Myanmar's Drug Crisis Is Becoming India's National Security Challenge

Myanmar has rapidly emerged as the world's most active narcotics hub, filling the global supply vacuum with both [opium and synthetic drugs](#). For years, India's anti-narcotics strategy has largely focused on its western frontier, where heroin originating from Afghanistan dominated the security discourse. But a significant shift is underway. As Afghanistan's opium production has collapsed following the Taliban's ban, Myanmar has rapidly emerged as the world's most active narcotics nucleus.

For India, this is no longer a distant regional development. With a long, porous border and an increasingly sophisticated trafficking network operating through the [Northeast](#), Myanmar's growing drug economy is steadily evolving into a national security challenge that extends far beyond law enforcement.

Why Myanmar Has Become The World's New Drug Capital

Afghanistan remained the epicentre of illicit opium production, supplying a substantial share of the world's heroin. However, the Taliban's 2022 ban on poppy cultivation dramatically altered that equation, reducing Afghan opium production by nearly 93 per cent from its peak. While this was widely viewed as a major breakthrough in the global fight against narcotics, it did not reduce global demand. Instead, it created a lucrative supply gap – one that Myanmar has been quick to fill.

According to the Narcotics Control Bureau's (NCB) 2025 report, ***Myanmar's illicit opium cultivation expanded by more than 50 per cent between 2020 and 2024, with the area under cultivation reaching nearly 45,200 hectares.*** The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) estimates that the country produced close to [995 tonnes of opium in 2024](#), making it the single most important alternative source for global narcotics following Afghanistan's decline. Far from witnessing a contraction in the drug trade, the world is instead seeing its centre of gravity shift eastwards.

Yet opium tells only part of the story. Myanmar has also established itself as the world's largest producer of [methamphetamine](#), particularly within the notorious Golden Triangle that spans Myanmar, Laos and Thailand.

Unlike opium, which depends on seasonal cultivation and suitable terrain, methamphetamine can be manufactured year-round inside clandestine laboratories using precursor chemicals. The lower production costs, higher profit margins and relative ease of transportation have made synthetic drugs

an increasingly attractive [business](#) for organised crime syndicates operating across Southeast Asia.

Much of this expansion has been fuelled by Myanmar's prolonged political instability. Since the [military coup in 2021](#), large parts of the country have witnessed sustained conflict between the junta and various ethnic armed organisations. Weak governance, shrinking economic opportunities and limited state control have allowed illicit economies to flourish, with drug production becoming an important source of revenue in conflict-affected regions such as Shan and Kachin States.

For many communities struggling with poverty and instability, poppy cultivation has become one of the few viable means of livelihood, while armed groups and criminal networks continue to exploit the chaos to expand production and trafficking.

This changing structure has significant implications for India. The NCB notes that it would be “analytically imprudent” to interpret Afghanistan's declining production as a reduced threat. Instead, trafficking networks have adapted by diversifying both their routes and products.

As the Golden Triangle regains prominence, Myanmar has emerged not merely as another source of narcotics but as the principal driver of a new phase in regional drug trafficking – one that is increasingly centred on India's eastern frontier rather than its western border.

How India's Northeast Became The Frontline

Myanmar's growing drug economy would have remained a regional concern had it not shared a long and difficult border with India. [Stretching over 1,643 kilometres across Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur and Mizoram](#), the India-Myanmar border cuts through dense forests, rugged mountains and remote tribal settlements. Much of this terrain remains unfenced, making surveillance and enforcement an enormous challenge. For decades, traffickers have exploited these geographical realities, but the scale of the threat has expanded considerably in recent years.

Compounding the challenge was the erstwhile Free Movement Regime (FMR), introduced to facilitate the movement of communities with longstanding ethnic and familial ties across both sides of the border. While the arrangement served important social and cultural objectives, security agencies have repeatedly argued that criminal syndicates and insurgent groups took advantage of these relatively relaxed border norms to move narcotics, arms and contraband with greater ease. Combined with difficult terrain and limited state presence in several stretches, the border has increasingly become a preferred corridor for transnational criminal networks.

The consequences are now visible across India's northeastern states. The NCB notes that Manipur, Mizoram and Nagaland have transitioned from being peripheral transit points to active

staging grounds for the distribution of narcotics into the Indian hinterland.

Rather than merely passing through these states, trafficking networks have established storage facilities, logistical routes and local distribution channels, allowing narcotics to move deeper into the country with greater efficiency. This marks a significant evolution in the way drug syndicates operate along India's eastern frontier.

Among these states, ***Mizoram has emerged as one of the most vulnerable entry points because of its proximity to Myanmar's Chin State.*** A major trafficking corridor passes through Champhai before moving towards Aizawl and Silchar in Assam's Barak Valley. From there, consignments are transported through Meghalaya to Guwahati, which serves as an important distribution hub for shipments heading to different parts of mainland India.

Similar routes originating from Manipur continue to feed illegal drug markets across the region, spotlighting the increasingly organised nature of these trafficking networks.

The impact extends well beyond border security. Drug trafficking has become deeply intertwined with insurgency, organised crime and illegal [financial](#) networks operating across the Northeast.

Militant groups have long been accused of facilitating or taxing narcotics shipments to generate revenue, while trafficking syndicates exploit longstanding ethnic linkages, informal trade routes and weak governance in remote areas. This convergence of organised crime and armed violence has transformed the region into one of [India's most sensitive internal security theatres](#), where narcotics are no longer simply a policing issue but part of a broader geopolitical challenge.

The Routes Fueling India's Drug Pipeline

The trafficking of narcotics from Myanmar into India is neither random nor opportunistic. Over the years, criminal syndicates have developed well-established routes that exploit difficult terrain, porous borders and existing transport networks to move drugs deep into the country.

Investigations have also revealed a two-way supply chain, where precursor chemicals are smuggled from India into Myanmar, processed in clandestine laboratories and trafficked back as finished narcotics.

Meanwhile, trafficking syndicates continue to refine their methods, using women and children as couriers, concealing drugs in everyday objects such as toys, luggage and fake

medical casts, and exploiting commercial transport networks to evade detection.

The NCB also warns that while the eastern frontier has emerged as India's fastest-growing narcotics corridor, the western border remains vulnerable, with traffickers adapting to Afghanistan's declining opium production by shifting towards synthetic drugs and increasingly employing technologies such as drones for cross-border deliveries. Together, these developments point to a trafficking ecosystem that is becoming more diversified, technologically enabled and considerably harder to disrupt.

The Statistics

The scale of the challenge is perhaps best reflected in the seizure data. According to the NCB's 2025 report, ***India recorded an all-time high of more than 1.48 lakh cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act during the year.*** Enforcement agencies seized over 1,200 tonnes of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, ranging from traditional plant-based narcotics to synthetic drugs, pharmaceutical diversions and precursor chemicals.

The figures indicate not only the magnitude of trafficking but also the increasingly diverse nature of the illicit drug market confronting Indian authorities.

One of the most striking trends has been the sharp rise in Amphetamine-Type Stimulants (ATS), particularly methamphetamine. The NCB notes that ATS seizures increased by nearly 140 per cent between 2020 and 2025, culminating in a record 8.2 tonnes seized in 2024.

This surge closely mirrors Myanmar's expanding production capacity, reinforcing concerns that India's eastern frontier has become the principal gateway for synthetic drugs entering the country. Unlike heroin, which has historically dominated trafficking routes, ***methamphetamine has emerged as the drug of choice*** for organised crime networks because of its lower production costs, higher profitability and ease of concealment.

The Northeast accounts for a significant share of these seizures. [Mizoram alone recorded the seizure of 1,477 kilograms of ATS, representing around 42 per cent of the country's total ATS seizures.](#) Manipur also reported substantial recoveries, while Assam has witnessed a sustained increase in operations under its "War on Drugs" campaign, leading to the confiscation of narcotics worth thousands of crores over the past few years.

Several large consignments of heroin, yaba tablets and opium have also been intercepted across Tripura and Nagaland, underscoring how the entire northeastern corridor has become vulnerable to the expanding narcotics trade.

The challenge, however, is not confined to land borders. ***In November 2024, the Indian Coast Guard intercepted a Myanmar-flagged fishing vessel near the Andaman and Nicobar Islands carrying nearly 6,000 kilograms of methamphetamine valued at around ₹36,000 crore.*** The

seizure demonstrated that traffickers are increasingly exploring maritime routes to supplement traditional land corridors, thereby expanding the geographic scope of India's anti-narcotics operations.

Law enforcement agencies have also intensified efforts to dismantle domestic manufacturing infrastructure. During 2025, the NCB busted 30 clandestine laboratories involved in producing methamphetamine and mephedrone – a figure that exceeded the total number of laboratories dismantled over the previous three years combined.

According to NCB Director General Anurag Garg, the growing diversity of seizures – from synthetic narcotics and pharmaceutical drugs to precursor chemicals – reflects an evolving security challenge that demands a far more integrated enforcement strategy than ever before.

Traffickers Are Adapting Faster Than Enforcement

The challenge confronting India today is not merely the volume of narcotics entering the country, but the rapid evolution of the trafficking ecosystem itself. [Traditional smuggling routes are now being complemented by digital platforms, encrypted communication](#), innovative concealment techniques and sophisticated [financial](#) networks. Drug syndicates are becoming increasingly agile, making enforcement far more complex than intercepting consignments at the border.

One of the most significant shifts has been the growing use of encrypted messaging applications. According to the NCB, platforms such as have emerged as important channels for advertising, coordinating and distributing narcotics.

Unlike darknet marketplaces that require specialised knowledge to access, these applications are widely available on smartphones, enabling traffickers to reach larger customer bases while maintaining a degree of anonymity.

Public channels on Telegram, for instance, have reportedly been used to display product catalogues, pricing and delivery mechanisms, reducing the barriers to entry for both suppliers and buyers.

The methods employed to transport drugs have also become more sophisticated. Investigators in Assam have uncovered instances where traffickers used women and children as couriers, banking on the assumption that they would attract less scrutiny during security checks.

Calculators & Reference Tools

Narcotics have been concealed inside toys, luggage, fake medical casts and other everyday objects, making detection considerably more difficult. Such tactics reflect a deliberate attempt by organised crime networks to exploit humanitarian sensitivities and routine passenger movement across the region.

At the same time, traffickers are diversifying both their products and their logistics. The NCB has reported the growing prevalence of hydroponic cannabis, mephedrone and other synthetic drugs, alongside the increasing use of [cryptocurrencies](#) and darknet marketplaces to facilitate financial transactions. On the western frontier, ***drone technology has emerged as another preferred method for delivering narcotics across the India-Pakistan border***, illustrating how trafficking networks are increasingly leveraging modern technology to minimise risks while maximising profits.

Perhaps the most worrying trend is the emergence of domestic manufacturing capabilities. The dismantling of 30 clandestine methamphetamine and mephedrone laboratories in 2025 suggests that India is no longer merely a transit or destination country.

Criminal syndicates are attempting to establish production facilities within the country itself, supported by the smuggling of precursor chemicals and access to increasingly sophisticated manufacturing techniques. This blurs the distinction between external and internal threats, requiring law enforcement agencies to simultaneously strengthen border security, cyber surveillance, financial intelligence and domestic policing.

Beyond Narcotics, A Growing National Security Challenge

The implications of Myanmar's expanding drug [economy](#) extend far beyond public health or criminal law.

Increasingly, narcotics trafficking is intersecting with [insurgency](#), [organised crime](#), [arms smuggling](#), [money laundering](#) and [illegal migration](#), creating a complex security challenge along India's eastern frontier. Hence, what was once viewed primarily as a law enforcement issue is now acquiring the characteristics of a broader national security concern.

Several insurgent groups operating in India's Northeast have long been accused of exploiting cross-border smuggling networks to sustain their activities. Organisations such as the National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN), the United Liberation Front of Assam (ULFA) and other armed groups have reportedly used the same routes that facilitate narcotics trafficking to move personnel, weapons and illicit funds across the India-Myanmar border.

In many cases, drug trafficking serves not only as a source of revenue but also as a mechanism to strengthen transnational criminal alliances that thrive in regions with weak governance and difficult terrain.

Myanmar's prolonged political instability has further complicated the situation. Since the military coup in 2021, the junta has been locked in conflict with several ethnic armed organisations, leaving large swathes of territory beyond effective state control. These ungoverned spaces have become fertile ground for drug production, illegal mining, arms trafficking and cyber-enabled crimes. Criminal syndicates have capitalised on the vacuum, operating with greater freedom while expanding their regional networks. The result is an increasingly interconnected ecosystem where narcotics, weapons, financial crimes and insurgency reinforce one another.

The financial dimension of the problem is equally significant. Revenues generated through narcotics trafficking are often channelled through money laundering networks and increasingly routed via cryptocurrencies and informal financial systems, making them harder to trace. [These funds not only sustain organised criminal enterprises but can also finance activities that undermine regional stability.](#) This convergence of illicit [finance](#) and cross-border crime presents fresh challenges for intelligence agencies, [financial](#) regulators and law enforcement authorities alike.

Recognising these evolving risks, Indian agencies have [increasingly framed drug trafficking as a matter of national security](#) rather than simply crime control. The objective is no longer limited to intercepting narcotics shipments but also to dismantle the broader ecosystem that enables them – from clandestine laboratories and financial networks to cross-border logistics and organised criminal syndicates.

