Arunachal: Longding Administration Intensifies Fight Against Drugs; NCORD Meet Calls For Community Participation

A District level Narco Coordination Centre (NCORD) meeting was convened at the DC Office Conference Hall, Longding on under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner Kunal Yadav, IAS.

A total of 37 NCORD members and stakeholders attended the meeting.

The meeting began with a welcome address by DySP (HQ) Kesang Norbu, APPS, who outlined the agenda for the day.

Superintendent of Police Dekio Gumja, APPS, in his capacity as Convenor, NCORD, made a detailed PPT presentation on the activities undertaken by District Police Longding to curb drug trafficking and abuse. He also reviewed the action taken on the minutes of the last NCORD meeting.

The SP stressed that fighting the drug menace is not the sole responsibility of police and administration, but requires active community involvement. He also briefed the house on the legal provisions under the NDPS Act.

Members representing villages, student organisations and women welfare associations shared their concerns over the rising drug abuse among youths in the district.

ZPM Wakka also put forth his views and suggestions to check drug consumption and peddling at the grassroots level.

Addressing the gathering, DC Kunal Yadav, IAS called for collective and coordinated efforts of all stakeholders to make Longding drug-free.

He made a special appeal to residents of Indo-Myanmar border villages to play a proactive role in preventing procurement of drugs from across the border and to take measures to discourage illicit opium cultivation in remote areas.

The DC assured that the district administration will extend beneficiary-oriented schemes and support for alternate cultivation to villagers who give up opium cultivation.

In conclusion, both the DC and SP appealed to all citizens of Longding district to unitedly discourage drug abuse and opium cultivation and work towards making Longding a drug-free district.

Four Arrested, Heroin Seized in Kamrup

Kamrup (Assam), 22 August (HS): At least four people have arrested and a large quantity of suspected heroin was seized during a police operation at Kalyanpur under Nagarbera Police Station in Kamrup (Rural) district.

Acting on information provided by Boko-Chhaygaon CDS and APS Janakishore Gogoi, a police team led by SI Champak Kalita, IC of Tupamari Outpost, along with SI Harjit Das, OC of Nagarbera Police Station, and other personnel, conducted a search at a house in Kalyanpur late Friday night in the presence of independent witnesses.

During the operation, police recovered 21 grams of suspected heroin from two containers, with a total weight of 72 grams, and another 25 grams of suspected heroin from 30 filled vials, with a total weight of 55 grams. The team also seized 157 empty containers/vials, four mobile phones and ₹3,240 in cash.

The arrested persons have been identified as Zahadul Islam, Zamiran Nessa and Tohinul Ali, all residents of Kalyanpur under Nagarbera Police Station, and Md Jamal Badshah of Bilasipara in Dhubri district.

Police said the suspected contraband and other items were seized following due legal procedures. Further investigation is underway and necessary legal action will be taken.

₹2 Crore Worth Codeine Syrup and Tramadol Seized in Assam's Cachar

GUWAHATI: Cachar Police seized 15,900 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup and 2,600 Tramadol capsules from a godown at Gosaipur in Udharbond.

The seized substances are estimated to be worth around ₹2 crore.

Police have arrested one person in connection with the seizure. The operation was carried out by Cachar Police as part of the ongoing crackdown on the illegal drug trade in Assam.

The case is under investigation, and police are probing the source and intended destination of the seized substances.

42.41 Kg Ganja Seized at New Bongaigaon Railway Station, One Arrested

Bongaigaon (Assam), 22 August (HS): Assam's Bongaigaon Railway Police seized 42.41 kg of ganja during an operation at New Bongaigaon Railway Station and arrested one person in connection with the alleged smuggling.

According to GRP sources, the operation was conducted on intervening night under the supervision of New Bongaigaon Railway Police officer Sanjeeb Choudhury. During a search of the AC coach of the down-bound Tripur Sundari Express, police recovered the contraband and arrested a passenger identified as Imran Sheikh.

Preliminary investigation suggests that the ganja was allegedly being transported from Agartala Railway Station in Tripura to Bengaluru. Railway Police have launched a further investigation to trace the source of the contraband and identify others allegedly involved in the smuggling network.

Drug checks stepped up at border

Thiruvananthapuram: With Onam festivities expected to draw large numbers of tourists, police have intensified checks on tourist buses at the Kadambattukonam border under 'Operation Toofan', focusing on drug use and trafficking.

District Anti-Narcotics Special Action Force (Dansaf), the police dog squad and excise officials were deployed for vehicle inspections from early Saturday. Police said checks on tourist buses and other vehicles would be intensified during the festival season to ensure a safe and drug-free Onam.

The operation began around 3am and continued until 11am, with personnel from Kallambalam police station and other local units joining the Dansaf team and dog squad. Tourist buses, cars and

taxis passing through the border were inspected, with particular attention to possible concealment of narcotics in vehicles or luggage and their possession by passengers.

The drive is part of a wider enforcement campaign by Thiruvananthapuram rural police ahead of Onam. Police have arrested more than 100 people for possession of illegal drugs as part of intensified action against narcotics in the district.

According to police, traffickers have increasingly been using border areas of the district to transport narcotics

brought in from other states. The location makes the border a key transit route, prompting enforcement agencies to strengthen surveillance and vehicle inspections.

Tourist buses are being given particular attention as large numbers of people are expected to travel during the Onam holidays. Police officials said checks would continue at the border and other strategic locations to prevent the movement of narcotics and identify those involved in trafficking.

The operation involves coordination between local police, Dsansaf, the dog squad and excise personnel. Sniffer dogs are being used to detect drugs concealed in luggage and vehicles.

Police said enforcement would be intensified in the coming days, with more vehicle checks and surveillance planned at key entry points. The objective is to prevent narcotics from entering the district during the festive season and ensure safe Onam celebrations. .

Keralam: Excise busts MDMA racket smuggling drugs from Delhi using women as carriers

Kochi, The Excise Department has busted a major drug racket that allegedly smuggled MDMA from Delhi to Keralam using women as carriers and arrested four people, officials said on Sunday.

Excise officials said around 279.3 grams of MDMA was recovered from the accused persons arrested in two separate operations involving members of the same racket.

S Vinod Kumar, Joint Excise Commissioner, said the Excise Ernakulam Range, acting on a tip-off, arrested two persons, including an 18-year-old woman, with 49.3 grams of MDMA from a luxury hotel in Kaloor here a few days back.

