## Representatives of the member countries underscore the need for stronger international cooperation to combat drug trafficking

### GUWAHATI

Representatives of member countries, [who converged in Guwahati for the two-day BRICS](#) Heads of Anti-Drug Agencies' Meeting 2026, on Monday (July 6, 2026) emphasised the need for stronger international cooperation to combat drug trafficking.

An intergovernmental organisation of major emerging markets and developing countries, BRICS initially comprised Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa. It expanded to include Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and Indonesia.

These countries represent almost half the global population, and more than 40% of the world's Gross Domestic Product.

Lucas Barbosa of Brazil's Ministry of Foreign Affairs lauded India for hosting the event. "The BRICS anti-drug working group has a long history of cooperation, and we intend to strengthen collaboration in law enforcement and intelligence sharing further. Drug trafficking is a transnational threat that requires coordinated action by all member countries," he told journalists on the sidelines of the meeting.

Anurag Garg, Director General of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), said the impact of drug abuse was a factor behind India hosting the heads of anti-drug agencies from the BRICS nations for the first time.

“Drugs have become an international scourge. Our youth is getting involved in drugs, and it is a problem that different nations have to fight together,” he said, adding that the delegates would focus on emerging challenges in narcotics enforcement, including darknet marketplaces, cryptocurrencies for illicit transactions, and maritime routes for drug trafficking.

The agenda of the meeting includes combating synthetic drugs and diversion of precursor chemicals, strengthening intelligence sharing and operational coordination, and enhancing capacity building and institutional cooperation among BRICS drug control agencies.

# BRICS must secure sea routes, share intel faster to beat traffickers: NCB chief

Guwahati: BRICS nations must build a rapid and secure intelligence-sharing alliance to counter transnational drug trafficking, director general of Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) Anurag Garg said on Monday, stressing that real-time information exchange and cross-border trust are essential to dismantling global narcotics networks. Addressing the inaugural session of the two-day BRICS Heads of Anti-Drug Agencies meeting in Guwahati, Garg urged members to move beyond localised policing and adopt a coordinated maritime strategy to protect international sea routes from drug smuggling.

He said drug trafficking has become more sophisticated and fast-evolving, turning what was once a local challenge into a global threat.

“The reality of 21st-century drug trafficking is stark: Criminal networks do not respect borders, they do not recognise sovereignty, and they do not wait for bureaucratic clearances. Jurisdiction-less crimes demand entirely jurisdiction-less efforts, and to defeat these syndicates, our law enforcement agencies must operate with a level of agility, mutual trust, and seamless, real-time cooperation that cuts through traditional barriers,” Garg said, leading the Indian delegation.

He said stronger international collaboration is “no longer a policy choice but an absolute necessity for collective survival”.

Outlining the meeting’s agenda, Garg said discussions were structured around emerging threats, including the use of Darknet platforms and digital technologies, the rise of New Psychoactive Substances (NPS), and steps to prevent diversion of precursor chemicals, alongside a dedicated session on maritime trafficking.

“We have specifically focused our efforts on the areas that are rapidly changing the face of drug enforcement. To address this, we will dive deep into specialised sessions targeting the exploitation of Darknet platforms and digital technologies, the alarming rise of New Psychoactive Substances (NPS), and the critical need to prevent the diversion of precursor chemicals. Furthermore, we have dedicated a crucial, standalone session to maritime trafficking,” Garg said.

He warned that illicit drugs from source countries are increasingly being shipped in large quantities via global maritime routes to markets worldwide.

To deepen cooperation, Garg proposed a BRICS Virtual Working Group to track and respond to shifting trafficking trends through regular meetings, real-time intelligence sharing, analysis of patterns, and coordinated enforcement operations.

Reaffirming India’s stance, Garg said the country is pursuing a zero-tolerance policy to dismantle trafficking networks while treating addiction victims with compassion.

## NCB chief warned sophisticated trafficking methods have transformed narcotics into a hyper-connected global threat demanding collective action



**Guwahati, July 6:** A [two-day meeting](#) of the heads of anti-drug agencies from BRICS member countries began in Guwahati on Monday, with India proposing the creation of a dedicated virtual working group to strengthen cooperation against evolving narcotics trafficking networks.

Inaugurating the meeting, Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) Director General Anurag Garg said the rapid evolution of drug trafficking methods has transformed the menace into a global challenge.

"The emergence of modern, highly sophisticated methods of trafficking has turned what was once a localised problem into a hyper-connected global threat," Garg said.

Highlighting the need for deeper cooperation among BRICS nations, he proposed establishing a dedicated BRICS Virtual Working Group.

"I propose the establishment of a dedicated BRICS Virtual Working Group to systematically address these rapidly evolving trends. This mechanism would serve as a vital platform to meet regularly, exchange real-time intelligence, analyse shifting trafficking patterns, and seamlessly coordinate joint law enforcement operations," he said.

Garg also underscored the need to strengthen the capabilities of frontline officers through specialised cross-border training programmes and the continuous exchange of best practices among member agencies.

"Together, as an expanded BRICS family, we possess the collective strength to truly change the world and turn the vision of a drug-free society into a reality," the NCB chief said.

Speaking to the press on the sidelines of the meeting, Ethiopian Embassy Charge d'Affaires in New Delhi Nebiyu Tedla said the menace of drugs has become an international issue and platforms like BRICS provide opportunities for collaboration, exchange of information and coordinated efforts to address it.

"Ours, like any other country, has challenges in this aspect. We will showcase our experience in the fight against drugs and its effect on socio-economic conditions. We will also learn from the other countries and hope the sessions will bring out the best practices," he said.

Russia's anti-drug department chief Ivan Gorbunov also stressed the importance of sharing experiences to deal with the menace.

"We have a common aim and also significant experience in the anti-drug field. This meeting will be useful for us and our partners," Gorbunov added.

