The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) Chandigarh Zonal Unit, in collaboration with Chandigarh Police, conducted a joint drug disposal programme on Friday at Alliance Environment, Phase-I Industrial Area, Chandigarh.

The Drug Disposal Pakhwada was launched on June 26, the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, by Union Home Minister Amit Shah during the 10th Apex NCORD Meeting. The initiative is being observed across India from June 26 to July 10.

During the event, NCB Chandigarh destroyed 1,859.180 kg of Poppy Straw and 24.310 kg of Charas, while Chandigarh Police simultaneously destroyed 60 injections, 3.343 kg of Ganja, 0.59539 kg of Heroin, and 0.03833 kg of Charas.

In total, the NCB Chandigarh Zonal Unit destroyed 2,027.192 kg of Poppy Straw, 24.310 kg of Charas, and 2.335 kg of Heroin during the Drug Disposal Fortnight, from June 26, 2026, to July 10.

The disposal was carried out in strict accordance with statutory provisions, with permissions obtained from competent authorities and supervised by the Drug Disposal Committee to ensure complete transparency and accountability.

Union Minister Amit Shah highlighted the government's steadfast commitment to protecting youth from narcotics during the International Day Against Drug Abuse. He stated the administration is focused on building a safer society and "healing the affected individuals with the care they deserve."

In a post on X, Amit Shah wrote, “Extending best wishes to all the warriors in our national battle against drugs, on International Day Against Drug Abuse. India under Modi Ji’s leadership has mounted the strongest fight against the global challenge of drug abuse, by eliminating narco-cartels ruthlessly and healing the affected individuals with the care and empathy they deserve.”

Anakapalli: With an aim to make Andhra Pradesh drug-free, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and EAGLE wing have jointly undertaken a massive ganja destruction programme here on Friday. Andhra Pradesh Culture NCB officials seized about 767.5 kg of ganja and 4.036 litres of hashish oil in six separate cases from different parts of the state. The seized drugs and hashish oil were destroyed by a machine without open burning, following pollution control standards, at the state-of-the-art incineration plant of Ramki Pharma in Tanam village of Parawada mandal. The process was completed under the supervision of EAGLE Superintendent of Police G. Swaroopa Rani and NCB Zonal Director Pankaj Kumar Dwivedi. NCB superintendent Rajan Kumar, Intelligence Officer K. Kiran Babu, EAGLE Division Inspectors G Demullu, Kalyani and members of the Anakapalli EAGLE cell were present.

Nigeria's anti-drug agency has charged 10 suspects, including three Mexican nationals, following a significant methamphetamine lab bust. The arrests took place between May 16 and May 18 in Lagos and Ogun state. The operation seized drugs worth \$363 million, spotlighting foreign drug cartels' influence in Nigeria.

The defendants have entered pleas of not guilty and remain in custody pending a bail hearing and trial set for July 16 and 22. This case underscores the escalating concern that international drug cartels are increasingly influencing Nigeria's drug landscape.

पुलिस उपाधीक्षक (डीएसपी) कृष्णकुमार चन्द ने बताया कि जवाबी फायरिंग में आरोपित के बाएं पैर में गोली लगी, जिसके बाद उसे काबू कर लिया गया। उन्होंने बताया कि बरामद हथियार और मादक पदार्थ के स्रोत, आरोपित के नेपाल आने के उद्देश्य तथा उसके संभावित नेटवर्क की जांच की जा रही है।

Mizoram seizes drugs worth Rs 414 crore in six months, 312 arrested

Mizoram Police seized narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances worth more than Rs 414.66 crore during the first six months of 2026, arresting 312 people, including 57 foreign nationals, in a major crackdown on drug trafficking across the state.



Mizoram Police seized narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances worth more than Rs 414.66 crore during the first six months of 2026, arresting 312 people, including 57 foreign nationals, in a major crackdown on drug trafficking across the state.

According to a police statement issued on July 10, authorities registered 219 cases under various provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act between January 1 and June 30.

Methamphetamine accounted for the largest seizure during the period, with 315.903 kg of the drug, valued at Rs 252.72 crore, recovered in 38 cases. The operations led to the arrest of 62 individuals, including 16 foreign nationals.

Police also seized 34.923 kg of heroin worth Rs 69.85 crore in 156 cases, resulting in the arrest of 211 people, including 39 foreigners.

Other major recoveries included 20.628 kg of crystal meth valued at Rs 61.88 crore, 22.286 kg of morphine worth Rs 22.29 crore, 141.492 kg of opium valued at Rs 7.07 crore, 60.681 kg of ganja worth Rs 30.34 lakh, 214.4 kg of codeine valued at Rs 25.22 lakh, and 30 kg of alprazolam worth Rs 30 lakh.

Police said the seizures highlight the force's sustained efforts to combat narcotics trafficking while also underscoring the scale of the drug menace confronting the border state, which shares a porous international boundary with Myanmar.

Assam Needs New Strategy to Break Grip of Drug Traffickers

Guwahati: Assam is aggressively dismantling drug trafficking networks through record seizures and arrests. The state is a prime target for smugglers due to its location near the Golden Triangle. Traffickers use the region to move heroin and meth toward larger Indian markets. These smuggling routes often link up with arms deals and money laundering rings. Police work remains essential for national security, but the current, reactive focus has limits.

Criminal syndicates simply adapt to police tactics by changing routes and using new technology. This means that enforcement alone is a losing game. The state now faces a mounting crisis regarding addiction among its youth. Experts warn that social problems like unemployment and mental health issues drive this demand. Addressing these roots is just as vital as stopping the flow of contraband.

The state must integrate healthcare and education into its anti-drug policies. Schools should teach emotional resilience and offer real-world facts about dependency. De-addiction centers remain scarce and many lack trained staff to handle the caseload. The government needs to treat addiction as a medical condition rather than just a crime.

Economic development in border districts could peel young people away from the illicit trade. By creating jobs, the state can remove the incentives that turn residents into couriers. Community leaders and local organizations can also bridge the gap where government outreach falls short. As the report concludes, "The next phase requires moving from a strategy focused primarily on supply reduction to one that addresses demand, rehabilitation, and social resilience with equal determination."

