- Ganja hydraulically compressed, vacuum-packed and concealed in backpacks for easier interstate transport.
- Drug traffickers increasingly using women, children, dolls, fake medical plasters, and hidden vehicle cavities to transport narcotics.
- Legitimate businesses allegedly used as fronts for cocaine distribution.

Key Trends

- Odisha continues to be a major source state for interstate cannabis trafficking, with consignments intercepted in Telangana, Kerala, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu.
- Rail, private buses and medical vehicles remain preferred transport modes for narcotics movement.
- Investigations indicate expanding interstate and international synthetic drug networks, with links involving New Delhi, Bengaluru, Thailand, Myanmar and Malaysia.
- Enforcement agencies continue targeting organised syndicates through joint interstate operations, intelligence-led surveillance and supply-chain investigations.

Chandigarh: The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) has invited applications from retired inspectors and sub-inspectors of central and state police forces, including Chandigarh Police, for engagement as consultants to handle pairvi work in trial courts for narcotics cases.

The bureau plans to fill four consultant posts in its Chandigarh zone and has set July 15 as the last date for submitting applications.

According to the NCB, the consultants will be engaged initially for one year, extendable by another year based on performance. The appointment will be subject to the terms and conditions laid down by the ministry of finance, and the consultant should not

exceed 65 years of age during the contract period.

The bureau has requested police departments to publicise the vacancies among eligible retired officers, stating that their services would strengthen efforts to combat drug trafficking.

Applicants must have retired from central or state govt service and possess at least three years' experience in investigation, prosecution of criminal cases or court duty in criminal courts. They should not have completed more than four years since retirement.

The selected consultants will assist law officers and investigating officers in conducting trials effectively. Their responsibilities will include coordinating the production of witnesses, documents and case property before courts, ensuring timely service of judicial processes, obtaining copies of court orders and depositions, and maintaining liaison with prosecution teams and court staff.

They will also monitor the progress of assigned cases, submit periodic status reports to the zonal director and report significant judicial developments related to NCB cases.

The Chandigarh Police has uploaded the application proforma on its official website to facilitate applications from retired personnel. The headquarters of the NCB Chandigarh Zone is located in Sector 66, Mohali.

हैदराबाद । डेस्क: नशीले पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ एक बड़े अभियान में तेलंगाना पुलिस की विशेष एंटी-नारकोटिक्स विंग 'ईगल' (EAGLE) फोर्स और नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो (NCB) को बड़ी सफलता मिली है। दोनों एजेंसियों ने एक संयुक्त ऑपरेशन चलाकर छत्तीसगढ़-महाराष्ट्र सीमा के पास 385 किलोग्राम गांजा जब्त किया है।

इस मामले में पुलिस ने राजस्थान के भीलवाड़ा जिले के रहने वाले 23 वर्षीय महादेव भील को गिरफ्तार किया है।

पुलिस अधिकारियों के मुताबिक, इस बड़े कंसाइनमेंट को पकड़ने के लिए ईगल फोर्स ने सात दिनों तक लगातार निगरानी रखी थी। खुफिया जानकारी के आधार पर टीम ने इस खेप का पीछा ओडिशा के जेपोर स्थित देवघाटी से शुरू किया था।

इसके बाद कोलकाता-मुंबई राजमार्ग पर स्थित बाघ नदी गांव (छत्तीसगढ़-महाराष्ट्र बॉर्डर) के पास घेराबंदी कर इसे रोक लिया गया। यदि यह खेप समय पर नहीं पकड़ी जाती, तो इसे महाराष्ट्र और राजस्थान में सप्लाई किया जाना था।

तेलंगाना पुलिस के अनुसार, ईगल फोर्स पिछले एक साल से अंतर-राज्यीय ड्रग तस्करी नेटवर्क को ध्वस्त करने में बेहद सक्रिय भूमिका निभा रही है। यह विशेष इकाई अब तक करीब 7,000 किलोग्राम गांजा जब्त कर चुकी है। इस यूनिट की मुस्तैदी के कारण विभिन्न राज्यों को नशीले पदार्थों के ट्रांजिट कॉरिडोर के रूप में इस्तेमाल करने की तस्करो की कोशिशें लगातार नाकाम हो रही हैं।

ईगल फोर्स का खुफिया तंत्र देश के अन्य राज्यों में भी ड्रग माफियाओं पर भारी पड़ रहा है। इससे पहले नवंबर 2025 में ईगल फोर्स द्वारा साझा की गई खुफिया जानकारी की मदद से रांची एनसीबी ने 500 किलोग्राम गांजा जब्त किया था।

वहीं, जून 2026 में ओडिशा की कोरापुट सदर पुलिस के साथ मिलकर चलाए गए एक साझा ऑपरेशन में भी 500 किलोग्राम गांजा बरामद किया गया था। इस नए ऑपरेशन के बाद पुलिस अब पकड़े गए आरोपी से पूछताछ कर इस पूरे सिंडिकेट से जुड़े अन्य तस्करो का पता लगाने में जुट गई है।

धनगढ़ी (नेपाल)। गौरीफंटा बॉर्डर से ब्राउन शुगर लाने के आरोप में 12 नेपाली लोगों को कैलाली जिले के धनगढ़ी उपमहानगरपालिका समेत अलग-अलग स्थानों से पकड़ा गया।

कैलाली जिले के डीएसपी योगेंद्र तिमिलसिना ने बताया कि भारत के गौरीफंटा बॉर्डर से धनगढ़ी आ रहे गोदावरी नगरपालिका वार्ड-6 लालपुर निवासी 20 वर्षीय राहुल भूल और लोकेन्द्र खड़का को त्रिनगर-धनगढ़ी पुलिस बैरियर पर पकड़ा गया। उनके पास से 2.800 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर बरामद हुई।

धनगढ़ी वार्ड-1 स्थित मोहाना नदी के त्रिवेणी घाट से अस्मित कठारिया और मनीष चौधरी को 2.270 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ पकड़ा गया। धनगढ़ी वार्ड-2 स्थित शीशा पुलिस पोस्ट के पास गौरीगंगा नगरपालिका के बड़ेपुर निवासी वेद धामी समेत चार युवकों को 110 मिलीग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ गिरफ्तार किया गया।

टीकापुर नगरपालिका वार्ड-1 स्थित साथी अस्पताल के पास स्थानीय 16 और 17 वर्षीय दो किशोरों को 390 मिलीग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ टीकापुर थाना पुलिस ने पकड़ा। बर्दगौरिया नगरपालिका वार्ड-2 बौनिया बाजार से महेंद्र निवासी गपका गांव और उपेंद्र जैशी निवासी मोनहयाल सुग्रखाल को 350 मिलीग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ गिरफ्तार किया गया।

Traffickers using children, women to transport drugs from Myanmar via Northeast

Doulasal (Assam): Days after India sought help from Myanmar to eradicate the menace of drugs, investigators in [Assam](#) on Sunday stated that traffickers have even been found using women and even children as conduits to transport narcotics via Northeast to the rest of the country.



"Many innovative modus operandi have come into fore during our operations. There are cases where women and children have been found to be used by traffickers as passengers in trains or buses to transport drugs. Since narcotic substances like heroin, brown sugar or cocaine are very costly, they resort to use the children to carry in small quantities in their pockets or even inside dolls," Munna Prasad Gupta, Special Director General of (CID, Assam), told *DH* here in Nalbari district, about 50 km west of Guwahati.

Gupta was speaking on the sideline of an event organised by the state police to destroy seized [drugs](#) worth Rs. 471.52 crore as part of the Assam government's "War on Drugs" campaign.

Kicking off the destruction drive, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma drove a yellow road roller over 2.29 lakh bottles of cough syrups, which were seized by the state police in the past three years.

The destroyed substances, seized in nine districts, included heroin, cocaine, morphine, cannabis, tablets and capsules, opium, poppy straw and opium plants.

The destruction drive will continue for the next 10 days.

Stating that continuous inflow of drugs from Myanmar, particularly heroin and methamphetamine tablets (a stimulant drugs) through the borders in Manipur and Mizoram emerged as a worry, Sarma said his government decided to intensify the "War on Drugs" campaign in view of Home Minister Amit

Shah's recent initiatives to crack down on trafficking of drugs from Myanmar through the Northeast.

"The Northeast and Bengal are used as a transit. With BJP coming to power in Bengal, I believe that this will help us carry out a more systematic and vigorous drive against this international network of drug traffickers. Our CID personnel even came across incidents where conduits used fake plasters (used in case of broken hands or legs) to transport drugs. Women and children are also being used, which has become a serious concern now," Sarma said.