Lucas Barbosa of Brazil's Ministry of Foreign Affairs underscored the need for collective action to address the transnational challenge.

"BRICS has a long tradition of cooperation, and we intend to enhance that in law enforcement and intelligence sharing because drugs are a transnational threat that needs to be dealt with through cooperation by all members," he said.

"We have positive expectations from this meeting," he added.

While representatives from most of the member countries were present at the meeting, the others joined virtually.

The two-day meeting will focus on three priority areas: combating synthetic drugs and the diversion of precursor chemicals, strengthening intelligence sharing and operational coordination, and enhancing capacity building and institutional cooperation.

Ahead of the meeting, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma had welcomed the delegates on Sunday, expressing confidence that the deliberations would strengthen cooperation among BRICS nations in combating the drug menace.

"Assam looks forward to hosting this important meeting and welcomes all participating delegates. India is making excellent progress towards a drug-free society, and tomorrow's deliberations will help deepen coordination among BRICS members in tackling this menace," Sarma said in a social media post.

Originally comprising Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa, BRICS expanded in 2024 with the inclusion of Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran and the United Arab Emirates. Indonesia joined the grouping in 2025.

# NCB focusing on transnational drug trafficking kingpins, says Director General Anurag Garg

NCB focusing on transnational drug trafficking kingpins, says Director General Anurag Garg

**The NCB says it is shifting its focus from couriers to kingpins in cross-border drug trafficking networks. The move underlines a broader effort to break Myanmar-linked supply chains entering India through the Northeast.**

The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) is intensifying its crackdown on transnational drug trafficking by targeting the kingpins behind cross-border narcotics networks instead of only arresting couriers, NCB Director General Anurag Garg said on Monday, July 6.

Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of a two-day meeting of the heads of anti-drug agencies from BRICS member countries in Guwahati, Garg said the agency has identified several major players involved in the illicit trade and efforts are underway to apprehend them.

"We are aware of the problem and are addressing it in a multi-phased manner," he said, referring to narcotics trafficked into India through the Northeast. He noted that Myanmar remains a source of methamphetamine and heroin entering the country, a trend reflected in the NCB's annual report.

Garg said the bureau's strategy has shifted towards dismantling trafficking networks by targeting their masterminds rather than focusing solely on petty couriers transporting drugs across the border.

"Rather than catching the petty couriers who carry it across the border, we are now concentrating on the kingpins. We have identified certain people on both sides, and the process to bring them in to face justice is on," he said.

Highlighting recent action, the NCB chief referred to the arrest of a key Myanmar-based drug trafficker in New Delhi in May as part of its efforts to dismantle transnational narcotics syndicates.

Garg also said the NCB is strengthening state-level anti-narcotics task forces, describing state agencies as the frontline in the fight against drug trafficking. He added that the bureau has expanded its presence in the Northeast by establishing zonal and regional offices in recent years, a move that has enhanced enforcement capabilities and contributed to a rise in drug seizures over the past year.

# Drug-linked gang clashes in Sri Lanka prison, leaves 26 dead

## COLOMBO

CLASHES broke out inside a prison in the outskirts of Sri Lanka's capital, killing at least 26 people, most of them inmates, and injuring more than 100, officials said Monday.

The unrest at the prison in Negombo, about 35 kilometers north of the capital, Colombo, started among inmates on Sunday, and when guards attempted to intervene on Monday, "they (inmates) started attacking the prison officials," prison spokesman AC Gajanayake said. He told reporters that some inmates attempted to escape but were stopped.

An official at the main state-run hospital in the area said seven prison officials and 18 inmates had died while an-

other 43 were being treated for injuries. He spoke on condition of anonymity because he was not authorised to speak to the media.

Three other hospitals were also treating dozens of injured, he said. Justice Minister Harshana Nanayakkara said the first clash erupted between two rival gangs connected to illegal drug trade.

After the authorities restored order on Monday evening, Nanayakkara said the inmates who led the violence were transferred to two other prisons. Army troops were also deployed around the prison. Sri Lankan prisons are highly congested, with more than 39,000 inmates crowded into a system with a total capacity of just 10,000. *AP*

# Meth tablets valued at RS 3.3 crore seized

Aizawl, July 6 (IANS) The Assam Rifles, in coordination with the Excise and Narcotics Department, seized highly addictive methamphetamine tablets worth approximately Rs 3.30 crore in eastern Mizoram's Champhai district, officials said on Monday.

A defence spokesman said that acting on specific intelligence inputs, troops of the Assam Rifles, in association with the Excise and Narcotics Department, carried out a joint operation in the Zote area of Champhai district, which shares a mountainous international border with Myanmar. During a search of the targeted area, the joint team recovered an abandoned TVS Apache RTR motorcycle.

A thorough search of the two-wheeler led to the recovery of 1.1 kg of methamphetamine tablets, a highly addictive narcotic substance with an estimated market value of around Rs 3.30 crore.

A case has been registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985. The seized contraband along with the motorcycle was subsequently handed over to the Excise and Narcotics Department in Champhai for further investigation and necessary legal proceedings.

The spokesman said the seizure reflects the Assam Rifles' continued commitment to dismantling drug trafficking networks and ensuring the safety and security of border residents in Mizoram.

He added that the force remains vigilant against trans-border smuggling activities and continues to work in close coordination with civil authorities to curb the menace of narcotics trafficking.

Methamphetamine tablets, popularly known as Yaba or "party tablets", contain a combination of methamphetamine and caffeine. The tablets are widely abused as high-potency stimulant drugs in Bangladesh, India and several neighbouring countries.

Similarly, various cough syrups containing Codeine Phosphate are also illegally smuggled and misused as narcotic substances, particularly in Bangladesh.