"Upon arresting and interrogating the two individuals, information was received regarding a person named Varun Dev, a wholesale dealer who traffics MDMA into Keralam. On getting information that they were coming to Ernakulam district on Saturday and that a deal was likely to take place, a search was conducted," he told reporters.

Excise officials intercepted their vehicle at Vyttila after it got caught in a traffic block on Saturday and recovered 230 grams of MDMA and three grams of hashish oil from a secret compartment built under the steering wheel, he said.

The two persons identified as Varun Dev and Vipin S Kumar , both from Pathanamthitta district, who were in the vehicle, were arrested by the Excise officials.

"Thus, a total of four accused have been arrested by us now. Six mobile phones and ₹69,500 in cash have also been recovered from their possession," Kumar said.

He said one of the arrested persons had earlier been caught with drugs by the police.

"Their modus operandi involves travelling to Delhi in this Mahindra Thar SUV, using women as carriers to bring the contraband in the vehicle to Keralam, and then retailing it here. Among them, the most important thing to note is that the girl caught in the first case turns 19 years old only in November this year," Kumar said.

Kumar said the accused were targeting young people for their drug operations.

"So, they have a method of trapping young girls like this and using them for drug smuggling and drug trade. This is something that requires serious attention," Kumar said.

He said most youngsters caught in cases registered under the NDPS Act were unaware of the legal consequences.

"For these commercial quantity cases, the law provides for imprisonment up to 20 years, with the minimum sentence being 10 years. So if convicted in this case, they will definitely receive a minimum sentence of 10 years. That can go up to a maximum of 20 years," he said.

Drug Bust: Onam Shoot Takes Dark Turn After MDMA Discovery

A man who brought a jeep for students to shoot Onam reels was arrested in Vadakara after police allegedly found MDMA in his possession. The incident came to light during a police inspection, turning what was meant to be a festive shoot into a drug case.

Vadakara: A 29-year-old man has been arrested in Vadakara for allegedly possessing MDMA. The unusual incident came to light when he was reportedly driving a rented jeep for a group of students who were shooting reels for Onam.

The Edachery police arrested Asif, a resident of Villiappally, near Illath Bridge on Vaikkilassery Road in Orkatteri. According to the police, 9.40 grams of MDMA was recovered from his possession. The students had reportedly rented the jeep to shoot videos as part of their Onam celebrations. Asif accompanied them as the driver while they travelled to the location for filming.

According to the police, the situation raised suspicion while the students were engaged in shooting their reels. Officers subsequently decided to inspect the jeep and those inside it. During the inspection, they allegedly found the MDMA in Asif's possession. Following the discovery, Asif was taken into custody and arrested in connection with the alleged possession of the drug. Police are continuing their investigation to establish the circumstances surrounding the possession and determine whether there are any other links to the case.

Police also clarified that the students had reportedly hired Asif only for driving purposes and had no prior connection with him. They were allegedly unaware of his activities and had no knowledge that he was carrying the suspected drug. The investigation is underway, with police examining further details of the incident.

Hash oil demand rises in Hyderabad amid ganja crackdown

Hash oil is increasingly finding demand among drug users in Hyderabad as enforcement agencies crack down on conventional ganja. Police say drug syndicates are turning to the concentrated cannabis derivative, with several persons recently arrested for allegedly trading it

Hyderabad: Hash oil, one of the costlier and more potent derivatives of cannabis and different from hashish, is increasingly finding demand among drug users in Hyderabad, with the crackdown by law enforcement agencies on conventional ganja prompting drug peddlers to explore newer forms of the contraband.

The oil is a concentrated cannabis extract made from cannabis plant material. It contains a high concentration of cannabinoids, particularly delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), and is produced by separating the resin and other compounds from the plant material using extraction processes.

Unlike dry ganja, which is typically smoked in rolled cigarettes, hash oil is a sticky or viscous substance that can be consumed in different ways, including smoking or vaping. Because it is highly concentrated, even a small quantity can contain considerably more THC than an equivalent amount of ordinary cannabis.

Police officials said gangs operating in the agency areas of Andhra Pradesh are increasingly involved in producing hash oil. "Hash oil is easy to conceal and transport compared to dry ganja. After suffering losses due to the crackdown on marijuana, the syndicates are changing the way they do business," an official of the Prohibition and Excise Department said.

The oil is sold to a network of smugglers who transport it to different parts of the country. Local peddlers then pack it in small containers of 5 ml and 10 ml and sell it to consumers. "Compared to dry marijuana, hash oil is costlier. A 5 ml bottle of hash oil is sold at a price ranging from Rs 2,500 to Rs 3,500," said an EAGLE Force official.

Most consumers of hash oil are college-going students and young professionals, police officials said. "For the sake of profit, youngsters are sourcing it from some places and selling it to colleagues. Many of those involved in selling it were arrested in recent days," another official explained.

In recent days, the EAGLE Force, police in the Hyderabad, Malkajgiri and Cyberabad commissionerates, and special teams of the Prohibition and Excise Department have arrested several persons allegedly involved in trading hash oil.

In the latest case, six persons, including an IT employee and two 17-year-old boys, were apprehended for allegedly transporting hash oil. Police seized 12 kg of the contraband, estimated to be worth Rs 1.5 crore. The organisers had allegedly recruited unemployed tribal youth from

Hyderabad, Aug 22 (PTI) Two persons were arrested here for allegedly transporting 14.2 kg of hashish oil worth Rs 1.75 crore, police said on Saturday.

Acting on credible information that two persons were transporting hashish oil on a motorcycle towards Gowrelly Road in Nagole on Friday, police teams conducted vehicle checks and intercepted them.

The two were carrying bags containing hashish oil, Malkajgiri Police Commissioner B Sumathi said in a release.

The accused were identified as T Nagaraju and N Narayana, both residents of Alluri Sitarama Raju district in Andhra Pradesh, she said.

During interrogation, police learnt that T Gopal, who is absconding, had approached the two accused and handed over bags containing hashish oil for transportation from the Odisha border to Hyderabad.

Gopal, a resident of Singavaram village in Malkangiri district of Odisha, had allegedly offered them Rs 1 lakh each for transporting and delivering the narcotic substance, the commissioner said.

A case was registered at Nagole Police Station, and further investigation was underway to trace the absconding accused and ascertain the intended recipients and distribution network of the hashish oil in Hyderabad, Sumathi added. PTI VVK SSK

Action Against Police Officials Over Ganja, Liquor Case

Ganja was allegedly found in the car after the accident, leading to allegations against the police officials.

NELLORE: Disciplinary action has been initiated against police officials in Prakasam district following a report by the district SP in connection with a case involving the alleged transportation of ganja and liquor in a car.