Opposition's call

Sarma said that a call by the opposition parties during the ongoing Assam Assembly's budget session also boosted government action to keep a check on the drug menace.

"Not much was done before 2016 (when Congress was in power) to eradicate drug menace. If we look at the seizure data, in 2015, only one kg of heroin was seized whereas in 2024, our police department seized 183kgs of heroin. We have seized drugs worth Rs. 1,000 crores annually in the past five years. More than 3,300 cases have been registered in the past five years while drugs worth Rs. 3,227 crores have been destroyed so far to send a strong message to the drug trafficking network," Sarma said, adding that the drive will intensify in the coming days.

Sarma said Shah recently told him that he would soon meet the chief ministers and director general of police in the Northeast to strengthen the coordination mechanism for ending the menace of drugs from Myanmar.

Doulashal: Assam Chief Minister [Himanta Biswa Sarma](#) said Assam is being used as a transit route for the illegal drug trade and that there is better synergy among Assam, Mizoram, Manipur and West Bengal in tracing drugs originating from Myanmar.

Assam on Sunday started the destruction of drugs worth Rs 473 crore. In the last five years, Assam has seized drugs worth Rs 3,327 crore.

Police have found that drug peddlers use women and children to carry small quantities of heroin. Drugs are concealed inside plasters on the body.

Sarma said, Assam is being used as a transit route for drugs originating from Myanmar, which come to Assam via Mizoram and Manipur before moving onwards to West Bengal and the rest of India. "We are able to seize just 20% of the drugs moving through Assam. Consumption of drugs is not high in Assam."

Sarma said that, for the first time in Assam, there is consensus among all political parties that the strictest action must be taken against drug cartels. "The Union Home Ministry has provided an incinerator for the destruction of drugs. In the last five years, over 3,333 cases have been filed under the NDPS Act."

Sarma said Union Home Minister Amit Shah is regularly holding meetings with the DGPs, and there is now greater synergy and intelligence sharing. "NCORD meetings are being held regularly. The new government in West Bengal is cooperating in the war against drugs. Border points in Mizoram and Manipur have been strengthened. Erection of fencing along the international border with Myanmar is going to intensify the war against drugs."

Assam: Majuli Police destroy over 115 kg seized ganja in anti-drug operations

Majuli Police destroyed 115.919 kg of seized ganja as Assam intensified its crackdown on narcotics and drug trafficking.

Guwahati: Reinforcing its crackdown on [narcotics](#), Majuli Police on Saturday destroyed 115.919 kg of [ganja seized](#) in separate anti-drug operations conducted across the district.

The contraband had been recovered during raids in the Dakhinpat-Kumargaon area and Perabhari village under the jurisdiction of Majuli Police Station.

The seized ganja was destroyed at the Majuli Brick Field in Boritika after all legal formalities were completed.

The disposal was carried out under the supervision of the District Level Drug Disposal Committee in accordance with prescribed legal procedures and environmental norms to ensure the safe destruction of the narcotic substance.

The exercise was attended by the Senior Superintendent of Police, Majuli, members of the District Level Drug Disposal Committee and other officials, who monitored the entire destruction process.

Police said the disposal of the seized ganja reflects the district's continued efforts to curb drug trafficking and prevent confiscated narcotics from re-entering the illegal market. Such destruction drives form an important part of the legal process after the completion of seizure and judicial procedures.

The exercise comes amid intensified anti-narcotics operations across [Assam](#), where law enforcement agencies have stepped up surveillance, raids and enforcement measures as part of the state's broader campaign against drug trafficking.

Officials reiterated that Majuli Police will continue taking strict action against narcotics-related offences and appealed to the public to cooperate by reporting drug-related activities to the authorities.

The police said sustained public participation, along with consistent enforcement, is essential to combating drug trafficking and curbing substance abuse across the state.

Drugs worth Rs 5.16 crore destroyed in Assam's Barpeta under court-approved disposal drive
In a major anti-drug operation, the Barpeta district administration and Assam Police on July 12 destroyed seized narcotic substances worth Rs 5.16 crore at the Barpeta Police Reserve Playground.

The destroyed contraband had been seized by police from different parts of the district over an extended period during various anti-narcotics operations.

According to officials, the destroyed drugs included 1,068 grams of heroin, 133 kg of ganja, 58,217 Yaba tablets, 494 capsules, and 123 bottles of cough syrup. The total market value of the narcotics destroyed was estimated at Rs 5,16,31,810.

The destruction of the seized drugs was carried out following approval from the Drugs Disposal Committee and in the presence of Barpeta Deputy Commissioner Nabadeep Pathak, In-Charge Superintendent of Police Samiran Baishya, senior police officials, and Excise Department officials.

The authorities reiterated their commitment to intensifying the crackdown on drug trafficking and ensuring the safe disposal of seized narcotic substances in accordance with legal procedure

The destruction exercise was carried out at Birjhora Tea Estate in Bongaigaon following the prescribed legal procedures. Officials said the disposal process was conducted with complete transparency while adhering to all environmental norms and regulatory guidelines.

The programme was attended by Bongaigaon Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Numal Mahatta, Additional Superintendent of Police (Crime) Jayanta Barua, the Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP), the Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC), and other senior officials.

Representatives of the Drug Disposal Committee, the Pollution Control Board, the Village Defence Party (VDP), civil society organisations, and members of the media were also present during the destruction of the seized contraband.

According to police, the total market value of the destroyed narcotics stood at Rs 6,63,35,450. The contraband included 1,027.093 kg of ganja valued at Rs 5,13,54,650, 294.59 grams of heroin worth Rs 58,91,800, 5,070 tablets valued at Rs 25,35,000, 13.084 kg of opium worth Rs 65,42,000, and 24

capsules valued at Rs 12,000.

Officials said the destruction of the seized narcotics underscores the state's sustained crackdown on drug trafficking networks and sends a strong message to organised drug syndicates operating in the region.

A team from the East Guwahati Police District (EGPD) under Basistha Police Station arrested a woman drug peddler during a raid at Amtola Basti in Byrnihat and recovered heroin, stolen electronic devices and cash from her possession.

The accused, identified as Nehar Begum (30), is also suspected of receiving and dealing in stolen property.

During the operation, police seized 67 vials of heroin weighing 78 grams, 214 empty vials, nine stolen mobile phones, one stolen tablet, one stolen laptop, and Rs 1,36,080 in cash.

Police have registered a case, and legal proceedings have been initiated. Further investigation is underway to ascertain the source of the narcotics and trace other individuals linked to the drug trafficking and stolen property network.

Manipur Police Bust Drug Rings and Seize Five Crore in Narcotics

Imphal: Manipur Police teamed up with Haryana authorities to take down a major drug suspect. They nabbed Dipu Gupta in Churachandpur. He was hiding out in the district headquarters. Officers grabbed 29.42 lakh in cash from the scene. This money allegedly comes from illegal narcotics deals. The suspect now faces charges under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act from a 2023 Haryana case.

Police kept the pressure on in a second hit. Bishnupur Commandos stopped a vehicle near the Kwakta Sericulture Centre. They pulled over 5 kilograms of brown sugar from a hidden spot in the door. The driver, Md Amzad Khan, went to jail. Authorities found an extra 83,770 rupees in his car. Police said the coordinated operations reflect the continuing efforts of state and central security agencies to dismantle drug trafficking syndicates and hawala networks operating within Manipur and across state borders.

A third raid hit near Moirang. Officers stopped an autorickshaw at Gelmol Lamkhai. They cuffed three men: Ebem, Hussain, and Md Nasimulla. The search turned up 68 grams of heroin. All three remain in custody as the investigation proceeds.

Imphal: A joint team of [Manipur Police](#) and central security forces seized around 49.5 kg of suspected opium after intercepting an abandoned SUV near Hengbung village in Senapati district on National Highway-2, officials said.

The seizure followed an early morning chase on July 12 after a Nagaland-registered Hyundai Creta allegedly ignored a police checkpoint and fled.

According to police, the incident took place around 6 am while personnel from Senapati Police and the Hengbung Outpost were conducting routine vehicle checks at the T Khullen checkpoint. The white SUV, which was travelling from Imphal towards Nagaland, failed to stop despite being signalled by the security personnel.

Police immediately launched a pursuit and alerted the Hengbung Outpost. The vehicle was later found abandoned near Hengbung Baptist Church with its ignition key still inside.

During a search of the SUV, security personnel recovered 49 packets containing approximately 49.5 kg of suspected opium.

