Narcotics nexus: Lawrence gang aide held in France

NEW DELHI: A key member of the [Lawrence Bishnoi](#) network, Garinder Deo, has been arrested in France. Deo, who allegedly conspired to move massive shipments of cocaine and heroin across the US, faces extradition to Canada. In a parallel crackdown, Canada's Immigration and Refugee Tribunal has ordered the deportation of another gang associate, Jashandeep Singh, for his alleged role in hiding the weapon used in a firing outside comedian Kapil Sharma's cafe in Surrey. The multi-nation sweep, tied to an extensive global law enforcement initiative, Operation Hardball, earlier led to the US Department of Justice (DOJ) filing comprehensive indictments against Lawrence and other key operatives. In the aftermath of the coordinated international crackdown, more arrests, including in India, are likely, sources said. According to the US DOJ indictment, Deo played a crucial role in managing the financial logistics for Lawrence's transatlantic criminal network. US authorities allege that he conspired to traffic massive quantities of narcotics, orchestrating the transport of illicit drugs from Southern California to eastern US. This network suffered a major blow in June 2025 when American agencies seized a massive shipment containing around 100kg cocaine and one kg heroin linked to the syndicate. Simultaneously, the Lawrence gang faced another setback in North America as Canada's Immigration and Refugee Board ordered the deportation of Jashandeep Singh. It is directly tied to an extortion and intimidation plot targeting prominent Indian entertainment figures, specifically involving the Surrey shooting. Investigative agencies established that Singh had assisted the syndicate by concealing the firearm used in the drive-by shooting. While formal criminal charges have not been finalised in court, immigration authorities ruled that his presence constituted a threat to public safety. Singh, who arrived in Canada in 2022 on a student visa, has denied all allegations. This follows the recent deportation of another gang member, Arshdeep Singh. These rapid operational

developments underscore the growing efficacy of Operation Hardball, which aims to dismantle the infrastructure, financial pipelines and safe havens utilised by Indian organised crime syndicates operating in the West. The operation relies on real-time intelligence sharing among agencies in the US, Canada, France and India, reflecting a zero-tolerance approach towards the Lawrence gang's expanding footprint in drug trafficking, extortion and violent crimes globally. In another development, a 63-year-old Indian-origin man, Guramrit Sidhu from Brampton, Ontario, has been sentenced to 20 years in a US federal prison for masterminding a cross-border drug trafficking network that smuggled hundreds of kilogrammes of methamphetamine and cocaine, valued at up to \$17 million, from the US into Canada in a month.

Assam Police seize Yaba tablets worth Rs 1 crore in Sribhumi; Himanta praises anti-drug drive

Assam Police seized 10,000 Yaba tablets worth about Rs 1 crore in Sribhumi and arrested two accused. Himanta Biswa Sarma praised the operation as part of Assam's continuing campaign against drug trafficking networks.

- The chief minister publicly commended Sribhumi Police for the successful operation
- Two accused were apprehended during the crackdown linked to narcotics trafficking
- Sarma announced the seizure on X while reinforcing the state's campaign

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on July 11, lauded the state police after they seized 10,000 Yaba tablets worth approximately Rs 1 crore in Sribhumi district and arrested two persons in connection with the operation.

Sharing the development on X, the chief minister praised the efforts of the Sribhumi Police in the state's ongoing campaign against narcotics.

"Breaking Bad? Not in Assam," Sarma wrote, adding, "Kudos to Sribhumi Police for seizing 10,000 Yaba tablets worth approx ₹1 crore and apprehending two accused."

In a lighter reference to the popular television series Breaking Bad, the chief minister added, "Assam Police making sure drug traffickers don't get a sequel."

He also used the hashtag #AssamAgainstDrugs, reiterating the state government's continued focus on cracking down on drug trafficking networks.

माणेपुर में पुलिस की बड़ी कार्रवाई - 29 लाख की ब्राउन शुगर बरामद, तीन गिरफ्तार

इम्फाल। मणिपुर पुलिस ने मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी और कानून-व्यवस्था से जुड़े मामलों में बड़ी कार्रवाई करते हुए बीते 24 घंटे में चलाए गए अलग-अलग अभियानों में तीन लोगों को गिरफ्तार किया है। पुलिस ने करीब पांच किलो ब्राउन शुगर, 29.42 लाख की संदिग्ध ड्रग्स से अर्जित राशि तथा 83,770 रुपये नकद बरामद किए हैं।

आधिकारिक जानकारी के अनुसार, बिष्णुपुर जिले के काक्टा क्षेत्र में पुलिस ने शनिवार को एक ग्रे रंग की टाटा पंच (एमएन-04पी-4706) को रोककर उसकी तलाशी ली।