Both Mizoram and Manipur have emerged as major drug trafficking corridors in the Northeast due to their long unfenced international borders with Myanmar, which forms part of the notorious "Golden Triangle", one of the world's largest illicit narcotics-producing regions.

Mizoram shares a 510-km unfenced international border with Myanmar and a 318-km border with Bangladesh, making the state particularly vulnerable to trans-border smuggling of narcotics and other contraband.

Similarly, Manipur shares a 398-km unfenced international border with Myanmar, which has also been exploited by drug trafficking syndicates and other cross-border criminal networks.

Security agencies have repeatedly expressed concern that the porous borders of both Mizoram and Manipur continue to facilitate the movement of narcotics originating from the Golden Triangle region, underscoring the need for sustained coordinated operations to combat drug trafficking across the Northeast.

# Guwahati Police Seize Over 290 Grams of Heroin in Multiple Raids In Last One Week

GUWAHATI: Guwahati Police have carried out a series of anti-narcotics operations this week, seizing a combined total of approximately 291 grams of heroin across four separate raids in the city. In the first operation, a CGPD team from Panbazar PS arrested a woman drug peddler, Mallika Begum (22) of 2 No. Rail Gate, after she was caught with 16 vials of heroin weighing 18.93 grams.

In a second raid, an EGPD team from Basistha PS raided a hideout at Khanapara and arrested three peddlers, Dipankar Saikia (23) of Jorhat, Bhaskar Borah (24), and Rahul Das (33), both from Guwahati. Officers recovered 60 vials of heroin weighing 73.73 grams.

Police also stated that 16 drug-addicted victims were rescued and sent to a rehabilitation centre for treatment.

In the third case, the CGPD team from Panbazar PS arrested three more peddlers Gokul Sarkar (19), Majirum Begum (25), and Ramesha Khatun (30) at 2 No. Rail Gate. Officers found 41.81 grams of heroin concealed inside five tobacco cans, along with 51 empty vials.

In the fourth and largest bust, a WGPD team from Fatasil Ambari PS, acting on intelligence, raided a hideout in the Birubari–Shankarpur area and arrested Nurul Haque (39) of Panbazar, Nitesh Singh (21) of Fancy Bazar, and Saleha Bibi (27) of Panbazar. The team seized 127 vials of heroin weighing 156.77 grams, along with cash worth ₹1,14,082 and three mobile phones.

The scale of these seizures within a single week signals a worrying rise in drug trafficking across Guwahati, spanning Rail Gate, Khanapara, and Birubari-Shankarpur. While police continue enforcement under anti substance abuse campaign, the recurring busts highlight the urgent need for sustained vigilance and rehabilitation support.

# Two held in Assam's Dhubri with suspected psychotropic drugs, cash seized

**Police arrested two alleged drug peddlers in Dhubri and seized suspected psychotropic medicines and cash. A case has been registered as investigators trace the supply chain and others linked to the network.**

Police arrested two alleged drug peddlers and seized suspected psychotropic substances along with cash during an anti-narcotics operation in Assam's Dhubri district.

Acting on specific intelligence about the illegal sale of narcotic and psychotropic substances, a team from the BN College Town Outpost (TOP) conducted a raid in the Chotobajani area on Monday evening, July 6. During the operation, police intercepted and apprehended two suspects allegedly involved in the illicit drug trade.

The arrested persons have been identified as Riyajul Hoque, a resident of Adabari Part-II, and Ejaj Sheikh of IG Road, both under Dhubri Police Station limits.

A search conducted in the presence of independent witnesses led to the seizure of seven bottles of Triprolidine Hydrochloride and Codeine cough syrup, 134 Spas Plus capsules, 69 Nitcor-10 (Nitrazepam) tablets and ₹5,000 in cash, which police suspect to be proceeds from drug trafficking.

Officials said the recovered pharmaceutical substances are suspected to fall under the provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. The seized contraband and cash have been taken into custody, and a case has been registered under relevant sections of the law.

Police said further investigation is underway to trace the supply chain and identify others involved in the illegal distribution network.

# 670 kg Ganja Seized at Guwahati Airport Cargo Terminal; Four Arrested, International Smuggling Link Suspected

GUWAHATI: In a major crackdown on drug trafficking, Assam Police seized approximately 670 kilograms of ganja from the cargo terminal of Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport in Guwahati and arrested four alleged traffickers. Investigators suspect the involvement of an international drug smuggling network.

The seizure was made during the scanning of 111 parcels at the airport's cargo terminal. Airport officials became suspicious of the consignments and immediately alerted Azara Police. During the subsequent search, police recovered 670 kg of ganja meticulously packed into 111 parcels that were allegedly ready to be dispatched to various states through courier services.

Preliminary investigation revealed that the contraband was sourced from the Mairang area in Meghalaya's West Khasi Hills district and transported to Guwahati via Jorabat. Police said the consignments were intended for delivery to Punjab, Delhi and Haryana. To evade detection, the accused allegedly booked the parcels using the names and addresses of deceased individuals.

The four accused have been identified as Abu Bakkar Siddique alias Roman (22), a resident of Tripura who was apprehended at the airport; Phalbakstar Parlong (32), Alvinestar Siem (21), and Crush Dokhar (40), all residents of Meghalaya's West Khasi Hills district. Police said Dokhar was driving the vehicle used to transport the consignment.

Azara Police have registered Case No. 87/2026 under Section 20(b)(ii)(C) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act against the four accused. The arrested individuals have been produced before the court, while further investigation is underway to uncover the larger drug trafficking network and identify others involved in the operation.

# Telangana Aims for Drug-Free State by 2029

**Hyderabad, July 6:** Telangana's Director General of Police (DGP) C.V. Anand announced on Monday that drug traffickers will be considered more dangerous than extremists and terrorists. He emphasized that stricter legal actions will be taken against those involved in drug trafficking.