Police said the vehicle is registered in the name of Z Reithingam (52), a native of Ukhrul district who is currently residing in Dimapur, [Nagaland](#).

The seized narcotics and the vehicle have been handed over to Senapati Police Station for further legal action. Meanwhile, police have launched a manhunt to trace and arrest the driver who fled the scene.

Railway Protection Force intensifies anti-crime drive, seizes drugs, rescues seven children

The Railway Protection Force (RPF) of Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) carried out a series of coordinated anti-crime and passenger assistance operations on July 7 and 8, reinforcing railway security across its jurisdiction through successful action against narcotics trafficking, liquor smuggling, theft and other unlawful activities.



The Railway Protection Force (RPF) of Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) carried out a series of coordinated anti-crime and passenger assistance operations on July 7 and 8, reinforcing railway security across its jurisdiction through successful action against narcotics trafficking, liquor smuggling, theft and other unlawful activities.

Working in coordination with the Government Railway Police (GRP), Excise Department, Child Welfare authorities and other law enforcement agencies, the RPF conducted multiple operations that led to significant recoveries and arrests while also extending timely assistance to passengers in need.

During the two-day operations, RPF teams recovered more than 15 kilograms of ganja valued at approximately Rs 7.60 lakh from different railway stations under NFR. In separate cases, 185 bottles of illicit liquor worth over Rs 20,000 were seized from trains and railway premises. The offenders were apprehended and handed over to the concerned authorities for legal action.

As part of its drive against theft and other criminal activities, the RPF also apprehended several offenders involved in mobile phone theft. Seven stolen mobile phones, collectively valued at around Rs 1.04 lakh, were recovered and handed over to the Government Railway Police for further legal

proceedings.

The force continued its humanitarian initiatives by rescuing seven minor children, including six boys and one girl, from different railway stations across the Northeast Frontier Railway network. The children were safely handed over to the respective Child Welfare Committees and Child Help Desks to ensure their rehabilitation, care and protection from potential exploitation.

In another instance, RPF personnel provided immediate assistance to an ailing elderly passenger at a railway station. After establishing the passenger's identity through available documents, the individual was shifted to the Railway Health Unit for first aid before being referred to a higher medical facility by railway ambulance under RPF escort. The passenger's family members were also informed promptly.

Northeast Frontier Railway said the sustained operations reflect the Railway Protection Force's continued commitment to ensuring passenger safety, protecting railway property and maintaining a secure travel environment. The RPF will continue to strengthen surveillance, prevent unlawful activities and provide prompt assistance to passengers across the railway network.

As Kochi city tightens vigil, drug traffickers turn to outskirts

KOCHI: Heightened surveillance and frequent vehicle checks in Kochi have forced drug traffickers to alter their routes, with the Aluva-Angamaly-Perumbavoor belt emerging as a key transit and distribution corridor, according to excise department officials.

In the backdrop of the [seizure of over 116 kg of ganja](#) in Karukutty, an official said the operation was carried out based on a specific tip-off that a large consignment meant for distribution in Ernakulam district would be routed through the area bypassing Kochi city.

“Traffickers have realised that bringing contraband directly into Kochi has become increasingly difficult because of intensive checking. They now unload and distribute consignments from locations around 10 km outside the city before moving the drugs through local networks,” the official said.

The official said the syndicate had travelled from Odisha by train to Thrissur before splitting up and boarding different buses to avoid attracting attention. But excise personnel in plain clothes carried out surveillance using private vehicles and intercepted the suspects.

Officials pointed to the sophisticated methods adopted by traffickers. The seized cannabis had been hydraulically compressed and vacuum-packed, significantly reducing its volume.

“Normally, a sack can hold only six to seven kilograms of loose ganja. By compressing it hydraulically, traffickers can pack as much as 20 to 25 kilograms into the same space, making it easier to transport and conceal,” the official explained.

In this case, the contraband had been packed into 58 packets and concealed in 11 shoulder bags. Investigators believe interstate traffickers are changing their business model by bypassing middlemen. Instead of relying solely on local carriers, some suppliers are transporting the contraband themselves to maximise profits before handing it over to retailers.

Officials said an investigation is under way to determine whether the accused were merely carriers or were directly linked to the distribution network in Kerala.

The excise department has noticed a growing trend of retail drug sales around railway stations and railway tracks, where small quantities are sold directly to consumers. Officials said breaking up larger consignments into small packets yields significantly higher profits than wholesale distribution, making direct retail sales more attractive to traffickers.

From industrial chemist to 'Batasingaram Alchemist': EAGLE traces decade-long drug trail

Hyderabad: Keesari Matsyagiri, known to investigators as the 'Batasingaram Alchemist', represents the emerging profile of the science-educated clandestine chemist. A Bachelor of Science graduate in Applied Nutrition, Zoology and Chemistry who once worked in legitimate chemical industries, he allegedly crossed over to the illegal manufacture of mephedrone after coming into contact with Gujarat-based drug manufacturers.

Case documents of the Elite Action Group for Drug Law Enforcement (EAGLE) Force, Hyderabad, accessed by TOI, reveal that his stay in Charlapally jail strengthened his links with the drug network before he allegedly set up a laboratory inside a mango farm at Batasingaram. Equipped with professional

chemistry apparatus and industrial chemicals, the facility resembled a 'Breaking Bad'-style operation, reflecting the growing role of technically trained chemists in Telangana's synthetic drug trade.

He was arrested in June 2026 by the Hyderabad narcotics police station of the EAGLE Force, Telangana.

Matsyagiri, 38, a resident of Tirumala Hills in Thirumalagiri, Suryapet district, completed his degree at SLNS Degree and Postgraduate College, Bhongir, in 2009. He subsequently worked as a chemist in several chemical industries, including Sri Sai Chemicals at Bacharam village in Abdullapurmet.

A laboratory job opens the door to mephedrone

According to the police, Matsyagiri's entry into the illegal drug trade began in 2015 while he was employed at Sri Sai Chemicals. Two men from Gujarat, identified as Vijay and Santosh Singh, allegedly hired a laboratory unit at his workplace to manufacture mephedrone.

Police said Matsyagiri, who had the technical knowledge required for chemical production, allegedly joined them in search of higher earnings. It was during this period, between 2015 and 2016, that he is suspected to have learnt the process of manufacturing mephedrone.

Vijay and Santosh were caught by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence in Madhya Pradesh in 2016. Investigators allege that Matsyagiri later developed links with others involved in setting up illegal drug-manufacturing units in different parts of the country. Police have described him as having a criminal history spanning more than a decade and links with a gang involved in mephedrone production.

The case took a more serious turn in 2017 when Matsyagiri, Vijay and Santosh were arrested in connection with the murder of Chandra Shekar, whom they allegedly suspected of being a police informant. The murder case was registered under Section 302 of the Indian Penal Code.

Matsyagiri spent about three months in Charlapally jail in connection with the case. Investigators suspect that his incarceration helped him build further contacts within the drug-manufacturing network. Police records have also linked the murder case to drug syndicates operating through associates from Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh.

Boduppall unit and earlier DRI arrest

Police said Matsyagiri returned to clandestine drug production and allegedly established a mephedrone laboratory at Boduppall in Dec 2023. He was arrested by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Hyderabad, on

Dec 21, 2023.

He had also previously been booked in narcotics cases, including one in which an illegal laboratory in Hyderabad was raided and a large quantity of mephedrone was seized, according to case records. A preventive detention order was issued against him under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act.

Despite the earlier cases, investigators allege that Matsyagiri resumed efforts to manufacture mephedrone after coming into contact with Nimmala Naresh, described in the First Information Report (FIR) as a loan commission agent.

Around four months before their arrest in June 2026, Matsyagiri allegedly proposed that the two enter into a partnership to manufacture the synthetic drug. They rented a tin shed inside a mango farm on Batasingaram Road in Rangareddy district.

To avoid suspicion, the two allegedly told the farm watchman that they would manufacture 'facial glow powder' in the shed.

Professional apparatus inside mango farm

The unit was equipped with apparatus generally associated with chemical production, including four-necked round-bottom flasks, heating mantles, voltage stabilisers, stirring motor stands and vacuum pumps.

Police said industrial chemicals such as toluene, bromine and acetone were procured for the manufacturing process. According to sources, the chemicals and apparatus were allegedly supplied through a man identified as Prabhakar, who is absconding.

About a month before the arrest, Matsyagiri allegedly purchased the chemicals and laboratory equipment and manufactured approximately 750 gram of mephedrone at the Batasingaram unit. Investigators are examining the source of the chemicals and the network through which the finished drug was to be distributed.