As Myanmar's internal conflict continues with no immediate resolution in sight, India's eastern frontier is likely to remain under sustained pressure, demanding a coordinated response that integrates border management, intelligence sharing, financial surveillance and regional diplomacy.

The Last Bit,

India has significantly strengthened its anti-narcotics framework over the past few years, with record seizures, the dismantling of clandestine laboratories and greater coordination among central and state agencies. The government's "whole-of-government" approach has brought together organisations such as the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), Assam Rifles, state police forces, the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI), Coast Guard and other enforcement agencies to target trafficking networks across land and maritime borders. Yet, the evolving nature of the threat suggests that enforcement alone will not be enough.

Securing the India-Myanmar border remains one of the most immediate priorities. The challenging terrain, long stretches of unfenced border and limited infrastructure continue to constrain surveillance despite increased deployment of security forces. While the government's decision to

review and tighten the Free Movement Regime reflects growing security concerns, effective border management will also require better technology, including drones, satellite surveillance, integrated check posts and real-time intelligence sharing among agencies operating in the region.

Equally important is closer regional cooperation. Drug trafficking is inherently transnational, and disrupting supply chains will require sustained engagement with Myanmar despite its ongoing political instability. Intelligence-sharing mechanisms, coordinated border operations and cooperation on precursor chemical monitoring will be essential to curb the flow of narcotics. At the same time, engaging with neighbouring countries affected by the Golden Triangle's drug economy could help build a broader regional response against organised crime networks operating across Southeast Asia.

Domestically, the focus must extend beyond seizures to dismantling the financial and technological infrastructure that sustains the drug trade. This includes tracking cryptocurrency transactions, strengthening cyber capabilities to monitor encrypted communication platforms, identifying money laundering channels and targeting the criminal syndicates that finance and coordinate trafficking operations.

Simultaneously, greater investment in de-addiction programmes, community awareness and rehabilitation will remain critical in reducing domestic demand, ensuring that the fight against narcotics is not confined to policing alone.

A U.S.-Mexico Impasse Will Test How Far the Trump Administration Will Go to Fight Drug Trade

After months of U.S.-Mexico tensions sparked by the Trump administration's threats to strike unilaterally at Mexican drug traffickers, the two governments are heading for a potentially more serious confrontation over President Claudia Sheinbaum's refusal to arrest Mexican officials charged in the United States with drug corruption.

U.S. Justice Department officials have yet to present a full picture of their evidence against 10 current and former Mexican officials, whose indictments were announced on April 29. They include the governor of Sinaloa state, Rubén Rocha Moya, an ally of the president and a prominent figure in her leftist political party.

But as the Trump administration steps up its efforts to target Mexican government figures who are accused of protecting the drug trade, Sheinbaum is taking a hard-line stand against extraditing Rocha and the others charged in a New York federal court, Mexican officials said.

"She is very clear about this," a senior Mexican official said of the U.S. request for Rocha's extradition. "She has decided no."

The impasse presents the Trump administration with a potentially critical test of its aims in Mexico, raising questions about how far it will go to challenge the corruption that has long sustained Mexico's trade in illegal drugs.

By elevating the importance of the drug issue and threatening harsh economic penalties if Sheinbaum did not join forces to combat it, the administration has pushed Mexico to dramatically escalate its fight against organized crime.

After years in which Sheinbaum's political mentor, former President Andrés Manuel López Obrador, withdrew from confrontation with the drug mafias, her security forces have worked with U.S. intelligence and law enforcement agencies to destroy clandestine drug labs, seize large caches of drugs, and kill or capture ranking crime bosses.

Sheinbaum also circumvented the two countries' extradition treaty to hand over at least 92 accused traffickers sought by the United States — voicing none of the concerns about U.S. evidence that she has cited in refusing to arrest the Sinaloa officials.

Still, U.S. officials acknowledge privately, the two countries' intensified counter-drug campaign has emphasized tactical strikes and short-term gains rather than a coherent, longer-term strategy to undermine organized crime groups, confront endemic corruption or strengthen Mexico's criminal justice system.

To many senior Trump administration officials, particularly in the Justice Department and the White House, attacking the high-level corruption that sustains the drug trade represents a crucial next step. They have argued it is a step that U.S. prosecutors should take aggressively if Mexico will not do so, according to U.S. officials who spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss internal deliberations.

Some diplomatic and intelligence officials, however, are wary of pushing Sheinbaum too hard, seeing her position as precarious. They fear that demanding she take on her own party's old guard might prompt her to pull back on Mexico's cooperation with U.S. drug enforcement and immigration policies, the officials said.

The U.S. policy debate also turns on a question that continues to obsess Mexico's political class nearly two years into her presidency: How much independence does Sheinbaum really have from her political patron López Obrador, who remains a [commanding figure within their National Regeneration Movement?](#)

After keeping largely silent on Mexico's changing relationship with Washington, López Obrador thrust himself back into the public debate on June 3 with a blistering attack on the New York indictments. U.S. officials were simply using drug corruption as a pretext, he claimed, to undermine Morena, as the leftist party he founded is known.

"To be clear," the former president wrote, "some U.S. officials are plotting to weaken Morena and strengthen the rightist opposition in Mexico with the idea of once again having a submissive, corrupt, mafioso and cruel government." Such a regime, he added, would be more amenable to Washington's "interventionist designs."

Sheinbaum did her best to respectfully downplay the significance of the former president's screed. But current and former Mexican officials noted that López Obrador's missive, while supportive of her, did nothing to dispel suspicions that he continues to pull strings in her administration.

To many analysts of Mexican politics, the source of Sheinbaum's unyielding response to the Rocha indictment seems plain: her fear that if some accused officials cooperate with the U.S. authorities in the Sinaloa case and possibly other investigations, the Trump administration could target other Morena leaders, including key allies of López Obrador.

"I think the message from Andrés Manuel was, 'Claudia, you have to stop this or they are going to destroy us,'" a Mexican security expert, Eduardo Guerrero, said in an interview. "But the longer she waits to turn Rocha over, the tougher the punishment from the United States is going to be."

Trump administration officials have done little to assuage such concerns.

Asked two weeks after the Sinaloa indictment about the administration's plans for dealing with Mexican corruption, the head of the Drug Enforcement Administration, Terrance C. Cole, told the Senate Appropriations Committee, "I can assure you this is just the start about what's to come in Mexico."

Turning Themselves In

When Rocha was elected in 2021 as governor of Sinaloa, a stronghold of Mexico's drug trade for almost a century, the former teachers' union organizer was known as a skilled political operator and a close friend of then-President López Obrador. But his campaign was assailed for what opposition parties and civic groups called the blatant role that criminal gangs played on Rocha's behalf — intimidating voters, stuffing ballot boxes, and kidnapping and threatening numerous opposition candidates.

Despite detailed complaints to Mexico's elections authorities, López Obrador and Sheinbaum strongly defended Rocha. Rocha insisted he had nothing to do with the mafias but suggested that it would be impossible to govern the state without somehow coordinating with them. "You have to find a way to do it," he said in a television interview during the campaign.

Questions about Rocha's links to the traffickers exploded again in July 2024, after a son of Joaquín Guzmán Loera, the imprisoned drug boss known as El Chapo, kidnapped his father's longtime partner in the Sinaloa cartel, Ismael Zambada García. The son, Joaquín Guzmán López, then flew Zambada across the U.S. border, delivering him to U.S. agents on an airstrip in New Mexico and surrendering himself.

In a statement released by his lawyer, Zambada said he was kidnapped outside Culiacán, the state capital, when he went to meet Rocha and a Sinaloa congressman, Héctor Cuén, who supposedly wanted the drug boss to mediate a dispute between them. Instead, Zambada claimed, he was betrayed by Guzmán while Cuén, whom he described as "a longtime friend," was murdered.

Rocha at the time denied any involvement in the episode, [saying he was traveling in Los Angeles](#). A spokesperson for the state government, from which Rocha has taken a leave of absence, said it would not comment on the accusations against him. Rocha could not be reached for comment.

Both Guzmán and his brother Ovidio, who was extradited to the United States in 2023, have since provided federal prosecutors with extensive accounts of their relationships with Mexican government figures, as has at least one of their former lieutenants, law enforcement officials said. Investigators in New York also obtained detailed ledgers of the gang's bribe payments, which were referenced extensively in the Rocha indictment.

After Zambada's kidnapping, three U.S. officials said López Obrador's government made repeated requests for information on what Zambada and the Chapitos, as Guzmán's sons are known, might have been telling U.S. investigators. But the prosecutors answered those queries only when they

finally laid out their case: “As he had promised, since he was elected governor, and in exchange for the Chapitos’ support in his election, Rocha Moya has allowed the Chapitos to operate with impunity in Sinaloa,” the indictment stated.

It also said Rocha had met personally with the Chapitos’ leaders and allowed them to name corrupt law enforcement officials to his government. Rocha’s aides took the traffickers’ bribes, allowed them to operate with impunity, arrested their rivals, freed them from jail when they were arrested themselves and warned them of law enforcement operations supported by the United States, the prosecutors said. Rocha has denied the allegations.

Barely a day after a federal court in New York unsealed the indictment of the 10 men, Sheinbaum dismissed that evidence as insufficient. She said the suspects could be investigated in Mexico but that she would not act without “overwhelming and irrefutable proof” of their guilt.

Such provisional arrest requests are often granted as a matter of course; by treaty, the country asking for extradition has 60 days to present more detailed evidence after the initial arrest is made. But Sheinbaum has argued that the indictment and various other Justice Department documents given to Mexico did not come close to justifying the U.S. request.

Some U.S. diplomats were initially skeptical of the New York prosecutors’ apparent reliance on imprisoned traffickers as primary witnesses in such a politically sensitive case, officials familiar with the matter said.

More recently, though, at least one of the accused Mexicans has changed that calculus. The former Sinaloa secretary of public safety, Gerardo Mérida, turned himself in to U.S. marshals at the Arizona border on May 11. Mérida — a retired army general accused of taking more than \$100,000 a month from the cartel while in office — pleaded not guilty in New York. But he later indicated to the prosecutors that he might be willing to cooperate with their investigation in return for leniency, one official familiar with the matter said. Mérida’s court-appointed attorney, Sarah Krissoff, did not respond to calls and emails asking for comment on his status.

A second suspect in the case, former Sinaloa finance secretary Enrique Díaz Vega, is also believed to have turned himself in to the U.S. authorities, but the Justice Department has not confirmed that. Nicholas Biase, a spokesperson for the U.S. attorney for the Southern District of New York, declined to comment on the status of either suspect, and Vega could not be reached for comment.

Months ago, current and former U.S. officials said, Sheinbaum’s powerful security chief, Omar García Harfuch, told American diplomats privately that the Mexican president was determined to take on the country’s corruption problem and would prove her bona fides by prosecuting officials of her own party. Since the Rocha indictment, however, she has taken a very different tone, accusing Washington of egregious meddling in Mexico’s affairs.

“An action of this magnitude has no precedent in the history of our bilateral relationship,” Sheinbaum said at a political rally in late May. “When they dictate from abroad who is guilty and who is not, that is no longer cooperation. We are talking about interference!”

Aides to Sheinbaum have begun to suggest that she could indeed scale back anti-narcotics cooperation if Washington pushes too hard on the Rocha case, two U.S. officials said.

Whether she has the wherewithal to follow through remains to be seen. But such threats have worked for Mexico in the past. When U.S. agents arrested Mexico’s former defense minister, Gen. Salvador Cienfuegos Zepeda, in Los Angeles in late 2020, former Attorney General William Barr abruptly dropped the case after López Obrador threatened to limit Mexico’s counter-drug cooperation.

Despite the American concession, López Obrador still seized on the arrest to shut down several joint counter-drug programs and push through a new national security law curtailing the work of U.S. agents in Mexico. With the Biden administration focused on preserving Mexico’s cooperation on immigration, López Obrador later abandoned the so-called Mérida Plan, the two countries’ 14-year campaign to jointly fight drug trafficking and strengthen the Mexican criminal justice system.

“But these guys are not Biden,” a former Mexican foreign minister, Jorge G. Castañeda, said of the Trump administration in an interview. While Sheinbaum’s predecessors could almost always rely on U.S. leaders to prioritize Mexico’s stability above other interests, he added, “Trump just doesn’t care.”

2024 cocaine bust in Spain leads all the way to Wall Street, Dubai

Investigation reveals a financial network used to allegedly launder money running all the way to the founders of a special-purpose acquisition company in California.

It was supposed to be a cargo of bananas from Latin America. What Spanish police found on the ship in the Mediterranean port of Algeciras instead were 13 tons of cocaine.

The drug bust in the fall of 2024 became the biggest in Spain's history at the time. The ensuing investigation has now revealed what authorities allege was a financial network used to launder money running all the way to the founders of a special-purpose acquisition company in Newport Beach, California, that raised \$200 million from investors just last year.

The case has all the ingredients of a movie: a drug kingpin, a corrupt senior police officer with millions in cash reportedly stashed in his walls, and links to Spanish royalty. Yet the allegations are also striking in how they link financiers with Wall Street connections, an Irish fintech trading crypto assets, luxury Dubai real estate and multiple offshore lenders.

