Phek, August 29 (MExN): Drug abuse and involvement in drug-related illegal activities remained a serious concern in Phek district, with over 1,000 youths in the district headquarters alone involved in substance use, a legal official said on Saturday.

Addressing a legal awareness programme organised by Nagaland State Legal Services Authority (NSLSA) in collaboration with Phek District Legal Authority (DLSA) and other organisations, the PRA, NSLSA in a press release stated, Legal Aid Defense Counsel (LADC) Vethothi Vero said opium use accounts for nearly 49% of the substance abuse cases in the area.

“The society is no longer alien to the presence and use of illicit drugs... This is a vicious cycle with adverse consequences for families and society,” Vero said, stressing the need for strong and proactive intervention by village leaders and the youth.

He also called for a compassionate approach towards persons struggling with addiction and highlighted the importance of reporting drug-related activities to the police.

Referring to the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985, Vero informed that the law prescribes stringent punishment for serious drug offences, with imprisonment extending up to 20 years in certain cases.

He also highlighted the availability of de-addiction and rehabilitation services, including Opioid Substitution Therapy (OST), and encouraged persons struggling with addiction to seek professional help, adding that addiction can be treated with appropriate support and rehabilitation.

The legal awareness programme was held at the ZAPO Hall in Zuketsa and was jointly organised by the NSLSA, DLSA Phek, Controller of Legal Metrology and Consumer Protection, Nagaland, and Zuketsa Area Public Organization (ZAPO).

Assam Police seize Yaba tablets worth Rs 3 crore in Cachar, three arrested

Assam Police in Cachar district arrested three alleged drug peddlers and seized 9,800 yaba tablets estimated to be worth around Rs 3 crore during a late-night operation in Sonai on Friday, August 28, officials said.



Assam Police in Cachar district arrested three alleged drug peddlers and seized 9,800 yaba tablets estimated to be worth around Rs 3 crore during a late-night operation in Sonai on Friday, August 28, officials said.

The operation was launched following a specific tip-off regarding the movement of suspected drug traffickers in the area. Acting on the information, Cachar Police conducted a raid in Sonai and apprehended three men allegedly involved in drug trafficking.

Police said 9,800 yaba tablets were recovered from the possession of the accused during the operation. The seized contraband has an estimated market value of approximately Rs 3 crore.

Cachar Police confirmed the seizure and arrests in a social media post, stating that the operation was carried out based on a tip-off and resulted in the recovery of the yaba tablets.

The arrested accused have been identified as Kaji Chiru Miya, Krishna Kamal Das and Aabir Das. According to police, all three are residents of West Tripura district and were subsequently arrested in connection with the seizure.

Following the recovery, Cachar Police have launched an investigation to trace the alleged forward and backward links of the arrested persons. Investigators are also examining whether the accused are connected to a larger drug trafficking network operating across state borders.

Further details regarding the source of the contraband, its intended destination and the wider network, if any, are awaited.

Bishnupur Police arrested two drug peddlers and recovered heroin during routine checking. In a separate joint search, security forces seized firearms, grenades and IEDs, and further investigation is underway.

Bishnupur district police arrested two drug peddlers and recovered heroin, while a joint operation by police and security forces separately led to the seizure of a cache of firearms, grenades and improvised explosive devices on August 29.

During routine frisking and checking at Sericulture Training under Phougakchao Ithai police station, personnel intercepted two men and recovered five soap cases containing about 53 grams of Heroin No. 4, police said.

The arrested men were identified as 34-year-old Md Amir Khan of Kwakta Ward No. 3 and 33-year-old Md Bungo of Kwakta Pangal Lamkhai. A Suzuki Burgman Street 125cc two-wheeler was also seized.

In a separate operation, a combined team of Bishnupur district police and security forces recovered a range of weapons and explosives from Keipha Road Patton near a water supply pump.

The recovered items included a 9mm pistol with magazine, a .32 pistol with magazine, a country-made AK rifle with magazine, a country-made MP-9 with magazine, a country-made SBBL, and a country-made .22 rifle with magazine.

Security personnel also recovered two No. 36 hand grenades, two improvised explosive devices (IEDs), ammunition of various calibres and other accessories.

Further investigation is underway.

The Assam Rifles arrested two allegedly illegal Myanmar nationals and recovered 130 grams of heroin valued at approximately ₹24 lakh in Changlang district, Arunachal Pradesh, on August 28, the force announced on Sunday.