During a district crime review meeting held at the Bhadradri Kothagudem district police office, the police chief stated that effective control over drug and cannabis trafficking in the Bhadradri Kothagudem and Khammam districts will play a crucial role in strengthening the state's anti-drug campaign.

He pointed out that the borders of Bhadradri Kothagudem are adjacent to Chhattisgarh and Andhra Pradesh, making it a significant entry point for cannabis trafficking. The DGP directed district police to intensify actions against cannabis cultivation, transportation, and illegal trade.

Expressing concern over the rising impact of drugs on society, the DGP highlighted that the increasing addiction among youth poses a serious threat to future generations. He cited the drug problem in Punjab as an example and urged officials to take concrete steps to prevent Telangana from facing a similar situation.

The DGP made it clear that drug traffickers will be treated as more dangerous than extremists and terrorists, and more stringent legal actions will be pursued against them. He stated that Telangana police will conduct uncompromising operations against the drug trafficking network, bringing offenders hiding in the country or abroad to justice.

Reiterating the state government's vision, the DGP committed to making Telangana a drug-free state by December 2029 with active public participation. He instructed officials to enhance surveillance at bus stations, railway stations, check posts, and other sensitive locations, deploy dog squads, and accelerate actions against drug trafficking networks.

The DGP also emphasized the need to improve the quality and speed of investigations, file charge sheets on time, and increase conviction rates. He directed that all case records and digital evidence be uploaded to the Crime and Criminal Tracking Network System (CCTNS) to expedite the investigation and trial processes.

Highlighting Bhadradri Kothagudem as an important industrial district, the DGP stressed the need for intelligence-based and targeted policing to control crime effectively. He praised the district police's performance and called on officials to continue professional and effective policing, aiming to make Bhadradri Kothagudem a model district in law and order.

During the meeting, Superintendent of Police Rohit Raj presented a detailed overview of the district's crime statistics, cannabis cases, cybercrime, women's safety, road safety, incidents related to left-wing extremism, and the progress of criminal investigations.

# 34 venues, 27 cases: Kerala cops link late-night DJ parties to drugs, violence

**KOCHI:** The Kochi police commissioner has informed the High Court that there has been a rapid and unchecked proliferation of “DJ parties” in the city, conducted without adequate regulatory oversight or effective control mechanisms.

What began with only three venues has now expanded to more than 34 active commercial establishments. These events are organised on a commercial basis, with entry fees ranging from Rs 1,500 to Rs 6,000 per person. Organisers also collect up to Rs 20,000 per table for reservations.

The commissioner said this rapid and uncontrolled growth has created a risky situation, posing significant challenges to the maintenance of public safety and law and order.

“So far, the Kochi City Police have registered 27 criminal cases related to such late-night events, including cases involving unlawful assemblies, drug-related offences, crimes against women, and other violations of law,” the commissioner stated in an affidavit filed before the High Court.

The statement was filed in response to a petition by Mahadevan, the licensee and vice-president of the Radisson Blu Hotel, Kadavanthra, seeking permission to operate the bar attached to the five-star hotel until 3 am.

The commissioner said several establishments holding FL-3 licences have been conducting late-night “DJ parties” under the cover of the extended operating hours granted by the excise department. These events have allegedly resulted in incidents of drug abuse, violent disturbances, and threats to public safety.

The police described a “DJ party” as a high-intensity commercial event involving amplified music, lighting effects, and dense crowds. Based on past experiences, such events are often associated with alcohol consumption and alleged drug use, leading to disorderly conduct, brawls, public nuisance, crowd management issues during assembly and dispersal, traffic disruption, and broader law-and-order concerns. Given the increasing number of such events in Kochi, and their repeated links to public order issues, the commissioner contended that strict regulatory intervention is necessary.

The police further stated that several incidents affecting public safety and public order were reported from the petitioner’s establishment, Radisson Blu, during 2026 alone. Criminal cases were registered at the Kadavanthra police station in connection with offences including alleged narcotic drug trafficking, assault, rioting, and damage to property within the hotel premises. According to the police, these incidents substantiate the concerns raised by the department.

## Police justify decision

The commissioner submitted that leaving the high-risk late-night entertainment sector unregulated poses serious public safety concerns, as demonstrated by several incidents in Kochi city. On November 1, 2021, an allegedly unregulated DJ event at Hotel No 18, Fort Kochi, involving suspected drug use, was followed by a high-speed chase that culminated in a fatal road accident, claiming the lives of three persons.

The police also referred to other serious incidents, including an alleged sexual assault during a DJ event at Hotel Olive Downtown in August 2023 and a stabbing incident at the same hotel in July 2022 after a person was denied entry to an overnight event. According to the commissioner, these incidents underscore the need for strict regulatory oversight.

The police also referred to a recent tragedy in North Goa to highlight the risks associated with unregulated nightlife events. They submitted that around 25 people reportedly lost their lives in a massive nightclub fire, illustrating the grave dangers posed by inadequate fire safety measures and the absence of proper emergency evacuation facilities. According to the commissioner, the incident demonstrates the importance of stringent regulation to ensure public safety.

# Kerala to crack down on medical stores illegally selling narcotic drugs

Kerala home minister Ramesh Chennithala on Monday said that the police had received information that some medical stores were illegally distributing narcotic drugs in various forms and warned of strict legal action against those involved.

The minister said inspections would be intensified and no medical store found facilitating the illegal drug trade would be spared.

"There will be no compromise with any establishment that helps the spread of narcotic drugs. Medical stores found guilty will face the maximum punishment provided under the law," Chennithala said.

He said strict action would be taken against those behind the drug trade, irrespective of their influence.

"No matter how influential they are, those involved in the drug trade will face strict action," the home minister said.

Chennithala said the government's anti-drug campaign, Operation Toofan, had been receiving strong public support, including from women and children.