Santamaguluru sub-inspector V. Nagamalleswara Rao has been attached to the VR (Vacancy Reserve). Show-cause notices have been issued to the Darshi DSP, while charge memos have been served on the Ballikurava SI and Santamaguluru CI.

The action follows a road accident near Shankaravarappadu in which two SIs travelling in a car reportedly collided with an auto while trying to avoid a motorcycle. Ganja was allegedly found in the car after the accident, leading to allegations against the police officials.

Following the incident, the Inspector General of Police and the district SP visited the concerned mandals and the incident locations on Thursday and conducted a discreet inquiry into the circumstances surrounding the case.

The latest disciplinary measures were taken based on the findings and report submitted by the SP, officials said.

Three elderly among 5 held in Hyderabad with 38 kg ganja worth Rs 10 lakh

Five people, including three elderly persons, were arrested in Hyderabad for allegedly transporting 38 kg of dry ganja worth around Rs 10 lakh, police said.

The accused were apprehended on August 21 in the Gandhi Nagar police station limits after police received information about the movement of the contraband.

According to police, the accused included two men aged 65 and 78 and a 66-year-old woman. They are from Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra and Jharkhand.

Additional Commissioner of Police (Crimes) M Srinivas said the group allegedly procured the ganja from Araku in Visakhapatnam and was taking it to Mumbai through Hyderabad by bus.

Police said the accused were allegedly working as carriers for an unidentified person who supplied them with instructions and paid them for each delivery.

The ganja was allegedly packed into travel bags after being collected from Araku. The accused then travelled to Hyderabad on different buses to avoid attracting attention, police said.

They were allegedly paid around Rs 10,000 to Rs 12,000 for each delivery.

Police said the suspected source was using elderly people as carriers, believing they would be less likely to attract suspicion during travel.

The investigation is underway to identify the person who allegedly supplied the ganja and to trace the wider network, police said.

202 kg of ganja seized in Coimbatore; two arrested

COIMBATORE: Coimbatore district police seized 202 kg of ganja and arrested two men in separate anti-narcotic operations on Friday.

In the first incident, police from the Periyanaickenpalayam prohibition enforcement wing (PEW) conducted targeted surveillance on the Tamil Nadu Engineering College Road near Karumathampatti. Acting on specific intelligence, police apprehended C Chiranjeevi, 39, a native of Theni district, and recovered 181 kg of contraband intended for illegal distribution.

Chiranjeevi confessed that he had travelled to Odisha to purchase ganja and transported it on a Kerala-bound truck, according to

police.

In a parallel operation, the Kovilpalayam police conducted vehicle checks in their jurisdiction based on confidential tips. Authorities arrested M Nandhakumar, 21, Coimbatore, after seizing approximately 21 kg of hidden ganja from his possession. Police noted that Nandhakumar was previously linked to multiple criminal offences.

TIRUCHY: Tiruchy police on Saturday (August 22) arrested four persons, including a woman from West Bengal, with 3.6 kg of ganja.

The gang has been smuggling a huge quantity of ganja from Odisha and stocking it in Puducherry, from where they supplied ganja across Tamil Nadu.

Based on an input about ganja peddling across the State from Ramji Nagar in Tiruchy, SP Dongare Pravin Umesh ordered the formation of a special team.

They conducted a raid at a house in Ramji Nagar and seized 3.6 kg of ganja. The police also arrested Sangeetha (40), a resident of West Bengal, her 17-year-old son, Prabakaran (40) and Jagan (30), both from Ramji Nagar.

The subsequent investigation found that Sangeetha was smuggling a huge quantity of ganja from Odisha and stocking it in Puducherry, from where the gang has been distributing ganja across Tamil Nadu and Puducherry.

Further inquiry with Sangeetha revealed that the gang had used Tiruchy as the major transit spot for peddling ganja. Subsequently, the police seized vehicles and mobile phones used for the offence.

The police found that there were other ganja peddling cases against three persons, except Sangeetha.

WARANGAL: More than 1,000 students and young people took part in the “Mana Ooru – Mana Badhyata: 2K Run for Drugs-Free Society” organised by the Mahabubabad district police at Guduru mandal centre on Saturday. District Superintendent of Police Dr. Shabarish, flagged off the run.

Addressing participants, Dr. Shabarish appealed to students to value their formative years and avoid harmful habits. He warned that drugs such as narcotics and ganja damage physical and mental health and can destroy future prospects, adding that temporary pleasure from substances can lead to lifelong consequences.

Explaining police measures, the SP said the department uses modern technology to curb drug use, trafficking and sales. He demonstrated a ganja testing kit to students and described how tests help identify suspected substances, urging youth to steer clear of situations that could jeopardise their future.

Dr. Shabarish also cautioned that offences involving sale, supply, transport or consumption of narcotic drugs attract strict legal action under the NDPS Act, and such convictions can adversely affect employment and overseas travel opportunities.

The SP warned shopkeepers against selling tobacco products to minors and said strict action will be taken against those who violate the rules. He advised essential shops and pan stores to display mandatory boards warning against selling tobacco products to minors.

To encourage public cooperation in making Mahabubabad drug-free, the SP called on citizens to report any information about ganja cultivation, transport or sales. He said informants could receive a cash reward of up to ₹5,000 and assured that their identities would be kept fully confidential. He asked people to share tips on the Anti-Drug Helpline at 87126 56999.

The programme concluded with public representatives, police and officials from various departments, teachers, students and youth taking a pledge against drugs. Local police officials, community leaders and a large number of students and young participants attended the event.

PANJIM: The ongoing investigation into a prison smuggling attempt has taken a high-profile turn following the arrest of Colvale Central Jail inmate Rovina Pereira Lobo, exposing an alleged network operating comfortably behind prison walls. Lobo, an undertrial who has not been convicted in the double-murder case of Martha and Vera Lobo, was arrested after police established a direct link between her and a compromised security staffer.

The plot unraveled when a Goa Human Resource Development Corporation (GHRDC) security staffer, Asha Chodankar, was caught red-handed attempting to enter the high-security facility. Contraband consisting of around 236 grams of suspected ganja and two grams of suspected charas was found concealed inside a steel thermos flask in her possession. A subsequent search of Chodankar's locker yielded three mobile phones and three ATM cards, bringing the internal security breach into sharp focus.

The institutional response, however, follows a familiar pattern. Speaking to O Herald, Superintendent of Police (SP) Vishwesh Karpe stated that the identity of the external source who handed over the thermos flask to Chodankar remains unknown. He added that a detailed investigation will be conducted to cross-verify statements from the accused.