Border security requires more than just foot patrols. Assam should leverage drones, artificial intelligence, and better intelligence sharing with neighboring countries. Traffickers ignore state lines, so the response must be equally fluid. Success will only arrive when policymakers treat this fight as a matter of public health, not just a policing achievement.

Assam Police arrested two alleged drug peddlers and seized 10,000 banned tablets in Sharifnagar, Sribhumi. The action comes amid intensified anti-drug drives across the Barak Valley and a probe into possible wider links.

- The accused were identified as Asit Pal and Mahir Ahmed
- Officers recovered the prohibited consignment directly from the suspects during operation

In a major anti-drug operation, Assam Police arrested two alleged drug peddlers and seized 10,000 banned intoxicating tablets from the Sharifnagar area of Sribhumi district.

The accused have been identified as Asit Pal and Mahir Ahmed. They were apprehended during a police operation launched following inputs about the illegal trafficking of narcotic substances in the area.

Police recovered the prohibited tablets from the possession of the two accused during the operation. The seized consignment has been taken into custody, and a case has been registered under the relevant provisions of the law.

The arrests come amid intensified anti-drug drives across the Barak Valley, where law enforcement agencies have stepped up efforts to crack down on the illegal trade and trafficking of narcotic substances. Further investigation is underway to identify the source of the consignment and any possible links to a wider drug network.

Arunachal: Siang Police Bust Drug Racket In Boleng; Three Arrested With Heroin And Cash

Siang District Police scored a major breakthrough in the fight against narcotics after arresting three alleged drug traffickers in a late-night operation at Boleng.

The joint operation was conducted by Siang Police along with the West Siang Anti-Drug Squad (ADS).

Among those arrested are two women hailing from West Siang district and one personnel of the Indian Reserve Battalion (IRBn).

The raid was carried out under the supervision of Superintendent of Police J.K. Lego, IPS, with direct inputs from SDPO Y. Yangi. SI T. Padung, Officer-in-Charge of Boleng Police Station, led the ground team comprising police officers and personnel.

Based on specific inputs about movement of suspected drug carriers from Aalo towards Boleng, the team set up strategic naka points and intercepted the accused.

In strict adherence to NDPS Act, 1985 procedures, the search and seizure was done in the presence of Niyang Pertin, Circle Officer-cum-Executive Magistrate, Boleng, and an independent witness.

Police recovered 10.74 grams of suspected heroin(brown sugar), 1.22 grams of suspected opium, 11 OST(Bupet-N) tablets and ₹12,030 in cash believed to be proceeds from drug trade.

A case has been registered at Boleng Police Station under relevant sections of the NDPS Act, 1985. Investigation is underway to identify the source and forward linkages of the narcotics.

Reiterating the force's stance, Siang Police said it remains committed to eradicating drug trafficking from the district. The department has urged citizens to share credible information on drug-related activities to safeguard the youth from substance abuse.

Thiruvananthapuram: Kerala on Friday proposed a permanent interstate coordination mechanism involving the five southern states and central agencies to strengthen action against drug trafficking and organized cross-border narcotics crime under Operation Toofan, the anti-narcotics drive launched by the state police.

The proposal was announced by home minister Ramesh Chennithala after chairing an interstate coordination meeting of police chiefs from southern states and senior officials of central enforcement agencies at the state police headquarters. The meeting was convened to enhance coordination under "Operation Toofan: The Narco Hunt", which the state govt described as India's largest anti-narcotics campaign.

The minister said each participating state would appoint a nodal officer of SP rank or above, while central agencies, including the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI), Customs and the Railway Protection Force (RPF), would also nominate nodal officers to facilitate real-time intelligence sharing and joint enforcement operations. He said a joint operation with the southern states and central agencies to block the major drug trafficking routes into Kerala would begin soon. Karnataka's home minister is also expected to visit Kerala for follow-up coordination discussions.

Chennithala said the district anti-narcotic special action force (Dansaf) would be further strengthened to improve anti-drug operations at the district level without affecting regular law-and-order duties.

He also announced that two new NDPS courts would be set up shortly in Thiruvananthapuram and Ernakulam to strengthen the disposal of narcotics cases, while the state would also implement the Centre's recommendation to establish 10 more such courts.

Stating that drug trafficking networks are increasingly using online platforms and courier services, the minister said surveillance and enforcement against such channels would be intensified. Distribution of medicines without valid prescriptions would be strictly regulated, and the health department and police would conduct joint inspections to prevent the misuse of medicines with narcotic potential through medical stores.

The next phase of Operation Toofan will focus on preventing drug trafficking through all major entry routes into Kerala, including state borders and transport networks such as buses, trains, aircraft and boats, with the objective of making the state drug-free, he said.

The coordination meeting was attended by Tamil Nadu DGP Mahesh Kumar Aggarwal, Puducherry DGP Shalini Singh, Karnataka ADGP (law and order) R Hithendra, Customs Preventive commissioner for Kerala-Lakshadweep T Tiju, NCB deputy director general R Sudhakar, IB joint director Don K Jose, DRI additional director general K Padmavathi, Telangana anti-narcotic bureau SP P V Padmaja, Andhra Pradesh elite anti-narcotic group for law enforcement SP (operations) K M Maheswara Raju, RPF divisional security commissioner Mohammed Hanif and other senior officials from state police forces and central agencies.

The minister also announced that ADGP (law and order) P Vijayan has been appointed chief police coordinator for the forthcoming Sabarimala pilgrimage season.

ED launches laundering probe into ₹1,500cr hydroponic ganja racket

Hyderabad: Enforcement Directorate has stepped into the battle against organised drug trafficking, launching a money laundering investigation into major narcotics cases, including an international hydroponic ganja syndicate that allegedly smuggled drugs worth nearly ₹1,500 crore into India over the past three years.

The agency has registered an Enforcement Case Information Report (ECIR) in connection with the latest international hydroponic ganja smuggling racket. Sources said the ED is examining the financial transactions linked to multiple consignments and related cases involving hydroponic ganja allegedly smuggled from Thailand through Hyderabad airport in vacuum-sealed packages.