He said the police had found that a small number of medical stores were involved in distributing narcotic drugs in different forms and assured that such establishments would be identified and punished. -- *PTI*

# Four history sheeters held for trafficking drugs from Mumbai

**CHENNAI:** The Tambaram City police arrested four history-sheeters who allegedly smuggled narcotic tablets from Mumbai and sold them to youngsters in the Chennai suburbs.

They seized 420 tablets from the accused.

Following intelligence inputs that a group from Chennai suburbs was procuring narcotic tablets from Mumbai for distribution here, a special team launched an intensive probe.

The team monitored suspects' mobile phone activity and found they were reaching Chennai by train. As the suspects realised they were being tracked, they got down at Kadapa in Andhra Pradesh and travelled by car via Vellore and Poonamallee to reach Mudichur.

The suspects were then hiding near a burial ground in Kadapperi and sold the narcotics to youths when the special team surrounded and arrested them.

The accused were identified as Sakthivel (26) of St Thomas Mount, Manoj Kumar (26) of Perumbakkam, Ranjith Kumar (25) of Mannivakkam and Ruben (20) of Kadapperi.

Police said all four have several criminal cases pending against them and recovered 420 narcotic tablets, syringes used to dissolve and inject powdered tablets, a fake pistol, machetes and six mobile phones.

It was found that the gang used courier services earlier to bring in tablets from Mumbai and then changed their modus operandi when police intensified action against drug trafficking via courier.

The four accused were produced before the Tambaram court and remanded in judicial custody.

**CHENNAI:** The Tamil Nadu Police seized 296 kg of ganja, 1.3 kg of other narcotic substances, and 802 painkiller tablets and arrested 621 persons in a three-day state-wide special enforcement drive from July 3 to July 5. They also seized 6,653 kg of banned oral tobacco products.

During the drive, the district and city police carried out intensive vehicle checks, raids, surveillance and intelligence-based operations at vulnerable locations across the state to curb the illegal trafficking, possession, sale and transportation of narcotic drugs and banned tobacco products.

The Chennai City police said they have registered 33 cases and arrested 54 people in a special drive conducted over the past seven days. They also seized 46.6 kg of ganja, 12 grams of methamphetamine and 386 tablets.

HYDERABAD: The Secunderabad GRP, in coordination with the EAGLE team, busted an interstate ganja smuggling racket and arrested three transporters, including a 17-year-old Child in Conflict with Law (CCL), at Secunderabad Railway Station. Police seized 41.131 kg of dry ganja worth Rs 20.56 lakh.

**CHENNAI:** The Customs officials seized 3 kg of hydroponic ganja and arrested a man at the city airport on Sunday (July 5).

The seized contraband, worth Rs 3 crore, was smuggled in from Bangkok.

Based on specific intelligence that narcotic substances were being smuggled into Chennai on a flight from Bangkok, officers from the Air Intelligence Unit kept a close watch on passengers arriving on the international flight late at night.

During the screening, officials grew suspicious of a 38-year-old Tamil Nadu man who had returned from Thailand after claiming to have travelled as a tourist.

The flyer gave evasive replies during questioning, following which the officials escorted him to the Customs office and searched his baggage.

The search revealed five concealed parcels inside his luggage. On opening the packages, they found 3 kg of high-grade hydroponic ganja valued at Rs 3 crore.

The contraband was seized, and the passenger was arrested.

During preliminary interrogation, the Customs officials found that the accused had acted as a drug courier for a smuggling network.

Officers are now attempting to identify the kingpin and other members of the network.

# ‘Ganja’ Under NDPS Act Means Only Flowering Tops, Not Leaves or Branches: Delhi HC [Read Order]

**New Delhi:** The Delhi High Court has held that dried leaves and small branches of the cannabis plant do not fall within the statutory definition of “**ganja**” under the **Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (NDPS Act)**, and that when seized material is weighed inclusively without isolating the qualifying flowering or fruiting tops, the actual quantity of ganja cannot be determined at the stage of bail.

On this basis, a Single Judge Bench of Justice Prateek Jalan granted regular bail to two accused persons charged under Sections 20/29 of the NDPS Act, holding that the stringent conditions under Section 37 of the Act were rendered doubtful in the absence of a reliable determination of commercial quantity.

The applications were filed before the Delhi High Court under Section 483 of the **Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS)**. Both applicants had been apprehended while carrying a black bag containing 21.95 kilograms of a substance alleged to be ganja.

According to the prosecution, the Seizure Memo recorded that the bag was full of dried leaves and small branches, which appeared to be ganja by smell and sight. Upon examination of their mobile phones, it was found that Shahid @ Aabu had received photographs of the narcotic substance from one Yunus @ Mukhiya, and the phones also reflected Call Detail Record connectivity between the applicants and the said co-accused, who remains at large.

The applicants, through their counsel, argued that the seized substance did not answer the statutory definition of “**ganja**” under Section 2(iii)(b) of the **NDPS Act**, which defines ganja as the flowering or fruiting tops of the cannabis plant, excluding seeds and leaves when not accompanied by the tops. They contended that since the Seizure Memo described the material as dried leaves and small branches, and the entire substance was weighed without separating the non-qualifying components, the actual quantity of ganja, if any, could not be determined. Consequently, they argued, the presumption of commercial quantity required to attract the rigours of Section 37 of the NDPS Act did not arise.

The prosecution, on the other hand, pointed to the **Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL)** report dated 21.02.2025, which confirmed the sampled material to be ganja within the meaning of the Act. With the total recovery exceeding 20 kilograms, the threshold for commercial quantity, the Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that Section 37 of the Act would apply, making the grant of bail subject to more stringent conditions.

The Court examined the FSL report closely. While the report described the exhibit as dried greenish-brown coloured flowering and fruiting tops, vegetative material, and confirmed it to be ganja, the Seizure Memo itself referred to dried leaves and small branches. The Magistrate's Court order at the time of sampling had noted the material as a muddy brown substance. These discrepancies, the Court found, were significant.

