Moreover, in Sopore, police apprehended a drug peddler during patrolling at Butpora, Sopore. During search, a charas-like substance was recovered from his possession and seized in accordance with due legal procedure.

The accused has been identified as Aaqib Rasool Sheikh, son of Ghulam Rasool Sheikh, resident of Shahabad, Sopore.

Accordingly, a case FIR No. 166/2026 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Sopore, and further investigation has been taken up.

Police remains committed to eradicating the menace of drugs from society and appeals to the general public to cooperate with the police by sharing any information related to drug peddling or other unlawful activities.

10 more booked under Gangsters Act in multi-crore codeine syrup racket

Varanasi: In a fresh crackdown on the multi-crore codeine cough syrup smuggling network, Sarnath police have booked 10 already arrested accused under the stringent Uttar Pradesh Gangsters and Anti-Social Activities (Prevention) Act, naming alleged smuggler Lokesh Agrawal as the gang leader.

Police said Lokesh's group operated as part of the syndicate of fugitive codeine smuggling kingpin Shubham Jaiswal and his jailed father Bhola Jaiswal, who have already been booked under the Gangsters Act earlier this year. Except for one accused who suffered a brain stroke, all members of Lokesh's gang are currently lodged in jail.

DCP (Varuna Zone) Pramod Kumar said on Saturday that the 10 accused booked under Section 3(1) of the Uttar Pradesh Gangsters and Anti-Social Activities (Prevention) Act, 1986, include Lokesh Agrawal of Mahmoorganj, Vishnu Kumar Pandey of Sarnath, Prateek Kumar of Pandeypur, Akash Pathak of Golghar in Varanasi, Sureshchandra Gupta, Faizur Rahman, Satyendra Kumar Sahu, Mohammad Saif of Prayagraj, Vinod Agrawal of Kanpur, and Manish Kumar Singh of Gorakhpur.

Police said all the accused were arrested after their involvement in the illegal trafficking and storage of codeine-based cough syrup was uncovered in 2025. The investigation in the Sarnath case has been completed, and a chargesheet has already been filed before the court. Based on the investigation, a report recommending action under the Gangsters Act was sent to Police Commissioner Mohit Agrawal. Following his approval, the accused were booked under the Act.

According to the DCP, Lokesh, a resident of Mohani Kunj in Mahmoorganj under Sigrā police station limits, formed an organised gang that earned huge illegal profits through the trafficking and storage of codeine-mixed cough syrup. Police alleged that the gang members used the proceeds of the crime to fund a lavish lifestyle. The gang allegedly operated under the direction of Shubham, whose network has been investigated in multiple cases.

Cases related to the codeine cough syrup racket have been registered at the Rohaniya, Sarnath, and Kotwali police stations in Varanasi following the Sonbhadra police's busting of the illegal trade in Oct 2025. Shubham's father was arrested from Kolkata in 2025, while he is believed to be hiding in Dubai. Police have initiated the process for his extradition.

'Safe Punjab' Helpline Drives Major Anti-Drug Action Across the State; Nearly 22,000 Arrested

'Safe Punjab' WhatsApp helpline emerges as a key tool in the state's 'War Against Drug' campaign, encouraging citizens to report drug peddlers anonymously

Punjab's campaign against substance abuse is increasingly becoming a people-driven movement, with thousands of residents from across the state stepping forward to anonymously report drug peddlers and suppliers through the **'Safe Punjab' WhatsApp helpline (97791-00200)**.

Launched as part of the **'War Against Drug'** campaign led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, the initiative has witnessed an overwhelming public response, strengthening law enforcement efforts against drug trafficking while ensuring complete confidentiality for informants.

According to official data, the helpline has so far received **43,520 anonymous tip-offs** from across Punjab. Acting on these inputs and subsequent investigations, Punjab Police has registered **17,120 cases** and arrested **21,962 accused** involved in drug-related activities.

The initiative was designed to encourage public participation in the state's anti-drug campaign by allowing citizens to report suspicious activities without fear of intimidation or exposure. Officials said the assurance of anonymity and prompt police action has significantly increased public confidence in the system.

In addition to the WhatsApp helpline, the government has introduced **anonymous complaint collection through e-rickshaws**, which are currently operating in **3,440 villages**, covering nearly one-third of Punjab's villages. These mobile platforms have become an additional source of intelligence for identifying and apprehending drug traffickers.