Investigators suspect the network generated substantial illicit proceeds and may have wider financial and criminal links, prompting the agency to invoke provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) and prosecute those involved. The ED has also registered an ECIR in the Visakhapatnam-Alluri Sitharama Raju district ganja seizure case of Andhra Pradesh involving more than 1,000 kg of contraband, sources said.

Thai-Hyd route under lens

The development follows a major crackdown by the Eagle Force, which dismantled the hydroponic ganja smuggling syndicate.

Police said the racket was reportedly operated by two brothers from Maharashtra who allegedly shifted from red

sanders smuggling to hydroponic ganja trafficking in 2023 because of the higher profits involved. Investigators estimate that about 1,700 kg of hydroponic ganja entered the country through the network during this period.

According to the investigation, the syndicate is believed to have cultivated cannabis through an agreement with Oriental Plantation company in Thailand and allegedly used Jalwa Club and a company named Cali Goods in Pattaya as front entities. The drugs were reportedly concealed in trolley bags and smuggled into India through couriers recruited from different cities, including Hyderabad. Each courier was allegedly paid ₹20,000 per trip.

Police said the consignments were primarily intended for affluent consumers in Mumbai, where hydroponic ganja commands a premium in the illegal market.

The probe further revealed alleged links between the syndicate and members of the Mumbai underworld, besides Indian and foreign associates responsible for logistics and transportation. Investigators said the network relied on multiple couriers to move hydroponic ganja from Thailand into India while maintaining a sophisticated supply chain catering to a high-end customer base. The operation allegedly functioned across borders with the support of associates based in both Thailand and India.

The investigation began after the hydroponic ganja seizure at Hyderabad airport in April. The breakthrough led to the arrest of 13 persons, while one of the key accused remains absconding. Police said efforts are under way to secure Interpol assistance to trace and apprehend him and other foreign-based associates linked to the syndicate.

Under ED scanner

In another case now under the ED's scrutiny, the Alluri Sitharama Raju district police and the Narcotics Control Bureau arrested three persons and seized 1,125 kg of ganja being transported in a vehicle at Busuputtu village under the limits of Munchingputtu police station in June 2026.

The seized contraband was estimated to be worth more than ₹1.5 crore. According to Munchingputtu sub-inspector P Nani, the accused included two persons from Andhra Pradesh and one from Odisha. Police said the ganja was packed in bags and loaded inside a van when the vehicle was intercepted, leading to the seizure of the contraband.

Hyderabad: The Elite Action Group for Drug Law Enforcement (EAGLE) Force along with the Cyberabad Police and Hyderabad Narcotics Police Station (HNPS) busted an illegal drug network in Fathenagar, Balanagar.

The joint raid led to the arrest of a drug seller and 29 drug consumers who tested positive for ganja.

Raid launched after complaints

The operation was conducted after the EAGLE Force received multiple complaints through its toll-free helpline 1908.

A special police team reached Fathenagar with two consumers to identify the drug sellers. During the operation, 31 people from different parts of Hyderabad were caught while trying to buy ganja.

Among them, 29 consumers tested positive for drug use. Police also found that 11 of them were children of single parents. Three were orphans.

Drug seller arrested, elderly woman absconding

Police identified 30-year-old Kaliwala Ajay alias Akash as the main accused. His 78-year-old grandmother, Chandramma, was also identified as a seller. She is currently absconding.

According to police, Chandramma was allegedly selling small ganja packets for Rs 500 each in front of her house.

A total of 17.8 grams of ganja and one mobile phone were seized during the raid.

Youth reveal major ganja supply points

During questioning, the arrested consumers told police that Fathenagar, Nanakramguda (Gachibowli), and Dhoolpet are major locations for purchasing ganja.

Most of the arrested youth were around 25 years old and admitted that they had been addicted to drugs for more than two years.

Police also said drug peddlers were making huge profits by selling 5 grams of ganja for Rs 500. They were earning nearly Rs 1 lakh per kilogram.

Several peddlers managed to escape after noticing the police team.

Case registered under NDPS Act

All seized ganja, the arrested accused, and the 29 consumers were handed over to the Hyderabad Narcotics Police Station.

A case has been registered under the NDPS Act.

Hyderabad: Youth Beaten To Death By Friends Over Ganja Dispute

Hyderabad: A 22-year-old man from Pasumamula under the Hayathnagar mandal near the city was allegedly beaten to death by his friends after being lured out of his house in the early hours of Wednesday, reportedly over disputes over ganja transactions and an altercation involving a girl. According to police, the deceased, identified as Nishani Suhas, was addicted to Ganja and also involved in selling it to fund his addiction.

Earlier, when he was staying in Secunderabad, his mother Nandini realized he was going astray and bought a house in Pasumamula to keep watch over him. After losing her husband and getting her daughter married, Nandini had pinned all her hopes on her son.

Police said Suhas was close friends with Rakesh from Secunderabad, Parashuram and Raju from Nadimipally and Pedda Amberpet, and one other person. Since Suhas did not have a mobile phone, he allegedly used one of their phones to chat with a girl on Instagram. He is said to have sent her obscene messages and also to have spoken to her inappropriately. The girl later informed her boyfriend, who was one of their friends, about the incident.

Combined with previous fights over money during their ganja dealings, and his indecent behavior with the girl, they allegedly planned to eliminate him. In the early hours of Wednesday, Parashuram, Raju, Rakesh and another person made an audio call to Suhas's mother Nandini from Parashuram's Instagram account as he did not have a phone. When she did not answer, they went directly to the house and took him out.

The group took him to a deserted area on the outskirts of Pasumamula village and attacked him. Suhas who managed to run about half a kilometer in an attempt to escape, however they chased and beat him up brutally and on his genitals until he died.

Police sources said his body was later dumped on a cement bench near the cremation ground on the Pedda Amberpet-Pasumamula road and fled.

Hayathnagar police have registered a case and are investigating. One suspect is in custody and being questioned, while efforts are on to nab the others.