इस दौरान वाहन सवार लिलोंग चिंगजाओ निवासी मोहम्मद अमजद खान (47) को गिरफ्तार किया गया। उसके कब्जे से लगभग पांच किलो ब्राउन शुगर और 83,770 नकद बरामद किए गए।

एक अन्य कार्रवाई में हरियाणा में दर्ज एनडीपीएस अधिनियम से संबंधित एक मामले के सिलसिले में चुराचांदपुर से दीपू गुप्ता को गिरफ्तार किया गया। उसके पास से 29.42 लाख नकद बरामद हुए, जिन्हें ड्रग्स कारोबार से अर्जित संदिग्ध राशि बताया गया है।

पुलिस के अनुसार, आरोपित चुराचांदपुर जिले में ड्रग्स तस्करी के लिए हवाला लेन-देन में शामिल था। उसे बरामद राशि के साथ हरियाणा पुलिस के हवाले कर दिया गया है।

उधर, लेइमाखोंग क्षेत्र के कांटो साबल में भीड़ द्वारा उपद्रव और परित्यक्त मकानों में आग लगाने के प्रयास से जुड़े मामले में मणिपुर पुलिस, सीआरपीएफ, आरएएफ और सेना की संयुक्त टीम ने हेंगजांग गांव के प्रमुख एवं लेइमाखोंग एरिया प्रोटेक्शन कमेटी (एलएपीसी) के अध्यक्ष कम्मांग ल्हौवुम (65) तथा खुंखो कुकी गांव निवासी पागिन हेंगशिंग (30) को गिरफ्तार किया है। पुलिस ने बताया कि मामले में अन्य आरोपितों की गिरफ्तारी के लिए अभियान जारी है।

Inter-state drug syndicate busted, 35g meth seized near Auroville, 6 held

Villupuram: The Auroville police have busted a drug syndicate, seizing 35g of methamphetamine valued at about ₹1 lakh and arresting six people in connection with the racket, which stretches across [Tamil Nadu](#), [Puducherry](#), and [Karnataka](#). A team from Auroville police station, acting on a tip-off regarding illicit drug consumption near Kuyilappalayam, raided a guesthouse, seized 10g of methamphetamine and arrested five people in the guesthouse. On inquiries, they revealed that they received the contraband from a man identified as Kannan from the Tiruvannamalai district. Police traced the man, arrested him, and seized 25g of methamphetamine from his possession. Further interrogation exposed an international link operating out of neighbouring Karnataka. Kannan revealed that he had established contact with a Nigerian national residing in Bengaluru via WhatsApp. He confessed to purchasing the entire bulk consignment of methamphetamine directly from the Nigerian last month.

Bengaluru, July 11 (IANS) Karnataka Home Minister Priyank Kharge on Saturday said the state police force has achieved another major success in its crackdown on narcotics, with Bengaluru City Police dismantling an inter-state drug trafficking network and seizing banned narcotic substances worth Rs 30.43 crore.

Addressing the media, Kharge said the police recovered 29 kg of MDMA, 20 grams of cocaine, and 1,000 ecstasy tablets in a series of coordinated operations. The estimated value of the seized contraband is Rs 30.43 crore, while its street value is approximately Rs 60.86 crore.

A total of five cases have been registered, and eight accused, including one foreign national, have been arrested in connection with the operations.

In the first operation, conducted under the jurisdiction of Hebbal Police Station in North Bengaluru, police arrested a foreign national and seized 17.282 kg of MDMA valued at Rs 17.28 crore. The minister said the investigation is underway to trace the inter-state supply network linked to the accused.

In another operation, the Central Crime Branch's Anti-Narcotics Wing recovered 6.718 kg of MDMA and 20 grams of cocaine worth Rs 7.15 crore. Four persons were arrested in the case, and investigators are probing the source of the drugs as well as the financial network behind the trafficking.

In a separate case registered at Girinagar Police Station, officers seized 5 kg of MDMA and 1,000 ecstasy tablets valued at Rs 6 crore.

Kharge reiterated that the Karnataka government is implementing a strict "zero-tolerance" policy against narcotics and is committed to completely dismantling drug trafficking networks operating in the state.

He said there would be no leniency towards those involved in the production, transportation, sale, or consumption of narcotic substances. Police units across Karnataka are working in close coordination and are also keeping a close watch on inter-state and international drug syndicates.

The Home Minister said Bengaluru City Police have registered hundreds of drug-related cases in recent weeks, arrested several accused, and seized narcotics worth several crores of rupees, dealing repeated blows to organised drug networks.

Kharge also appealed to the public, particularly parents and educational institutions, to cooperate with the police in the fight against drug abuse. He urged citizens to immediately report any suspicious activities to help make Karnataka a drug-free state.

Bengaluru :The Bengaluru police busted an international narcotics trafficking network and arrested eight people, five of them foreign nationals, officials said on Saturday.