Assam Police Launch Multi-District Raids Against Drugs, Theft, and Gambling

Guwahati: Assam police are hitting criminal networks hard. Officers executed raids across several districts, catching suspects involved in drug trafficking, fuel theft, gambling, and illegal storage.

In Katigorah, Cachar police seized 3,000 Yaba tablets. They arrested Hasan Ahmed, a local from Lahmali village, during a late-night operation on K.H. Road. Authorities value the haul at several lakh rupees. Police registered a case under the NDPS Act.

Tinsukia police uncovered a massive condensate theft racket. In a pre-dawn raid on Monday, July 13, officers discovered an illegal tap on an Oil India Limited pipeline. They seized 1,450 litres of stolen condensate stored in 25 plastic gallons and drums. Police arrested Dhanjit Chetia of Motapung village, while another suspect escaped. Investigators also found a hose pipe and a filtering setup. "Acting on credible intelligence, a joint team from Gelephukuri Outpost and Barekuri Police Station conducted an early morning raid and busted an illegal condensate theft operation involving unauthorised tapping of an OIL pipeline. One accused was apprehended, while others fled. A case has been registered, and further investigation is underway," Assam Police said in a statement.

Meanwhile, law enforcement cracked down on gambling in Nagarbera. Officers raided a site in Khameri, arresting Monowar Hussain, Golap Ali, Shahjahan Ali, and Amjad Ali. Police recovered Rs 34,840 in cash and five mobile phones. A case is now active against all four men.

In the Nagaon district, Rupahihat police raided a private home to stop illegal fuel hoarding. They seized 12 domestic LPG cylinders from the residence of Giasuddin in Koch Gaon. Police arrested the suspect. They are now tracing where the cylinders came from and if they were meant for commercial sale.

Aizwal: Authorities on Monday destroyed [narcotic drugs](#) worth Rs. 70.70 lakh that had been seized by Serchhip Police in seven cases registered during the 2025-26 financial year.

The drug disposal exercise was carried out at the Serchhip Police Station under the supervision of Serchhip District Drugs Disposal Committee Chairman Gavit Gogna after all mandatory legal procedures were completed, officials said.

The destroyed contraband included 220 grams of heroin and 89 grams of crystal methamphetamine.

Meanwhile, [Mizoram Police](#) said they have seized narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances worth more than Rs. 414.66 crore and arrested 312 people, including 57 foreign nationals, during the first six months of 2026.

According to police data, methamphetamine accounted for the largest seizure during the period. Authorities recovered 315.903 kg of the drug, valued at Rs. 252.72 crore, leading to the arrest of 62 individuals, including 16 foreign nationals.

Police also confiscated 34.923 kg of heroin worth Rs. 69.85 crore and arrested 211 people, among them 39 foreign nationals.

Other major recoveries included 20.628 kg of crystal meth valued at Rs. 61.88 crore, 22.286 kg of morphine worth Rs. 22.29 crore, 141.492 kg of opium valued at Rs. 7.07 crore, 60.681 kg of ganja worth Rs. 30.34 lakh, 214.4 kg of codeine valued at Rs. 25.22 lakh, and 30 kg of alprazolam worth Rs. 30 lakh.

The figures highlight the scale of anti-narcotics operations carried out across Mizoram this year, with law enforcement agencies continuing their crackdown on drug trafficking in the border state.

Cachar Police Seize 3,000 Yaba Tablets in Assam Drug Bust

Imphal: A coordination meeting on the development of [Kamjong district](#), one of India's last border districts along the [Myanmar frontier](#), was held on Monday at the Camp Office of the Deputy Commissioner at the 2nd Manipur Rifles Complex.

The meeting was chaired by Deputy Commissioner L.N. Kashung and attended by Additional Deputy Commissioner H.L. Jain, Sub-Divisional Officers (SDOs), and district-level officials.

Later in the day, Kashung also chaired a meeting of the District-Level Narcotics Coordination Centre (NCORD) Committee.

During the review, officials assessed the measures taken by different departments to curb drug trafficking and substance abuse in the district. The Deputy Commissioner called for stronger coordination among law enforcement agencies, security forces and line departments to intensify efforts against the illegal drug trade and eliminate the drug menace in Kamjong.

Manipuri Students Demand Drug Education in State Schools

Imphal: Hundreds of students marched to the Board of Secondary Education Manipur office on Monday. The Manipuri Students' Federation led the charge. They demand immediate changes to the state school curriculum. The group wants mandatory drug prevention education for students in Classes V through XII.

Protesters also targeted the State Council of Educational Research and Training office at Lamphelpat. They carried placards and shouted slogans against government inaction. The federation wants specialized textbooks and life skills training included, citing recommendations from the World Health Organization.

MSF president Hijam Roshan led the protest. He questioned the state's commitment to its youth. During his address, he asked, "Are you letting drugs destroy Manipur's future?"

The group claims they have asked for these changes for five years. They submitted a memorandum to the Chief Minister on June 28, 2021. A follow-up request followed on June 15 of this year. No action happened. The federation points to the Magnitude of Substance Use in India 2019 report to highlight the growing crisis.

The current enforcement of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act of 1985 has not stopped the flow. "Not a single day passes without drugs being smuggled into Manipur," Roshan told reporters. The federation plans to ramp up agitation if the state and central governments stay silent.

The MSF has run its “Let’s Give Up Dangerous Drugs” campaign since 2020. They have hosted seminars and rallies to reach schools and colleges. Now, the Bishnupur District Committee is pushing the Zonal Education Officer to move their formal proposal to the Directorate of Education. They want this included under the National Education Policy 2020 frameworks.

Police arrest 94, seize drugs in citywide anti-narcotics drive

Chennai: The city police registered at least 57 narcotics cases and arrested 94 people during a weeklong special anti-drug drive conducted across the city between July 5 and July 11.

A total of 80.272kg of ganja, one gram of methamphetamine, 19g of heroin, 1,068 narcotic pills, 20g of 'OG' ganja, five mobile phones, ₹15,500 in cash, one two-wheeler and one autorickshaw were also seized during the crackdown.

The anti-narcotics intelligence unit also monitored networks involved in the distribution of narcotics and synthetic drugs, gathered intelligence on traffickers and suppliers, and coordinated with local police stations to facilitate arrests and further investigation.

Malappuram man arrested with MDMA worth Rs 25 lakh

Kozhikode: A 33-year-old man was arrested with MDMA and hybrid cannabis worth over Rs 25 lakh in Kuttippuram, Malappuram, as part of Operation Toofan.

The accused, Abdul Mufasir of Koottayi in Tirur, was allegedly involved in a drug distribution network operating through highway routes in Kottakkal, Tirur, Kuttippuram and Valanchery. He was arrested following a joint operation by the Malappuram Dansaf team and Kuttippuram police.

Police seized 493.16 grams of MDMA, valued at around ₹25 lakh in the illicit market, and 8g of hybrid cannabis. The drugs were allegedly concealed inside a luxury car's spare tyre compartment, wrapped with a magnet and cello tape.

Police said Mufasir was earlier arrested in 2024 by Malappuram and Kalpakanchery police in connection with commercial-scale MDMA sales and had spent nearly two years in judicial custody. He was released on bail before allegedly resuming drug trafficking.

According to police, the luxury vehicle allegedly used to transport MDMA from Bengaluru to Kerala has also been seized. Police are investigating those who provided financial and other support to the accused.

Hyderabad Police crack interstate hash oil network, seven held

Hyderabad: The Hyderabad City Police busted two major interstate drug trafficking networks in two separate raids across the city, seizing 24.956 litre of hash oil worth Rs 3.12 crore.

A total of seven people, including five drug peddlers and two consumers, have been arrested.

In a press briefing on Monday, July 13, City Police Commissioner VC Sajjanar said that Hyderabad is being used as a major transit point for drug trafficking.

In the first case, Lasangi Yakobu alias Venkat, 29 and Yendrapalli Suri Babu, 32, from Andhra Pradesh, were arrested near Metro Pillar No A992 at Erragadda with 23.706 litre of hash oil worth Rs 296 crore.

The hash oil was allegedly transported from Odisha and Andhra Pradesh and brought to Hyderabad by train. The accused were trying to board a Bengaluru-bound bus to deliver the consignment when they were caught.

The operation was jointly carried out by the Jubilee Hills Zone Commissioner's Task Force and Borabanda police.

In the second case, three people: Bonangi Chinnayya Padal, 24, Padamatiniti Bharath Kumar, 23 and Mohammad Shoaib, 20 – were arrested with 1.250 litre of hash oil worth Rs 16 lakh. The hash oil was packed into 75 small containers of about 4 ml each. They were caught on Road No 10 in Jubilee Hills. Four mobile phones and a two-wheeler were also seized.

Two consumers, Bogam Kalyan Teja and Tudapalli Uday Kumar, were also apprehended. The drug was also sourced from Andhra and intended to be sold for around Rs 3,000/bottle in the city.

Police also identified an Odisha-based supplier, identified as Lobby, as the alleged main source of the narcotic. He is currently absconding.

Cases have been booked under the Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

Ganja seizures on trains triple in Trichy division

Trichy: Ganja smuggling through trains has surged in the Trichy railway division, keeping Railway Protection Force (RPF) personnel on high alert. The RPF seized 76kg of ganja from trains passing through the division in the first six months of 2026 — more than three times the quantity seized during the corresponding period last year.

Officials say smugglers are increasingly using rail networks, often in combination with road transport, to evade detection. The RPF seized 99.6kg of ganja and arrested two smugglers in the whole of 2025. In comparison, it has already seized 76kg and arrested two smugglers by the end of June this year, accounting for nearly 76% of last year's total haul.

According to RPF officials, smugglers typically employ carriers who travel as ordinary passengers while concealing the contraband in luggage racks, toilets or beneath berths. The carrier retrieves the package only if conditions are favourable for leaving the station undetected.

“Smugglers mingle with passengers in unreserved coaches, but the contraband is kept away from them. If inspections intensify, they simply abandon the ganja and leave the station without risking arrest,” a police source said.

Officials said most of the ganja entering Trichy originates in West Bengal, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh. The

Howrah–Trichy Superfast Express (12663), which passes through these regions, has emerged as one of the routes frequently misused for transporting the contraband. Seizures rose sharply between March and April this year. Trichy city police said smugglers have altered their modus operandi in response to increased surveillance. Instead of relying solely on trains, they now combine rail, public transport and private vehicles to move narcotics. “Smugglers avoid major transit points such as Chennai Central and instead route consignments through Chennai Egmore before moving them to Trichy. They also get off at intermediate stops instead of bus stands and prefer longer routes via Salem, Karur and Dharmapuri to evade police checks. Procurement from Andhra Pradesh has declined in recent months,” a senior police officer said.

Police said increased enforcement has reduced the circulation of ganja in the city, although the drug continues to fetch nearly three times its purchase price in the local market. Between July 4 and July 11, the Prohibition Enforcement Wing (PEW) and Trichy city police seized about 6kg of ganja in three separate cases.

Box

Ramji Nagar emerges as ganja peddling hotspot

Trichy: Ramji Nagar has emerged as a key hub for ganja trafficking in the city, with police linking a series of recent arrests to the locality.

Between June 16 and July 11, Trichy city police registered seven major cases involving ganja smuggling and peddling. Eight accused, all from Ramji Nagar, were arrested in these cases.

“Earlier, habitual offenders from Ramji Nagar were mainly involved in burglary. Now, many have shifted to ganja

smuggling. Most major cases involving bulk movement of ganja in Trichy have links to residents of the area. The Goondas Act has also been invoked against some of them,” a police officer said.

Police seized around 1.7kg of ganja from a house in Ramji Nagar on June 16. They said vacant plots near waterbodies, railway tracks, abandoned buildings and bridges across rivers have become preferred locations for peddling the drug.

To curb the menace, city police have stepped up surveillance and are conducting awareness programmes in the locality.

Three arrested for administering anesthesia drug to ganja consumers in Adilabad

Three persons were arrested in Adilabad for allegedly administering Mephentermine Sulphate, an anaesthetic drug, to ganja consumers. Police seized syringes, drug bottles, mobile phones and a scooter, while four other accused are absconding and efforts are on to trace them

Adilabad: Three persons were arrested for allegedly administering an anaesthetic drug meant for surgeries to ganja consumers here on Monday. Four more persons were absconding. Police seized 190 syringes, 50 bottles of the drug, two mobile phones and a scooter from the accused.

SP Akhil Mahajan, in a statement, said that Sindhe Jagannath, an RMP, Syed Kamaruddin, the owner of a medical shop, and Mushraff were apprehended for their involvement in injecting the drug, Mephentermine Sulphate, into consumers at a bus stand at night. Ramesh, Sameer, Irfan and Mukeed were still at large.

During interrogation, the three confessed to committing the crime to earn easy money. They admitted to purchasing the drug for Rs 390 per vial from medical stores and selling it to consumers for Rs 1,500 per vial. Selling the drug directly to the public and administering it is an offence. Stern action would be taken against those involved in the illegal sale of the drug, Akhil warned.

94.7 kg ganja worth Rs 47 lakh seized in Telangana; Odisha-to-Karnataka drug route busted, 3 held

Hyderabad: In a major blow to an interstate drug trafficking network, Telangana's EAGLE Force and Khammam Police intercepted a car carrying 94.775 kg of ganja worth Rs 47.39 lakh on the Greenfield Highway, arresting three alleged transporters.