100 kg ganja seized in twin ASR district busts

Visakhapatnam: The Alluri Sitharama Raju (ASR) district seized around 100 kg of dry cannabis in two separate incidents in the district. In the first incident, the police recovered around 80 kg of dry cannabis from an overturned car near the Andhra-Odisha Border at Labburu locality under Munchingiput mandal. The police said the accused absconded from the location after their ganja laden car overturned. A case has been registered, and the investigation is on to identify and nab the smugglers.

The officials of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and Elite Anti-Narcotics Group for Law Enforcement (EAGLE) on Friday destroyed 767 kg of dry cannabis and over four litres of Hashish Oil (Hash Oil) related to six cases from parts of the state through incineration at Tanam village under Parawada mandal in Anakapalle district.

South states join hands to crack down on drug trafficking

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: Building on the success of Kerala's flagship anti-drug campaign, [Operation Toofan](#), five southern states, one Union Territory and central enforcement agencies have decided to set up a permanent interstate coordination mechanism to crack down on narcotics trafficking across the region.

The decision was taken at a meeting of the police brass from Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Puducherry and top officers of the central enforcement agencies, chaired by Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala in Thiruvananthapuram on Friday.

The meeting also decided to appoint nodal officers of SP rank or above in all southern states to facilitate real-time intelligence sharing and ensure swift action against interstate drug trafficking networks. Central agencies, including the Narcotics Control Bureau, Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Customs and Railway Protection Force, will also nominate nodal officers to strengthen inter-agency coordination.

The officials agreed to hold periodic coordination meetings and exchange intelligence to track narcotics movement and dismantle drug syndicates. Speaking to media after the meeting, Chennithala said the interstate mechanism would soon launch joint operations to choke major routes used for trafficking narcotics into the state.

Surveillance against online, courier services to be stepped up

Karnataka Home Minister Priyank Kharge would visit Kerala on July 15 for follow-up discussions, he said. He said Kerala Police's specialised anti-drug unit, the District Anti-Narcotics Special Action Force (DANSAF), will be upgraded into a dedicated anti-narcotics task force in all 20 police districts. Headed by DySPs, the permanent units will be strengthened with additional personnel and vehicles.

Two more special NDPS courts would soon be established in Thiruvananthapuram and Ernakulam, while the Centre's proposal to set up 10 additional NDPS courts in Kerala would also be implemented to expedite the disposal of narcotics cases, the home minister said.

Surveillance and enforcement would be stepped up against online platforms, courier services and "drop" delivery models, which are increasingly being exploited by drug traffickers, he said.

The government would also launch a joint crackdown by the health department and police on the abuse of prescription medicines to curb the misuse of pharmaceutical drugs sourced through medical stores.

Officials from neighbouring states said Operation Toofan has already curbed the flow of narcotics into Kerala. Chennithala said the next phase would focus on sealing all major entry points, including state borders, roads, buses, trains, airports and waterways, to prevent drug trafficking.

Pune: The Pune crime branch arrested a history-sheeter and seized 3kg of mephedrone (MD) worth Rs 5.79 crore from him in the early hours of Wednesday.

The accused has been identified as Prashant Sawant (38) of Lohegaon. The crime branch's anti-narcotics cell, led by senior police inspector Trupti Sonawane, laid a trap near Katraj Chowk and apprehended Sawant. A case has been registered against him with the Bharati Vidyapeeth police.

An officer said the police received a tip-off that a man carrying drugs would arrive at Katraj Chowk in the early hours of Wednesday. "We laid a trap and took him into custody. We found 3kg of MD in his bag," the officer said.

The seized drugs were valued at Rs 5.79 crore. "We are interrogating Sawant to trace the source of the contraband," he added.

Mumbai Police arrests two more in Rs 50.74 crore MD drug case

Mumbai, July 11 (IANS) The Mumbai Police's Anti-Narcotics Cell (ANC), Kandivali Unit on Saturday arrested two more accused in connection with a major commercial MD drug case, taking the total number of arrests in the case to six.

During the operation, police also seized 210 kg of liquid 2-Bromo-4-Methylpropiofenone, a regulated precursor chemical used in the manufacture of MD (Mephedrone), as the investigation into the drug syndicate continues.

According to police, the arrests were made in connection with C.R. No. 54/2026, registered under Sections 8(c), 22(c), and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985, linked to Agripada Police Station C.R. No. 253/2026.

The two arrested accused, aged 32 and 27, are residents of Pydhuni in Mumbai. They were taken into custody at around 4:30 a.m. on July 11 following an Intelligence-based operation conducted by the ANC.

Officials said that acting on credible information received on July 10, the Kandivali Unit laid a trap in the Wadi Bunder area after learning that liquid MD was likely to be supplied there. During the operation, the police intercepted the two suspects and recovered 210 kg of liquid 2-Bromo-4-Methylpropiofenone, a controlled precursor chemical commonly used in the illegal production of MD drugs.

The latest seizure is linked to an earlier operation in which the ANC had recovered 14 kg of MD and liquid MD valued at over Rs 50.74 crore. With the arrest of the two accused, the total number of people arrested in the case has now increased to six.

Investigators suspect that an organised MD drug syndicate is operating in Mumbai, with possible links extending to other states. Police are now probing the supply chain, financial transactions, and the network behind the procurement and distribution of the precursor chemicals and narcotics.

Further investigation into the case is underway.

Earlier, on June 27, the Mumbai Police's Anti-Narcotics Cell had conducted another major anti-drug operation in Goregaon, seizing 750 grams of heroin worth approximately ₹3.75 crore. One accused, identified as Subhan Imran Gada, was arrested during that operation.

Police said the Kandivali Unit had acted on specific Intelligence regarding a drug supplier operating in Goregaon. During the raid, officers recovered the heroin from the accused and arrested him. Investigators are now examining the source of the seized narcotics and whether the case has links to an interstate or international drug trafficking network. The accused was subsequently produced before a court, which remanded him to police custody for further investigation.