They also seized banned narcotic substances with an estimated market value of Rs 60.86 crore.

Police said they seized 29 kg of MDMA, 20 grams of cocaine, and 1,000 ecstasy pills from the accused.

The operation was carried out by the Hebbal police station, the CCB Anti-Narcotics Wing, and the Girinagar police station in separate cases registered under the NDPS Act, police said.

According to a statement, five special teams were constituted by the Hebbal police over the past 15 days as part of the operation, following which a Nigerian national based in New Delhi, a woman from Manipur residing in Bengaluru, and two residents were arrested.

The team seized 17.282 kg of MDMA from their possession, with an estimated market value of Rs 34.56 crore.

In a separate operation, the CCB Anti-Narcotics Wing registered three NDPS cases and arrested three foreign nationals, including two Nigerians and a South African.

Police seized 6.718 kg of MDMA and 20 grams of cocaine from them, with an estimated market value of Rs 14.30 crore.

Investigation revealed that the drugs had been procured from a Delhi-based supplier and were being distributed to local peddlers in Bengaluru, a senior police officer said.

In the third case, officers and staff of the Girinagar police station had been gathering intelligence for the past 10 days based on credible information received from informants about the sale of prohibited narcotic drugs within the station limits.

During the operation, another Nigerian national was apprehended, and 5 kg of MDMA and 1,000 ecstasy pills, estimated to be worth Rs 12 crore, were seized from his possession, police said.

"Investigation revealed that the seized MDMA had been transported from New Delhi by a foreign national and was being supplied through local accused for illegal distribution across Bengaluru city," it said.

According to police, Bengaluru city has registered 2,936 NDPS cases so far in 2026 and arrested 3,840 accused, including 37 foreign nationals.

During this period, authorities seized 1,415.274 kg of narcotic drugs worth Rs 221.27 crore, with an estimated market value of Rs 322.92 crore.

Film production controller arrested with MDMA in Kochi

KOCHI: A film production controller was arrested with MDMA from a lodge room in Kochi. The accused has been identified as Vishal Soman, a native of Thalayolaparambu. He was taken into custody by the District Anti-Narcotic Special Action Force (DANSAF) during a raid at a lodge in Elamkulam. Police seized 5.6 grams of MDMA from his possession.

According to the police, Vishal had drug links with gym trainer Kevin and Sadiq, who were arrested with drugs a day earlier. Officers said they will carry out a detailed investigation into the drug network believed to be operating behind the accused.

Chennai: Three men found carrying about 1,200 narcotic tablets and 1.5 kg of ganja were arrested by the RK Nagar police during a series of raids in North Chennai. The arrests followed a tip-off about the illegal storage and sale of narcotic substances in Tondiarpet. During the operation, police intercepted a man identified as [Saddam Hussein](#), 29, of Netaji Nagar, Tondiarpet. Police recovered 150 narcotic tablets from him. Saddam told police that he bought the tablets from Mohanasundaram, 21, of Shastri Nagar, Tondiarpet. Police searched Mohanasundaram's house and recovered another 400 narcotic tablets. Further questioning led investigators to Prem alias Eli, 24, of Tiruvottiyur. A raid at his residence resulted in the seizure of 650 narcotic tablets and 1.5 kg of ganja. The arrested trio was sent to Puzhal prison.

22 kg ganja seized from car in Coimbatore; one arrested

Coimbatore: The city police's prohibition enforcement wing (PEW) arrested a 32-year-old man and seized 22kg of ganja from his car on Thondamuthur Road near Vadavalli on Saturday. The arrested has been identified as J Shelton, 32, of Kannimar Koil Street near Devarayapuram in Thondamuthur. He was apprehended when a police team intercepted the vehicle around 11.30am, following a tip off. Police found ganja concealed in the car and seized both the contraband and the vehicle. Meanwhile, an officer from the PEW wing said Shelton was a major supplier of ganja in Coimbatore. "He was procuring it in large quantities from other states and supplying it locally," the officer said. Shelton was later produced before a court and remanded in judicial custody.

Banaskantha: A Special NDPS Court in Palanpur has sentenced a man to 20 years' rigorous imprisonment in connection with a Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) case involving the seizure of 16.575 kg of charas valued at more than Rs one crore, nearly six years after the narcotics were recovered.

The judgment, pronounced on July 9, convicted Samir Ahmed Sheikh Nagori under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act based on evidence presented by the prosecution. Along with the prison term, the court imposed a fine of Rs two lakh.

It ordered that if the fine is not paid, the convict will have to undergo an additional one year of rigorous imprisonment.

According to the ATS, the case was registered in 2020 after officers, acting on specific intelligence, intercepted a vehicle and seized 16.575 kg of charas with an estimated value of Rs 1,00,51,800.