The operation took place in the general area of Nampong, based on specific intelligence concerning narcotics smuggling.

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In a statement posted on X, the Assam Rifles said, “Assam Rifles apprehended two illegal Myanmar nationals in the general area of Nampong, Changlang District, Arunachal Pradesh on 28 Aug 2026, based on specific intelligence regarding narcotics smuggling.”

The recovered heroin was seized from the apprehended individuals during the operation.

“The successful operation highlights Assam Rifles’ continued commitment towards curbing illegal infiltration, trans-border narcotics smuggling and ensuring security in the Northeast,” the statement added.

In a separate operation, Assam Rifles in coordination with Mizoram Police seized methamphetamine tablets worth approximately ₹2.63 crore in Aizawl on August 27. Three individuals were arrested, and 878 grams of methamphetamine tablets were recovered.

The apprehended individuals were handed over to Aizawl Police for further investigation and legal action under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (ND&PS) Act.

Additionally, Assam Rifles along with the Customs Preventive Force in Champhai, Mizoram, recovered 437 bags of areca nuts weighing 32,890 kilograms and valued at ₹3,44,68,720 in the general area of Zotlang on August 28.

The seized consignment was handed over to the Customs Preventive Force, Champhai, for further legal proceedings.

Aizawl: Officials of the Mizoram excise and narcotics department seized over 352 grams of heroin from a 27-year-old Myanmar woman and arrested her in Champhai town on Friday night, department spokesperson Peter Zohmingthanga said on Saturday.

Lalpekmawi (27), a resident of Khawmawi village in Myanmar's Chin state, was booked under relevant sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, at Champhai Excise & Narcotics Station.

The department has seized over 17.632 kg of heroin during this year, Zohmingthanga said. It has also seized 68.138 kg of methamphetamine and 11.531 kg of crystal meth during the same period.

Other seizures include 145.499 kg of cannabis (marijuana) and other clinical drugs widely abused by youths in the state.

Meanwhile, leaders of the central committee of Young Mizo Association (YMA) said the availability of drugs in Mizoram had declined significantly due to concerted efforts by enforcement agencies and civil society groups. They said the reduced availability had prompted some drug users to travel to Assam to purchase drugs.

The issue was raised in a meeting of 'Working Committee on Ruihhlo Do' (combat against drugs) chaired by Mizoram excise & narcotics minister Lalnghinglova Hmar on Friday. The committee suggested that a meeting of the superintendents of police of Mizoram's Kolasib district and Assam's Cachar district be held soon to initiate coordinated efforts to combat drug trafficking along the inter-state border.

541 kg of ganja seized in Tripura, cash and phones recovered

Agartala, Aug 29: A major drug haul was unearthed in Tripura's Sonamura on Saturday, with a joint team of police, BSF and TSR seizing 541.2 kg of dry ganja from a residential premises at Matinagar Madhya Para.

Acting on specific intelligence, personnel from Sonamura Police Station, 81 Battalion BSF and 11th Battalion TSR raided the house in Ward No. 5 and recovered the ganja packed in 12 blue plastic drums.

The team also seized ₹5.04 lakh in cash, several Android mobile phones and other documents during the operation.

The owner of the house was arrested and a case has been registered at Sonamura Police Station under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985. The accused is expected to be produced before the local court, with police seeking remand for further investigation.

The seizure followed a coordinated operation by Sonamura Police, the BSF and Tripura State Rifles. Investigators are now probing the source of the consignment and its intended destination.

Awareness on drug trafficking and substance abuse

DIMAPUR: A drug trafficking and substance abuse awareness campaign was held at the Conference Hall of Police Baptist Church, Wokha, on August 28 with the objective of sensitising students and the public on the dangers of drug abuse, drug trafficking and tobacco consumption. The programme was organised by DEF Wokha/ANTF Wokha in collaboration with Wokha District Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan, District AIDS Prevention & Control Unit and District Tobacco Control Unit. Around 80 participants attended the programme.