Five Gujarat ATS officers get Coast Guard honour for Mundra cocaine seizure

Ahmedabad: Five officers of the Gujarat Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) have been awarded the Director General Coast Guard Commendation Disc for their role in a joint operation with the [Indian Coast Guard](#) that led to the seizure of almost 119kg of cocaine off the Mundra coast in May this year. The officers honoured are ATS superintendent of police and IPS officer K Siddharth and police inspectors J M Patel, V R Jadeja, B M Patel and J N Chavda. The awards recognise their contribution to the intelligence-based operation conducted on May 25 and 26, in which ATS and Coast Guard teams recovered five bags containing cocaine from the sea near a container vessel. The contraband, valued at Rs 1,150 crore in the international market, was seized after ATS shared specific intelligence and Coast Guard interceptor boats launched a search operation. The operation was the 15th joint anti-narcotics mission carried out by the Coast Guard and Gujarat ATS in the past five years.

Punjab & Haryana High Court Stays Trial Against Cop Accused Of Selling Drugs In Jail

The Punjab & Haryana High Court has stayed trial court proceedings against a Constable posted on security duty at Central Jail, Bathinda, who has been chargesheeted under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (NDPS Act) and Section 52 of the Prisons Act, 1894 for allegedly selling drugs in prison.

Justice Ramesh Chander Dimri issued notice of motion on the cop's petition seeking quashing of the FIR, the final report, and the consequential orders.

"Notice of motion returnable on 09.09.2026. Further proceedings before the trial Court shall remain stayed in the meanwhile," the Court ordered.

The prosecution's case rested on secret information alleging that the petitioner had facilitated the supply of intoxicating substances to certain undertrial prisoners in exchange for money. It was alleged that ₹77,000 had been transferred via UPI to a mobile number linked to the petitioner's mother's bank account, and that the petitioner had made an extra-judicial admission before the police.

According to the cop's petition however, the investigation itself undermined the prosecution's case. The investigating agency traced the UPI transaction and recorded the statement of the person who had transferred the money, one Sukhmanbir Singh, who stated that the ₹77,000 had been sent at the request of undertrial prisoner Jobanjit Singh solely for purchasing clothes, and not for procuring any intoxicating substance.

The petition asserted that the police found no evidence connecting the transaction to the supply of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances, and that the alleged involvement of undertrial prisoners Jobanjit Singh and Lokesh Jain found only casual mention in the final report, unsupported by any admissible statements recorded against the petitioner.

The petitioner challenged the very maintainability of the prosecution, contending that under Section 59(3) of the NDPS Act, no court can take cognizance of an offence punishable under Section 59(2) except upon a complaint made with the previous sanction of the Central or State Government. It was contended that despite this mandatory requirement, the police filed a final report under Section 193 BNSS (corresponding to Section 173(2) Cr.P.C.) instead of a sanctioned complaint, rendering the cognizance taken by the Special Court, and the consequent framing of charges, without jurisdiction.

It was further contended that the charge framed under Section 52 of the Prisons Act was equally unsustainable, since that provision merely enables a Jail Superintendent to refer a prisoner to a Magistrate for trial where departmental punishment is considered inadequate, a procedure that was never followed in the present case and that, in any event, no FIR could have been registered for an offence under Section 52.

It was additionally argued that the proviso to Section 52 bars double punishment for the same act, making a parallel prosecution under the Prisons Act impermissible once proceedings under the NDPS Act had already been initiated on the same allegations.

Srinagar, Jul 09: In a major crackdown on the financial infrastructure of narcotics trafficking under the ongoing Nasha Mukht Jammu & Kashmir Abhiyan, Srinagar Police have attached two immovable properties worth approximately Rs 1.05 crore belonging to two notorious drug peddlers, reaffirming the commitment to dismantle the drug network by targeting assets acquired through illicit narcotics trade.

The action was carried out by the Police Station Rainawari under the provisions of the NDPS Act.

The attached properties belong to Zahoor Ahmad Sheikh (son of late Ghulam Hassan Sheikh, resident of Tujgari Mohalla, Nowhatta) and Bilal Ahmad Kand (son of Ghulam Hyder Kand, resident of Kand Mohalla, Dal, Rainawari).

An immovable property of Zahoor Ahmad Sheikh, comprising a three-storeyed residential house constructed on five marlas of land at Tujgari Mohalla, Srinagar, with an estimated market value of approximately Rs 65 lakh, has been attached in connection with FIR No. 59/2019 under Section 8/20 NDPS Act of Police Station Rainawari.

The accused is also involved in FIR No. 11/2018 under Section 8/20 NDPS Act and FIR No. 41/2021 under Sections 8/20 NDPS Act and 48 Excise Act at Police Station Nowhatta.

An immovable property of Bilal Ahmad Kand comprising five marlas of land along with a single-storeyed temporary structure at Kand Mohalla, Rainawari, having an estimated value of approximately Rs 40 lakh, has been attached in connection with FIR No. 36/2022 under Section 8/20 NDPS Act of Police Station Rainawari.

Both properties have been attached under Section 68-F of the NDPS Act after being identified as illegally acquired assets generated through proceeds of narcotics trafficking and drug peddling.

By targeting the economic backbone of drug traffickers, Srinagar Police are sending a strong message that crime will not pay and that illegally acquired assets will be traced and confiscated in accordance with the law.

Panchkula: Panchkula police Thursday destroyed narcotic substances worth over ₹6.03 crore seized in 105 cases, officials said. The contraband was disposed of at a high-temperature incineration facility in Barwala under the supervision of police commissioner Pankaj Nain. Police said all legal procedures were followed to ensure the seized substances were completely destroyed and could not be misused. To ensure transparency, DCP Srishti Gupta, ACP Ajit Singh, other police officials and technical staff remained present during the process. Officials said the drug disposal committee, headed by the police commissioner, approved the destruction only after obtaining necessary permissions from the courts concerned, ensuring compliance with legal requirements. The destroyed contraband included 2.29kg of [heroin](#) from 60 cases, 24.09 kg of charas from 11 cases, 31.75 kg of ganja from 12 cases, 5.35 kg of opium plants from one case, 6.98 kg of opium from 19 cases, 6.42 kg of poppy husk from one case and 750 intoxicating tablets from one case. Police commissioner Nain said the scientific disposal of narcotics was an important step in curbing the illegal drug trade and preventing seized contraband from re-entering circulation. DCP Gupta urged residents to share information about drug trafficking, peddling networks and the illegal sale of narcotics through the Manas Helpline (1933) or Panchkula police's drug information helplines 7087081100 and 7087081047. She also appealed to families not to hide cases of drug addiction and encouraged those affected to seek timely help and rehabilitation.