In its judgment, the Special NDPS Court observed that trafficking in narcotic drugs in commercial quantities poses "a serious threat to society, particularly to the younger generation".

Taking into account the quantity of the contraband, the gravity of the offence and its wider impact on society, the court imposed a stringent sentence on the convicted accused.

The ATS said proceedings against the remaining accused in the case will continue separately in accordance with law. The case dates back to October 2020, when the Gujarat ATS intercepted a Maharashtra-registered car near Palanpur in Banaskantha district following a tip-off.

Investigators said the charas had allegedly been transported from Ludhiana, Punjab, and concealed in cartons of apples.

Two men from Maharashtra, including Samir Shaikh, were arrested at the scene, while the ATS later arrested an alleged key conspirator from Ahmedabad during the course of the investigation.

Investigators had alleged that the consignment was to be delivered in Gujarat for monetary consideration.

The conviction comes under the NDPS Act, which prescribes stringent punishment for offences involving commercial quantities of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances.

Under the law, commercial quantity offences can attract rigorous imprisonment extending up to 20 years along with substantial monetary penalties.

'Operation Thunder' intensifies anti-narcotics crackdown; 425 NDPS cases registered, 202 accused arrested between January and June 2026

Nagpur: Nagpur City Police have intensified their crackdown on drug trafficking under the special anti-narcotics campaign 'Operation Thunder', registering a significant rise in seizures, arrests and cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act during the first six months of 2026.

The campaign, carried out under the guidance of Police Commissioner Vishwas Nangre Patil, has resulted in the seizure of narcotics worth Rs 6.93 crore between January and June 2026, compared with Rs 1.94 crore during the corresponding period last year, an increase of nearly 257 per cent.

According to official data released by the Nagpur City Police, a total of 425 NDPS cases were registered during the January-June 2026 period, compared with 359 cases during the same period in 2025, marking an increase of 66 cases, or 18.38 per cent.

The most striking rise was recorded in cases involving the synthetic drug MD (Mephedrone) powder. Between January and June 2025, police had registered eight commercial quantity cases and seized 1.680 kg of MD powder. During the corresponding period in 2026, the number of commercial quantity cases rose to 14, while seizures increased dramatically to 9.254 kg. This represents a 75 per cent increase in commercial quantity cases and a more than fivefold rise in the quantity of MD powder recovered.

Police said the success was achieved through continuous surveillance of drug peddlers, consumers and history-sheeters, coupled with preventive action against habitual offenders. Investigators also strengthened their efforts by tracing both backward and forward links in drug trafficking networks, leading to the identification and arrest of key accused involved in the illicit trade.

During the first six months of 2026, police arrested 202 accused in NDPS cases, compared with 192 arrests during the corresponding period last year. Preventive action was initiated against 102 habitual offenders as part of the sustained anti-drug campaign.

Officials said large quantities of MD powder, ganja and other narcotic substances were seized during the operations, dealing a significant blow to the illegal drug supply chain operating in the city.

Nagpur Police said "Operation Thunder" is aimed at making the city drug-free by taking stringent action against those involved in the sale, possession, transportation and consumption of narcotic substances. The department has reiterated its commitment to intensifying special drives in the

coming months and ensuring strict enforcement of the NDPS Act against drug traffickers and peddlers.

Police Commissioner Vishwas Nangre Patil has directed all units to continue sustained operations against narcotics networks, with a focus on dismantling organised drug syndicates and creating a drug-free society in Nagpur.

Strict Compliance With Search And Seizure Safeguards Under NDPS Act Is Mandatory: Chhattisgarh High Court Acquits Seven Accused

A division bench of the High Court of Chhattisgarh, comprising **Chief Justice Ramesh Sinha** and **Justice Ravindra Kumar Agrawal**, has set aside the trial court's conviction and sentencing of seven individuals accused of possessing and selling commercial quantities of prohibited psychotropic substances under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985. The court held that strict compliance with the statutory procedural safeguards under the NDPS Act is mandatory, ruling that severe punishments under the Act necessitate scrupulous procedural adherence. Finding egregious lapses and timeline contradictions in the state police's investigation, the High Court extended the benefit of doubt to all seven appellants and ordered their immediate release.

Background of the Case

The case originated on October 10, 2022, when Assistant Sub-Inspector Rajesh Mandle received secret information regarding two individuals selling intoxicating tablets near Mukut Nagar water tank in Raipur. The police intercepted Niyajuddin alias Vikky and J. Bhaskar Rao, recovering 120 Alprazolam tablets and 144 Tramadol capsules.

Subsequent interrogation and memorandum statements led to a wider chain of arrests and seizures:

- **Ravindra Goyal**, owner of Pratham Medical Store, was intercepted in a car, yielding 14,400 Tramadol Spasmo capsules.