Enroute to Mysuru

The consignment was allegedly being smuggled from Malkangiri district in Odisha to Mysuru in Karnataka, while the suspected supplier and receiver remain absconding.

The seizure was made during a coordinated operation on July 12 at Greenfield Highway Exit No. 6, where police intercepted a Tata Indica Vista (DL8CZ2449) based on specific inputs.

A thorough search of the vehicle led to the recovery of 40 packets of ganja weighing 94.775 kg. Police also seized two smartphones and a keypad mobile phone, which are expected to provide crucial leads into the interstate network.

Three transporters arrested

The arrested accused have been identified as Akula Ayyappa Reddy, Mogiliseti Devi and Pujari Chandrashekar Ambrish, who were allegedly transporting the contraband.

During preliminary interrogation, investigators found that the consignment had originated in Odisha and was bound for Karnataka.

Police identified the alleged supplier as Guru and the intended receiver as Manoj. Both are currently absconding, and efforts are underway to trace and apprehend them.

Interstate network under scanner

Police suspect the seized consignment is part of a larger interstate drug trafficking network operating across multiple states.

Officials said the mobile phones recovered during the operation are being examined to identify other members of the syndicate, financial transactions and transport routes.

The seizure has also provided investigators with fresh leads into the supply chain linking Odisha, Telangana and Karnataka.

Case registered

The accused, the seized ganja and the vehicle have been handed over to the VM Banjara Police Station under the Khammam Commissionerate.

A case has been registered under Crime No. 124/2026, and further investigation is in progress to dismantle the entire network behind the illegal trade.

EAGLE Force appeals for public support

Reaffirming its commitment to making Telangana drug-free, EAGLE Force urged citizens to remain vigilant and share information about drug-related activities with the police.

The agency also appealed to parents to monitor their children's activities and encourage them to stay away from narcotics.

Officials said the identity of informants would be kept strictly confidential and credible information leading to action would be suitably rewarded.

It was launched simultaneously across all 28 districts of Andhra Pradesh and will be carried out in ASR district from July 13 to August 20, 2026, covering all mandals and police station limits. The initiative aims to achieve zero ganja cultivation in the district. Addressing the press meet in Visakhapatnam, Ravi Krishna said illegal ganja cultivation poses a serious threat to society. He appealed to villagers, farmers, to support the police in preventing ganja cultivation.

NESCO Drug Death Case: Chargesheet Says 4,000 Ecstasy Pills Were Smuggled From Germany In Parcels Declared As Dresses

Mumbai, July 13, 2026: The investigation into the NESCO drug case has revealed that two consignments of MDMA (Ecstasy) pills allegedly arrived in India from Germany, concealed in parcels declared as dresses.

Drug Consignments Allegedly Smuggled

According to the chargesheet filed by the Vanrai Police last week before the Metropolitan Magistrate Court in Borivali, the parcels were allegedly dispatched by German national Laxmi Prasad Loknathan under the guise of shipping dresses, with "Sweetheart Midi Dress" mentioned on the bills.

The first parcel reached India on February 2 and was sent to an address in Ulhasnagar via Dubai. The police claimed that nearly 3,000 MDMA pills were concealed inside a dress.

A second parcel containing around 1,000 pills allegedly arrived in March 2026 through Delhi before reaching Mumbai. Police said a total of 4,000 Ecstasy pills were smuggled through the two consignments, both transported by an American courier company.

The parcels were allegedly received by Dipesh Hemwani in Ulhasnagar and later handed over to accused Ayush Sahitya.

Advocate Surendra Landge and Azad Gupta, who previously represented Patel, said they would go through claims in the chargesheet.

Wanted Accused Visited Mumbai

The chargesheet further states that wanted accused Loknathan visited Mumbai and stayed at a five-star hotel from April 1 to April 3. His hotel expenses were allegedly paid by accused Mahesh Khemlani.

The police have also alleged that the organisers had obtained permission for a gathering of only 300 to 400 people but allowed more than 4,000 people to enter the concert venue.

During the investigation, the police recorded eyewitness Shital Salavi's statement before the Metropolitan Magistrate Court in Andheri under the relevant provisions of law.

- The two accused were apprehended in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh, and Jodhpur, Rajasthan, under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985.
- This operation is part of a broader investigation that began in February 2026, following the seizure of 8.17 kilograms of Mephedrone from a passenger bus.

The **Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN)** has dismantled a sophisticated **Mephedrone (MD)** manufacturing laboratory in **Pune, Maharashtra**, and arrested two alleged masterminds of an interstate synthetic drug trafficking syndicate during **Operation Vajra**. The operation was carried out by the Preventive Branch of the Office of the Deputy Narcotics Commissioner, **CBN Neemuch**, following specific intelligence inputs. The investigation and coordinated raids were conducted between **1 and 10 July 2026**, spanning multiple states.

The two accused were arrested from **Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh**, and **Jodhpur, Rajasthan**, under the provisions of the **Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985**. During the searches, CBN officers uncovered a high-tech clandestine laboratory in Pune equipped with advanced machinery, laboratory instruments, heavy glassware, precursor chemicals and safety equipment allegedly used for the manufacture of synthetic drugs.

Investigation traced network across several states

The latest breakthrough is part of an investigation that began in **February 2026**, when CBN officials intercepted a passenger bus at **Mandsaur** and seized **8.17 kilograms of Mephedrone**. Subsequent searches led investigators to an illegal drug manufacturing unit at **Thavlay, Mhow**, where officers seized **43.82 kilograms of Mephedrone**, **261.32 kilograms of precursor chemicals**, and advanced manufacturing equipment.

As the investigation expanded, officers tracked the alleged mastermind, who had reportedly been moving across multiple states while using forged identity documents to evade arrest. After an extensive undercover operation, CBN, with assistance from the **Ujjain Police**, arrested the suspect in

Ujjain during the night of **3 July 2026**. Further investigation revealed that the syndicate had established another sophisticated manufacturing facility at **Diggi, Bhosri, Pune**, allegedly financed and coordinated by a co-conspirator based in Jodhpur.

Acting on this information, CBN teams conducted simultaneous late-night raids in **Pune and Jodhpur on 9 July 2026**, leading to the arrest of the second accused and the dismantling of the alleged laboratory.

CBN intensifies crackdown on synthetic drug networks

During the coordinated operation, officers seized digital machinery, laboratory equipment, precursor chemicals, glassware and safety gear, all of which have been taken into custody under the NDPS Act. Investigators are continuing to examine the network and identify any additional individuals connected to the alleged drug manufacturing operation.

The **Central Bureau of Narcotics**, headquartered in **Gwalior**, functions under the **Ministry of Finance** and is responsible for regulating the legal cultivation of opium poppy, overseeing trade in psychotropic substances and precursor chemicals, and enforcing narcotics laws to curb illegal drug trafficking.

According to the agency, CBN has registered **142 cases** and made **193 arrests** so far during the current calendar year, while also dismantling **four clandestine drug laboratories**. The bureau said the latest operation reflects its continued efforts to disrupt organised narcotics networks and support the national goal of building a **Drug-Free India (Nasha Mukh Bharat)**.

Two Held with 28 Grams of MD Drug in Nagpur

Nagpur: In a major crackdown on drug trafficking, Yashodhara Nagar Police arrested two alleged drug peddlers and seized 28 grams of mephedrone (MD) along with a mobile phone. A case has been registered against the accused under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, and further investigation is underway.

According to police, a patrol team was conducting night rounds near Ita Bhatti Chowk when officers noticed a man behaving suspiciously. On seeing the police, he allegedly attempted to conceal an object in his pocket and flee the spot. The police swiftly intercepted and detained him.

During the search, officers recovered approximately 28 grams of mephedrone (MD) and a mobile phone from the possession of Irfan Amjad Khan. During interrogation, he allegedly disclosed that he had procured the contraband with the help of Rehan Nayeem Syed, who was subsequently arrested.

Police have registered a case against both accused under the NDPS Act. Investigators are now probing the source of the seized narcotics and trying to identify the intended recipients and any larger drug trafficking network linked to the case.

Woman arrested in Ahmedabad for selling drugs hidden inside chocolate wrappers

Police seized mephedrone, ganja and cash worth over Rs 5 lakh as investigators uncovered a drug distribution racket

In a major **anti-narcotics operation**, Ahmedabad Police arrested a 28-year-old woman for allegedly selling drugs concealed inside chocolate wrappers in an attempt to avoid detection. The raid led to the **seizure of narcotics** and **cash collectively** valued at more than Rs 5 lakh.

The arrest was carried out during a joint operation by the **Ahmedabad City Police's Local Crime Branch (Zone 5)** and the Gomtipur Police Station surveillance team after receiving specific intelligence. Acting on the tip-off, officers raided a residence in the Vikram Mill ni Chali area of Gomtipur and arrested **Simaben Diwakar**.

According to police, the accused had packed **narcotics** inside **ordinary chocolate wrappers** to make them appear like regular confectionery and reduce the chances of detection during **transportation** and **sale**.

During the search, police recovered 127.95 grams of **mephedrone (MD)** worth approximately **Rs 3.84 lakh**, **132.42 grams of ganja** valued at **Rs 6,621**, and **Rs 1.13 lakh** in cash. The total value of the seized drugs and cash has been estimated at **Rs 5.03 lakh**.

Investigators said the woman has previously been booked under the Narcotic Drugs and **Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act**. A fresh case has now been registered at Gomtipur Police Station under the relevant provisions of the NDPS Act.

Police have also launched a manhunt for her husband, Suraj alias **Taklo Ramkishan Diwakar**, who **remains absconding**. Authorities said he has more than 35 criminal cases registered against him, including **offences** related to **assault, gambling**, prohibition violations and externment.

Investigators are probing whether the accused was part of a larger **narcotics distribution network** operating in Ahmedabad and are **examining possible** links to other drug suppliers and peddlers.

House , land seized under NDPS Act as part of anti-narcotics crackdown

Srinagar, July 13: Police in Sopore have attached immovable properties worth over Rs 1.23 crore belonging to an absconding alleged drug peddler under the provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act as part of the ongoing 100-Day Nasha Mukht Jammu & Kashmir Abhiyaan.

The attached assets include a double-storey residential house with a boundary wall and 1 kanal 10 marlas of land under Survey No. 365 Min, with a combined estimated value exceeding ₹1.23 crore.

Police identified the accused as Mohammad Ashraf Mir alias Ashu, son of Late Farooq Ahmad Mir, a resident of Jamia Qadeem, Sopore, presently residing at Krankshivan Colony, Nageen Bagh-B, Sopore.

According to police, the attachment was carried out in connection with FIR No. 23/2026 registered at Police Station Sopore. A financial investigation found that the properties were allegedly acquired through proceeds from illicit narcotics trafficking. The attachment proceedings were executed in the presence of independent witnesses in accordance with Section 68F of the NDPS Act.

Police said the accused is absconding in the case, and a Hue and Cry Notice and Look Out Notice have already been issued against him. He is also involved in multiple NDPS cases, indicating his continued alleged involvement in drug trafficking.

Officials said the action is aimed at dismantling the financial network supporting the narcotics trade by depriving offenders of assets allegedly acquired through proceeds of crime.

Reiterating its zero-tolerance policy against drug trafficking and substance abuse, police said stringent legal and financial action will continue against those involved in the narcotics trade.

4 drug peddlers arrested in Rajouri, Samba

JAMMU, July 13: Four alleged drug peddlers, including a woman, were arrested with heroin and ganja in separate operations carried out by police in Rajouri and Samba districts today, officials said.

In Samba district, police arrested one Mohammad Atif and his wife Salma Sheikh, both residents of Ward Number 17, Shanker Nagar, Udampur, after intercepting their Ertiga car (PB01F-0894) during a naka on the Rakh Barotian-Shiv Nagar link road near Shamshan Ghat in Vijaypur.

During the search, police recovered around 20 grams of heroin-like substance (chitta) from their possession and also seized the vehicle.

Accordingly, the duo was booked under the relevant sections of the NDPS Act registered at Police Station Vijaypur.

Meanwhile, in Rajouri district, police arrested two alleged drug peddlers in separate incidents.

At Thalka Naka in Nowshera, police apprehended one Avikash Chand of Ward Number 1, Poonch, after he tried to flee on noticing the naka, and recovered about 5 grams of heroin-like substance from his possession.

In another operation near Bhella Bridge in Rajouri town, police arrested one Mohammad Javid of Gakhrote, Peeri in Kotranka after he attempted to escape during routine patrolling.

Police recovered 87 grams of ganja-like substance from him and seized the contraband after completing legal formalities.

Separate cases under the NDPS Act have been registered at Police Stations Nowshera and Rajouri.

Police said further investigations are underway to trace the sources of the narcotics and identify the forward and backward linkages of all the arrested individuals.

Man gets 4-year RI for smuggling 700g charas

Mohali: A Special NDPS Court in Mohali has convicted a Himachal Pradesh resident for possessing 700 grams of charas and sentenced him to four years of rigorous imprisonment (RI). The court also imposed a fine of Rs 2,000, with an additional one-month RI in case of default.