At 8.30 pm on June 10, 2026, police received information that Matsyagiri was transporting mephedrone for delivery. Officers intercepted a white Hyundai i20 near the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority weighbridge close to the Shivaji Maharaj statue on Batasingaram Road on June 11.

Matsyagiri and Naresh were taken into custody while allegedly transporting 795 gram of mephedrone to Suryapet for delivery to customers.

The investigation is now focused on the chemical supply chain, the intended recipients in Suryapet, and the wider manufacturing network allegedly associated with Matsyagiri.

4 held with Rs15cr worth meth in Sivaganga

Sivaganga: Four people have been arrested by Sivaganga Town police after they were found in possession of 3kg of methamphetamine worth Rs15 crore near Indira Nagar Railway Gate on Sunday.

Police said a team apprehended the suspects based on a tip and seized the contraband. They were identified as Rasool Deen, 35, of Ilayangudi in Sivaganga district, Abu alias Sagubar Sadik, 26, of Triplicane, Chennai, Mohamed Hafeez, 28, and Mohammed Rafeeq alias Babu, 30, of Trichy. Superintendent of police R Shiva Prasad said the property originated in Chennai and was intended to be smuggled to Malaysia via Bangalore.

Police also seized three mobile phones from the accused, and a case was registered. Preliminary investigation revealed that the accused had been operating as mules (kuruvi) for several years. The four accused were produced before the jurisdictional court and remanded to judicial custody. Further investigation is under way.

“The incident came to light after the suspects were involved in a scuffle over the sale of drugs among them,” the SP added.

Bengaluru police seize 5kg of MDMA, nab foreign national

Bengaluru: Girinagar police have arrested a Nigerian national and seized 5kg of MDMA, valued at crores of rupees, in a major crackdown on narcotics trafficking.

Acting on credible intelligence gathered over nearly 10 days, police registered a case under the NDPS Act and raided the service road near PES University, where they arrested Chigbandu Nwankappa. The MDMA was seized from him.

Preliminary investigation revealed that the drugs were transported from New Delhi and distributed through local peddlers. Police are continuing investigation to identify other members of the syndicate and trace the supply chain.

TIRUPATI: A Bengaluru link has come under Renigunta Urban police's scanner following the arrest of three alleged MDMA peddlers, including a Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) employee. Police suspect the accused procured the contraband from Karnataka's capital before distributing it in Tirupati and Renigunta.

The accused have been identified as T. Gunasekhar (26) of Settipalli, S. Ashwin Kumar (30) of Maruthi Nagar in Tirupati, and P. Rahul Yadav (30), a temple inspector with TTD's Govindaraja Swamy group of temples.

Acting on specific information, a police team led by circle inspector S. Jayachandra intercepted the trio in the parking area of the railway station in Renigunta on July 9. The team seized 62 grams of MDMA valued at around ₹3 lakh, four mobile phones, two digital weighing scales, and two motorcycles allegedly used to transport and distribute the narcotic substance.

Preliminary investigation revealed that the accused allegedly purchased MDMA in larger quantities from a supplier based in Bengaluru at a lower price. They brought it to Tirupati, repackaged it in small sachets, and sold the MDMA to local customers at higher prices.

Police are now analysing the seized mobile phones to identify the Bengaluru-based supplier and trace others involved in procuring and distributing the drug.

Sources said Rahul Yadav had joined the TTD on compassionate grounds following the death of his father. He had reportedly discontinued his studies in the United Kingdom and returned to India to take up the appointment. Police suspect he and the other accused are part of an interstate network operating between Bengaluru and Tirupati.

Renigunta Urban police have registered a case under Crime No. 126/2026 under Sections 8(c), 22(c) and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. The accused have been produced before a court, which has remanded them to judicial custody.

Further investigations are underway.

Hybrid ganja seizure: Arrested accused key links in international racket

Kochi: Ernakulam rural police investigating the international drug trading network behind the smuggling of Rs 18 crore worth hybrid ganja has found that the two accused who were arrested on Saturday were the key links in the syndicate who supply the contraband brought from Thailand to distributors.

Perumbavoor police arrested Fayis, 38, residing in Koduvally, Kozhikode, and Jagath, 29, Eranhipalam, Kozhikode. They were caught from hideouts in Kozhikode and Wayanad through a scientific investigation, police said. The accused were remanded in judicial custody on Sunday.

Abu Tahir, 39, Harikrishnan, 25, Presjith, 40, Sreejesh, 41, and Sanjay P, 22, were previously arrested from various parts of the state. The main accused, Tahir, was apprehended by police from Bengaluru.

Police said these individuals are the main masterminds in the drug network. The accused were caught following a detailed investigation centred around drug distribution networks inside and outside India. According to police, they are high-ranking operatives in the international drug syndicate that smuggles hybrid ganja into Kerala through airports. Police have seized mobile phones, bank transaction documents, foreign travel documents, digital evidence and luxury vehicles used for smuggling drugs from the accused.

Police said Tahir and Harikrishnan would send agents to Thailand by providing them with visas, tickets and compensation. When they returned, they would bring hybrid ganja. The group would collect this outside airport and then distribute it for sale.

Earlier, as part of Operation Toofan, Ayush, 39, and his wife Anika, 30, were caught with about 17kg of hybrid ganja

worth around Rs 18 crore. Ayush was first caught with 1.16kg of hybrid ganja being smuggled on a motorcycle and subsequently, a search conducted at a flat in Kunnuvazhi led to the discovery of 16kg of hybrid ganja.

Fraud case may be handed to CB: A multi-crore fraud case under investigation by city police, where property deeds submitted as collateral for loans were pledged without owners' knowledge, is likely to be handed over to crime branch (CB).

In June, Palarivattom police registered the case based on a complaint filed by an Edappally resident, who alleged that the accused caused him a debt of Rs 49.14 crore. The allegation was that the accused got hold of the deeds by paying off the complainant's loans and then used them to take fresh loans, which were eventually defaulted. Case was registered against five individuals who own two private companies in Kochi. Move to transfer the case to CB comes after multiple similar incidents were reported across state.

116kg ganja seized in major excise crackdown in Angamaly

Kochi: In a major crackdown on [drug trafficking](#), the Angamaly excise range on Sunday seized 116.370kg of the contraband and arrested four men who allegedly smuggled it in from [Odisha](#).

The accused have been identified as Balbhadra Dharua (30), Lakshman Patra (39), Taraswer Patra (36) and Pradeep Ghadei (27), all natives of Odisha allegedly involved in transporting the narcotic across state borders.

Excise officials apprehended the four near Karukutty railway station, recovering 58 large bundles of ganja packed into 11 backpacks.

Excise deputy commissioner (Ernakulam) P K Sathish said the seized contraband carries a black-market value of Rs 1.16 crore. "We received confidential information that huge quantities of ganja destined for Angamaly were arriving these past few days. Surveillance and investigation were underway in the area when these four youths were found with the drugs," he said.

Officers said the ganja originated in Rayagada, Odisha, and that those arrested were carriers hired to transport it for a commission of Rs 30,000 each. A detailed investigation is underway to trace the broader supply chain and identify the local networks linked to the syndicate.

According to officers, ganja sells locally in Ernakulam at Rs 500 per 5 grams, the basis for the Rs 1.16 crore valuation, even though it is procured in Odisha at just Rs 3,000 to Rs 5,000 per kg.

They said the arrested men are giving conflicting statements, and their call records are being examined to verify their claims. Excise has also received information on suspected kingpins behind the operation, and a probe is underway.

"The ganja we seized was meant to be sold across various parts of the district. Going by a standard dose of 5 grams, this haul would have supplied over 23,000 doses. This operation has prevented exactly that," Sathish said.

The seizure was made under Operation Thunder, the excise department's ongoing anti-narcotics drive, which runs parallel to the state police's Operation Toofan.

In June, the Ernakulam division of the excise department seized 420.10 litres of Indian-made foreign liquor, 23.85 litres of beer, 128 litres of wash and 20 litres of rectified spirit as part of the operation.

The division also seized 17.35 kg of ganja, 12.56 grams of methamphetamine, 165.672 grams of MDMA, 72.597 grams of heroin and 23.39 grams of hashish oil, along with 143.78 kg of illegal tobacco products and 48 ganja plants. Officials noted that a single mature plant can yield up to 1 kg of ganja.