- **Mukesh Kumar Sahu** was arrested after a search at his residence in village Karsa turned up 28,800 Tramadol Spasmo capsules.
- **Mohammad Hasan** and his son **Sahil Hasan** were apprehended at Mowa, Raipur, with 1,15,200 and 3,744 Tramadol Spasmo capsules respectively, alongside 41,600 Alprazolam tablets.
- **Akash Vishwakarma**, proprietor of Narmada Pharma in Jabalpur, and **Viral Patel**, a wholesaler in Gujarat, were subsequently arrested on the basis of co-accused disclosure statements.

The Special Court (NDPS Act), Raipur, on September 1, 2025, convicted and sentenced Ravindra Goyal, Sahil Hasan, and Mukesh Kumar Sahu to 15 years of rigorous imprisonment and a fine of Rs. 1,50,000 each under Section 22(c). Viral Patel and Akash Vishwakarma received 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and a Rs. 1,00,000 fine under Section 29 read with Section 22(c). Niyajuddin and J. Bhaskar Rao were sentenced to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment and a Rs. 1,00,000 fine under Section 22(b).

Arguments of the Parties

Senior Advocates Ms. Fouzia Mirza and Mr. Ashish Shrivastava, along with counsels for the other appellants, argued that the prosecution's case was riddled with material inconsistencies and procedural violations of Sections 42, 50, 52-A, and 55 of the NDPS Act. They highlighted that:

- The document showing compliance with Section 42(2) was recorded as prepared at 16:00 hours, yet bore a receiving stamp from the CSP office at 15:25 hours—an inherent impossibility.
- Under Section 50, the accused were improperly given the option to be searched by the police officer himself.
- The sampling was not conducted before a Magistrate, violating Section 52-A.
- There was an unexplained discrepancy in the physical inventory; the seizure memo for J. Bhaskar Rao recorded strips of 8 capsules each, whereas the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) report recorded strips of 24 capsules.
- Viral Patel and Akash Vishwakarma were implicated solely on inadmissible confessional statements of co-accused, as no drugs were recovered from them.

The Government Advocate, Mr. Shaleen Singh Baghel, opposed the appeals, arguing that minor discrepancies should not dismantle the case given the massive quantity of psychotropic substances seized. He contended that the chain of supply was established, and the official witnesses of the raiding party had consistently supported the prosecution's case.

The Court's Analysis

The High Court analyzed the procedural adherence of the police and identified critical, fatal infirmities in the investigation.

1. Inherent Impossibilities in Section 42 Compliance

The court observed a temporal mismatch in the transmission of the secret information to superior officers. The receipt of the communication occurred 35 minutes before its recorded preparation. The court held that this contradiction raised serious doubts about whether the mandatory requirement was met before the search.

2. Defective Section 50 Search Options

The notices served to the accused stated they could be searched by a Gazetted Officer, a Magistrate, or the police officer himself. The High Court observed that Section 50 does not contemplate allowing the searching officer to conduct the search. Citing *State of Punjab v. Baldev Singh (1999)*, the court noted:

“Conducting a search under Section 50, without intimating to the suspect that he has a right to be searched before a gazetted officer or a Magistrate, would be violative of the ‘reasonable, fair and just procedure’ and the safeguard contained in Section 50 would be rendered illusory, otiose and meaningless.”

3. Breach of Section 52-A and Chain of Custody (Section 55)

The court noted that the police failed to draw samples in the presence of a Magistrate as mandated by Section 52-A. Citing *Union of India v. Mohanlal (2016)*, *Yusuf @ Asif v. State (2023)*, and *Surepally Srinivas v. State of Andhra Pradesh (2025)*, the court reiterated that magistrate-led sampling is not an empty formality.

Additionally, the court highlighted that the prosecution failed to produce any Malkhana or seal registers to prove safe custody under Section 55, raising the possibility of tampering. This was compounded by the fact that the FSL report described strips of 24 capsules, contradicting the seizure memo’s description of 8-capsule strips. Citing *Ashok v. State of Madhya Pradesh (2011)*, the court emphasized that failing to establish an unbroken chain of custody materially damages the prosecution.

4. Inadmissibility of Co-accused Confessions

Regarding appellants Viral Patel and Akash Vishwakarma, from whom no contraband was recovered, the court ruled that their prosecution rested entirely on co-accused statements. Applying the Constitution Bench ruling in *Tofan Singh v. State of Tamil Nadu (2021)*, the court observed:

“confessional statements recorded under Section 67 of the NDPS Act are inadmissible as confessions against the maker and cannot be made the foundation of conviction.”