According to PRO DEF Wokha, Addl. SP Wokha and Nodal Officer, ANTF Wokha, Biren Lotha spoke on drug trafficking and substance abuse, highlighting major drug hotspots, inter state movement of drugs and the need for greater awareness and vigilance among students and the community. District Welfare Officer, Wokha, C. James Ezung explained different types of drugs, their effects and the meaning of drug abuse and intoxication. He encouraged students to share problems with trusted elders and seek help when facing difficulties, stressing the message of “Refuse, Resist and Report” as an approach to prevent drug abuse. Speaking on the harmful effects of tobacco, Psychologist (NTCP), DH Wokha, Tshopeu Khutsoh discussed the composition of tobacco and its two broad forms- smoking and smokeless. She noted that there are around 274 million tobacco users worldwide, with India among the major tobacco producing countries. She sensitised students on the health consequences of tobacco consumption, including oral cancer, and reminded them of the prohibition on sale of tobacco products to persons below 18 years and within 100 yards of educational institutions. Students were also informed about the availability of free treatment for tobacco users at Dr. Motsuo Memorial Hospital, Wokha, and encouraged to seek professional assistance. The release added that an interactive session was conducted, allowing participants to raise questions and engage with resource persons. On the spot medical testing for HIV, syphilis and hepatitis was also carried out as part of the programme.

Meth-odical raid DRI sleuths seize 19kg amphetamine in two cases in Bengaluru

BENGALURU: The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Bengaluru Zonal Unit (DRI-BZU), in less than a month, has seized over 19 kg of suspected amphetamine in two separate cases in Bengaluru under ‘Operation Meth Endgame’. The network spans from Karnataka to Delhi/NCR region, said sources.

“In the first case, the DRI seized around 4.594 kg of suspected amphetamine from north Bengaluru on July 30. This led to the detection of an organised trafficking and financial network involving clandestine deliveries, digital coordination and movement of drug proceeds,” said sources. “In the second incident, the DRI officials seized 14.98 kg of crystalline substance suspected to be amphetamine from another trafficking network on August 25.”

Amphetamine is a psycho stimulant, which acts on the central nervous system. It is banned under the Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985. “The market value of the over 19 kg amphetamine in the underground market is roughly around Rs 19.5 crore. The price of a contraband drug depends upon the demand and availability,” said the sources.

The DRI has been on the trail to unearth the drug trafficking network since July last year, when the DRI, Mangaluru Regional Unit (MRU), had intercepted a female passenger travelling to Bengaluru from Delhi by bus and seized 3.8 kg of crystal methamphetamine from her in Belagavi.

“After an investigation that spanned from Bengaluru to Delhi/NCR region, the DRI between August 9 and 10, identified a residential premises in Jewar area, Gautam Buddha Nagar, Uttar Pradesh, which was reportedly being used for manufacturing of methamphetamine by an Indian lady, who was acting on behalf of a Nigerian male.

He was apprehended from an apartment in Noida. It was a full fledged methamphetamine manufacturing unit with the complete infrastructure including precursor chemicals, equipment and tools etc.

The DRI (MRU) seized 30 kg precursor chemicals along with the manufacturing equipment,” said sources. “In a quick follow up action on August 25, the DRI-BZU seized 14.98 kg of amphetamine from a lady travelling from Delhi to Bengaluru by train at the KSR Railway Station,” they said.

“Although the two cases involve separate syndicates, the investigations revealed a similar pattern wherein different persons performed compartmentalised roles relating to transportation, collection, receipt and intended onward delivery of the suspected contraband. The trafficking arrangements were coordinated through mobile phones, WhatsApp calls, photographs and location-based instructions.

Pre-arranged meeting points and intermediaries were used for transferring consignments, while the handlers attempted to remain physically removed from the actual movement and handover of the suspected contraband. The DRI is analysing digital and electronic evidence, examining communication patterns to unravel the wider trafficking networks. Eight persons have been arrested so far under the ‘Operation Meth Endgame’ in both cases,” said sources.

DRI intercepts a woman, recovers 7 packets of Amphetamine drug

Enquiry revealed that on August 25, in an intelligence-led operation, officers of DRI intercepted an Indian woman passenger at KSR Bengaluru Railway Station.

She was travelling by train from New Delhi to Bengaluru and was suspected to be carrying a large quantity of contraband drugs.

Detailed examination of her baggage resulted in the recovery of seven packets containing a crystalline substance, weighing 14.9 kg (approx.) which, on preliminary testing using a field drug detection kit, indicated the presence of Amphetamine.

The recovered psychotropic substance, along with the relevant packing and concealment material, was seized under the provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Based on information gathered during the proceedings, DRI officers conducted a swift follow-up operation at the designated delivery location. A person who arrived at the spot to receive the baggage from the carrier was intercepted. Further follow-up action led to the interception of another person

who had come to receive the contraband from the first receiver. All three persons involved in the transportation and attempted receipt of the contraband were arrested under the provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985.