This latest incident is far from an isolated security breach; rather, it underscores a persistent, long-term breakdown of authority inside Colvale Central Jail. Data tabled in the Goa Assembly reveals a staggering history of illicit activity, noting that 161 mobile phones were confiscated from prisoners between 2017 and May 2025. During that exact same period, 171 prisoners were caught possessing prohibited articles, and 11 jail staffers were suspended for facilitating the smuggling of contraband.

Major historical breaches paint a picture of an uninhibited supply line.

In January 2026, a massive internal raid recovered 48 mobile phones alongside illicit drugs and electronic accessories from various cells. Another recent raid also reportedly resulted in the recovery of additional mobile phones from inmates.

In 2025, outside accomplices successfully hurled a massive consignment of 1.4 kilograms of ganja directly over the prison walls, triggering an investigation into the intended inmate recipient as police arrested several persons in connection with the incident.

Two separate security guards were arrested in the span of a single month—one carrying 208 grams of ganja and seven grams of cocaine, and another attempting to supply cocaine to an undertrial in June 2022.

In 2019, a sweeping raid resulted in the single largest haul at the facility, uncovering 80 mobile phones and nearly two kilograms of ganja.

The regular discovery of support accessories—including chargers, power banks, and headphones—confirms that prisoners have maintained active, long-term communication facilities without meaningful disruption.

These recurring discoveries have shifted the investigation's focus from petty smuggling to a far more dangerous possibility: that Goa's wider narcotics trade is being actively managed from inside the prison blocks.

Sources familiar with the jail's internal dynamics allege that repeat offenders and high-profile undertrials are using these smuggled mobile phones to maintain seamless contact with external operators. From their cells, these inmates allegedly dictate terms, handle logistics, and issue precise instructions regarding the supply and distribution of narcotics across prime coastal tourist belts and local villages in both North and South Goa.

Furthermore, the financial infrastructure behind this network appears highly organized. External operatives allegedly collect lucrative commissions and protection money from ground-level drug dealers, funneling a portion of those illicit funds straight back to the mastermind inmates controlling the syndicate from the inside.

With a definitive pattern of security personnel acting as internal mules, authorities are now facing intense pressure to look beyond isolated cases. Moving forward, investigators must establish whether these are detached criminal acts or part of a heavily structured, organized syndicate requiring deep-rooted internal facilitation from within the prison apparatus.

Retired Superintendent of Police Bossuet Silva, who served in various positions in the Goa Police, including the Anti-Narcotics Cell, said the repeated recovery of drugs and mobile phones from Colvale Central Jail should not be viewed as isolated incidents, but should be investigated as a possible organised narcotics network.

"From my experience in the Anti-Narcotics Cell, I can say that a drug network cannot function for long without communication, money and protection. If inmates are able to obtain mobile phones, communicate with people outside and continue receiving drugs and money inside the prison, then the authorities have to look beyond the individual who is caught carrying the contraband. They have to identify who is actually controlling the network," Silva said.

He said the alleged involvement of politically well-connected individuals in the narcotics trade operating around the prison is an aspect that should be thoroughly investigated.

"There are allegations that politically well-connected persons are involved in this network and that their people are collecting money from the drug trade outside and sending it inside the prison. If this is true, it means the issue is much bigger than prison security. It points towards an organised network with people operating both inside and outside the jail," he said.

Sub Divisional Police Officer of Mapusa, Vishwesh Karpe (SP) said that the investigation in the present case of the security guard is underway to find out the source and end of the narcotics.

“We have taken remand only on Saturday of the main suspect from Colvale jail; we are investigating the case in detail,” Karpe said.

Three arrested in Malegaon drug bust

Nashik: In a crackdown on the illegal trade of narcotics and banned prescription drugs, a joint team of Nashik Rural and Malegaon City police arrested three men and seized contraband, a vehicle and other material collectively worth Rs 6.4 lakh during a midnight operation in Malegaon.

The raid was conducted on the night of Aug 20-21 near a deserted building in the Kali Kutti Ground area under the supervision of Nashik Rural SP D S Swami and additional SP Suraj Gunjal.

Police seized 1,200 bottles of cough syrup and more than 67,000 sedative tablets, allegedly meant for illegal distribution. A utility vehicle worth Rs 3.2 lakh and mobile phones were also confiscated.

The prime accused, Firoz Khan Lukman Khan, a resident of Umarwada in Surat, Gujarat, was allegedly operating the racket with the help of his associates. Investigators said he had arrived in Malegaon to stockpile and distribute the pharmaceutical contraband. Police said Firoz Khan was already wanted in a case registered at the Pawarwadi police station under the NDPS Act and MCOCA, and was also linked to another NDPS case registered at Azad Nagar police station.

The other arrested accused were identified as Rais Khan Sayeed Khan and Wahid Hasan Siddique Hasan, both residents of Malegaon. A fourth suspect managed to flee during the raid and is being traced.

According to police, the operation was carried out after specific intelligence inputs regarding illegal storage and distribution of narcotic and psychotropic substances in the city.

The raid was led by sub-inspector Paraji Waghmode with assistance from the special team of the additional SP, Malegaon, the technical analysis branch of Nashik Rural police and officers from Malegaon city police. Police are investigating the supply chain and possible links of the accused with larger interstate drug trafficking networks.

Army, BSF and Punjab police discuss joint strategy to counter drone-led drug smuggling

CHANDIGARH: Top officials of the Army, Border Security Force (BSF) and Punjab Police met at Western Command, Chandimandir, to strengthen coordination and border management against drone-enabled narcotics smuggling along the India-Pakistan border in Punjab.

The meeting focused on the growing use of drones to smuggle drugs and other contraband across the border and on strengthening coordinated responses, surveillance and intelligence sharing.

A post on X by Western Command said, "HQ #WesternCommand hosted a focused interaction on the emerging challenge of drone-enabled narcotics trafficking along the border. Mr PK Sinha, SDGP Law & Order, Punjab, along with the ADGP, Anti-Narcotics Task Force, Punjab, shared perspectives on the evolving narco-drone threat and measures to strengthen coordinated response mechanisms, technology integration and operational synergy."

"Lt Gen #PushpendraSingh, AVSM, SM, #Armcommander, #Westerncommand, underscored the importance of inter-agency coordination, technology-enabled surveillance and concerted action to effectively counter emerging border security challenges," it concluded.