Applying *Balwinder Singh (Binda) v. Narcotics Control Bureau (2024)* and *Noor Aga v. State of Punjab (2008)*, the bench held that without independent corroborating evidence, such disclosures hold no legal value, and the statutory presumptions under Sections 35 and 54 of the NDPS Act cannot be invoked.

The Decision of the Court

The High Court allowed all the criminal appeals, setting aside the trial court's judgment dated September 1, 2025, and acquitting all seven appellants.

Before parting, the court expressed deep concern regarding the negligent manner in which the state police handled the investigation of such a grave offense, pointing out that this was the second case on the same day displaying identical systemic errors (referencing *Dorilal v. Directorate of Revenue Intelligence Raipur*).

The court stated: ***“These are not isolated procedural irregularities but substantial violations having a direct bearing on the fairness and credibility of the prosecution.”***

The court added: ***“They disclose a disturbing pattern of negligence, lack of professional competence and complete indifference towards the mandatory safeguards under the NDPS Act.”***

The Registry was directed to forward the copy of the judgment to the Director General of Police, Chhattisgarh, to examine the lapses, identify and penalize the responsible officers, and issue comprehensive Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and training programs to ensure strict statutory compliance in future investigations.

SRINAGAR: Police in south Kashmir's Anantnag district have detained two alleged repeat drug peddlers under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT NDPS) Act as part of its continued drive against narcotics, officials said on Saturday.

The detainees have been identified as Junaid Ahmad Mantoo, son of Aijaz Ahmad Mantoo, a resident of Waghama, and Mohammad Ashraf Dar, son of Jalal Uddin Dar, a resident of Tulkhan, Bijbehara.

According to police, both individuals are repeat offenders with involvement in multiple cases registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. Despite repeated legal action, they allegedly continued to engage in drug trafficking.

Considering their persistent involvement in narcotics-related activities and the threat they allegedly posed to public safety, detention orders were issued against them under the PIT NDPS Act, police said.

Daltonganj: Two persons, including a 55-year-old habitual narcotics trader from Haryana, were arrested in Palamu district with 48.2 kg of poppy straw (husk) and 230 grams of ready-to-use opium during a late-night anti-crime checking drive, police said on Saturday. Chandigarh: Calling drug abuse a social challenge rather than merely a law-and-order issue, Haryana chief minister Nayab Singh Saini on Saturday launched the anti-drug 'Haryana Uday' campaign, announcing the formation of district and local task forces to mobilise community participation in the fight against narcotics.

Addressing a state-level interaction with NGOs and chemist associations in Panchkula, Saini said the govt's crackdown on drug traffickers must be complemented by public participation to eradicate addiction. "A drug-free Haryana can be achieved only through public participation. The government can curb the supply of drugs through laws and police action, but society must eliminate the demand," he said while administering an anti-drug pledge to participants.

The CM said the campaign would strengthen community policing and involve citizens, NGOs, educational institutions and chemists in creating awareness against substance abuse. Task forces at the district and grassroots levels will comprise sub-divisional magistrates, block development and panchayat officers, gram sarpanches and NGO representatives to coordinate awareness drives and monitor local efforts. Saini said the government had adopted a two-pronged strategy of strict enforcement against drug peddlers and social intervention to prevent addiction among youth. He said properties of drug traffickers had been attached and illegally acquired structures demolished as part of the state's crackdown.

Emphasising rehabilitation, Saini said individuals battling addiction should not be permanently stigmatised but given an opportunity to return to mainstream society. "Love, trust and acceptance can transform lives. Rehabilitation is as important as enforcement," he said.

The chief minister also urged parents to spend more time with their children and strengthen family bonds to reduce the risk of drug addiction. "Children need time, trust and communication from their families more than mobile phones," he said.

Appealing to NGOs to take the campaign to every village, ward and locality, Saini said Haryana's youth had excelled in sports, education, science and entrepreneurship, and protecting them from drugs was essential for building a developed Haryana and India.

मंडी के एसपी विनोद कुमार ने दोनों मामलों की पुष्टि करते हुए बताया कि सभी 6 आरोपियों के खिलाफ थाना सुंदरनगर में एनडीपीएस अधिनियम के तहत मुकदमे दर्ज कर आगामी कार्रवाई शुरू कर दी गई है। उन्होंने बताया कि पुलिस अब इस मामले की बैकवर्ड और फॉरवर्ड लिंकेज खंगाल रही है। यह पता लगाया जा रहा है कि चरस की यह बड़ी खेप कुल्लू में किससे खरीदी गई थी और इसे आगे किस स्थान पर सप्लाई किया जाना था। पुलिस आरोपियों के मोबाइल फोन और अन्य इलेक्ट्रॉनिक साक्ष्यों की भी बारीकी से पड़ताल कर रही है, ताकि यह साफ हो सके कि इन युवकों के तार किसी बड़े अंतर्राज्यीय नशा तस्करी गिरोह से तो नहीं जुड़े हैं।