Tamil Nadu: Two arrested for smuggling 21 kg ganja in ambulance in Coimbatore

[Coimbatore](#) (Tamil Nadu) [India], July 13 (ANI): The [Coimbatore](#) Prohibition Enforcement Wing (PEW) has arrested two individuals for allegedly attempting to smuggle 21 kilograms of contraband (ganja) inside an ambulance to evade police checkpoints and security scrutiny, officials said on Monday. The accused have been identified as 28-year-old Manikandan, a resident of Peelamedu, and 28-year-old Veerachinna Maruthu, an ambulance driver hailing from Sivagangai. According to the police, the duo hatched a plan to use a medical vehicle for the illegal transport of narcotics, believing that an ambulance would not be stopped or suspected during rigorous security checks at state and district borders. Manikandan reportedly approached Maruthu with the proposal to transport the contraband to make a large profit through illegal sales. The investigation revealed that the two suspects travelled to Ichapuram in Andhra Pradesh, where they purchased 21 kg of contraband. They were transporting the consignment to [Coimbatore](#) in a Tata Winger ambulance when the PEW team, acting on specific intelligence, intercepted the vehicle. Both Manikandan and Maruthu were arrested on the Ukkadam to Vaalankulam flyover and produced before a local magistrate, who remanded them in judicial custody. Meanwhile, in a separate incident in Karur yesterday, a major fire broke out at a private bus body-building company in Karuppampalayam along the Karur-[Coimbatore](#) National Highway in Tamil Nadu, gutting three buses and causing extensive damage to construction materials, officials said. According to officials, the company is owned by Senthil Kumar. Firefighters rushed to the spot with three fire tenders and water tankers and launched firefighting operations. The blaze was brought under control after nearly three hours. Three buses parked inside the facility, along with various equipment and materials used for bus body construction, were gutted in the fire, officials said. (ANI)

Hyderabad Police Seize 41 Kg of Cannabis, Three Odisha Men Arrested

Telangana's anti-narcotics unit, the **EAGLE Force**, has seized more than **41 kilograms of cannabis** in Hyderabad and arrested three men from Odisha in connection with an interstate drug trafficking case. The contraband, valued at approximately **₹20.5 lakh**, was being transported to the city through a private passenger bus, officials said.

The seizure was made during a joint operation conducted on **July 11** by the **Rachakonda Narcotics Police Station** and the **Khammam Regional Narcotics Control Cell**. Acting on specific intelligence, officials intercepted an Odisha-registered **Baba Bholonath Travels** bus in the **Auto Nagar** area of Hyderabad and recovered **41.01 kg of cannabis** concealed inside the vehicle.

Along with the narcotics, police also seized the bus used for transportation and **four mobile phones** believed to be linked to the smuggling operation. Authorities said the accused were transporting the consignment from Odisha to Hyderabad in return for a commission.

The arrested individuals have been identified as **Laxman Kurami (22)**, a bus helper, **Komal Khil (32)**, the driver, and **Bubu Madakami (33)**, the conductor. All three are residents of Odisha. During interrogation, the suspects reportedly admitted that they were involved in transporting the cannabis for financial benefits.

Police said two other key individuals connected to the case remain absconding. One of them, identified as **Nubin**, is believed to be the main supplier based in Odisha, while another suspect was allegedly waiting in Hyderabad to receive the consignment. Efforts are underway to trace and arrest both men.

Officials noted that this is the **third major cannabis seizure involving private travel buses** in recent months. They recalled that on **May 21**, authorities had intercepted another bus travelling from **Malkangiri, Odisha, to Hyderabad**, seizing **21 kg of cannabis** and arresting four people.

In a separate development, the EAGLE Force, working with the **Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Raipur**, recently dismantled an interstate drug trafficking network following a **seven-day surveillance operation** along the **Chhattisgarh–Maharashtra border**. That operation led to the seizure of **385 kg of cannabis**, dealing a significant blow to organized narcotics trafficking. Officials have urged private bus operators to remain vigilant and prevent their vehicles from being used for illegal transportation activities.

Man held with 5.5kg ganja, weapons

Madurai: Police on Sunday arrested a 22-year-old man after seizing 5.5kg of ganja, along with weapons and a two-wheeler from him in a special operation.

Police said a special police team conducted a search in Kumar Nagar area under Melur police station limits in the morning based on a tip. During the operation, the suspect attempted to flee but was overpowered and detained. The accused was identified as Abinash, a resident of Chokkampatti. Besides 5.5kg of ganja, police recovered an electronic weighing machine, two knives, and a two-wheeler from his possession.

A case has been registered at Melur police station under provisions of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and the Arms Act. Further investigation is under way, but police have urged the public to share information related to such activities. Stringent action would continue against those involved in the sale and transport of narcotic substances and illegal weapons, they said.

TIRUCHY: Apart from carrying out activities through anti-drug clubs that were launched in November 2024 and delivering anti-drug use messages during morning assemblies, several government and aided schools in Tiruchy have taken the extra step to raise awareness on the ills of drug and alcohol use. बेंगलुरु में 60.86 करोड़ रुपये के ड्रग्स के साथ अंतरराष्ट्रीय तस्करी नेटवर्क का भंडाफोड़, पांच विदेशी नागरिक समेत आठ गिरफ्तार

बेंगलुरु पुलिस ने मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ बड़ी कार्रवाई करते हुए एक अंतरराष्ट्रीय ड्रग्स नेटवर्क का पर्दाफाश किया है। संयुक्त अभियान के दौरान पुलिस ने पांच विदेशी नागरिकों सहित कुल आठ आरोपितों को गिरफ्तार किया है। कार्रवाई में लगभग **60.86 करोड़ रुपये** मूल्य के विभिन्न मादक पदार्थ जब्त किए गए हैं। पुलिस का कहना है कि यह हाल के वर्षों में शहर में ड्रग्स तस्करी के खिलाफ सबसे बड़ी कार्रवाइयों में से एक है।

पुलिस अधिकारियों के अनुसार, यह अभियान **हेब्ल थाना, सेंट्रल क्राइम ब्रांच (CCB) की मादक पदार्थ रोधी शाखा** और **गिरिनगर थाना** की संयुक्त टीमों ने चलाया। आरोपितों के खिलाफ **एनडीपीएस अधिनियम** के तहत अलग-अलग मामले दर्ज किए गए हैं। प्रारंभिक जांच में सामने आया है कि गिरफ्तार किए गए लोगों का संबंध अंतरराष्ट्रीय स्तर पर सक्रिय ड्रग्स सप्लाय नेटवर्क से है, जो देश के विभिन्न हिस्सों में मादक पदार्थों की आपूर्ति करता था।

पहले अभियान में पुलिस ने एक वाहन और संदिग्ध ठिकानों पर छापेमारी कर **17.282 किलोग्राम एमडीएमए (MDMA)** बरामद किया। जब्त किए गए इस मादक पदार्थ की अनुमानित अंतरराष्ट्रीय बाजार कीमत **34.56 करोड़ रुपये** बताई गई है। पुलिस ने इस मामले में कई महत्वपूर्ण सुराग भी जुटाए हैं, जिनके आधार पर आगे की जांच जारी है।

इसके अलावा, सीसीबी की मादक पदार्थ रोधी शाखा ने अलग-अलग अभियानों में तीन विदेशी नागरिकों को गिरफ्तार किया, जिनमें **दो नाइजीरियाई** और **एक दक्षिण अफ्रीकी नागरिक** शामिल हैं। इनके कब्जे से **6.718 किलोग्राम एमडीएमए** और **20 ग्राम कोकेन** बरामद की गई, जिसकी अनुमानित कीमत **14.30 करोड़ रुपये** आंकी गई है। जांच के दौरान पुलिस को जानकारी मिली कि यह खेप **नई दिल्ली स्थित एक सप्लायर** के माध्यम से बेंगलुरु पहुंचाई गई थी।

तीसरे मामले में गिरिनगर थाना क्षेत्र से एक अन्य **नाइजीरियाई नागरिक** को गिरफ्तार किया गया। उसके पास से **पांच किलोग्राम एमडीएमए** और **एक हजार नशीली गोलियां** बरामद हुईं, जिनकी अनुमानित कीमत करीब **12 करोड़ रुपये** है। पुलिस के अनुसार, प्रारंभिक जांच में पता चला है कि यह मादक पदार्थ भी एक विदेशी नागरिक द्वारा नई दिल्ली से बेंगलुरु लाया गया था।

इस संयुक्त कार्रवाई में पुलिस ने कुल मिलाकर **करीब 29 किलोग्राम एमडीएमए, 20 ग्राम कोकेन और 1,000 नशीली गोलियां** जब्त की हैं। अधिकारियों का कहना है कि पूरे नेटवर्क की वित्तीय गतिविधियों, विदेशी संपर्कों और सप्लाय चैन की गहन जांच की जा रही है। पुलिस यह भी पता लगाने में जुटी है कि इस गिरोह के तार देश के अन्य राज्यों और अंतरराष्ट्रीय तस्करी नेटवर्क से किस स्तर तक जुड़े हुए हैं।

बेंगलुरु पुलिस ने स्पष्ट किया है कि शहर में मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी और अवैध कारोबार के खिलाफ अभियान लगातार जारी रहेगा। अधिकारियों ने कहा कि युवाओं को नशे की गिरफ्त से बचाने और संगठित अपराध पर लगाम लगाने के लिए ऐसी कार्रवाई आगे भी जारी रहेगी।

Mumbai Police arrest two more in Rs 50.74 crore MD drug case, total accused rises to six

The Mumbai Police's Anti-Narcotics Cell (ANC) has arrested two more accused in connection with a major [MD \(Mephedrone\) drug case](#) involving narcotics worth Rs 50.74 crore, officials said on Saturday.