Sources said the meeting discussed creating a unified intelligence grid, improving intelligence sharing, regularly exchanging inputs from drone wreckage analysis and forensics, and strengthening night surveillance along vulnerable stretches of the border.

The officials also discussed regular operational reviews, joint border grid meetings and coordination to counter narco-terrorism. Measures to break the narco-terror nexus, deploy counter-drone systems and conduct joint training for counter-drone and anti-smuggling operations were also discussed.

The meeting also focused on preventing the cross-border movement of drugs, weapons and illegal human crossings and improving coordination among the forces responsible for border management.

The meeting came days after Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann called for closer cooperation between the state government and the Army on border security and anti-drone measures. On August 12, Chief of Army Staff Gen Dhiraj Seth met Mann at his residence in Chandigarh, where civil-military coordination, regional security, border management, defence preparedness, recruitment and rehabilitation of Agniveers were discussed.

In July, the Ministry of Home Affairs told Parliament that drone-assisted smuggling had increased since 2021. Punjab accounted for 298 of the 305 such incidents reported across the country in 2025.

Dehradun police face new challenge as drug-addicted youth turn to crime

Dehradun: Police in Dehradun are facing a growing challenge from youngsters allegedly turning to crimes such as chain snatching, burglary and mobile phone theft to fund their drug addiction, with several such incidents reported across the city over the past six months and elderly residents increasingly emerging as targets. The trend has also raised concerns over repeat offenders returning to crime after securing bail.

In one of the latest incidents, a 25-year-old man was arrested following a brief encounter with police for allegedly snatching a gold chain from an elderly woman who was out for a walk in Vasant Vihar, an upscale locality. The accused had been released on bail just a month ago after being arrested for mobile phone snatching five months earlier. Police found that he had allegedly been involved in 17 similar crimes, which he committed to fund his drug addiction.

Around a week earlier, police arrested two youths in their early twenties for allegedly robbing an elderly woman of valuables after holding her captive inside her home. The two allegedly entered the house by posing as civic body employees. Following their arrest, they confessed to committing the crime to fund their drug addiction, police said.

“The development is worrisome for society as a whole. Drug abuse not only destroys a person’s family but can also lead to crimes like these. After a certain stage, those consuming drugs may find it difficult to control their urge to obtain them and can go to any extent to procure them, including committing serious crimes,” said psychiatrist Dr Satyakant Dwivedi.

He added that police action alone would not be enough to curb such crimes and that society would also have to play a role. “The menace of drug abuse has to be checked at the family level. Parents should ensure that their wards do not go down the wrong path,” Dr Dwivedi said.

Dehradun SP (city) Pramod Kumar acknowledged that youngsters turning to crime to fund their drug addiction had emerged as a challenge for police, even as the force continues its crackdown on drug trafficking in the city.

“We have been continuously cracking down on drug traffickers by making arrests and seizing drugs. Police have also identified certain areas, including those around educational institutions, where drug trafficking is more prevalent. We have booked repeat offenders under stringent laws such as the

The vehicle was frozen under Section 68-F of the NDPS Act following an investigation into Balwinder Singh, alias Bindu, a resident of Pirawali.

A case was registered against Singh on April 29, 2025, after police allegedly recovered 101 grams of heroin from his possession. Subsequent financial tracking revealed the SUV was linked to the accused.

Police officials stated that enforcement efforts will extend beyond arrests and narcotics seizures to systematically identify and seize assets acquired through illegal drug proceeds.

“Our action against drug trafficking will go beyond arrests and recovery of narcotics. Assets allegedly acquired

through or connected with the illegal drug trade would also be identified and frozen or seized as per law,” said Hisar SP Siddhant Jain.

Jaipur, Oct 11 (PTI) The Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) and Rajasthan Police, in a joint operation, have arrested two men and seized 1.492 kg of heroin allegedly smuggled from Pakistan, officials said on Saturday.

The operation was conducted by Kesrisinghpur Police Station SHO Balwant Ram and his team near the railway crossing on Mirjewala Road on Friday evening.

The arrested accused have been identified as Karanjot Singh, 19, and Prabhdeep Singh, 19, both residents of Punjab, officials said.

According to a senior officer, the seized heroin is estimated to be worth around Rs 7.5 crore in the international market.

A case has been registered under the NDPS Act at Kesrisinghpur police station.

Initial probe reveals that the heroin was received from two unidentified individuals near Kesrisinghpur bus stand and was intended to be delivered to a handler in Tarn Taran in Punjab, police said.

"Further investigation is underway to trace the supply network and identify others involved in the cross-border smuggling," the officer said. PTI SDA APL RHL

Drug haul worth Rs 1.42 crore seized in Bhilwara

Bhilwara: Phuliyakalan police in Bhilwara district recovered 750 kg of poppy husk and 6 kg of opium from two cars during a late-night crackdown on drug trafficking Friday. SP Sagar Rana said the estimated value of the seized contraband was around Rs 1.42 crore, with the poppy husk valued at Rs 1.12 crore and opium at Rs 30 lakh.

The recovery was made during a blockade on the Bhim-Uniyara highway under the Phuliyakalan police station area. Police said the narcotics were being transported in two luxury cars.

The suspects fled the spot after getting wind of the police action, taking advantage of the darkness. Police have launched an

investigation to identify the accused and trace the suspected smuggling network.

Investigators are examining the registration details of the two vehicles, mobile phone contacts and CCTV footage along the route to determine the source of the consignment and its intended destination.

Rana said all police officers in the district had been directed to step up action against illegal drug trafficking. The seized contraband and vehicles were taken into custody and a case was registered under the NDPS Act.

Two arrested with 17 Kg chura post at Madhopur Checkpost

Pathankot police have arrested two alleged drug traffickers and seized 17 kilograms of chura post (poppy husk) during a special checking operation at the interstate Madhopur checkpost on the Punjab—Jammu and Kashmir border.

According to police, the accused were transporting the narcotics concealed between cartons of apples loaded in a truck coming from Jammu and Kashmir. The contraband was allegedly being smuggled under the cover of a legitimate apple consignment destined for Madhya Pradesh.

Acting on directions from the Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP), a Sujampur police team had set up a special checkpoint at Madhopur. During the operation, officers stopped a suspicious truck arriving from the Jammu and Kashmir side for inspection.

A thorough search of the vehicle, including its cabin and cargo section, led to the recovery of a sack containing 17 kg of chura post hidden among apple boxes. Police immediately detained the two occupants of the truck and seized the narcotics.

Preliminary interrogation revealed that the accused had allegedly arranged an apple consignment from Kashmir and were using it as a cover to transport the illegal substance. The consignment was reportedly being taken to Madhya Pradesh.