Authorities said every complaint undergoes a thorough verification process before legal proceedings are initiated. Credible information is immediately forwarded to the concerned district police units to ensure swift action against offenders.

Punjab Director General of Police (DGP) **Gaurav Yadav** said the strong response reflects people's desire to live in a drug-free society.

"The response to the 'Safe Punjab' initiative demonstrates that people want to live in a drug-free environment and are willing to support law enforcement when they are assured that their identity will remain protected. Public participation has been overwhelming, and so has our response," he said.

Health and Family Welfare Minister **Dr. Balbir Singh** said the initiative complements the state's broader anti-drug strategy by combining enforcement with community participation, awareness and rehabilitation.

"While police action remains critical, lasting success against substance abuse requires sustained cooperation from the public," he said.

Officials said the initiative has maintained complete confidentiality for all complainants, encouraging more citizens to come forward with actionable information. With more than **17,000 cases leading to nearly 22,000 arrests**, authorities believe the 'Safe Punjab' helpline has become a significant force multiplier in Punjab's fight against the drug menace.

The government expressed confidence that continued public participation, coupled with prompt police action, will further strengthen efforts to eliminate substance abuse and create a safer future for Punjab.

Two drug peddlers arrested in Rajganj with 350 grams brown sugar; scooty seized

Rajganj, 04th July: Police from Bhorer Alo police station arrested two drug peddlers and recovered approximately 350 grams of brown sugar along with a scooty during an operation in the Motagach area along the Ambari-Hathi More road under Rajganj block.

According to police sources, late Friday night, a suspected exchange of a packet between two individuals was about to take place in the area. Acting on a confidential tip-off, police personnel were already present at the spot and conducted a raid, apprehending both suspects.

During the search, around 350 grams of brown sugar were recovered from the scooty's storage compartment. The two-wheeler used in the incident was also seized on the spot.

The arrested individuals have been identified as Hasmat Sheikh, a resident of Malda district, and Liaquat Ali, a resident of Sannyasikata area in Rajganj.

Police stated that the duo had allegedly planned to bring narcotics from Malda and sell them in Rajganj. Following the arrests, a detailed investigation has been initiated into the case.

Both accused are scheduled to be produced before the Jalpaiguri court on Saturday.

124.6kg ganja seized in West Champaran, two arrested

Bettiah: Acting on a tip-off, police seized 124.6 kg of ganja from an SUV on Majhaulia-Mahna main road near Cheilabhar village in West Champaran district on Saturday. Two traffickers were arrested, while two others riding a motorcycle managed to escape during the operation.

The arrested men were identified as Deepak Kumar (27), a resident of Kaudihar Chowk in Raxaul, and Anuj Kumar (18), a resident of the ITI locality in Bettiah.

According to police, preliminary interrogation revealed that the consignment had been brought from Raxaul and was to be delivered to Lohiyaria. Investigators suspect the seizure is linked to an organised narcotics trafficking network and have intensified efforts to identify other members of the syndicate.

Majhaulia SHO Amar Kumar said police received specific information about the movement of a large consignment of narcotics. A vehicle-checking drive and blockade were subsequently set up on the Majhaulia-Mahna road near Cheilabhar village, where the suspicious SUV was intercepted and searched.

“Police received secret information that a large consignment of narcotic substances was being transported. A checking drive and blockade were set up on the Majhaulia-Mahna main road near Cheilabhar village. During the search of the suspicious vehicle, 124.6 kg of ganja was recovered. The SUV was seized and two traffickers were arrested, while two others riding a motorcycle managed to flee,” the SHO said.

Police said the identities of the two absconding suspects have been established and raids are underway to apprehend them. Amar Kumar further said police are investigating the wider trafficking network, including the intended destinations of the contraband and others involved in the supply chain. A case has been registered under the NDPS Act, and further investigation is in progress.

Odisha Police Destroys Over 102.22 Metric Tonnes of Seized Ganja

Odisha Police destroyed 102,221.615 kg (102.22 metric tonnes) of seized ganja by July 3 under the Nashamukta Odisha Abhijaan during the ongoing National Pre-Trial Drug Destruction Special Drive.