मुजफ्फरपुर, प्रमुख संवाददाता। मुजफ्फरपुर डीआरआई की टीम ने पटना के फतुहा स्थित एक ट्रांसपोर्ट कंपनी के गोदाम से 1.8 करोड़ रुपये की प्रतिबंधित कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप जब्त की है। गोदाम में 18 हजार बोतल कफ सिरप मिली है। कफ सिरप की यह खेप पश्चिम बंगाल से मंगाई गई थी। इसे बिहार से बॉर्डर क्रॉस कराकर बांग्लादेश भेजा जाना था। जब्त कफ सिरप की बोतलों पर 193 रुपये मूल्य अंकित है। डीआरआई के आधिकारिक सूत्रों ने बताया कि एनडीपीएस के तहत जब्त होने वाली इस कफ सिरप की कीमत सरकारी स्तर पर एक हजार रुपये प्रति बोतल तय है। डीआरआई को पश्चिम बंगाल से कफ सिरप लाए जाने की सटीक जानकारी मिली थी।

इसके आधार पर छापेमारी की गई। डीआरआई को पश्चिम बंगाल से पटना तक बड़े रैकेट की जानकारी मिली है। कुछ और स्थानों पर कार्रवाई हो सकती है। डीआरआई सूत्रों के अनुसार, गोदाम की तलाशी में भूरे रंग के गत्ते के कार्टनों में छिपाकर रखी गई कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप की बोतलें बरामद हुईं। नशीली होने के कारण यह कफ सिरप प्रतिबंधित है। कफ सिरप के रिसीवर का ड्रग लाइसेंस पहले ही रद्द हो चुका था। इतना ही नहीं, प्राप्तकर्ता के नाम पर दर्ज पता भी फर्जी पाया गया। कोडीन को फॉस्फेट एनडीपीएस अधिनियम के तहत अत्यधिक नशीली दवा की श्रेणी में रखा गया है। अब डीआरआई इस गिरोह में शामिल मुख्य सरगना, वितरकों और आपूर्ति नेटवर्क की पहचान करने के लिए आगे की जांच कर रही है।

सूचना के सत्यापन के बाद अनुमंडल पुलिस पदाधिकारी (सदर) के नेतृत्व में गठित एसआईटी ने छापेमारी कर दोनों संदिग्धों को पकड़ लिया। तलाशी के दौरान उनके पास से कुल 4.04 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर बरामद हुई।

गिरफ्तार आरोपियों की पहचान सूरज चौधरी उर्फ सोनू (31 वर्ष), निवासी- बुड़वाकुरा, थाना- मोहनपुर और मनीष कुमार उर्फ सत्री (23 वर्ष), निवासी- सिंहरायडीह, थाना- मोहनपुर के रूप में हुई है। इस मामले में मोहनपुर थाना कांड संख्या 115/2026 के तहत एनडीपीएस अधिनियम की धारा 21(बी) में मामला दर्ज कर आगे की कानूनी कार्रवाई की जा रही है।

देवघर पुलिस ने कहा है कि जिले में नशे के अवैध कारोबार के खिलाफ अभियान लगातार जारी रहेगा और ऐसे कारोबार में शामिल लोगों के विरुद्ध सख्त कार्रवाई की जाएगी।

रांची में ब्राउन शुगर तस्करी पर पुलिस की बड़ी कार्रवाई, 15 ग्राम नशीला पदार्थ और 1.70 लाख रुपये नकद बरामद

रांची। Major police crackdown on brown sugar smuggling in Ranchi, तमाड़ थाना क्षेत्र में पुलिस ने ब्राउन शुगर तस्करी के खिलाफ बड़ी कार्रवाई करते हुए दो आरोपितों को गिरफ्तार किया है। उनके पास से 15 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर, दो इलेक्ट्रॉनिक वजन मशीन, एक कीपैड मोबाइल और 1.70 लाख रुपये नकद बरामद किए गए हैं।

गिरफ्तार आरोपितों की पहचान राजा शिव दत्त मलिक उर्फ राजा और आसिफ खान के रूप में हुई है। दोनों को एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत गिरफ्तार कर न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया गया है।

पुलिस के अनुसार, नौ जुलाई को वरीय पुलिस अधीक्षक को गुप्त सूचना मिली थी कि तमाड़ थाना क्षेत्र के बंगाली टोला में ब्राउन शुगर की खरीद-बिक्री की जा रही है। सूचना के सत्यापन के बाद ग्रामीण पुलिस अधीक्षक और बुंदू अनुमंडल पुलिस पदाधिकारी के निर्देश पर तमाड़ थाना प्रभारी दुलाल कुमार महतो के नेतृत्व में विशेष छापेमारी दल का गठन किया गया।