A DSP said that one of the arrested men, identified as Satnam Singh, has a criminal record and was previously booked under the Excise Act in an illegal liquor case. Police are now investigating the backward and forward linkages of the trafficking network to identify suppliers, receivers, and other associates involved in the operation.

A case has been registered, and further investigation is underway.

Amritsar police turn to gurdwara speakers to alert youth against drugs, crime

Stepping up their efforts to protect youth along the border belt from drug abuse and criminal exploitation, the Amritsar Rural Police have launched a community outreach drive in collaboration with gurdwaras to caution parents and teenagers.

Under the initiative, village granthis (priests) are making public announcements through gurdwara loudspeakers to raise awareness about anti-social elements targeting vulnerable adolescents.

Launched nearly 10 days ago, the drive has already covered several border villages in the Ramdas and Attari sectors. The police plan to expand the programme to public intersections, schools and local youth clubs using public address systems ahead of upcoming festive gatherings.

Speaking on the initiative, Amritsar Rural senior superintendent of police (SSP) Kanwalpreet Singh Chahal said the campaign specifically targeted teenagers aged 16-17.

According to police, intelligence and recent investigations revealed that criminal networks were able to lure impressionable youth with incentives like mobile phones, motorcycles, financial aid or promises of foreign travel.

“These young minds are exploited by anti-social elements to carry out illegal tasks, ranging from picking up contraband consignments to executing low-level attacks,” SSP Chahal said.

“With the pervasive influence of social media and easy access to instructional content online, parents often remain unaware of their children’s activities and peer group,” he said.

Through this campaign, police aim to encourage parents and village elders, including panchs and sarpanchs, to closely monitor behavioural changes in youngsters.

Several cases of teenagers being lured by anti-social gangs and anti-national agencies have cropped up in the recent past.

On August 4, 2026, the Amritsar commissionerate police busted two ISI-backed cross-border terror modules with the arrest of nine individuals. Among them four were juveniles.

Abroad-based handlers had recruited these teenagers from Amritsar, Tarn Taran and Gurdaspur to conduct surveillance on security installations and execute petrol bomb attacks, according to investigators.

In July, following a brief encounter near Bhaini village, Amritsar Rural Police arrested two young operatives wanted for executing a petrol bomb attack after being lured by online foreign handlers.

शिमला। प्रतिबंधित दवाइयों के अवैध कारोबार और मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के एक मामले में अदालत ने दोषी को तीन साल के कठोर कारावास की सजा सुनाई है। दोषी को 20 हजार रुपये जुर्माना भी देना होगा।

पुलिस थाना ठियोग में दर्ज एनडीपीएस एक्ट के मामले में अतिरिक्त जिला एवं सत्र न्यायाधीश (सीबीआई) शिमला की अदालत ने यह फैसला सुनाया। पुलिस थाना ठियोग में 23 जुलाई 2020 को एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा 18 और 21 के तहत मामला दर्ज किया था। मामले में आरोपी जीत सिंह निवासी ठियोग जिला शिमला (27) के कब्जे से प्रतिबंधित दवाइयों की 120 टेबलेट और 79 ग्राम अफीम बरामद की थी। मामले की जांच पूरी करने के बाद पुलिस ने न्यायालय में चालान पेश किया। सुनवाई के दौरान अभियोजन पक्ष ने मामले से संबंधित साक्ष्यों और तथ्यों को प्रभावी ढंग से न्यायालय के समक्ष प्रस्तुत किया। इसके आधार पर अदालत ने आरोपी को दोषी करार दिया। वहीं, धारा 18 एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत दो वर्ष के कठोर कारावास और 15 हजार रुपये जुर्माने की सजा सुनाई गई है। जुर्माना अदा न करने की स्थिति में दोषी को अतिरिक्त कारावास भुगतना होगा।

एसपी (रतलाम शहर) राकेश पंद्रो ने शनिवार दोपहर पुलिस कंट्रोल रूम में आयोजित पत्रकारवार्ता में बताया कि एसपी अमित कुमार के निर्देशन में मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी पर अंकुश लगाने के लिए अभियान चलाया जा रहा है। इसी दौरान पुलिस को सूचना मिली कि जावरा की तरफ से इंदौर जा रहे कंटेनर क्रमांक एनएल-01-एए-6956 में डोडाचूरा ले जाया जा रहा है।

सूचना के आधार पर शुक्रवार और शनिवार की दरमियानी रात रतलाम ग्रामीण एसडीओपी किशोर पाटनवाला के मार्गदर्शन में बिलपांक थाना प्रभारी अय्यूब खान के नेतृत्व में पुलिस टीम को कंटेनर की तलाश के लिए रवाना किया गया। टीम ने महु-नीमच हाईवे पर कंटेनर की तलाश की। इस दौरान कंटेनर बिलपांक थाना क्षेत्र के सातरूंडा फंटे के पास लेबाय पर खड़ा मिला। पुलिस ने घेराबंदी कर कंटेनर के ड्राइवर 42 वर्षीय मोहनलाल पिता बगदीराम माली, निवासी ग्राम बराड़ा, सरवनिया महाराज के पास, थाना जावद, जिला नीमच और क्लीनर 53 वर्षीय प्रेमचंद पिता केसुराम धाकड़, निवासी ग्राम रामपुरिया, थाना बेगूं, जिला चित्तौड़गढ़ (राजस्थान) को हिरासत में लिया।

कंटेनर की तलाशी लेने पर कंबलों के नीचे डोडाचूरा के छह कट्टे छिपाकर रखे मिले। कट्टों में कुल 106 किलो 47 ग्राम डोडाचूरा भरा हुआ था। पुलिस ने डोडाचूरा और कंटेनर जब्त कर दोनों आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया। आरोपियों के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा 8/15 के तहत प्रकरण दर्ज किया गया है।

प्रारंभिक पूछताछ में आरोपियों ने बताया कि वे डोडाचूरा नीमच की संगराणा घाटी निवासी अनील सिंह राजपूत से लेकर महाराष्ट्र के मालेगांव की ओर जा रहे थे। पुलिस आरोपियों को रिमांड पर लेकर पूछताछ कर रही है। पुलिस यह पता लगाने का प्रयास कर रही है कि डोडाचूरा किसे पहुंचाया जाना था और इस तस्करी में और कौन लोग शामिल हैं।