The campaign, supervised by the State Task Force and CID Crime Branch, reflects Odisha Police's commitment to eliminating narcotics and enforcing the NDPS Act.

Boudh Police led the effort by destroying 37,484.885 kg, while Kandhamala Police destroyed 34,245.430 kg, fully meeting its target. Malkangiri contributed 8,969.940 kg, Gajapati 6,671 kg, and Koraput 6,155.773 kg. Other districts including Balangir, Nabarangpur, Sundaragada, Kendujhar, and Ganjam also added significant quantities.

Additional districts such as Anugola, Khordha, and Raurkela joined the drive after securing Drug Disposal Committee orders. Anugola destroyed 966 kg, Khordha 400.920 kg, and Raurkela 116.500 kg, enhancing the overall achievement. Several districts, including Jharsuguda, Mayurbhanj, SRP Raurkela, and SRP Kataka, completed 100% destruction of their assigned targets.

As of July 3, only 5,528.897 kg of seized ganja remains to be destroyed. Police units have been directed to finish the process before the nationwide drive concludes on July 10.

Director General of Police Yogesh Bahadur Khurania reaffirmed Odisha Police's priority in combating drug trafficking and organised narcotics networks. The milestone strengthens the state's resolve to achieve a drug-free Odisha under the Nashamukta Odisha Abhijaan.

शराबबंदी के बाद बिहार में कितना बढ़ा सूखे नशे का काला बाज़ार?

उड़ता बिहार: 10 साल में कितना बढ़ा सूखे नशे का कारोबार? शराबबंदी के बाद आए आंकड़ों से समझिए

बिहार में पूर्ण शराबबंदी लागू होने के बाद से पिछले 10 वर्षों में राज्य में शराब की तस्करी के साथ-साथ 'सूखे नशे' (Drug Abuse) और उसके अवैध कारोबार में बेतहाशा वृद्धि दर्ज की गई है। नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो (NCB) और बिहार पुलिस के आंकड़ों के अनुसार, साल 2015-16 में जो नशा केवल कुछ किलो गांजा या अफीम तक सीमित था, वह अब बढ़कर हर साल हजारों किलो गांजा, अफीम, लाखों नशीली गोलियों और कोडीन-युक्त कफ सिरप के रूप में एक समानांतर काले बाज़ार का रूप ले चुका है।

बिहार में नशे का तेजी से बढ़ता कारोबार

बिहार में 2015 से 2026 के बीच सूखे नशे के मामलों में भारी इजाफा हुआ है। शराबबंदी के बाद रहन-सहन में बदलाव आया है, लेकिन इसका नकारात्मक असर नशे की संस्कृति पर पड़ा है। अब न केवल शराब, बल्कि सूखे नशे का भी बढ़ता कारोबार समाज के लिए चुनौती

बन रहा है। ड्रग्स जैसे गांजा, स्मैक, चरस और अन्य नशीली दवाओं की तस्करी खुलेआम हो रही है। हालात ये हैं कि अक्सर जहरीली शराब पीने से मौतें भी हो रही हैं।

दुर्लभ आंकड़े और बढ़ते नशे के सेवन

बिहार पुलिस के आंकड़ों के अनुसार, 2026 में मई तक ड्रग्स के खिलाफ बड़ी कार्रवाई की गई है। 21,024.37 किलो गांजा और 54.048 किलो चरस के साथ-साथ अन्य नशीली दवाओं की भारी बरामदगी हुई है। ऐसी स्थिति में शराबबंदी का कोई खास असर पड़ता हुआ नजर नहीं आ रहा है। पुलिस ने 89 तस्करी के खिलाफ कानूनी कार्रवाई की है।

क्यों बढ़ा ड्रग्स का चलन?