पुलिस टीम जब बंगाली टोला स्थित राजा शिव दत्त मलिक के घर पहुंची, तभी वहां मौजूद एक युवक पुलिस को देखकर भागने लगा। पुलिसकर्मियों ने पीछा कर उसे पकड़ लिया। पूछताछ में उसने अपना नाम आसिफ खान बताया। एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा-50 के तहत तलाशी लेने पर उसके पास से करीब तीन ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर बरामद हुई।

पूछताछ में उसने स्वीकार किया कि उसने यह ब्राउन शुगर राजा शिव दत्त मलिक से खरीदी थी। आसिफ की निशानदेही पर पुलिस ने राजा शिव दत्त मलिक के घर की तलाशी ली।

तलाशी के दौरान 12 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर, दो इलेक्ट्रॉनिक वजन मशीन, एक कीपैड मोबाइल और तस्करी से अर्जित 1.70 लाख रुपये नकद बरामद किए गए। बरामद नकदी और अन्य सामान के संबंध में आरोपित कोई वैध दस्तावेज प्रस्तुत नहीं कर सके।

मुजफ्फरपुर DRI ने पटना के फतुहा स्थित एक गोदाम पर छापा मारकर 1.75 करोड़ रुपये मूल्य की 18,000 कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप की बोतलें जब्त की हैं।

जागरण संवाददाता, मुजफ्फरपुर। डायरेक्टरेट ऑफ रेवेन्यू इंटेलिजेंस (DRI), मुजफ्फरपुर की विशेष टीम ने राजधानी पटना के फतुहा स्थित गोदाम पर छापेमारी कर कोडीन युक्त 18 हजार बोतलें कफ सिरप की जब्त की है। इसकी कीमत करीब पौने दो करोड़ रुपये बताई जा रही है।

जांच में पता चला कि ये नशीली दवाएं फर्जी पते व रद्द लाइसेंस पर सप्लाई की जा रही थी। ड्रग्स तस्करी के खिलाफ डीआरआइ की अब तक की सबसे बड़ी कार्रवाई मानी जा रही है। हालांकि इसमें किसी की गिरफ्तारी नहीं हो सकी है।

बताया गया कि डीआरआइ की विशेष टीम के अधिकारियों को खुफिया इनपुट मिला कि राजधानी पटना के फतुहा स्थित गोदाम पर भारी मात्रा में कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप की खेप है। इसपर डीआरआइ की विशेष टीम ने कार्रवाई की। गोदाम की तलाशी के दौरान अधिकारियों को भूरे रंग के गत्ते के कार्टन में शातिराना तरीके से छिपाई गई प्रतिबंधित कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप की कुल 18 हजार बोतलें मिलीं। इसे जब्त कर लिया गया।

डीआरआइ अधिकारियों की मानें तो इनकी अनुमानित कीमत करीब 1.75 करोड़ रुपये आंकी गई है। इस कार्रवाई से डीआरआइ की ओर से अंतरराज्यीय फार्मास्युटिकल ड्रग्स रैकेट की कमर तोड़ने की कोशिश की गई है।

प्रारंभिक जांच के बाद डीआरआइ टीम ने दवा सिंडिकेट की सप्लाई चेन को लेकर चौंकाने वाली बातों की जानकारी दी है। अधिकारियों ने बताया कि कागजी दस्तावेज खंगालने पर पता चला कि इस खेप को जिस प्राप्तकर्ता रिसीवर के नाम पर भेजा गया था, उसका ड्रग लाइसेंस काफी समय पहले ही रद्द किया जा चुका था।

अधिकारियों ने दर्ज पते की भौतिक पड़ताल की तो वह भी पूरी तरह फर्जी व अस्तित्वहीन पाया गया। इससे स्पष्ट हुआ कि वैध फार्मास्युटिकल कारोबार की आड़ में इस प्रतिबंधित कफ सिरप को पूरी तरह से ब्लैक मार्केट में खपाने की तैयारी थी।

अधिकारियों के मुताबिक, कफ सिरप में मौजूद कोडीन फास्फेट एक अत्यधिक व्यसनकारी स्वापक (नार्कोटिक) पदार्थ है। इसी वजह से यह स्वापक औषधि और मनःप्रभावी पदार्थ (एनडीपीएस) अधिनियम 1985 के तहत पूरी तरह से विनियमित है।

बताते हैं कि युवाओं में नशे के लिए इसकी बढ़ी मांग को देखते हुए इसे तस्करी के लिए मंगवाया गया था। विशेष टीम फार्मास्युटिकल ड्रग सिंडिकेट के मुख्य सरगना, अवैध वितरकों व स्थानीय नेटवर्क को ट्रेस कर ध्वस्त करने में जुटी है।