Relying on coordinate bench decisions in *Ravina Kumari v. State (NCT of Delhi)* [BAIL APPLN. 1256/2024] and *Ashok Kumar v. State Govt. of NCT of Delhi* [BAIL APPLN. 2962/2025], as well as its own earlier order in *Manjay Kumar v. State NCT of Delhi* [BAIL APPLN. 4206/2025], the Court reiterated the legal position on the definition of ganja.

The judgment in *Ravina Kumari* had held that in a heterogeneous mixture comprising both flowering tops and non-qualifying material such as leaves, stems, and stalks, only the weight of the flowering and fruiting tops constitutes ganja for the purposes of the NDPS Act. The weight of leaves and stalks, which do not independently fall within the statutory definition, cannot be added to determine whether the quantity crosses the commercial threshold.

Applying this principle, the Court noted that the total weight of 21.95 kilograms was only marginally above the 20-kilogram commercial quantity threshold for ganja. Since the material had been weighed without isolating the qualifying components, the actual quantity of ganja could not be ascertained at this stage. In such circumstances, there existed a *prima facie* doubt as to whether the seizure constituted a commercial quantity, rendering the applicability of Section 37 of the NDPS Act doubtful. The Court observed that the weight of the actual ganja recovered is a matter of trial.

Turning to the personal circumstances of the applicants, the Court noted that Mujabil had been in custody for approximately one year and four months and was only 18 years of age at the time of arrest. Shahid @ Aabu had been in custody for around one year and had previously been released on interim bail on three occasions without any allegation of misuse. The prosecution confirmed that neither applicant had any prior involvement in criminal cases. The charges had been framed, but prosecution evidence had not yet commenced, with 16 witnesses cited by the prosecution, indicating that the trial was likely to take considerable time.

The Court directed that both applicants be released on bail upon furnishing personal bonds of Rs. 35,000 each with one surety each in the like amount, and imposed standard conditions, including appearance before the Special Court on all dates of hearing, surrender of passports, if any, continued residence at the address as per prison records, submission of mobile numbers to the investigating officer, and prohibitions against contacting prosecution witnesses, tampering with evidence, or committing any offence during the pendency of the trial.

The Court clarified that its observations were solely for the purpose of adjudicating the bail applications and should not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.

# Police destroy seized drugs in Anantnag, Sopore

SRINAGAR, July 6: Police today destroyed a large quantity of seized narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances in separate disposal proceedings Anantnag and Sopore.

A police spokesperson said that the destruction was carried out after obtaining legal sanctions and in compliance with the directions of the competent courts at the Government-approved disposal facilities.

In Anantnag, police destroyed over 308 kilograms of seized contraband linked to multiple NDPS cases, including poppy straw, charas, bung boosa, ganja, cannabis powder and leaves, heroin, brown sugar and 823 bottles of codeine phosphate, the spokesperson said.

The spokesperson said Sopore Police also destroyed a substantial quantity of seized narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances connected with multiple NDPS cases registered in the police district. "The disposal was carried out through incineration under the supervision of the District Drug Disposal Committees and designated officers, ensuring transparency and compliance with the NDPS Act, NDPS Rules and prescribed procedures," the spokesperson said.

# Chandigarh: Delhi woman gets 2-years' jail for heroin possession

A Special NDPS Court in Chandigarh convicted a Delhi woman for possessing 200gm of heroin, holding that the prosecution had successfully proved the recovery and maintained an unbroken chain of custody of the contraband despite several procedural objections raised by the defence.

The court ruled that the safeguards under Section 50 of the NDPS Act were not attracted in the case because the heroin was recovered from a polythene bag taken out of the accused's shoulder bag and not from her in person.

Special court judge Raman Goklaney convicted Nina, a resident of Burari, Delhi, under Section 21(b) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. The court sentenced her to two years' rigorous imprisonment and imposed a fine of ₹10,000, with one month's simple imprisonment in default of payment.

According to the prosecution, a police party laid a naka near Furniture Market Chowk in Chandigarh on November 20, 2020, when the accused, carrying a pink shoulder bag, allegedly turned back on noticing the police and attempted to throw away a polythene packet. The packet was recovered and found to contain 200 grams of heroin. The sample was later sent to the Central Forensic Science Laboratory (CFSL), which confirmed the presence of heroin.

During the trial, the defence sought acquittal on multiple grounds, including the absence of independent public witnesses, alleged violation of mandatory safeguards under Section 50 of the NDPS Act, non-examination of the lady constables who intercepted the accused, discrepancies in the prosecution's timeline, delay in sending the sample for forensic examination, and the contention that the accused was formally arrested after sunset without prior permission of a magistrate.

Rejecting these arguments, the court held that the recovery witnesses gave consistent and reliable accounts of the incident and that there was no evidence of any motive for the police officials to falsely implicate the accused. It observed that merely because no independent witness joined the proceedings did not render the prosecution case unreliable when the official witnesses were found to be trustworthy.

The court also ruled that the safeguards under Section 50 of the NDPS Act were not attracted in the case because the heroin was recovered from a polythene bag taken out of the accused's shoulder bag and not from her in person. Relying on a Supreme Court (SC) judgment, the court held that Section 50 applies only to personal searches and not to the search of bags or other articles carried by an accused.

On the defence argument regarding the arrest of a woman after sunset, the court observed that the accused had been apprehended before sunset and that the subsequent completion of formal arrest procedures in the evening did not invalidate the recovery. It further held that a chance recovery under the NDPS Act constituted an exceptional circumstance requiring immediate police action.

The court further held that the non-examination of the lady constables did not weaken the prosecution's case, observing that criminal cases are decided on the quality rather than the quantity of evidence and that their testimony would have been merely corroborative.