Amritsar Commissionerate Police have busted a major international drug trafficking network, seizing 8.378 kg of heroin worth an estimated ₹48 crore in the international market, along with ₹2 lakh in suspected drug money. Two accused, including a juvenile, have been arrested.

Police Commissioner Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said the operation was launched following specific intelligence. In the first phase, Chheharta Police arrested 28-year-old Lovepreet Singh alias Love, a BA graduate from Khasa village, along with a juvenile, and recovered 2 kg of heroin.

Based on their interrogation, police recovered an additional 3.010 kg of heroin and ₹2 lakh in drug proceeds, taking the first operation's total seizure to 5.010 kg. A follow-up operation led to the recovery of another 3.368 kg of heroin, bringing the total haul to 8.378 kg.

Preliminary investigations suggest that Pakistan-based smugglers were using drones to drop heroin consignments at pre-designated locations along the India-Pakistan border. Local operatives allegedly collected the consignments and distributed them further. Police said Lovepreet Singh had no previous

criminal record, and further investigations are underway to identify others linked to the cross-border trafficking network.

Former Pakistan jail inmate among four drug peddlers held in Jammu province

JAMMU, July 10: Four alleged drug peddlers, including a man who had earlier served a seven-year jail term in Pakistan, were arrested with heroin and poppy straw-like substances in separate anti-narcotics operations carried out by police in Jammu, Kathua, and Samba districts today.

In Jammu district, Police Station R.S. Pura arrested one Yashpaul of Kotli Mian Fateh, after recovering 32.34 grams of heroin (chitta)-like substance from his possession at Baspur Abdullian Link Road.

Police also seized a mobile phone and Rs 14,000 in cash from his possession.

Officials said the accused had previously spent seven years in a Pakistan jail for allegedly entering the country without valid documents.

An FIR number 136/2026 under sections 8/21/22 of the NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station RS Pura.

In Kathua district, police arrested one Sandeep Kumar of Hatli Morh after recovering around five grams of heroin-like substance from his possession during patrolling at Chak Partap in the jurisdiction of Police Post Hatli.

He was booked in case FIR number 343/2026 under sections 8/21/22 of the NDPS Act registered at Police Station Kathua.

Meanwhile, Police in Samba district achieved two separate successes under the ongoing Nasha Mukta Jammu and Kashmir Abhiyan.

In the first operation, a team of Police Station Vijaypur intercepted a WagonR car near Sangwal and recovered about 10.14 grams of heroin-like substance from the possession of driver Yogeshwar Singh of Rajinderpura, Bagoona.

The accused was arrested and booked in case FIR number 114/2026 under sections 8/21/22/25 of the NDPS Act registered at Police Station Vijaypur.

In another operation, a team of Police Station Ghagwal intercepted a Scooty at a naka laid at Y-Junction, Ghagwal, and recovered approximately 1.720 kilograms of poppy straw-like substance from the rider, identified as Anil Kumar of Harsath.

The accused was arrested and booked in case FIR number 70/2026 under section 8/15 of the NDPS Act registered at Police Station Ghagwal.

Police said investigations are underway in all the cases to ascertain the forward and backward links of the accused and identify others involved in the drug trafficking network.

Man arrested with 110g brown sugar

Indore: A 28-year-old man from Mandsaur was arrested in Indore on Friday with 110 gm of brown sugar worth around Rs 11 lakh.

Acting on a tip-off, police laid a trap near a marriage garden on the bypass and nabbed the suspect, who was allegedly waiting to sell the drug. A search led to recovery of brown sugar and a mobile phone.

The man was identified as Ramkishan alias Ramniwas Giri (28), a resident of Katiya village under Suwasra police station in Mandsaur district. Police said that he worked as a farmer. During questioning, Ramkishan allegedly admitted that he was addicted to drugs and had started trafficking brown sugar to fund his addiction and earn quick money. He told police that he procured the narcotics from Kotdi area of Mandsaur at lower rates and sold them in Indore for a profit.

Khajrana police station in charge Manoj Singh Sendhav said that a case has been registered against Ramkishan under the NDPS Act. He has been taken on police remand.

सहायक जिला शासकीय अधिवक्ता (एडीजीसी) के.एम. जोहरी ने बताया- 21 अक्टूबर 2022 को लोधा थाना पुलिस गश्त पर थी। इसी दौरान वीरमपुर चौराहे के पास ग्राम रायट निवासी चीनी उर्फ रहीश पुत्र बनिया को गिरफ्तार किया। तलाशी में उसके पास से 450 ग्राम नशीला डायजापाम पाउडर बरामद हुआ।

पुलिस ने एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा 50 के तहत निर्धारित प्रक्रिया का पालन करते हुए 50 ग्राम पदार्थ का नमूना जांच के लिए अलग किया, जबकि शेष 400 ग्राम को सील कर कब्जे में ले लिया। इसके बाद आरोपी के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धाराओं 21/22 के तहत मुकदमा दर्ज किया गया।

विवेचना के दौरान पुलिस ने गवाहों के बयान दर्ज किए, घटनास्थल का नक्शा तैयार किया और नमूना विधि विज्ञान प्रयोगशाला (एफएसएल) भेजा। रिपोर्ट में बरामद पदार्थ डायजापाम होने की पुष्टि के बाद न्यायालय में आरोप पत्र दाखिल किया गया।

जुर्माना नहीं भरने पर 6 महीने अतिरिक्त जेल

सुनवाई के दौरान अभियोजन पक्ष ने तर्क दिया कि आरोपी युवाओं और नशे के आदी लोगों को मादक पदार्थ बेचकर समाज को नुकसान पहुंचा रहा था। वहीं, बचाव पक्ष ने आरोपी की आर्थिक स्थिति और पारिवारिक जिम्मेदारियों का हवाला देते हुए नरमी की मांग की।