The convict, Sunil Thakur, was arrested by the special task force (STF), Phase 4, Mohali, from Gharuan bus stand on Feb 21, 2019. The court directed that the period already spent by the accused in judicial custody be set off against the sentence.

According to the prosecution, the STF received specific information that Thakur was travelling by bus from Ludhiana to Gharuan carrying charas. Acting on the tip-off, an STF team laid a naka at Gharuan bus stand. At 4.30pm, the accused got off the bus and allegedly appeared nervous on spotting police personnel. After completing mandatory legal formalities and in the presence of a DSP, police searched his bag and recovered 700 grams of charas. Samples were drawn, sealed and the contraband was seized.

The prosecution said the samples were later sent to the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL), which confirmed that the recovered substance was charas.

During interrogation, Thakur allegedly told investigators that he had procured the contraband from Nishant Khanna of Kullu, Himachal Pradesh. Khanna was later arrested with 200 grams of charas and named in the case. However, proceedings against him were abated following his death during the trial.

During the trial, the defence questioned the prosecution's case, citing the absence of independent witnesses, delay in sending samples to the FSL and alleged procedural lapses under the NDPS Act.

Rejecting the arguments, the court held that the prosecution had established an unbroken chain of evidence. It observed that the absence of independent witnesses by itself did not make the recovery doubtful and noted that the samples remained properly sealed until they reached the FSL.

Relying on the forensic report and evidence on record, the court concluded that the prosecution had proved beyond reasonable doubt that 700 grams of charas had been recovered from the accused's possession and convicted him under Section 20 of the NDPS Act.

Himachal Pradesh high court on Monday ordered a Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) probe into allegations that police framed a US tourist and his associates in a narcotics case, mandating the inquiry into the petitioners' detention and the circumstances causing the tourist's serious injuries.

Jamyang Tsering, who is an acclaimed chef in New York, had moved the HC seeking quashing of the FIR under an NDPS case, against him and his two associates, in Bhuntar police station.

"The case diary maintained by the police does not provide any satisfactory explanation as to why the petitioners were kept on the spot from 6.50 pm till 1.30 am. The entry in the case diary also mentions that the e-sakshya app was not functioning, and recording was not carried out. The circumstances in which petitioner no.1 was injured are also not properly explained. Therefore, it is necessary that an independent investigation be carried out in the circumstances surrounding the injury to petitioner and the apprehension of the petitioners," ruled justice Rakesh Kainthla, on Monday while adding, "CBI is directed to investigate the present matter surrounding the apprehension of the petitioners and injury to petitioner."

Declining to quash the FIR, HC said, "...the FIR cannot be quashed at this stage on the ground that the allegations of the FIR are false. It was submitted that there were procedural violations, and the petitioners were kept on the spot for about 7 hours. Petitioner no.1 (Jamyang) was injured in the accident caused by a Tempo Traveller. These allegations require proof, but they cannot be used for quashing the FIR. Any procedural illegality committed by the police will not absolve the petitioners of their liability for the possession of the charas."

Advocate Nishant Sharma, appearing for petitioners, said, "Tsering after being detained had made first call to an IGP level officer and pointed out procedural lapses. The CBI will now be investigating how Tsering was injured but also the role of the police personnel and circumstances in which the 'charas was planted'."

According to the petition, Tsering, a renowned chef in New York, had arrived in India from the United States in late January 2026. On February 22, he was travelling to McLeodganj with two companions after exploring potential business opportunities in Manali and Kasol, when their vehicle was

intercepted by police. He was visiting India to set up a hotel.

The petitioners alleged that police officials demanded a bag containing ₹4 lakh in cash and after they refused to hand it over, forcibly entered the vehicle, planted 28 grams of charas in their belongings and illegally detained them. They further claimed they were subjected to intimidation for several hours without access to food, drinking water or washroom facilities.

The petition also alleged that during the incident Tsering was pushed onto the road by police personnel and was subsequently hit by a passing vehicle, suffering grievous injuries that required hospitalisation.

The police, however, maintained that 28 grams of charas and ₹4 lakh in cash were recovered from the vehicle in accordance with law in the presence of independent witnesses. They contended that Tsering was struck by a speeding tempo traveller while search proceedings were underway.

Woman drug peddler booked under PIT-NDPS Act in Samba

Habitual Drug Peddler Detained Under PIT-NDPS Act In Kathua

Jammu, July 13: Police have detained a habitual criminal under the PIT-NDPS Act in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district, officials said.

Sajid Hussain, a resident of Garha Kamad in the Hiranagar tehsil of the district, was detained after the execution of a warrant issued by the Jammu divisional commissioner, police said.

A habitual drug peddler, Hussain was allegedly involved in the possession and transportation of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, they said.

He was named in two cases under the NDPS Act at Rajbagh and Hiranagar police stations.

Based on his records, police prepared a dossier recommending his detention under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT-NDPS) Act, and forwarded it to the divisional commissioner (DC).

The act is a preventive detention law used to detain habitual or organised drug traffickers to stop them from committing future crimes.

Following the DC's approval, a team from the Hiranagar police station detained Hussain, and lodged him in the district jail in Bhaderwah. (Agencies)

Court denies bail to alleged drug supplier

JAMMU, July 13: The Special Judge (NDPS Cases), Jammu, has rejected the bail application of Showkat Ali Shah, an alleged supplier in a case involving the recovery of 2.570 kilograms of charas.

Special Judge Parvaiz Iqbal passed the order in the case titled NCB versus Shahjahan Haroon and Others, registered under Sections 8, 20 and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act.

According to the Narcotics Control Bureau, the contraband was recovered on October 26, 2024, from Shahjahan Mohammad Haroon Siddiqui and Sakila Samad Shaikh while they were travelling in a passenger taxi on National Highway-44 near the Forest Protection Force headquarters in Jammu.

The NCB alleged that the seized charas had been supplied by Showkat Ali Shah and was meant to be delivered to another accused in Mumbai. The agency claimed that call-detail records, WhatsApp chats and calls connected the applicant with the co-accused and the alleged interstate drug-trafficking network.

The prosecution further alleged that more than 100 WhatsApp messages had been exchanged between the applicant and the co-accused during the relevant period.

Seeking bail, the applicant argued that no contraband, mobile phone or SIM card had been recovered from his possession. He contended that he had been implicated mainly on the basis of statements allegedly made by the co-accused under Section 67 of the NDPS Act.

Special Public Prosecutor Ajay Singh Manhas opposed the plea, arguing that the recovery involved commercial quantity and that the stringent conditions prescribed under Section 37 of the NDPS Act had not been satisfied.

The court observed that the prosecution case was not based solely on the statements of the co-accused, as call records, WhatsApp communications and other circumstances had also been relied upon to establish the applicant's alleged role.

It held that an accused allegedly operating behind the scenes as a supplier or conspirator cannot claim bail merely because no narcotic substance was recovered from his personal possession.

The court further observed that a conspirator or abettor under Section 29 of the NDPS Act stands on the same footing as the person from whose conscious possession the contraband is recovered.

Noting that the applicant was also facing trial in another NCB case involving the alleged supply of 1.330 kg of charas, the court said the circumstance was relevant while assessing the possibility of reoffending.

Finding that the applicant had failed to satisfy the twin conditions under Section 37 of the NDPS Act, the court dismissed the bail application as devoid of merit.

IndiGo official held with heroin in Leh

An aircraft maintenance engineer of a private airline was arrested by the Anti-Narcotics Task Force in Leh on Monday after recovering heroin from his possession, officials said.

The person has been identified as Ajay Thakur, 22, a resident of Himachal Pradesh's Mandi district. According to NDTV, he was working for IndiGo.

The incident has triggered a wider investigation into the suspected nexus between airport personnel and drug syndicates operating in the region, PTI quoted officials as saying.

During routine patrolling duty, a team of the Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) intercepted Thakur, while he was travelling in a private car. The officials later seized 2.27 grams of heroin from his possession.

Subsequently, an FIR was registered against the accused under relevant sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act at the ANTF police station.

Officials said that the matter follows a series of successful ANTF operations in recent weeks exposing the growing interstate network of drug traffickers attempting to target the youth of Ladakh.

"The investigation is now focused on establishing the source of the contraband and identifying the possible links between airport employees, interstate suppliers and local drug peddlers. The investigating agencies are examining whether the accused was acting independently or as part of a larger network involved in facilitating the movement and distribution of narcotic substances in Ladakh," PTI quoted an official as saying.

Since the beginning of 2026, law enforcement agencies in the Union Territory have registered 33 NDPS cases and arrested 27 accused persons. They have seized a wide range of narcotic and psychotropic substances.

As per the official data, enforcement agencies have seized 3.523 kg of charas, 4.9 kg of ganja, 40.39 gm of heroin, 1.709 kg of brown sugar, 289 mg of cocaine, along with other narcotic substances during various operations conducted across the Union Territory.

6.4 kg hydroponic weed found in aircraft lavatories; 3 held

New Delhi: Customs officers at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport have arrested three passengers in separate smuggling cases after seizing 6.37 kg of suspected hydroponic weed concealed inside aircraft lavatories, beneath passenger seats and in baggage, officials said on Monday. Hydroponic weed is a high-potency variety of cannabis grown in nutrient-rich water instead of soil.

The three seizures, involving passengers arriving from Bangkok and Phuket, resulted in the recovery of 6.37 kg of the suspected contraband, separate official statements said. In the first case, an Indian passenger arriving from Bangkok on Monday was intercepted on the basis of advance passenger information system (APIS) profiling after crossing the Green Channel, a statement said. While nothing suspicious was found in the passenger's baggage, Customs officers rummaged through the aircraft and found four sealed packets of suspected hydroponic weed weighing 3.47 kg, concealed inside both the rear lavatories, it said. "On being questioned, the passenger admitted to concealing the packets inside the lavatories," the statement said. In another case, a passenger arriving from Phuket on Monday was intercepted on the basis of APIS profiling. When no contraband was found in the passenger's baggage, Customs officers searched the aircraft and found six sealed packets containing suspected hydroponic weed weighing 1.5 kg beneath the seats in Row 12, a statement said. The passenger later admitted to hiding the packets inside the aircraft, it said.

Delhi Police bust interstate drug syndicate, seize 765.6 kg ganja worth Rs 2.30 crore

New Delhi, July 13 (IANS) In a major crackdown on interstate narcotics trafficking, the Delhi Police have seized 765.6 kg of ganja with an estimated market value of around Rs 2.30 crore and arrested four members of an interstate drug trafficking network, officials said on Monday.

According to officials, the accused were tracked continuously for more than 36 hours across multiple states, including Bihar, Odisha, Jharkhand, Delhi, Haryana and Punjab, before police teams successfully apprehended them during a coordinated operation.

The operation was carried out as part of the Government's 'Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyan' and the ongoing campaign against narcotics trafficking. Officials said the Anti-Narcotics Squad of Delhi's Outer District had developed specific intelligence regarding the movement of drug traffickers and maintained close surveillance in the area before launching the operation.

Police said that on June 20, the Anti-Narcotics Squad of the Outer District received a specific secret input regarding the movement of narcotics. Acting swiftly on the information, Inspector Virender Sindhu, under the close supervision of the ACP (Operations), constituted a dedicated raiding team to identify and apprehend those involved.

Acting on the intelligence, the raiding team conducted an operation near Madhuban Chowk in Pitampura, where one accused, identified as Ashok Kumar, a 40-year-old resident of Shakurpur in Delhi, was intercepted while carrying two bags.

An FSL team was called to the spot, and a search of the bags allegedly led to the recovery of 22.610 kg of ganja.

Following the recovery, a case under Section 20(C) of the NDPS Act was registered at Rani Bagh Police Station. Ashok Kumar was arrested, and the seized ganja was taken into custody as case property.

During sustained interrogation, investigators found that Ashok Kumar had allegedly been involved in transporting a much larger consignment of 285 kg of ganja in a truck.

Police said he had earlier been arrested in a separate case registered under Sections 20(C)/25 of the NDPS Act at Farrukh Nagar Police Station in Haryana's Gurugram district, where 285 kg of ganja had also been recovered.

Further questioning revealed that a man known as Ajeet Singh had allegedly been supplying ganja from Odisha. Through financial investigation and technical surveillance, investigators identified the suspect as Inderjeet Ray, a resident of Patna in Bihar, who was allegedly using the alias 'Ajeet Singh' while dealing with members of the drug trafficking network.

Officials said police teams began tracking Inderjeet Ray from July 9 and monitored his movements continuously for more than 36 hours. Multiple teams followed him from Bihar through several states using sustained technical surveillance before eventually apprehending him along with his associate, Nitish Kumar, from a hotel in Punjab's Ludhiana on July 10.

During subsequent interrogation, the accused allegedly disclosed that a large consignment of ganja had been transported and stored in a rented godown in Jamalpur, Ludhiana.

Acting immediately on the information, police conducted a raid at the premises and recovered 743 kg of ganja from the godown.

During the raid, another accused, Dharmender Kumar, a resident of Jamalpur in Ludhiana and an alleged associate of Inderjeet Ray, was also arrested in connection with the case.