Addressing the alleged delay in forwarding the sample to the forensic laboratory, the court noted that the seals remained intact throughout and the CFSL report confirmed there had been no tampering. It held that the two-day delay was inconsequential in view of the intact chain of custody.

The court also observed that minor discrepancies of about 20 to 30 minutes in the witnesses' timelines were natural and did not affect the core prosecution case.

Concluding that the prosecution had proved beyond reasonable doubt that the accused was in conscious possession of heroin and that the chain of custody remained intact from seizure to forensic examination, the court convicted Nina under Section 21(b) of the NDPS Act.

Mohali: Mohali police arrested two suspected drug smugglers and seized 400 grams of [heroin](#) from their possession during a naka on the road connecting Sector 104 and Sukhgarh village under the Sohana police station. The accused, both residents of Chandigarh, were travelling in a Hyundai i10 car that was intercepted after the driver allegedly attempted to flee on spotting the police checkpoint. A case has been registered under Sections 21 and 29 of the NDPS Act, and further investigations are under way to trace the source and intended destination of the contraband. Police said the naka was set up around 1.20 pm by a team led by SI Barma Singh, in-charge of the Saneta police post. During checking, a white Hyundai i10 approaching from the Sukhgarh side allegedly aroused suspicion when its driver tried to turn back on seeing the police party. The vehicle was stopped and its occupants identified as [Ajay Kumar](#) and Varun alias Sonu, both residents of Sector 49-C, Chandigarh. Police said the duo were informed of their legal rights before the search. During the operation, 200 grams of heroin was allegedly recovered from Ajay Kumar and another 200 grams from Varun, taking the total recovery to 400 grams. The seized contraband was sealed as per procedure and the car was also impounded. Investigators are now probing the source of the heroin, its intended recipients and possible links of the accused to a larger drug trafficking network operating in the region.

# Three arrested with brown sugar worth Rs 3.6 lakh

Indore: Three men were arrested from Super Corridor service road allegedly for illegal possession of 36 grams of brown sugar. The seized contraband has an estimated market value of Rs 3.60 lakh, Indore Crime Branch said on Monday.

Deputy commissioner of police (DCP) Crime Branch Rajesh Kumar Tripathi stated that, based on a tip-off, a team set up a blockade on the service road and intercepted three individuals riding a motorcycle.

During a physical inspection of the vehicle, the team found brown sugar concealed beneath the motorcycle's seat. The three, Manita Kewat, Akash Kaushal and Rishi Yadav, were searching for buyers to sell the narcotics when they were apprehended. According to investigators, all three men work as labourers.

The Crime Branch registered a case and was interrogating the three to trace the origin of the contraband, establish their supply network and identify intended buyers in the region.

## 4.4 quintals of ganja worth Rs 3.5cr seized, truck driver held

Kanpur: In a major crackdown on interstate drug trafficking, the Kanpur Police Commissionerate seized 4.4 quintals of ganja worth Rs 3.5 crore in the international market and arrested a truck driver in the Sajeti police station area on Sunday. The consignment was allegedly being transported from [Odisha](#) to [Rajasthan](#). Acting on a tip-off received by ADCP (South) Sumit Sudhakar Ramteke, a police team led by ACP Ghatampur Krishnakant and Sajeti police laid a trap near Baripal Market and intercepted the truck. During the search, police recovered hundreds of packets of ganja concealed inside the vehicle. The truck driver attempted to flee but was chased and arrested. During questioning, the accused identified himself as Rameshwar, a resident of Rajasthan. He told police that he was instructed to hand over the consignment to a person after entering Rajasthan. According to him, the recipient knew only the truck's registration number, while traffickers based in Odisha acted as intermediaries between the sender and receiver. Police have seized the driver's mobile phone and launched an investigation into the interstate trafficking network. Preliminary investigations revealed that the ganja was to be distributed across different districts of Rajasthan and sold in small packets. Police also found that traffickers frequently use women and children as passengers in vehicles to avoid suspicion during transit. In this case, women and children were reportedly travelling in the truck but were dropped off before it reached Kanpur. According to police, ganja procured at a low price in Odisha fetches several times its original value by the time it reaches other states. Investigators suspect the seized consignment is linked to a major interstate drug trafficking syndicate and are trying to identify the network operating between Odisha and Rajasthan. ADCP (South) Sumit Ramteke said police acted on specific intelligence to seize 4.4 quintals of ganja and arrest the truck driver. He said the investigation into the entire trafficking network is underway and added that the police's campaign against drug trafficking will continue.

The city police have arrested a woman and her son for allegedly trafficking narcotics and recovered 15 kg of ganja, ₹31,400 suspected to be drug proceeds, packaging material and a scooter allegedly used in the crime from their possession.

The accused have been identified as Prakash Bharati, a native of Bihar currently residing in Kotla Afgana village in Ludhiana, and his mother, Mandrika Bharati.

ASI Kapil Kumar, in-charge of the Ishwar Colony police post, said he was on routine patrol with other police personnel when they intercepted Prakash Bharati and recovered 5 kg of ganja from his possession.

An FIR under Sections 20, 25, 61 and 85 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act was registered at Focal Point police station.

During interrogation, the police uncovered the alleged involvement of Mandrika Bharati, who was subsequently nominated in the case and arrested.

Further investigation led to the recovery of another 10 kg of ganja, taking the total seizure to 15 kg. The police also recovered ₹31,400, believed to be drug proceeds, along with empty pouches allegedly used for packaging the contraband.

The ASI said further investigation is underway to trace the source of the narcotics and identify others involved in the supply chain.