With the latest arrests, the total number of people taken into custody in the case has increased to six.

During the operation, police seized 210 kg of liquid 2-Bromo-4-Methylpropionophenone, a regulated precursor chemical commonly used in the illegal manufacture of MD drugs. Officials said the recovery is expected to provide further leads into the larger drug trafficking network under investigation.

Two accused arrested in intelligence-based operation

According to police, the case has been registered as C.R. No. 54/2026 under Sections 8(c), 22(c) and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985, and is linked to Agripada Police Station C.R. No. 253/2026.

The two arrested men, aged 32 and 27, are residents of the Pydhuni area in south Mumbai.

Police said they were arrested at around 4.30 am on July 11 during an intelligence-based operation conducted by the ANC's Kandivali Unit.

Officials said the operation was launched after receiving specific information on July 10 that a consignment of liquid MD or its precursor chemical was likely to be supplied in the Wadi Bunder area.

Acting on the information, [officers laid a trap and intercepted](#) the two suspects, recovering 210 kg of liquid 2-Bromo-4-Methylpropionophenone from their possession.

Investigation focuses on organised drug syndicate

Police said the latest seizure is linked to an earlier operation in which the ANC recovered 14 kg of MD and liquid MD collectively valued at more than Rs 50.74 crore.

Investigators suspect that an organised drug syndicate is operating in Mumbai, with possible links extending to other states.

Officials are examining the supply chain, financial transactions and the network involved in procuring precursor chemicals and manufacturing and distributing narcotic substances.

Further investigation is underway to identify other members of the syndicate and determine the full extent of the operation.

Earlier operation led to heroin seizure in Goregaon

In a separate operation on June 27, the [Mumbai Police's Anti-Narcotics Cell](#) seized 750 grams of heroin worth approximately Rs 3.75 crore in Goregaon.

One accused, identified as Subhan Imran Gada, was arrested during that raid.

According to police, the Kandivali Unit had acted on specific intelligence about a suspected drug supplier operating in the Goregaon area.

During the operation, officers recovered the heroin from the accused and arrested him. Investigators are examining the source of the seized narcotics and whether the case has links to an interstate or international drug trafficking network.

The accused was later produced before a court, which remanded him to police custody for further investigation.

Crime branch seizes 55 kg ganja, arrests two

Nagpur: The Crime Branch Anti-Narcotics Squad arrested two persons and seized 55 kg ganja from Dahibazar near Dalal Chowk area under Shanti Nagar police station limits on Sunday.

Acting on suspicion during patrolling around 5.10 pm, the team raided a closed tin shed in front of one Sheikh Wasim's house. They detained Sheikh Javed Sheikh Munna Rain (35), and Mohammad Harun Rashid Pinjari (39).

Police recovered 55 kg ganja packed in plastic bags, three mobile phones, weighing scales, Rs1.35 lakh cash and an unregistered moped valued at Rs 16.50 lakh from their possession. The duo revealed that their accomplice Vicky (35) from Odisha supplied the contraband for sale.

A case under the NDPS Act has been registered at Shanti Nagar police station. Both accused have been arrested.

Punjab police arrest 476, recover drugs, stolen items worth lakhs

The police seized 247.6 gm of heroin, 3 kg of ganja, 1.4 kg of opium, 100 kg of poppy husk, and 380 banned tablets/capsules. Cash worth Rs 13,250 linked to the drug trade was also recovered, they said.

Punjab Police arrested 476 people in Khanna during Operation Prahar 3.0, seizing drugs, arms, stolen vehicles and illicit liquor in a major crackdown.

Punjab Police's Operation Prahar 3.0 against criminals, narco syndicates and gangsters involved in the illicit trade has yielded significant results in Khanna with the arrest of 476 persons in 24 hours.

As per official updates, police authorities arrested 326 under substantive cases and 111 under preventive cases, while 10 other proclaimed offenders and four gangsters were also arrested in the ongoing operations. Officials reported the recovery of contraband and stolen items from the possession of the criminals booked until 4 pm on Saturday.

The police seized 247.6 gm of heroin, 3 kg of ganja, 1.4 kg of opium, 100 kg of poppy husk, and 380 banned tablets/capsules. Cash worth Rs 13,250 linked to the drug trade was also recovered, they said.

Police also recovered five stolen two-wheelers, one stolen four-wheeler, eight stolen trucks, four stolen mobiles, and one silver chain.

Excise teams seized 153 litres of liquor along with 160 empty bottles of high-end brands used for filling local spurious liquor. Gambling money amounting to Rs 6,320 was also confiscated in joint action, they said.

Additionally, in the arms and ammunition category, the police recovered two .32 bore pistols, four cartridges, and three datars/knives.

Officials said a local gang involved in procuring empty bottles of premium liquor brands and filling them with low-quality liquor was also busted and dismantled during the joint operation. Senior Superintendent of Police, Khanna range, Dr Darpan Ahluwalia, said a campaign against online content and social media handles promoting and glorifying violence and arms has been forwarded to the State Cyber Crime Cell for immediate blocking and removal.

The ongoing Operation Prahar 3.0 continues to focus on maintaining law and order, curbing the drug menace and targeting organised criminal activities in the region.

No Prescribed Format For Providing Written Grounds Of Arrest: Delhi High Court Upholds NDPS Accused's Custody

The Delhi High Court on Monday passed a john doe order directing take down and removal of various URLs on Facebook unauthorizedly hosting content of Zee.

Justice Anup Jairam Bhambhani passed the ex parte ad interim order in a suit filed by Zee Entertainment Enterprises Limited against various Facebook profiles uploading and hosting its content without any authorisation.

It was Zee's case that its content was being hosted and uploaded by users illegally and without prior approval, for monetary gains.

While the Court directed Meta to take down the infringing URLs, it however refused to pass an order directing blocking of the Facebook accounts without hearing the parties.

Justice Bhambhani said that such an order can be passed at a later stage after the parties file reply to the suit.

The Court issued summons in the suit and asked the parties to file written submissions.

Police bust Delhi-Tricity cocaine racket; nab Nigerian national

Panchkula: The anti-narcotics cell of Panchkula Police busted a Delhi-to-Tricity cocaine supply network, arresting a Nigerian national who allegedly ran the racket under the cover of a clothing and footwear business.

The breakthrough came during the investigation of a case registered under the NDPS Act at Chandi Mandir Police Station. Police said the accused had been supplying cocaine for nearly five years while operating a business front in Delhi.

DCP, Crime and Traffic Amrinder Singh said that on June 17, 2026, the anti-narcotics cell received a tip-off that Anchit alias Chintu, a resident of Peer Muchalla, would deliver cocaine near Herbal Park

in Sector 26.

Acting on the information, a team led by Inspector Saurav Rawat laid a trap and arrested Anchit along with his XUV-500 vehicle. A search of the vehicle led to the recovery of 87 cocaine pellets weighing 43 grams.

During interrogation, Anchit revealed that he had procured the cocaine from a Nigerian national in Vikas Puri,

Delhi, on the instructions of Ajay, another resident of Peer Muchalla. Police subsequently arrested Ajay and, based on further investigation, apprehended Aja Ogbonna, a Nigerian national residing in Tilak Nagar, Delhi.

Police commissioner Pankaj Nain said the investigation established that Ogbonna had been involved in cocaine trafficking since arriving in India on a business visa in 2018. He allegedly used his clothing and footwear business as a cover to avoid suspicion while supplying cocaine to customers.

The accused was produced in court and has been sent to judicial custody.