फरीदाबाद पुलिस ने किये 417 आरोपी गिरफ्तार, 47 गुमशुदा मिले, 227 पीओ व जमानत तर्क अपराधियों पर की कार्रवाई

Faridabad/Alive News: फरीदाबाद पुलिस ने जिले में अपराध और असामाजिक गतिविधियों पर प्रभावी अंकुश लगाने के उद्देश्य से 10 से 12 जुलाई तक तीन दिवसीय विशेष अभियान चलाया। इस दौरान थाना पुलिस, अपराध शाखाओं और अन्य विशेष इकाइयों ने संयुक्त कार्रवाई करते हुए 417 आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया। साथ ही 47 गुमशुदा व्यक्तियों को तलाशकर उनके परिजनों से मिलवाया गया, जबकि 227 उद्घोषित (पीओ) और जमानत तर्क अपराधियों के विरुद्ध भी कार्रवाई की गई।

पुलिस प्रवक्ता के अनुसार, अभियान के दौरान मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी पर विशेष फोकस रखा गया। एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत दर्ज 9 मामलों में पुलिस ने 3 किलोग्राम से अधिक गांजा, 25 प्रतिबंधित इंजेक्शन और 1.3 ग्राम एमडीएमए बरामद करते हुए 9 नशा तस्करों को गिरफ्तार किया।

अवैध हथियार रखने वालों के खिलाफ भी सख्त कार्रवाई की गई। पुलिस ने 17 अवैध देशी कट्टे बरामद कर 17 आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया और उनके खिलाफ संबंधित धाराओं के तहत मुकदमे दर्ज किए।

आबकारी अधिनियम के तहत चलाए गए अभियान में 79 आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया गया। इस दौरान करीब 2000 बोतल देसी और अंग्रेजी शराब तथा 4 लीटर कच्ची शराब बरामद की गई।

जुआ अधिनियम के तहत दर्ज 54 मामलों में 64 आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया गया और उनके कब्जे से 1,47,590 रुपये नकद बरामद किए गए।

इसके अलावा सार्वजनिक स्थानों पर हुड़दंग, शांति भंग करने और आमजन के लिए परेशानी पैदा करने वाले 57 व्यक्तियों के खिलाफ भी कार्रवाई की गई।

कैबिनेट ने मुरादाबाद के सिरसखेड़ा में 97.15 एकड़ जमीन पर दो हजार बंदियों की क्षमता की नई जेल बनाने के लिए 386.91 करोड़ रुपये की स्वीकृति दी गई है। ललितपुर में 100 एकड़ जमीन में 552 बंदी क्षमता की नई जेल के निर्माण के लिए 225.06 करोड़ रुपये की स्वीकृति प्रदान की गई है। औरैया में 60.70 एकड़ जमीन पर 1056 बंदियों की क्षमता वाली नई जेल 264.96 करोड़ रुपये की स्वीकृति प्रदान की गई।

श्रीनगर, 13 जुलाई (आईएनएस)। जम्मू-कश्मीर की सांबा पुलिस ने ड्रग्स नेटवर्क के साथ अवैध मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी एवं कारोबार पर करारा प्रहार करते हुए 20 ग्राम हेरोइन जैसा नशीले पदार्थ रखने के आरोप में एक महिला समेत दो ड्रग तस्करों को गिरफ्तार किया है।

दरअसल, जम्मू-कश्मीर में 'नशा मुक्त अभियान' के तहत ड्रग तस्करी के खिलाफ अपनी लगातार चल रही मुहिम में सांबा पुलिस को एक और बड़ी कामयाबी मिली है। पुलिस ने विजयपुर पुलिस स्टेशन के इलाके में एक महिला समेत दो अन्य ड्रग तस्करों को गिरफ्तार किया और उनके पास से लगभग 20 ग्राम हेरोइन जैसा पदार्थ बरामद किया।

जब पुलिस अधिकारियों ने मौके पर छोड़े गए उस लावारिस काले बैग की गहनता से तलाशी ली, तो उसके भीतर से 21 ग्राम नशीली हेरोइन और 97,800 रुपये की संदिग्ध नकदी बरामद हुई। जांच के दौरान जिस मकान के ठीक सामने से वह संदिग्ध युवक भागा था, वहां मौजूद एक स्थानीय महिला ने उसकी पहचान अपने पति जान निवासी वीटा एनक्लेव के रूप में स्पष्ट तौर पर की है। इस पूरे मामले की पुष्टि होने के बाद एंटी नारकोटिक्स सेल की लिखित शिकायत पर फरार आरोपी के खिलाफ अंबाला के थाना बलदेव नगर में एनडीपीएस एक्ट की प्रासंगिक धारा 21/61 के तहत एक गंभीर आपराधिक केस दर्ज कर लिया गया है।

तस्करी से होने वाली कमाई के एक हिस्से को धार्मिक स्थल पर देने की बात भी जांच में सामने आई है। थाना प्रभारी विनोद कुमार ने बताया कि आरोपी से पूछताछ के आधार पर तस्करी में शामिल अन्य लोगों की पहचान कर उनके खिलाफ कार्रवाई की जाएगी।

नशा तस्करी नेटवर्क की पड़ताल में जुटी पुलिस

डीएसपी मुकेश कुमार ने बताया कि आरोपी के खिलाफ पहले भी जम्मू-कश्मीर में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज है। प्रारंभिक जांच में यह भी सामने आया है कि इस तस्करी में कैंटर का मालिक भी शामिल हो सकता है। पुलिस पूरे नेटवर्क की जांच कर रही है। पानीपत पुलिस ने नशा तस्करी पर अंकुश लगाने के लिए एंटी नारकोटिक्स सेल के साथ-साथ

थाना स्तर पर भी विशेष टीमों गठित कर रखी हैं, जो लगातार गुप्त सूचनाओं के आधार पर कार्रवाई कर रही हैं। इतनी बड़ी मात्रा में डोडा चूरापोस्त की बरामदगी नशे के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान की बड़ी सफलता है। पुलिस ने कैंटर, डोडा चूरापोस्त तथा अन्य सामान को कब्जे में लेकर थाना समालखा में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज किया है।

तिरपाल और माल के नीचे छिपाया था नशा

आरोपी को सोमवार को न्यायालय में पेश कर पुलिस रिमांड पर लिया गया। रिमांड के दौरान उससे गहन पूछताछ कर नशा तस्करी के पूरे नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य आरोपियों की पहचान कर गिरफ्तारी के प्रयास किए जाएंगे। पुलिस जांच में सामने आया कि आरोपी ने गिरफ्तारी से बचने के लिए कैंटर की बॉडी में सबसे नीचे 51 प्लास्टिक कट्टों में डोडा चूरापोस्त रखा था। इसके ऊपर कंडीशनर की 601 पेटियां लोड कर दी गई थीं, ताकि मादक पदार्थ पूरी तरह छिपा रहे और किसी को संदेह न हो। इसके बाद पूरी बॉडी को तिरपाल से ढक दिया गया था। हालांकि, सटीक सूचना के आधार पर पुलिस ने तलाशी लेकर पूरी खेप बरामद कर ली।

सोमवार को पत्रकार वार्ता में एसएसपी संजय कुमार वर्मा, एसपी देहात अक्षय संजय महाडीक ने बताया कि रविवार देर रात पुलिस ने चेकिंग में कार समेत चार सवारों को पकड़ा था। जांच के दौरान कार के अंदर से गांजा बरामद हुआ। आरोपित अंतरराज्यीय गांजा तस्कर गिरोह के सदस्य हैं।

पकड़े गए तस्करों ने अपने नाम मिथलेश निवासी चाकघाट, रीवा मध्य प्रदेश, रोहित उर्फ मुन्ना निवासी पकड़ी बाजार, सिवान, बिहार, संदीप निवासी रिविल गंज, छपरा, बिहार तथा युवती ममता यादव निवासी ग्राम जुटमिल, रायगढ़, छत्तीसगढ़ बताए।

एसएसपी ने बताया कि बरामद गांजा लगभग 10 लाख रुपये का है। इसे गाजियाबाद के साहिबाबाद के गांव झंडापुर निवासी वीरेश कुमार महतो उर्फ राजा को सप्लाई करना था। गाजियाबाद में वीरेश व उसका साथी महेश यादव उर्फ डीपी यादव निवासी लोनी, गाजियाबाद इसे बेचते हैं।

कार भी मुख्य तस्कर वीरेश महतो की है। बताया कि तस्कर महेश यादव छत्तीसगढ़ से गांजा खरीदकर उसे गाजियाबाद पहुंचाने की जिम्मेदारी इन लोगों को देता था। छत्तीसगढ़ से गाजियाबाद गांजा पहुंचाने के लिए हर खेप में आरोपितों को 36 हजार रुपये और युवती को छह हजार रुपये मिलते थे।

दिल्ली-यूपी तक फैला नेटवर्क

एसएसपी ने बताया कि गांजा तस्करी के साथ उसकी सप्लाई का नेटवर्क दिल्ली समेत यूपी से जुड़ा है। आरोपित गाजियाबाद समेत आसपास के जिलों में इसकी सप्लाई करते थे।

देखा जा रहा है कि गांजे की बड़ी खेप कहीं कांवड़ यात्रा को देखते हुए तो नहीं लाई गई थी? इसको लेकर टीम जांच में लगी है। साथ ही फरार मुख्य तस्करों की धरपकड़ के लिए एसओजी और पुलिस की टीम लगाई गई है।

सोनभद्र में सूखे नशे (अफीम, हेरोइन, स्मैक) से बर्बाद हो रही युवाओं को नई जिंदगी देने के लिए मेडिकल कॉलेज में ओएसटी (ओपिओइड सब्सीट्यूशन थिरेपी) सेंटर का शुभारंभ किया गया। यहां अफीम, हेरोइन, स्मैक के लती व्यक्तियों को उपचार-काउंसिलिंग की जाएगी। मरीजों को खोजकर सेंटर तक पहुंचाने में एनजीओ की टीमों सहयोग करेंगी। लगभग 300 मरीज चिह्नित भी कर लिए गए हैं। सामान्य रूप से भी तीन से चार नशे के लती रोजाना मेडिकल कॉलेज के मनोरोग चिकित्सा विभाग में पहुंच रहे हैं। प्राचार्य प्रो. आनंद कुमार ने फीता काटकर थिरेपी सेंटर का शुभारंभ किया। कहा कि यह पद्धति अफीम, हेरोइन या स्मैक जैसे नशे से पीड़ित व्यक्तियों के लिए एक सुरक्षित और वैज्ञानिक चिकित्सा है। इसमें खतरनाक और अवैध नशे की जगह डॉक्टर की देखरेख में सुरक्षित दवाएं (मेथाडोन या बुप्रेनोर्फिन) दी जाती हैं। यह दवाइयां नशे की तलब और होने वाली शारीरिक परेशानी को दूर करती हैं। हेरोइन के नशे के लिए लिए बार-बार इंजेक्शन लगाने से बनने वाली इंफेक्शन की भी स्थिति से यह थिरेपी बचाव करेगी। असिस्टेंट प्रोफेसर मनोरोग चिकित्सा डॉ. जितेश गुप्ता ने कहा कि इस कार्य में राष्ट्रीय एड्स नियंत्रण संगठन (एनएसीओ) और उत्तर प्रदेश राज्य एड्स नियंत्रण सोसाइटी (यूपीएसएसीएस) की टीम सहयोगी करेगी। नशे से जूझ रहे व्यक्तियों व उनके परिवारीजनों से अपील की कि वह बगैर झिझक के इस सुविधा का लाभ उठाएं। कहा कि नशा कोई अपराध नहीं, बल्कि एक उपचार योग्य बीमारी है। सेवानिवृत्त एसीएमओ डॉ. गणेश, डॉ. बीके श्रीवास्तव, असिस्टेंट प्रोफेसर डॉ. राहुल सिंह, डॉ. अश्वनी शाह, डॉ. अमित गुप्ता, डॉ. अमित पाठक आदि ने भी विचार रखे। कहा कि एचआईवी से बचाव में यह थिरेपी काफी कारगर है।

बाहरी फेरीवालों का पंजीकरण किया अनिवार्य

नशा मुक्ति, स्वच्छता और पेयजल संरक्षण का लिया निर्णय

धर्मपुर (मंडी)। नवगठित पंचायत जन्धरू कलां की पहली आम सभा में नशा मुक्ति, स्वच्छता और पेयजल संरक्षण को लेकर कई महत्वपूर्ण निर्णय लिए गए। उपप्रधान बनवीर सिंह की अध्यक्षता में आयोजित बैठक में पंचायत प्रतिनिधियों, वार्ड सदस्यों और बड़ी संख्या में ग्रामीणों ने भाग लिया।

निर्णय लिया गया कि विवाह और पुत्र जन्म के अवसर पर ट्रांसजेंडर समुदाय को दी जाने वाली पारंपरिक शगुन राशि अब बीपीएल सहित सभी परिवारों के लिए 1,100 रुपये निर्धारित की जाएगी। इसके अलावा सुरक्षा, सामाजिक सुधार और पर्यावरण संरक्षण से जुड़े कई प्रस्ताव सर्वसम्मति से पारित किए गए।

क्षेत्र की सुरक्षा व्यवस्था को मजबूत करने के उद्देश्य से पंचायत क्षेत्र में आने वाले बाहरी फेरीवालों और विक्रेताओं का पंजीकरण अनिवार्य कर दिया गया है। बिना पंजीकरण किसी भी बाहरी वेंडर को व्यापार करने की अनुमति नहीं दी जाएगी। युवाओं को नशे की प्रवृत्ति से दूर रखने के लिए निगरानी एवं जागरूकता समिति का गठन किया गया, जो संदिग्ध गतिविधियों पर नजर रखने के साथ-साथ लोगों को नशे के दुष्प्रभावों के प्रति जागरूक करेगी। स्वच्छता व्यवस्था को बेहतर बनाने के लिए सूखे कचरे के वैज्ञानिक निस्तारण की व्यवस्था सुनिश्चित करने और सार्वजनिक स्थानों पर कचरा फैलाने वालों पर रोक लगाने का निर्णय लिया गया। वहीं, पेयजल स्रोतों को प्रदूषण से बचाने के लिए ऐतिहासिक द्रुमन बावड़ी के आसपास वाहन धोने पर पूर्ण प्रतिबंध लगाने का फैसला किया गया। बैठक के अंत में प्रधानमंत्री आवास योजना के पारदर्शी क्रियान्वयन, पात्र लाभार्थियों के चयन और पंचायत के समग्र विकास कार्यों पर विस्तार से चर्चा की गई। इस दौरान ग्रामीणों से विकास कार्यों में सक्रिय भागीदारी निभाने की अपील भी की गई।

Krishnagar police arrest 23 in two days during mega crackdown on drugs, illicit liquor

The Krishnagar Police in West Bengal has arrested as many as 23 people and seized narcotic substances and a large quantity of illicit liquor within the first two days of a two-week special enforcement drive.