बिहार में सूखे नशे का चलन बढ़ने की कई वजहें हैं। ड्रग्स का इस्तेमाल शराब की तुलना में सस्ता और आसानी से उपलब्ध है। इसके अलावा, कॉलेज और स्कूलों में भी इन नशीली दवाओं की पहुंच बढ़ी है। बिहार के सीमावर्ती जिले जैसे किशनगंज, अररिया, और मधुबनी अब ड्रग्स ट्रांजिट कॉरिडोर में तब्दील हो चुके हैं।

NDPS मामलों में रिकॉर्ड उछाल

रिपोर्ट के अनुसार, शराबबंदी लागू होने के बाद से NDPS (नारकोटिक ड्रग्स एंड साइकोट्रोपिक सब्सटेंस एक्ट) से जुड़े मामलों में 150% से अधिक की वृद्धि हुई है। साल 2019 में जहां ऐसे 697 मामले दर्ज किए गए थे, वहीं ये मामले बढ़कर 2023 में 2,126 और 2024 में 2,411 तक पहुंच गए।

पिछले 10 वर्षों का संक्षिप्त विश्लेषण

नारकोटिक्स विभाग के ताजा आंकड़ों (2025-26) के अनुसार, सूखे नशे की बरामदगी के जो आंकड़े सामने आए हैं, वे चौंकाने वाले हैं-

गांजा: साल 2015 में केवल 14.37 किलो गांजा जब्त हुआ था, जो 2025 तक आते-आते 28,000 किलो (28 टन) तक पहुंच गया।

अफीम (Opium): साल 2015 में केवल 1.97 किलो अफीम पकड़ी गई थी, जबकि अब हर साल 2,400 किलो (2.4 टन) तक अफीम और पाँपी स्ट्र बरामद हो रहे हैं।

सिरप और दवाएं: इसके अलावा हर साल 3.25 लाख कोडीन-युक्त कफ सिरप की बोटलें और 3.48 लाख नशीले टैबलेट (Drugs/Tablets) भी बरामद किए जा रहे हैं।

शराब की समानांतर तस्करी

सूखे नशे के साथ-साथ शराब का अवैध कारोबार भी कम नहीं हुआ है। उत्पाद एवं मद्य निषेध विभाग के 10 वर्षों के आंकड़े बताते हैं कि इस अवधि में 11 लाख से अधिक केस दर्ज किए गए और लगभग 17 लाख लोगों की गिरफ्तारी हुई है। जनवरी से मई 2026 के बीच ही राज्य में 17.53 लाख लीटर से ज्यादा अवैध शराब जब्त की गई, जिसकी कीमत 140 करोड़ रुपये से अधिक आंकी गई। दिलचस्प बात यह है कि इसमें देसी शराब से ज्यादा विदेशी शराब (IMFL) शामिल है, जो महंगे नशे की उपलब्धता को दर्शाती है।

बेरोजगारी और नशे का मिलाजुला प्रभाव

बेरोजगारी, सामाजिक तनाव, और पलायन जैसे मुद्दे भी नशे की प्रवृत्ति को बढ़ावा दे रहे हैं। नशामुक्ति केंद्रों में भर्ती होने वाले मरीजों में अधिकतर युवा होते हैं। यह चिंता का विषय है कि स्कूलों और कॉलेजों में भी नशे का प्रयोग बढ़ता जा रहा है।

सस्ते नशे का बढ़ता चलन

सूखे नशे की सुलभता इसके बढ़ने का एक मुख्य कारण है। स्मैक, नशीली गोलियां और कफ सिरप आसानी से और सस्ते में उपलब्ध हैं। शराब की तस्करी बढ़ी चुनौती है, जबकि ड्रग्स की ट्रांसपोर्टिंग अपेक्षाकृत आसान है। बढ़ी खेप को किसी क्षेत्र में डंप कर इसे फिर सप्लायर तक पहुंचाया जा सकता है।

आगामी चुनौतियां

इंजेक्शन के माध्यम से ड्रग्स लेने वालों की संख्या में भी बढ़ोतरी हुई है। मई तक 3,45,309 इंजेक्शन जब्त किए गए हैं। इसके प्रयोग से एचआईवी संक्रमित मरीजों की संख्या में भी इजाफा हो रहा है। एक ही सिरिज का प्रयोग कई लोगों द्वारा किया जा रहा है, जिससे संक्रमण का खतरा बढ़ जाता है। आंकड़ों के अनुसार, सख्त कानून के बावजूद शराब और ड्रग्स की तस्करी ने संगठित माफियाओं को जन्म दिया है, जिसके कारण युवा पीढ़ी अब अल्कोहल से निकलकर सीधे 'सूखे नशे' (Synthetic drugs) और सिंथेटिक दवाओं की गिरफ्त में आ रही है।