उपनिरीक्षक लोकेश कुमार और सैफ खान पुलिस टीम के साथ क्षेत्र में गश्त कर रहे थे। इसी दौरान मुखबिर ने सूचना दी कि खटीमा रोड की ओर से दो युवक मादक पदार्थ लेकर आ रहे हैं। सूचना पर पुलिस टीम डगा पुल के पास पहुंची और वाहनों की लाइट बंद कर घेराबंदी कर दी। कुछ देर बाद पुल की ओर से स्कूटी सवार दो युवक आते दिखाई दिए। पुलिस को देखकर उन्होंने भागने का प्रयास किया, लेकिन पुलिसकर्मियों ने पीछा कर दोनों को पकड़ लिया। पूछताछ में आरोपियों ने अपना नाम शादाब और अनस निवासी शेरपुरकलां, थाना पूरनपुर बताया।

थाइलैंड से गोरखपुर में कौन भेज रहा ओजी गांजा, राष्ट्र विरोधी कनेक्शन की भी जांच

जागरण संवाददाता, गोरखपुर। थाइलैंड से नेपाल के रास्ते पूर्वांचल तक पहुंच रहे ओजी गांजा की सप्लाई चेन को लेकर जांच एजेंसियों की सक्रियता बढ़ गई है। बुधवार रात रामगढ़ताल क्षेत्र में गुजरात और प्रतापगढ़ के पांच युवकों से 3.085 किलोग्राम ओजी गांजा बरामद होने के बाद अब जांच का फोकस उस युवक तक पहुंचने पर है, जो देवरिया नंबर की कार से खेप पहुंचाने आया था। एजेंसियां यह पता लगाने में जुटी हैं कि थाइलैंड से खेप किसके जरिए भेजी जा रही है, भारत व नेपाल में इसे कौन रिसीव करता है। गोरखपुर तक खेप पहुंचाने वाला नेटवर्क कितना बड़ा है।

जांच एजेंसियों के सामने सबसे बड़ा सवाल यह है कि विदेश से ओजी गांजा भारत तक किस नेटवर्क के जरिये पहुंच रहा है। थाइलैंड से खेप निकलने के बाद नेपाल तक पहुंचने और फिर सीमा पार कर पूर्वांचल आने की संभावित कड़ियों की पड़ताल की जा रही है। पकड़े गए युवकों के मोबाइल नंबर, आपसी संपर्क, बैंक खातों और पैसों के लेनदेन की भी जांच हो रही है।

विज्ञापन हटाएं सिर्फ खबर पढ़ें

गिरफ्तार आरोपितों से पूछताछ में मिले नाम और नंबरों को पहले से सक्रिय तस्करी नेटवर्क से मिलाया जा रहा है। नशे की तस्करी के पीछे कहीं राष्ट्रविरोधी ताकतों या संगठनों का आर्थिक कनेक्शन तो नहीं है, इसकी भी जांच की जा रही है। एटीएस के साथ खुफिया एजेंसियां इस पहलू को देख रही हैं। हालांकि अभी तक जांच में ऐसा कोई प्रत्यक्ष प्रमाण सामने नहीं आया है। एजेंसियां सभी संभावित कड़ियों और संपर्कों की पड़ताल कर रही हैं।

सीमा से जुड़े जिलों को पहले ही किया गया था सतर्क ओजी गांजा की लगातार पकड़ी जा रही खेप के बाद पिछले माह एएनटीएफ के एसपी ने नेपाल सीमा से सटे जिलों के पुलिस अधिकारियों के साथ बैठक की थी। इसमें तस्करी पर प्रभावी अंकुश लगाने, नेटवर्क में शामिल लोगों को चिह्नित करने और सीमा क्षेत्र में सक्रिय तस्करों की जानकारी जुटाने के निर्देश दिए गए थे। एसपी एएनटीएफ गोरखपुर भी इस सिलसिले में क्षेत्र में पहुंचे थे। अब रामगढ़ताल में पकड़ी गई बड़ी खेप के बाद उस नेटवर्क की कड़ियां जोड़ने का काम तेज हो गया है।

होटल और दूसरे शहरों तक पहुंच रही खेप जांच एजेंसियां यह भी पता लगा रही हैं कि गोरखपुर में आने वाली खेप सीधे खरीदारों तक पहुंचती है या यहां से इसे दूसरे जिलों में भेजा जाता है। पूर्व में सामने आए मामलों में होटल और अन्य स्थानों तक ओजी गांजा पहुंचाने की जानकारी मिली थी।

अब बुधवार रात पकड़े गए पांच आरोपितों के मोबाइल और बैंक खातों की जांच से सप्लायर से लेकर खरीदार और आगे के कैरियर तक पूरी श्रृंखला सामने आने की उम्मीद है। एजेंसियों की निगाह फिलहाल देवरिया नंबर की कार से खेप पहुंचाने वाले युवक पर टिकी है। एक टीम को देवरिया भेजा गया है।

पुलिस के अनुसार, गिरफ्तार आरोपी मनोहर झा के खिलाफ गाजियाबाद और गौतमबुद्धनगर में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत पहले भी मामले दर्ज हैं। पुलिस उनके अन्य आपराधिक इतिहास की जानकारी जुटा रही है। इस कार्रवाई में एएनटीएफ वाराणसी और अलीनगर पुलिस की टीम शामिल रही।

162 Kg Ganja Seized from Car in Kalahandi, One Arrested with Minor

Acting on the directives of Kalahandi Excise Superintendent Ranjan Kumar Naik, a team led by Deputy Superintendent Sagarika Pradhan intercepted a white Maruti Suzuki car on National Highway 59 near Rajamunda under M. Rampur block.

During the raid, excise inspector Vijay Bhushan Nayak, along with M. Rampur excise officer Ajit Kumar Nayak and staff, seized 162 kilograms of ganja being smuggled from Kandhamal district to Balangir. The officials also confiscated two smartphones used in the operation.

The car, bearing registration number OR-02-AW-9881 (original number CG-04-HA-2811), was driven by Bapi Pradhan (26), accompanied by a minor. Both were arrested under NDPS Act case number 124/26-27.

Excise sources revealed that the arrested youth hails from the jurisdiction of Phiringia police station in Kandhamal. The raid team included officers Baleswar Dhangadamajhi, Simanchal Majhi, Binata Kumar, Duleswar Pradhan, Daitari Tandi, Pruthviraj Bag, and Siddhant Pattanayak.

Authorities confirmed that the contraband was intended for illegal transport to Balangir.

4 held with 38kg ganja in Patna

Patna: Patna police, along with the Bihar Special Task Force (STF), arrested four people, including a woman, and seized around 38kg of ganja from their possession during a raid near the Labour Court under Jakkanpur police station area on Saturday morning.