The special drive began on 11 July and continued across different areas under the Krishnagar Police District, with teams from the police stations, District Intelligence Branch (DIB), District Enforcement Branch (DEB) and Special Operations Group (SOG) carrying out intelligence-based raids and searches.

During the operations conducted on 11 and 12 July, police registered 20 specific cases, including 20 cases under the Excise Act and three cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. A total of 23 persons were arrested, including three accused allegedly involved in narcotics-related offences.

Police seized 410 bottles of illicit liquor along with 63.675 litres of illegally manufactured liquor during the drive. In addition, a quantity of narcotic substances was recovered, including 48 bottles of Codeine Phosphate-based cough syrup and 1.3 kg of ganja.

The Superintendent of Police of Krishnagar Police District Atul V said that the operation has been intensified to dismantle networks involved in the supply and distribution of narcotic drugs and illegal liquor. The drive is being conducted under the direct supervision of senior officers, with special focus on identifying areas vulnerable to such illegal activities.

“The crackdown will continue for the next two weeks with regular raids, surveillance and intelligence-based action to curb the circulation of narcotic substances and illicit liquor,” he said.

The police district has also urged residents to provide information regarding illegal drug and liquor activities, assuring that strict action would be taken against those involved in such trades.

Mother-son duo, juvenile held in brown sugar raid in Jamshedpur

Jamshedpur, July 13: In a major crackdown on narcotics, Jamshedpur Police arrested a woman, her son and a juvenile for allegedly running a brown sugar trafficking racket from a house in Indranagar under Sitaramdera police station area.

Police seized 38 packets of brown sugar weighing 4.32 grams and Rs 4,820 in suspected drug sale proceeds during the raid.

Addressing a press conference on Monday, City SP Lalit Meena said the action was carried out following a credible tip-off received on Sunday evening that Bharati Kaibarto was operating an illegal drug trade from her residence at Hume Pipe's Indranagar locality.

After verification of the input, a special raiding team was constituted under the leadership of Sitaramdera police station in-charge Anand Kumar Mishra.

During the operation, police apprehended Bharati Kaibarto (40), her 22-year-old son Vishal Kaibarto, and a juvenile from the house.

A search of the premises led to the recovery of 38 packets of brown sugar, weighing 4.32 grams, along with Rs 4,820 believed to be proceeds from the sale of narcotic substances.

The City SP revealed that Bharati Kaibarto is a known and habitual drug peddler with six cases under the NDPS Act already registered against her at Sitaramdera, Jugsalai and Sonari police stations.

Her son, Vishal Kaibarto, also has two previous NDPS cases against him, indicating their continued involvement in the illicit drug trade.

An FIR has been registered against the accused under relevant provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, while proceedings against the juvenile are being carried out in accordance with the Juvenile Justice Act.

Reiterating the police's zero-tolerance policy against narcotics, City SP Lalit Meena said the anti-drug campaign would continue with intensified operations across the city and warned that no individual involved in the illegal drug trade would be spared.

Koraput: In an innovative attempt to blend local culture with public awareness, Jeypore police launched a creative campaign under the Nasha Mukti Bharat Abhiyan, adapting the popular tribal folk song “Chhi Chhi Chhi Re Nani Chhi” to spread the message against drug abuse.

The awareness poster gives a fresh spin to the well-known folk refrain. It depicts two villagers urging a man to consume intoxicants, only to be met with a firm refusal. Echoing the song’s catchy line, the man responds, “Chhi Chhi Chhi Re Nani Chhi,” symbolically rejecting drugs and intoxicants. The poster also carries the slogan “Nisha Mukta Jeypore, Nisha Mukta Odisha, Nisha Mukta Bharat,” underscoring the vision of a drug-free society.

Police officials said the campaign was designed to communicate the anti-drug message in a simple yet impactful manner by drawing on a cultural reference that resonates deeply with rural and tribal communities.

SDPO (Jeypore) Archita Mittal said culturally rooted messaging often leaves a stronger and more lasting impression than conventional awareness campaigns. “People connect more easily with messages that are familiar to them. By drawing inspiration from a popular tribal folk song, we wanted to communicate the importance of saying ‘no’ to drugs in an engaging and relatable manner. We hope the creative encourages people, particularly the youth, to make informed choices and strengthens the message of the Nasha Mukti Bharat Abhiyan,” Mittal said.

The poster is part of a broader district-wide campaign against substance abuse. Over the past few weeks, Koraput police have organised more than a dozen awareness programmes in schools, colleges and villages, sensitising students and local communities about the harmful effects of drug addiction.

SP (Koraput) Rohit Verma said the anti-drug campaign in the district goes beyond enforcement and focuses equally on prevention through sustained community engagement. “The fight against drug abuse cannot be won through policing alone. It requires the collective involvement of parents, teachers, educational institutions, community leaders and citizens. Under the Nasha Mukti Bharat Abhiyan, Koraput police have been conducting awareness drives across educational institutions, villages and public spaces while simultaneously taking strict action against the illegal trade in narcotic substances. Our focus is on preventing addiction through awareness, encouraging early intervention and ensuring that young people choose a healthy and drug-free future,” Verma said.

जानकारी के अनुसार, 12 जुलाई की शाम एसएसबी को गुप्त सूचना मिली थी कि रेलवे ब्रिज के समीप दो व्यक्ति मादक पदार्थ की खरीद-बिक्री करने आने वाले हैं। सूचना के आधार पर एसएसबी एवं सुखानी थाना पुलिस की संयुक्त टीम गठित की गई। रविवार रात 10:30 बजे कादोगांव रेलवे ब्रिज के पास वाहन जांच अभियान शुरू किया गया। करीब 11:10 बजे हाईवे की ओर से तेज रफ्तार बाइक पर दो युवक आते दिखाई दिए। पुलिस टीम को देखकर दोनों भागने लगे, लेकिन जवानों ने घेराबंदी कर उन्हें दबोच लिया। पूछताछ में उनकी पहचान साजिद आलम (47) एवं तस्वर आलम (28) दोनों निवासी बहादुरगंज थाना क्षेत्र, जिला किशनगंज के रूप में हुई।

326 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर बरामद

तलाशी के दौरान आरोपितों के पास से एक प्लास्टिक के थैले में रखे तीन पैकेटों से 326 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर बरामद की गई। ड्रग डिटेक्शन किट से जांच में पदार्थ के मादक होने की पुष्टि हुई। तीनों पैकेटों का वजन क्रमशः 126 ग्राम, 101 ग्राम एवं 99 ग्राम पाया गया। इसके अलावा एक मोटरसाइकिल, दो मोबाइल फोन तथा 972 रुपये नकद भी बरामद किए गए।

मामले की जांच

इस मामले में सुखानी थाना कांड संख्या 40/26 दर्ज कर दोनों आरोपितों को एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा 21(सी)/29 के तहत गिरफ्तार कर न्यायिक प्रक्रिया के लिए भेज दिया गया। मामले की जांच जारी है।

इस दौरान पुलिस ने एक युवक को भारी मात्रा में ब्राउन शुगर के साथ गिरफ्तार किया है। आरोपी के पास से नशे की 50 पुड़िया जब्त की गई हैं, जिनका कुल वजन 2.48 ग्राम है।

गुप्त सूचना पर बनी स्पेशल टीम

पटमदा डीएसपी दयानंद कुमार ने प्रेस वार्ता में बताया कि 12 जुलाई को वरीय पुलिस अधीक्षक (SSP) को एक गुप्त सूचना मिली थी। सूचना के अनुसार, ओलीडीह थाना क्षेत्र के सुवर्णरेखा आवासीय शिविर मैदान में कुछ युवक अवैध मादक पदार्थों की खरीद-बिक्री के लिए जुटे हैं।

सूचना के सत्यापन और कार्रवाई के लिए पुलिस अधीक्षक (नगर) के निर्देश पर पटमदा डीएसपी दयानंद कुमार के नेतृत्व में एक विशेष छापेमारी दल का गठन किया गया।

सुवर्णरेखा मैदान में पुलिस की घेराबंदी

विशेष टीम ने सुवर्णरेखा आवासीय शिविर मैदान में अचानक छापेमारी की। पुलिस को देखकर भागने की कोशिश कर रहे सालबनी, बांधडीह निवासी आशीष विशोई को टीम ने घेराबंदी कर दबोच लिया। तलाशी के दौरान उसके पास से ब्राउन शुगर की 50 पुड़िया (वजन 2.48 ग्राम) बरामद हुई।

आदित्यपुर से जुड़ा है नशे का कनेक्शन

पुलिस की शुरुआती पूछताछ में आरोपी आशीष ने चौंकाने वाला खुलासा किया है। उसने स्वीकार किया कि वह ब्राउन शुगर की यह खेप सरायकेला-खरसावां जिले के आदित्यपुर से लेकर आया था और इसे ओलीडीह व मानगो के इलाकों में ऊंचे दामों पर बेचने की तैयारी में था।

ओलीडीह थाना में आरोपी के खिलाफ मामला दर्ज कर उसे न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया गया है। पुलिस अब यह पता लगाने में जुटी है कि आदित्यपुर में वह किस बड़े सप्लायर के संपर्क में था।

डीएसपी ने कहा कि जिले में युवाओं को नशे की गर्त में धकेलने वाले इस सिंडिकेट के खिलाफ ऑपरेशन प्रहार आगे भी सख्ती से जारी रहेगा।

एसटीएफ ने 929 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर के साथ दो तस्करो को किया गिरफ्तार

सिलीगुड़ी, 13 जुलाई (हि.स.)। नशा तस्करी के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान के तहत स्पेशल टास्क फोर्स (एसटीएफ) ने सोमवार सुबह बड़ी सफलता हासिल की है। फांसीदेवा के घोषपुकुर-बागडोगरा स्थित राष्ट्रीय राजमार्ग-27 पर एक संदिग्ध चारपहिया वाहन को रोककर तलाशी लेने पर 929 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर बरामद की गई।

इस मामले में दो कथित मादक पदार्थ तस्करो को गिरफ्तार किया गया है। गिरफ्तार आरोपितों की पहचान राजीब शेख और रशीदुल शेख के रूप में हुई है। दोनों मालदा जिले के निवासी बताए जा रहे हैं।

एसटीएफ के अनुसार, बरामद मादक पदार्थ को मालदा से सिलीगुड़ी ले जाया जा रहा था। जब्त ब्राउन शुगर की अंतरराष्ट्रीय बाजार में कीमत करोड़ों रुपये आंकी जा रही है। एसटीएफ आगे की कार्रवाई में जुट गई है।

नवादा में पुलिस को बड़ी कारेवाई, हत्या के प्रयास का आरोपी 31 पुड़िया ब्राउन शुगर के साथ गिरफ्तार

Nawada : जिले की नारदीगंज थाना पुलिस को नशा कारोबार के खिलाफ एक बड़ी सफलता हाथ लगी है। पुलिस ने हत्या के प्रयास मामले में नामजद एक शातिर आरोपी को धर-दबोचा है। गिरफ्तारी के वक्त जब पुलिस ने उसकी तलाशी ली, तो उसके पास से 31 पुड़िया ब्राउन शुगर बरामद की गई। बरामद नशीले पदार्थ को जब्त करते हुए पुलिस ने आरोपी के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस (NDPS) अधिनियम के तहत एक नया मामला दर्ज कर आगे की कानूनी कार्रवाई शुरू कर दी है।

गुप्त सूचना पर पड़रिया गांव में छापेमारी

यह पूरी कार्रवाई नवादा के पुलिस अधीक्षक (SP) अभिनव धीमान के दिशा-निर्देश पर की गई। एसपी के आदेश के बाद नारदीगंज थाना प्रभारी राजेश कुमार के नेतृत्व में एक विशेष पुलिस टीम का गठन किया गया था। पुलिस को गुप्त सूचना मिली थी कि आरोपी अपने गांव में मौजूद है। इसी सूचना के आधार पर टीम ने त्वरित कार्रवाई करते हुए पड़रिया गांव में छापेमारी की और नारदीगंज थाना कांड संख्या 255/26 के प्राथमिक अभियुक्त सुनील कुमार यादव (पिता- स्वर्गीय सुरेश प्रसाद) को गिरफ्तार कर लिया।