मध्य प्रदेश में नशे के अवैध कारोबार के खिलाफ पुलिस को बड़ी सफलता मिली है। राजधानी भोपाल के बाद अब रीवा जोन के मऊगंज जिले में कथित MD (मेफेड्रोन) ड्रग्स निर्माण फैक्ट्री का भंडाफोड़ किया गया है। शाहपुर थाना क्षेत्र के बिझौली गांव में पुलिस की छापेमार कार्रवाई के दौरान करोड़ों रुपये की संदिग्ध MD ड्रग्स, बड़ी मात्रा में केमिकल, एसिड, ड्रग्स बनाने में उपयोग होने वाले उपकरण तथा एक लग्जरी चार पहिया वाहन बरामद किया गया। मौके से चार आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया है।

जानकारी के अनुसार यह कार्रवाई रीवा जोन के पुलिस महानिरीक्षक (आईजी) गौरव राजपूत के निर्देशन में की गई। अभियान का नेतृत्व मऊगंज पुलिस अधीक्षक (एसपी) एस.के. जैन और अनुविभागीय पुलिस अधिकारी (एसडीओपी) सची पाठक ने किया। पुलिस को मुखबिर से सूचना मिली थी कि बिझौली गांव में अवैध रूप से सिंथेटिक ड्रग्स तैयार की जा रही है। सूचना के आधार पर भारी पुलिस बल के साथ मौके पर दबिश दी गई, जहां संदिग्ध फैक्ट्री का खुलासा हुआ।

छापेमारी के दौरान पुलिस ने बड़ी मात्रा में संदिग्ध MD ड्रग्स, विभिन्न रासायनिक पदार्थ, एसिड, लैब उपकरण, मशीनें और अन्य सामग्री जब्त की। बरामद सामग्री की जांच के लिए विशेषज्ञों की मदद ली जा रही है ताकि यह स्पष्ट हो सके कि वहां किस स्तर पर ड्रग्स का निर्माण किया जा रहा था।

प्रारंभिक जांच में पुलिस को संदेह है कि यहां तैयार होने वाली MD ड्रग्स की सप्लाई रीवा के रास्ते मुंबई सहित अन्य स्थानों तक की जाती थी। हालांकि पुलिस ने स्पष्ट किया है कि यह जानकारी शुरुआती पूछताछ और जांच पर आधारित है तथा पूरे नेटवर्क, सप्लाई चेन और अन्य संभावित आरोपियों की भूमिका की विस्तृत जांच की जा रही है। जांच पूरी होने के बाद ही इन तथ्यों की आधिकारिक पुष्टि की जाएगी।

कार्रवाई की जानकारी मिलने पर मध्य प्रदेश के पुलिस महानिदेशक (डीजीपी) कैलाश मकवाना ने रीवा जोन पुलिस की इस सफलता की सराहना की। उन्होंने आईजी गौरव राजपूत, एसपी एस.के. जैन और पूरी पुलिस टीम को बधाई देते हुए इसे नशे के खिलाफ अभियान की महत्वपूर्ण उपलब्धि बताया। वहीं आईजी गौरव राजपूत ने भी कार्रवाई में शामिल पुलिस अधिकारियों और कर्मचारियों को पुरस्कृत किए जाने की घोषणा की है।

फिलहाल गिरफ्तार चारों आरोपियों से गहन पूछताछ जारी है। पुलिस उनके आपराधिक रिकॉर्ड, आर्थिक लेन-देन, नेटवर्क और इस कारोबार से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की तलाश में जुटी है। आरोपियों के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत वैधानिक कार्रवाई की जा रही है। पुलिस का कहना है कि जांच आगे बढ़ने के साथ इस मामले में और भी महत्वपूर्ण खुलासे हो सकते हैं।

# Odisha Police Torch 64.8 MT Ganja in Drug-Free Drive

Odisha Police have marked a major milestone under the Nishamukta Abhiyan by destroying more than 64.8 metric tonnes (64,816.17 kg) of seized ganja till 2.7.2026 in the ongoing statewide narcotics disposal drive.

The exercise was carried out under the supervision of the State Task Force (STF) of the CID Crime Branch.

According to the latest district wise progress report, 78,600.68 kg of seized ganja was identified for destruction in the special drive from 26.6.2026 to 10.7.2026

Of this, 64,816.17 kg has already been destroyed, till 2.7.2026. The remaining 13,784.22 kg will be destroyed by 10.7.2026.

The campaign witnessed significant contributions from districts across the state. Kandhamal led the drive by destroying 31,445.40 kg of seized ganja, followed by Boudh with 16,127 kg, Malkangiri with 8,969.94 kg, Gajapati with 3,116 kg and Bargarh with 1,306 kg. The performance of these districts played a key role in Odisha Police achieving the destruction of more than 64.8 metric tonnes of seized ganja during Phase 1 of the campaign.

Several districts have also achieved or exceeded their destruction targets, including Malkangiri, Gajapati, Koraput, Bolangir, Mayurbhanj, Bargarh, Balasore, Keonjhar, SRP Rourkela and Sundargarh. The progress reflects the sustained efforts of Odisha Police to eliminate seized narcotics and strengthen the fight against the illegal drug trade.

In this context, a programme on the National Level Pre Trial Drug Destruction Special Drive was held recently at Police Bhawan in Bhubaneswar. As per the directions of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Government of India, the nationwide drive is being conducted from June 26 to July 10, 2026 to accelerate the destruction of pre trial seized narcotic substances.

Director General of Police Yogesh Bahadur Khurania has accorded special priority to intensifying the fight against drug trafficking and the narcotics trade.

Reaffirming Odisha Police's unwavering commitment to a drug free state, he said, "Our fight against the illegal drug trade, smuggling and narcotics mafias will be intensified further in the days ahead. Odisha Police will maintain zero tolerance towards those who violate the law. Through coordinated enforcement, the use of advanced technology, active public participation and strong determination, we remain committed to building a drug free, safe and empowered Odisha."