दोनों पक्षों की दलीलें सुनने के बाद न्यायालय ने आरोपी को दोषी करार देते हुए तीन वर्ष के कठोर कारावास और 20 हजार रुपये अर्थदंड की सजा सुनाई। कोर्ट ने यह भी आदेश दिया कि जुर्माना अदा नहीं करने पर आरोपी को छह माह का अतिरिक्त साधारण कारावास भुगतना होगा। साथ ही बरामद डायजापाम को नियमानुसार नष्ट करने के निर्देश भी दिए गए।

जयपुर, 10 जुलाई (हि.स.)। जयपुर पुलिस कमिश्नरेट (दक्षिण) की ओर से चलाए जा रहे विशेष अभियान 'मिशन जागृति' के सकारात्मक परिणाम सामने आने लगे हैं। नशे के कारोबार पर शिकंजा कसने के साथ-साथ जन जागरूकता बढ़ाने के उद्देश्य से चलाए जा रहे अभियान के तहत एनडीपीएस एक्ट के मामलों में पिछले वर्ष की तुलना में 63.83 प्रतिशत की वृद्धि दर्ज हुई है। वहीं पुलिस अब तक करीब 5.18 करोड़ रुपये मूल्य के अवैध मादक पदार्थों का निस्तारण कर चुकी है।

पुलिस उपायुक्त (दक्षिण) राजर्षि राज के नेतृत्व में शुक्रवार को पुलिस थाना पत्रकार कॉलोनी में नशा मुक्ति को लेकर वृहद जनजागरूकता कार्यक्रम आयोजित किया गया। इससे पहले 22 जून को शिप्रापथ स्थित दीप ऑडिटोरियम में भी इसी प्रकार का कार्यक्रम आयोजित किया गया था।

इस कार्यक्रम में सांगानेर विधानसभा क्षेत्र के जनप्रतिनिधियों, पार्श्वदों, स्कूली विद्यार्थियों, एनसीसी कैडेट्स और विभिन्न कोचिंग संस्थानों के संचालकों सहित करीब 400 लोगों ने भाग लिया। पुलिस ने जनप्रतिनिधियों से अपने-अपने क्षेत्रों को 'नशा मुक्त वार्ड' बनाने के लिए पुलिस के साथ समन्वय बढ़ाने की अपील की।

डीसीपी राजर्षि राज ने विभिन्न कोचिंग संस्थानों का निरीक्षण कर संचालकों को परिसर को नशा मुक्त रखने के निर्देश दिए। संस्थानों में जागरूकता सामग्री वितरित की गई, व्हाट्सएप हेल्पलाइन नंबर 9530424984 का प्रचार किया गया तथा गोपनीय शिकायतों के लिए शिकायत पेटिका स्थापित कराई गई।

पुलिस के अनुसार वर्ष 2025 में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के 94 प्रकरण दर्ज हुए थे, जबकि 2026 में अब तक 154 मामले दर्ज किए जा चुके हैं, जो 63.83 प्रतिशत की वृद्धि है।

अभियान के दौरान पुलिस ने 53 नए प्रकरण दर्ज कर 60 आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया। आरोपियों के कब्जे से 15 किलो 400 ग्राम गांजा, 492 ग्राम 86 मिलीग्राम स्मैक, 102 ग्राम कोकीन, 109 ग्राम 6 मिलीग्राम एमडी तथा नशा सेवन के उपकरण बरामद किए गए।

इसके अलावा एनडीपीएस एक्ट के सात इनामी अपराधियों को गिरफ्तार किया गया, जिन पर कुल 40 हजार रुपये का इनाम घोषित था। नशे की तस्करी में प्रयुक्त 35 दोपहिया एवं चौपहिया वाहन भी जब्त किए गए।

पुलिस ने 18 अप्रैल, 29 अप्रैल, 30 मई और 3 जुलाई 2026 को अलग-अलग कार्रवाई करते हुए करीब 5 करोड़ 18 लाख रुपये मूल्य के अवैध मादक पदार्थों का नियमानुसार निस्तारण किया।

डीसीपी राजर्षि राज ने बताया कि नशे के कारोबार से अर्जित चल एवं अचल संपत्तियों का डोजियर तैयार किया जा रहा है। जांच पूरी होने के बाद संबंधित तस्करों की संपत्ति कुर्क करने सहित सख्त कानूनी कार्रवाई की जाएगी।

Odisha Police destroy drugs worth over Rs 569 crore

BHUBANESWAR: Odisha Police have destroyed over 108.90 tonnes of seized ganja and substantial quantities of other narcotics during the national pre-trial drug destruction special drive organised from June 26 to July 10.

In the operation coordinated by the Special Task Force (STF) of Crime Branch, police destroyed ganja valued at around Rs 544.52 crore. Besides, police disposed of 12.4 kg brown sugar amounting to Rs 24.8 crore and 3,631 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup as per the procedures under the NDPS Act.

The combined illicit market value of the destroyed narcotics stands at around Rs 569.32 crore, a statement issued by police said.

Boudh police led the effort by destroying over 37,000 kg ganja, followed by Kandhamal 34,245 kg. Several other police districts and units like STF, SRP Rourkela and SRP Cuttack actively participated in the campaign, exceeding the initial target of destroying 78,600 kg ganja.

The national pre-trial drug destruction drive, launched by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), was aimed at ensuring expeditious pre-trial disposal of seized narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, reduce storage-related risks, strengthen compliance with the provisions of the NDPS Act and prevent re-circulation of the seized contraband into the society.

DGP YB Khurania said, “Odisha Police remains firmly committed to dismantle drug trafficking networks, ensure scientific, transparent and time-bound disposal of seized narcotic substances and achieve the vision of ‘Nasha Mukta Odisha’ through sustained enforcement, inter-agency coordination and public participation.