नशा तस्करी के नेटवर्क की खंगाली जा रही कुंडली

थाना प्रभारी राजेश कुमार ने बताया कि आरोपी सुनील कुमार यादव की गिरफ्तारी के बाद जब उसकी सघन तलाशी ली गई, तो उसके पास से भारी मात्रा में ब्राउन शुगर की पुड़िया मिलीं। पुलिस ने उसे तुरंत हिरासत में ले लिया और थाने लाकर कड़ाई से पूछताछ कर रही है। पुलिस का मुख्य उद्देश्य यह पता लगाना है कि वह इस नशीले पदार्थ की खरीद-बिक्री किस नेटवर्क के जरिए कर रहा था, इसे कहाँ से लाया जा रहा था और इस अवैध धंधे में उसके साथ और कौन-कौन लोग शामिल हैं।

दागी पंजी में दर्ज है आरोपी का नाम

पुलिस रिकॉर्ड के अनुसार, गिरफ्तार अभियुक्त सुनील कुमार यादव का पुराना आपराधिक इतिहास रहा है। वह पहले से ही हत्या के प्रयास सहित कई अन्य गंभीर आपराधिक मामलों में नामजद अभियुक्त है। उसकी आपराधिक गतिविधियों को देखते हुए उसके खिलाफ सीसीए-12 (CCA-12) के तहत प्रस्ताव भी जिला प्रशासन को भेजा जा चुका है और पुलिस की दागी पंजी (क्रिमिनल रिकॉर्ड रजिस्टर) में उसका नाम पहले से दर्ज है। अब पुलिस उसके पूरे आपराधिक सिंडिकेट को ध्वस्त करने में जुट गई है।

नशा तस्करो के खिलाफ अभियान रहेगा जारी

रांची, 13 जुलाई (हि.स.)। राजधानी रांची में मादक पदार्थों के अवैध कारोबार के खिलाफ पुलिस ने कार्रवाई करते हुए डोरंडा थाना क्षेत्र से चार तस्करों को गिरफ्तार किया है।

सिटी एसपी पारस राणा ने सोमवार को बताया कि छापेमारी के दौरान पुलिस ने उनके कब्जे से 159.03 ग्राम ब्राउन शुगर (1,444 पुड़िया), 58,100 रुपये नकद और तीन मोबाइल फोन बरामद किए हैं। पुलिस इस कार्रवाई को शहर में नशे के कारोबार के खिलाफ बड़ी सफलता मान रही है।

पुलिस को गुप्त सूचना मिली थी कि डोरंडा थाना क्षेत्र के धोबी मुहल्ला खटाल इलाके में बड़े पैमाने पर ब्राउन शुगर की खरीद-बिक्री की जा रही है। सूचना को गंभीरता से लेते हुए वरीय पुलिस अधीक्षक के निर्देश पर नगर पुलिस अधीक्षक की निगरानी में वरीय पुलिस उपाधीक्षक (हटिया) नीरज कुमार के नेतृत्व में एक विशेष छापेमारी टीम गठित की गई।

गठित टीम ने त्वरित कार्रवाई करते हुए कुसई जतरा मैदान और साकेत नगर, हिनू इलाके में एक साथ छापेमारी की। इस दौरान पुलिस ने चार आरोपितों को रंगे हाथ गिरफ्तार कर लिया।

गिरफ्तार आरोपितों की पहचान दीपक भुईयां, नरेश कुमार, महेश कुमार और संदीप कुमार दांगी के रूप में हुई है। पुलिस ने चारों आरोपितों के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट की विभिन्न धाराओं के तहत मामला दर्ज कर उन्हें न्यायिक हिरासत में जेल भेज दिया।

सीतामढ़ी ने सीमा सुरक्षा बल के साथ मिलकर गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर कुख्यात अपराधी फैजल मंसूरी उर्फ छोटे मंसूरी को धर दबोचा है।

संजय सिंह, पटना। भारत-नेपाल सीमा पर अवैध कारोबार करने वालों पर पुलिस और एसएसबी ने बड़ी कार्रवाई की है। सीतामढ़ी के बैरगनिया थाना पुलिस और एसएसबी की 51वीं बटालियन की संयुक्त टीम ने गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर छापेमारी कर इलाके के कुख्यात अपराधी फैजल मंसूरी उर्फ छोटे मंसूरी को धर दबोचा। गिरफ्तार बदमाश के पास से पुलिस ने 3 देसी बंदूक, 6 जिंदा कारतूस और 1 किलो से ज्यादा चरस बरामद किया है। साथ ही उसकी मोटरसाइकिल और मोबाइल भी जब्त कर लिया गया है।

मामले की जानकारी देते हुए सीतामढ़ी एसपी अमित रंजन ने बताया कि बैरगनिया थाना पुलिस और एसएसबी 51वीं बटालियन को सूचना मिली थी कि जमुआ घाट, लालबकैया नदी के किनारे हथियार और नशीले पदार्थ की तस्करी होने वाली है। सूचना मिलते ही दोनों टीमों ने संयुक्त रूप से घेराबंदी कर छापेमारी की। इसी दौरान पुलिस ने बैरगनिया थाना क्षेत्र के चकवा गांव निवासी फैजल मंसूरी उर्फ छोटे मंसूरी को रंगे हाथों गिरफ्तार कर लिया। तलाशी के दौरान उसके पास से भारी मात्रा में अवैध सामान बरामद हुआ।

4 थानों में दर्ज हैं 7 गंभीर मामले

पूछताछ में सामने आया कि गिरफ्तार फैजल मंसूरी का आपराधिक इतिहास काफी लंबा है। वह नेपाल बॉर्डर से सटे इलाकों में हथियार और शराब तस्करी का काम करता था। पुलिस रिकॉर्ड के अनुसार उस पर कुल 7 गंभीर मामले दर्ज हैं। ये मामले सीतामढ़ी के बैरगनिया और सुप्पी थाने के अलावा पूर्वी चंपारण के छतौनी और ढाका थाने में दर्ज हैं। उस पर हत्या के प्रयास, लूट, आर्म्स एक्ट और मद्य निषेध अधिनियम के तहत केस दर्ज हैं। 2022 से 2026 के बीच उस पर चोरी, डकैती, हथियार और शराब तस्करी के कई आरोप लगे हैं। बैरगनिया थानाध्यक्ष अरविंद कुमार गिरी ने बताया कि फैजल इलाके का कुख्यात अपराधी है। वह लंबे समय से पुलिस को चकमा दे रहा था।

नेपाल बॉर्डर से जुड़ा तार

पुलिस को आशंका है कि फैजल नेपाल के रास्ते हथियार और नशीले पदार्थों की तस्करी करता था। लालबकैया नदी का इस्तेमाल वह तस्करी के लिए करता था। एसपी अमित रंजन ने कहा कि सीमा क्षेत्र में अपराध पर अंकुश लगाने के लिए एसएसबी के साथ लगातार संयुक्त अभियान चलाए जा रहे हैं। इस गिरफ्तारी से हथियार और नशे की एक बड़ी खेप पकड़ी गई है।

सीमा पर बढ़ी सख्ती

एसबी और पुलिस के इस संयुक्त ऑपरेशन के बाद भारत-नेपाल सीमा पर सुरक्षा बढ़ा दी गई है। एसएसबी के जवान अब रात में भी गश्त कर रहे हैं। स्थानीय लोगों ने पुलिस-एसएसबी की इस कार्रवाई की सराहना की है। उनका कहना है कि फैजल जैसे अपराधियों की वजह से इलाके में दहशत थी।

फिलहाल पुलिस पूरे नेटवर्क को खंगालने में जुटी है ताकि हथियार और नशे की तस्करी की कमर तोड़ी जा सके। पुलिस ने गिरफ्तार आरोपी के खिलाफ आर्म्स एक्ट और नडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत नया केस दर्ज किया है। उससे पूछताछ की जा रही है। पुलिस ये भी पता लगाने में जुटी है कि वह हथियार और चरस किसे सप्लाई करने वाला था। उसके नेटवर्क में और कौन-कौन लोग शामिल है।

रूपौली, एक संवाददाता। नगर पंचायत रूपौली कार्यालय के समीप एसएच-65 पर वाहन जांच अभियान के दौरान पुलिस ने प्रतिबंधित कोडीनयुक्त कफ सीरप की 82 बोतलों के साथ दो युवकों को गिरफ्तार किया है। पुलिस ने सीरप की खेप ले जा रही एक बाइक भी जब्त कर ली है। पूछताछ के आधार पर कार्रवाई करते हुए एक महिला दुकानदार को भी गिरफ्तार किया गया है। जानकारी के अनुसार, कुरसेला थाना क्षेत्र के दो युवक बाइक से कोडीनयुक्त कफ सीरप की खेप लेकर गिद्धा गांव जा रहे थे। इसी दौरान वाहन जांच के क्रम में पुलिस ने उन्हें रोककर तलाशी ली। तलाशी के दौरान 100 एमएल की 82 बोतल प्रतिबंधित कोडीनयुक्त सीरप बरामद की गई।

अपर थानाध्यक्ष मुकेश कुमार ने बताया कि गिरफ्तार आरोपितों की पहचान कुरसेला निवासी विशाल कुमार तथा तीनघड़िया निवासी रोहित कुमार के रूप में हुई है। पूछताछ में दोनों ने स्वीकार किया कि वे गिद्धा गांव स्थित एक किराना दुकान में सीरप की डिलीवरी देने जा रहे थे। पुलिस ने दोनों की निशानदेही पर संबंधित दुकान में छापेमारी कर एक महिला दुकानदार को भी गिरफ्तार कर लिया। मामले में एनडीपीएस एक्ट की सुसंगत धाराओं के तहत प्राथमिकी दर्ज की गई है। अपर थानाध्यक्ष ने बताया कि तीनों को न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया गया है। वहीं इस अवैध कारोबार से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की पहचान कर गिरफ्तारी के लिए छापेमारी की जा रही है।

Madhubani News: पुलिस ने विशेष छापेमारी अभियान में नशीली दवाओं और विभिन्न देशों की करेंसी जब्त की। एसएसपी योगेंद्र कुमार ने मामले का खुलासा किया। कुल 199 बोतल कोडीनयुक्त सिरप, 11.42 लाख नेपाली रुपये, 5.13 लाख भारतीय रुपये और विदेशी करेंसी बरामद हुई। तीन लोगों को गिरफ्तार किया गया, जबकि एक तस्कर फरार है।

मामले का खुलासा

एसएसपी योगेंद्र कुमार ने सोमवार को प्रेस कॉन्फ्रेंस में मामले का खुलासा करते हुए कहा कि नशीली दवाओं की तस्करी व अवैध मुद्रा रैकेट का भंडाफोड़ किया है। पुलिस ने दो अलग-अलग स्थानों से 199 बोतल कोडीनयुक्त प्रतिबंधित कफ सिरप, करीब 11.42 लाख नेपाली रुपये, 5.13 लाख भारतीय रुपये तथा सऊदी अरब का करेंसी 6 रियाल एवं यूएई करेंसी 5 दिरहम बरामद की गई है। इलेक्ट्रॉनिक सामान भी बरामद किया गया है। इस मामले में लदनियां पिपराही के ब्रह्मदेव कुमार राम, शंभू प्रसाद साह एवं खाजेडीह के बबलू कुमार चौधरी को गिरफ्तार किया गया है। जबकि एक तस्कर फरार हो गया।

पुलिस की कार्रवाई

उन्होंने बताया कि बीती रात लदनियां पुलिस को सूचना मिली कि ग्राम ठाढ़ी से कड़हरवा होते हुए एक व्यक्ति मोटरसाइकिल पर कोडिन सीरफ लेकर ग्राम गाढ़ा की ओर जाने वाला है। सूचना पर पुलिस कड़हरवा पहुंची तो पुलिस गाड़ी देखकर एक बाइक सवार भागने लगा। पुलिस ने उसे दबोच लिया। वह अपना नाम ब्रह्मदेव कुमार राम बताया। उसके पास से 19 लीटर नशीली सीरप बरामद हुआ। खाजेडीह चौक स्थित बबलू मेडीकल हॉल से खरीद कर लाया था। पूछताछ में यह भी बताया कि पिपराही निवासी शम्भू प्रसाद साह के दुकान से नेपाली पैसा देकर भारतीय पैसा लेता हूं। शम्भू साह के साथ कोडिन सीरप के धंधे में पैसा लगाते हैं तथा मुनाफा के पैसे को आपस में बांट लेते हैं।

गिरफ्तारी और छापेमारी

खाजेडीह चौक स्थित बबलू मेडिकल हॉल पर छापेमारी कर संचालक बबलू कुमार चौधरी को 9 बोतल सीरप व 20 हजार नकद के साथ गिरफ्तार किया। प्रेस कॉन्फ्रेंस के दौरान ग्रामीण एसपी शिवम धाकड़ भी मौजूद थे।



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