BSF, Punjab Police Seize 11 Kg Heroin Dropped by Drone Near Indo-Pak Border

Joint search operation in Tarn Taran foils major cross-border smuggling bid; case registered against unidentified traffickers under NDPS Act

Border Security Force (BSF) and Punjab Police jointly recovered 11 kilograms of heroin from a field near the India-Pakistan border. Preliminary investigations indicate that the consignment was smuggled into India using a drone from Pakistan and hidden in an agricultural field for later retrieval.

Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Surinder Lamba said the operation was launched following specific intelligence received by Sub-Inspector Vipin Kumar, Station House Officer of Valtaha Police Station. The input suggested that local smugglers were in contact with Pakistan-based handlers through WhatsApp calls and had arranged for a large heroin consignment to be delivered via drone.

Acting on the intelligence, BSF personnel and the Valtaha Police carried out a joint search operation in the border area. During the search, officials recovered a plastic bag and several loose packets concealed in the field of farmer Jaswinder Singh, a resident of Lakhna village.

Upon examination, the recovered packets were found to contain 11 kilograms of heroin.

SSP Lamba described the seizure as a significant success for security agencies in their ongoing crackdown on cross-border narcotics smuggling. He said a case has been registered against unidentified traffickers under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act at Valtaha Police Station, and further investigation is underway to identify those involved and trace the entire smuggling network.

Woman among two drug peddlers held with heroin in Samba, Rajouri

इंदौर पुलिस ने एमडी ड्रग्स तस्करी मामले में आगर मालवा निवासी दानिश कुरैशी समेत तीन आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया। कुल 47.78 ग्राम एमडी ड्रग्स और कार जब्त हुई। बरामद ड्रग्स की कीमत 15.70 लाख रुपये आंकी गई। राजस्थान कनेक्शन की जांच जारी है।

इंदौर पुलिस मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी पर लगातार शिकंजा कस रही है। इसी कड़ी में पुलिस ने पहले गिरफ्तार किए गए आरोपियों से पूछताछ के आधार पर आगर मालवा निवासी दानिश कुरैशी को लाखों रुपये की एमडी ड्रग्स के साथ गिरफ्तार किया है।

कनाड़िया थाना प्रभारी सहर्ष यादव ने बताया कि सूचना के आधार पर पुलिस ने पहले साजिद कुरैशी निवासी इल्यास कॉलोनी और इसराइल पटेल निवासी न्यू हिना पैलेस कॉलोनी को गिरफ्तार किया था। इनके कब्जे से 5.60 ग्राम एमडी ड्रग्स और कार (MP 09 ZG 3434) बरामद की गई थी।

दोनों आरोपियों को न्यायालय में पेश कर पुलिस रिमांड पर लिया गया। पूछताछ में उन्होंने बताया कि यह मादक पदार्थ आगर मालवा निवासी दानिश कुरैशी से लाया गया था। इसके बाद पुलिस ने दानिश को गिरफ्तार कर उसके कब्जे से 42.18 ग्राम एमडी ड्रग्स बरामद की।

तीनों आरोपियों के पास से कुल 47.78 ग्राम एमडी ड्रग्स जब्त की गई है, जिसकी अनुमानित कीमत करीब 15 लाख 70 हजार रुपये बताई जा रही है। तीनों के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज किया गया है।

फिलहाल पुलिस आरोपियों से गहन पूछताछ कर रही है। शुरुआती जांच में राजस्थान के कुछ बड़े ड्रग तस्करों से इनके संबंध होने की आशंका जताई जा रही है। पुलिस का मानना है कि आरोपी राजस्थान से एमडी ड्रग्स लाकर इंदौर के स्थानीय तस्करों को सप्लाई करता था। अब यह पता लगाया जा रहा है कि ड्रग्स किससे खरीदी जाती थी और किन-किन लोगों तक इसकी सप्लाई की जाती थी। पुलिस का कहना है कि इस मामले में जल्द ही कुछ और आरोपियों की गिरफ्तारी हो सकती है।

Odisha govt draws fresh action plan against drug abuse; seeks funds from Centre

BHUBANESWAR: The state government has drawn a fresh action plan to curb drug abuse and sought Rs 4.62 crore funding from the Centre under the National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR).

The proposal has been submitted by the department of Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (SSEPD) to take up awareness drives at different levels, intensify community outreach activities, hold capacity-building programmes and improve treatment, rehabilitation and reintegration to curb substance abuse.

As per the plan for 2026-27, anti-drug awareness programmes will be organised at school and college levels while sensitisation drives will be held in gram panchayats. Good choices and anti-drug clubs will be constituted for students in at least 150 institutions and youth engagement programmes conducted in at least 30 universities and medical colleges.

The department has also planned essay, debate, painting and quiz competitions among students in different institutions, while district-level awareness rallies, marathons, walkathons and cycle rallies will be organised across the state.

The awareness activities will include distribution of posters, leaflets and handbooks; message against drug abuse through wall-paintings, audio-visual films and social media campaign. For community outreach and early intervention, anti-drug programmes will be held at block level in which community members will be sensitised against drug abuse.

In addition, awareness campaigns will be conducted in 300 gram panchayats while 1,500 Nisha Mukta Mitras will be mobilised across all 30 districts. State-level training programme for the stakeholders concerned will be organised while police and excise sensitisation workshops will be held in coordination with the Home and Excise departments, and the Narco Coordination Centre (NCORD).

Department officials said family counselling and relapse prevention camps will be organised across all blocks, while vocational rehabilitation support will also be given to at least 120 beneficiaries with the help of the Skill Development and Technical Education (SDTE) department.

Three held with brown sugar in Chatra

History-Sheeteer Arrested For Assaulting Driver Who Refused To Transport Ganja In Ganjam

Brahmapur: A history-sheeteer was arrested in Ganjam district on Sunday for allegedly confining and assaulting a driver who refused to transport ganja, police said.

The month-old incident came to light after a purported video of the assault surfaced on social media on Saturday, triggering public outrage.

The accused, identified as R. Sibaram alias R. Arup of Pratap Krushna Chandrapur in Brahmapur, was arrested after a case was registered at the Brahmapur Sadar police station.

According to the police, the victim, Prasant Das of Krupasindhupur village, alleged in his complaint that Sibaram had asked him to drive a vehicle for the illegal transportation of ganja. When he refused, the accused allegedly confined him in a room and assaulted him with a fibre rod.

ASP (Brahmapur) Alok Jena said the accused has at least three criminal cases registered against him. He said a case has been registered under various provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act.

Das, who belongs to the Dalit community, told the police that he delayed lodging the complaint as he feared for his life.

Police also seized a pen drive containing the purported video of the incident. Preliminary investigation revealed that the accused and the victim were known to each other.

The ASP said efforts are underway to identify and arrest other persons allegedly involved in the incident.

संस, आदित्यपुर। झारखंड के सरायकेला-खरसावां जिले के आदित्यपुर थाना क्षेत्र में पुलिस को नशा तस्करों के खिलाफ एक और बड़ी सफलता मिली है।

पुलिस ने गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर शनिवार रात आदित्यपुर मुस्लिम बस्ती में छापेमारी कर कुख्यात महिला ड्रग तस्कर डोली परवीन के 19 वर्षीय बेटे शाहबाज खान को गिरफ्तार कर लिया है। पूछताछ के बाद पुलिस ने आरोपी को जेल भेज दिया है।

बाहरी राज्यों से लाता था ब्राउन शुगर

पुलिस से मिली जानकारी के अनुसार, गिरफ्तार आरोपी शाहबाज खान आदित्यपुर थाना का नामजद आरोपी था। वह अवैध रूप से झारखंड के बाहर (अन्य राज्यों) से भारी मात्रा में ब्राउन शुगर की खेप लाकर आदित्यपुर, जमशेदपुर और आसपास के विभिन्न इलाकों में छोटे पैडलर्स को बेचने का धंधा कर रहा था।

शाहबाज का पुराना आपराधिक इतिहास रहा है और वह इससे पहले भी नशीले पदार्थों की तस्करी के कई मामलों में जेल जा चुका है। थाना प्रभारी के अनुसार, शाहबाज खान इस इलाके में ड्रग्स सप्लाय नेटवर्क का एक अहम हिस्सा था।

मुस्लिम बस्ती में पूर्व में हो चुका है खूनी गैंगवार

शाहबाज की गिरफ्तारी से इस अवैध धंधे की कमर टूटेगी। आदित्यपुर की मुस्लिम बस्ती लंबे समय से ब्राउन शुगर के अवैध कारोबार के लिए कुख्यात रही है।

इस धंधे के वर्चस्व को लेकर पूर्व में ब्राउन शुगर किंगपिन डोली परवीन और उसके पति मोहम्मद कादिम के गिरोहों के बीच कई दफे हिंसक गैंगवार हो चुका है।