According to police, the arrested accused have been identified as Akash Kumar, Poonam Devi, Saurav Kumar and Dharmendra Rai. They received a tip-off that a consignment of ganja was being transported to Patna by train from Narkatiaganj in West Champaran district.

Acting on the information, a joint team of Jakkanpur police and STF set up surveillance near the Labour Court. When the four suspects arrived, police intercepted them and searched their belongings. During the search, officers recovered ganja concealed in a trolley bag. The seized contraband weighed around 38kg.

Patna sadar SDPO-I Manoj Kumar said the accused allegedly revealed during interrogation that the consignment was to be delivered to a man identified as Chandan Baba. Police have launched a search to trace him and identify other members of the suspected smuggling network.

Police are also examining information gathered during questioning to establish the source of the ganja and identify its intended recipients in the city. "Police are probing whether the accused are part of a larger network involved in transporting narcotics from other districts to the state capital," the SDPO said.

The seizure comes two days after another drug haul in Patna. Police had arrested a couple from the Mahavir Sthan area under Kotwali police station and recovered more than 12kg of ganja from their possession.

राज्य ब्यूरो, पटना। राज्य में गांजा, चरस, अफीम, हेरोइन और नशीली दवाओं जैसे सूखे नशे के बड़े तस्करों पर पुलिस अब शिकंजा कसने की तैयारी में है। हाल में जेल से बाहर आए और दोबारा अवैध गतिविधियों में शामिल होने की आशंका वाले तस्करों को एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत एक साल के लिए फिर जेल भेजा जा सकता है।

राज्य स्तर पर ऐसे करीब 60 तस्करों को चिह्नित किया गया है। इनमें से 12 को वापस जेल भेजने का प्रस्ताव दिया गया है। वहीं सभी जिलों के एसपी को नए ड्रग्स गिरोहों की पहचान करने का टास्क सौंपा गया है।

पुराने मामलों का होगा स्पीडी ट्रायल, आर्थिक गतिविधियों की जांच

नारकोटिक्स से जुड़े पुराने और गंभीर मामलों का स्पीडी ट्रायल कराने को कहा गया है। साथ ही ड्रग्स तस्करों की आर्थिक गतिविधियों की भी जांच होगी, ताकि अवैध कारोबार से जुड़े वित्तीय नेटवर्क का पता लगाया जा सके।

1933 पर आने वाली शिकायतों पर 24 घंटे में कार्रवाई

नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो की मानस हेल्पलाइन 1933 पर औसतन 400-500 शिकायतें आ रही हैं। निर्देश दिया गया है कि शिकायत मिलने के 24 घंटे के भीतर थानाध्यक्ष उसका भौतिक सत्यापन कर कार्रवाई करें और रिपोर्ट मुख्यालय को भेजें। शिकायतों की बढ़ती संख्या को देखते हुए राज्य स्तर पर कंट्रोल रूम बनाने पर भी विचार किया जा रहा है।

नशा मुक्ति केंद्रों की भी होगी जांच

राज्य के नशा मुक्ति केंद्रों की कार्यप्रणाली की भी समीक्षा होगी। मरीजों के इलाज और पुनर्वास की व्यवस्था की जांच स्वास्थ्य विभाग के सहयोग से कराई जाएगी। बेहतर काम करने वाले केंद्रों को प्रोत्साहित कर नशा पीड़ितों के पुनर्वास पर जोर दिया जाएगा।

किशनगंज, 22 अगस्त (हि.स.)। मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ किशनगंज पुलिस ने शुक्रवार को दो अलग-अलग स्थानों पर कार्रवाई करते हुए 290.07 ग्राम हेरोइन/स्मैक बरामद की है। पुलिस ने एक महिला समेत तीन आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया है। बरामद हेरोइन की अंतरराष्ट्रीय बाजार में कीमत करीब 60 लाख रुपये आंकी गई है। यह जानकारी एसपी संतोष कुमार ने शनिवार को एसपी कार्यालय में आयोजित प्रेसवार्ता में दी।

एसपी के अनुसार पहली कार्रवाई सदर थाना क्षेत्र के खगड़ा करबला चौक के पास की गई। गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर पुलिस उपाधीक्षक यातायात राजेश कुमार सिंह के नेतृत्व में एएनटीएफ, जिला आसूचना इकाई, विशेष कार्य बल, मद्यनिषेध एवं उत्पाद विभाग तथा सदर थाना पुलिस की संयुक्त टीम ने घेराबंदी कर एक महिला को पकड़ा। तलाशी के दौरान उसके पास से 186.19 ग्राम हेरोइन बरामद हुई। गिरफ्तार महिला की पहचान पश्चिम बंगाल के मालदा जिले के कालियाचक थाना क्षेत्र के मोजमपुर निवासी शैली खातून के रूप में हुई है। पुलिस के अनुसार पूछताछ में महिला ने बताया कि वह कथित तौर पर कालियाचक से हेरोइन लेकर किशनगंज के खगड़ा करबला चौक के पास डिलीवरी देने पहुंची थी। दूसरी कार्रवाई सदर थाना क्षेत्र के सिंहिया कुलामनी में की गई। पुलिस ने सूचना के आधार पर अकबर आलम के घर पर छापेमारी की। तलाशी के दौरान 103.88 ग्राम हेरोइन/स्मैक बरामद किया गया। पुलिस ने अकबर आलम को गिरफ्तार करने के साथ उसकी निशानदेही पर रूईधासा निवासी अभिषेक कुमार को भी गिरफ्तार किया। दोनों कार्रवाइयों में पुलिस ने कुल 290.07 ग्राम हेरोइन/स्मैक, 1.28 लाख रुपये नकद, एक मोटरसाइकिल और दो मोबाइल फोन बरामद किए हैं। दोनों मामलों में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत प्राथमिकी दर्ज कर पुलिस आगे की कार्रवाई कर रही है। पुलिस गिरफ्तार आरोपियों से पूछताछ कर मादक पदार्थ की आपूर्ति के स्रोत और गिरोह के बैकवर्ड एवं फॉरवर्ड लिंकेज का पता लगाने में जुटी है। बरामद मोबाइल की तकनीकी जांच भी की जा रही है। पुलिस का कहना है कि ड्रग नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की पहचान कर उनके खिलाफ भी कार्रवाई की जाएगी। एसपी संतोष कुमार ने कहा कि जिले में नशे के कारोबार के खिलाफ अभियान आगे भी जारी रहेगा।