Ranchi: Two peddlers were arrested from Bengali Tola in Ranchi district on Friday. SP (rural) Gaurav Goswami identified the accused as Raja Shivdutt, 29, and Asif Khan, 24. He said police seized 15 grams of brown sugar, Rs 1.70 lakh in cash, two weighing machines and mobile phones from them. Goswami said, “Acting on a tip-off regarding the sale of brown sugar by peddlers in Tamar area, a team raided the house of Shivdutt and arrested him along with Khan. Police had to chase Khan before he was caught.” The SP said the drugs were recovered from Shivdutt’s house. A case has been registered against the accused under relevant sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. Police said further investigation is under way to trace their supply network.

Odisha Crime Branch STF arrests interstate ganja racket kingpin from West Bengal

The Odisha Crime Branch's Special Task Force (STF) on Friday arrested an alleged kingpin of an interstate ganja trafficking network from Purba Medinipur in West Bengal.

The [Odisha Crime Branch's Special Task Force \(STF\)](#) on Friday arrested an alleged kingpin of an interstate [ganja](#) trafficking network from Purba Medinipur in West Bengal, uncovering a unique method allegedly used by the racket to identify buyers and suppliers. The accused, Ratan Mondal, had been absconding since January 2025.

STF officials said Ratan was apprehended after a 25-day operation in West Bengal. He is suspected to be a key receiver in a network that procured ganja from Kandhamal, Boudh and Sonepur districts of Odisha and supplied it to different states.

Half-Torn Note Used As Secret Code

During the investigation, the STF recovered a half-torn currency note, which investigators believe was used as a secret identification marker during ganja transactions. According to officials, one half of the note was kept by the supplier while the other half remained with the receiver. The contraband was allegedly handed over only after the two halves matched.

Investigators suspect Ratan played a key role in coordinating the movement and delivery of ganja through the interstate network.

Probe Into Wider Network

Ratan's alleged involvement has surfaced in multiple STF cases related to ganja smuggling. STF DIG Kanwar Vishal Singh said the investigation is continuing to identify other members of the syndicate and trace its wider interstate network.

The STF is also examining Ratan's financial links and the involvement of other associates as part of its ongoing investigation into the trafficking racket.

चक्रधरपुर, प्रतिनिधि पश्चिमी सिंहभूम पुलिस द्वारा मादक पदार्थों के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान के तहत चक्रधरपुर पुलिस ने बड़ी सफलता हासिल करते हुए ब्राउन शुगर तस्करी के एक संगठित सिंडिकेट का भंडाफोड़ किया है। पुलिस ने एक ही दिन दो अलग-अलग मामलों का उद्घेदन करते हुए पांच तस्करों को गिरफ्तार किया है। उनके पास से 75 पुड़िया ब्राउन शुगर, एक मोटरसाइकिल और चार मोबाइल फोन बरामद किए गए हैं। पुलिस अधीक्षक के निर्देश पर जिले में गांजा, ब्राउन शुगर एवं अन्य मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ लगातार अभियान चलाया जा रहा है। इसी क्रम में 8 जुलाई को चक्रधरपुर थाना क्षेत्र में दो अलग-अलग स्थानों पर छापेमारी कर कार्रवाई की गई। पहले मामले में पुलिस को सूचना मिली थी कि पुरानाबस्ती क्षेत्र में एक मकान से ब्राउन शुगर की बिक्री की तैयारी की जा रही है। सूचना के आधार पर अनुमंडल पुलिस पदाधिकारी डॉ सैयद मुस्तफा हाशमी के नेतृत्व में गठित टीम ने छापेमारी की। पुलिस को देखते ही भागने का प्रयास कर रहे शेखर सुमन साहु और शुभम वर्मण को पकड़ लिया गया। तलाशी के दौरान शेखर सुमन के पास से 11.1 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर की 40 पुड़िया तथा शुभम वर्मण के पास से 2 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर की 10 पुड़िया बरामद हुईं। साथ ही एक मोबाइल फोन और तस्करी में प्रयुक्त टीवीएस राडियन मोटरसाइकिल भी जब्त की गई। पुलिस ने मौके पर ब्राउन शुगर खरीदने पहुंचे आशीफ शेख उर्फ बंगला को भी गिरफ्तार कर लिया। वहीं दूसरे मामले में शाम के समय पुलिस को पोर्टरखोली क्षेत्र में ब्राउन शुगर बिक्री की सूचना मिली। इसके बाद पुलिस टीम ने घेराबंदी कर अभिषेक प्रामाणिक उर्फ अंडा और मुकेश राम रवि उर्फ बम्बा को गिरफ्तार किया। तलाशी के दौरान अभिषेक प्रामाणिक के पास से 3.5 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर की 24 पुड़िया तथा मुकेश राम रवि के पास से 0.15 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर की एक पुड़िया बरामद की गई। दोनों के पास से मोबाइल फोन भी जब्त किए गए। पूछताछ में गिरफ्तार आरोपियों ने स्वीकार किया कि वे आपस में जुड़े हुए हैं और चक्रधरपुर में संगठित तरीके से ब्राउन शुगर की खरीद-बिक्री का अवैध कारोबार चला रहे थे। पुलिस इस नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की तलाश में जुटी हुई है तथा मामले की गहन जांच जारी है। पुलिस ने दोनों मामलों में कुल 16.75 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर की 75 पुड़िया, एक टीवीएस मोटरसाइकिल (जेएच06एन-4747) तथा चार मोबाइल फोन जब्त किए हैं। छापेमारी अभियान में अनुमंडल पुलिस पदाधिकारी डॉ सैयद मुस्तफा हाशमी, थाना प्रभारी अवधेश कुमार, पुलिस अवर निरीक्षक आकाश कुमार, रंजीत उरांव, राजकिशोर तिवारी, सहायक अवर निरीक्षक बिरबल चौबे, दिलीप कुमार सहित

पुलिस बल के अन्य जवान शामिल थे. पश्चिमी सिंहभूम पुलिस ने आम लोगों से अपील की है कि मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी या किसी भी आपराधिक गतिविधि की सूचना तत्काल निकटतम थाना, डायल-112 अथवा पुलिस नियंत्रण कक्ष के मोबाइल नंबर 9931422251 पर दें. सूचना देने वाले की पहचान पूरी तरह गोपनीय रखी जाएगी.