इन झड़पों में कई लोगों की हत्या भी हो चुकी है। इसके बाद पुलिस ने कादिम समेत उसके गिरोह के कई मुख्य गुर्गों को जेल भेजा था, जिसके बाद से डोली परवीन का बेटा शाहबाज इस सिंडिकेट को आगे बढ़ा रहा था।

पुलिसिया कार्रवाई के आंकड़ों पर एक नजर:

कोल्हान क्षेत्र (विशेषकर जमशेदपुर और आदित्यपुर) को ड्रग्स मुक्त बनाने के लिए पुलिस का विशेष अभियान लगातार जारी है। पिछले दो महीनों (मई और जून) के भीतर जमशेदपुर और उससे सटे सरायकेला के सीमावर्ती इलाकों में पुलिसिया कार्रवाई के आंकड़े इस प्रकार हैं:

- कुल गिरफ्तार ड्रग तस्कर: 28 तस्कर (महिला तस्करों सहित)
- जब्त ब्राउन शुगर: लगभग 450 ग्राम (अनुमानित बाजार मूल्य ₹45 लाख से अधिक)
- जब्त नकद और वाहन: तस्करी की कमाई के ₹3.5 लाख नकद, 12 मोबाइल और 8 मोटरसाइकिलें।

पुलिस अधिकारियों का कहना है कि युवाओं को नशे के दलदल में धकेलने वाले इस सिंडिकेट के खिलाफ जीरो टॉलरेंस की नीति के तहत आगे भी लगातार छापेमारी जारी रहेगी।

नवगछिया : मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान के तहत परवत्ता थाना पुलिस ने बड़ी सफलता हासिल करते हुए करीब 100 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ दो आरोपितों को गिरफ्तार किया है। गिरफ्तार आरोपितों की पहचान कुणाल कुमार एवं पिपूष कुमार, दोनों निवासी रसलपुर, नवगछिया थाना क्षेत्र के रूप में हुई है। पुलिस ने दोनों के विरुद्ध एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत प्राथमिकी दर्ज कर आगे की कार्रवाई शुरू कर दी है।

पुलिस के अनुसार, गुप्त सूचना मिली थी कि दो युवक ब्राउन शुगर की खेप लेकर विक्रमशिला सेतु पहुंच पथ स्थित टेक्नो पेट्रोल पंप के रास्ते गुजरने वाले हैं। सूचना मिलते ही परवत्ता थाना पुलिस ने विशेष टीम का गठन कर टेक्नो पेट्रोल पंप के समीप वाहन एवं संदिग्ध व्यक्तियों की सघन जांच शुरू कर दी।

जांच के दौरान पेट्रोल पंप के पास खड़े दो संदिग्ध युवकों को रोककर पूछताछ की गई। दोनों के संतोषजनक जवाब नहीं देने पर पुलिस ने विधिवत तलाशी ली। तलाशी के क्रम में कुणाल कुमार के पास से 99.83 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर तथा 260 रुपये नकद बरामद किए गए। इसके बाद पुलिस ने दोनों आरोपितों को मौके से गिरफ्तार कर थाना ले आई।

पुलिस ने बरामद ब्राउन शुगर को जब्त कर लिया है। प्रारंभिक पूछताछ में यह पता लगाने का प्रयास किया जा रहा है कि मादक पदार्थ की यह खेप कहां से लाई गई थी और इसकी आपूर्ति किसे की जानी थी। साथ ही इस तस्करी नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की पहचान और गिरफ्तारी के लिए भी छापेमारी की जा रही है।

इस मामले में परवत्ता थाना में एनडीपीएस एक्ट की संबंधित धाराओं के तहत प्राथमिकी दर्ज की गई है। पुलिस दोनों आरोपितों को न्यायिक प्रक्रिया के तहत न्यायालय में प्रस्तुत करने की तैयारी कर रही है।

बाप-बेटे का ब्राउन शुगर सिंडिकेट बेनकाब, बेटा शराफत अंसारी गिरफ्तार, 19 पुड़िया बरामद

Jantara : जामताड़ा स्थित कर्माटांड थाना क्षेत्र में मादक पदार्थों के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान में पुलिस को रविवार को बड़ी सफलता मिली है। पुलिस ने बागबेर कलाझरिया के बीच शीतलपुर मैदान के समीप वाहन जांच अभियान के दौरान एक बाइक से 19 पुड़िया ब्राउन शुगर बरामद की है। इस मामले में पुलिस ने भिठरा निवासी शराफत अंसारी को गिरफ्तार कर लिया, जबकि उसका पिता मुर्तजा अंसारी फरार है।

जानकारी के अनुसार वाहन जांच के दौरान पुलिस ने बाइक संख्या JH-21P-3347 को रोककर उसकी डिक्की की तलाशी ली। तलाशी के दौरान 19 पुड़िया ब्राउन शुगर बरामद हुई। गिरफ्तारी के बाद पूछताछ में शराफत अंसारी ने चौकाने वाला खुलासा करते हुए बताया कि उसका पिता मुर्तजा अंसारी लंबे समय से ब्राउन शुगर के कारोबार में शामिल है।

उसने पुलिस को बताया कि उसे केवल नशीला पदार्थ लाने-ले जाने के लिए भेजा जाता था, कारोबार का पैसा और हिसाब-किताब उसके पिता ही संभालते थे। इस खुलासे से स्पष्ट हुआ कि दोनों बाप-बेटे मिलकर मादक पदार्थों के अवैध कारोबार में संलिप्त थे।

घटना की सूचना मिलते ही जामताड़ा एसडीपीओ वसीम रजा मौके पर पहुंचे और मामले की विस्तृत जानकारी ली। इसके बाद पुलिस ने मुर्तजा अंसारी के घर पर छापेमारी की, लेकिन वह पहले ही फरार हो चुका था। हालांकि पुलिस उसकी गिरफ्तारी के लिए लगातार छापेमारी कर रही है।

कर्माटांड थाना प्रभारी अलखनाथ चौबे ने बताया कि इस मामले में कर्माटांड थाना कांड संख्या 53/26 के तहत एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा 21(b) में प्राथमिकी दर्ज की गयी है। गिरफ्तार आरोपी शराफत अंसारी को न्यायालय में पेश करने के बाद जामताड़ा मंडल कारागार भेज दिया गया है।

गौरतलब है कि Lagatar.in ने कुछ दिन पहले ही प्रमुखता से खबर प्रकाशित कर कर्माटांड थाना क्षेत्र के भिठरा गांव सहित आसपास के इलाकों में ब्राउन शुगर के बढ़ते कारोबार को उजागर किया था। पुलिस की यह कार्रवाई उसी दिशा में एक बड़ी सफलता मानी जा रही है।

आबकारी विभाग को गुप्त सूचना मिली थी कि ब्राउन शुगर तस्करी के मामले में पहले से चर्चित महिला आशा पांडेय अपने घर में प्रतिबंधित नशीले पदार्थ रखे हुए है। सूचना के आधार पर उड़नदस्ता टीम ने उसके घर पर दबिश दी। छापेमारी के दौरान आरोपी ने इंजेक्शन छिपाने की कोशिश की, लेकिन महिला जवान की सतर्कता से उसे तुरंत पकड़ लिया गया।

28 नशीले इंजेक्शन बरामद

तलाशी में कुल 28 नशीले इंजेक्शन बरामद हुए। इनमें 19 REXOGESIC और 9 AVIL इंजेक्शन शामिल हैं। बरामद दवाओं के संबंध में आरोपी कोई वैध दस्तावेज या अनुमति प्रस्तुत नहीं कर सकी। इसके बाद आबकारी विभाग ने एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज कर उसे गिरफ्तार कर लिया।

पहले भी जा चुकी है जेल

आबकारी विभाग के अनुसार, आशा पांडेय पहले भी ब्राउन शुगर तस्करी के मामले में जेल जा चुकी है। वह लंबे समय से विभाग की निगरानी में थी। गुप्त सूचना मिलने के बाद की गई इस कार्रवाई को विभाग की बड़ी सफलता माना जा रहा है।

न्यायिक रिमांड पर भेजी गई

गिरफ्तारी के बाद आरोपी को न्यायालय में पेश किया गया, जहां से उसे न्यायिक रिमांड पर जेल भेज दिया गया। आबकारी विभाग ने कहा है कि जिले में नशे के अवैध कारोबार और मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ अभियान आगे भी इसी तरह लगातार जारी रहेगा।