In another unrelated intelligence-led operation on 25.08.2026, DRI intercepted another Indian woman passenger at Pune Junction station, who was travelling by train from Hazrat Nizamuddin Railway Station, Delhi, via Pune.

Detailed examination of her baggage resulted in the recovery of a white/yellow-coloured crystalline substance purported to be Amphetamine, weighing 2.53 kg (approx.) and tablets purported to be 3,4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA), weighing 878 grams (gross). The recovered contraband was seized under the provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985, and the passenger was arrested.

The latest seizures form part of DRI's intensified efforts to interdict synthetic drugs and dismantle trafficking networks operating across the country. In a fortnight, DRI has now seized around 150 kg Amphetamine Type Stimulant (ATS) class of drugs in five operations, including 76 kg Methamphetamine tablets in two operations along India's North-Eastern frontier and 55.86 kg Methamphetamine concealed by mixing it with maize/corn in an export consignment destined for Jeddah, Saudi Arabia.

Malappuram (Keralam), Aug 29 (PTI) Over 12 kg MDMA worth around Rs 10 crore was recovered from a vehicle in Coimbatore and three people were arrested as part of a probe into an earlier drug seizure in Manjeri, here, District Police Chief Chaitra Teresa John said on Saturday.

In a press conference, John said that the arrest and seizure was made as part of the investigation into a commercial quantity drug seizure case registered at Manjeri police station on August 6, in which nearly 97 grams of MDMA was recovered.

Six people were initially arrested in that case.

North Goa Special NDPS Court has rejected the bail application of a 25-year-old Liberian national, Patrick Bah, who was arrested in October

The North Goa Special NDPS Court has rejected the bail application of a 25-year-old Liberian national, Patrick Bah, who was arrested in October 2024 for alleged possession of commercial/intermediate quantities of ecstasy and methamphetamine, citing the accused's prior criminal antecedents under the NDPS Act, the risk of absconding, and the absence of any substantial change in circumstances since his previous bail rejections.

According to the prosecution, Bah was apprehended during a raid conducted by Anjuna Police on October 24, 2024 in Siolim, Bardez. Police seized 18 suspected ecstasy tablets (weighing 7.68 grams) and 23.98 grams of suspected methamphetamine from his possession. A case was subsequently registered under the NDPS Act.

The current plea marked Bah's fifth attempt at securing bail. Three earlier applications had been dismissed by the Special Court, while a fourth was withdrawn before the High Court of Bombay at Goa in March 2026.

A special NDPS court has rejected the bail pleas of Nitesh Khemlani, MBA students Pratik Pandey and Raunak Khandelwal, accused in connection with two suspected drug overdose deaths at a techno music concert held at Mumbai's NESCO Exhibition Centre. The court cited their alleged involvement and the possibility of witness pressure and investigation tampering.

The special NDPS court has rejected the bail pleas of Nitesh Khemlani, students Pratik Pandey and Raunak Khandelwal, who are accused in connection with two 'drug overdose' deaths during a music concert at the NESCO Exhibition Centre.

Two MBA students died and several others were hospitalised following a suspected drug overdose at a techno music concert held on April 11.

Accused seek bail

Seeking bail, Khandelwal claimed there was no material to establish his link with the “unfortunate” deaths.

Similarly, Pandey asserted that those injured and deceased were “habitual to partying and consuming pills”.

Prosecution allegations

According to the prosecution, Khemlani received a huge amount from his brother Nitesh, another key accused, and the money was spent on buying 4,000 MDMA pills overseas.

Pandey had sought pills following demand from his peers and had even received money from them to arrange the contraband, the prosecution argued.

He also distributed the pills to Khandelwal and others, it claimed, adding that the latter further passed on the drugs.

In his defence, Khemlani said he had been unemployed for the past four to five years and had been using his wife's bank account during this period.

DRI Mumbai Busts Drug Trafficking Network, 547 grams of Cocaine Seized

DRI Mumbai busts drug trafficking network, seizes 547 grams of cocaine; two foreign nationals arrested IANS

THE DIRECTORATE OF REVENUE INTELLIGENCE (DRI), Mumbai Zonal Unit, has busted an alleged drug trafficking network and seized 547 grams of a substance that tested positive for cocaine/methaqualone during an operation in Mira Road, Mumbai, the agency said in a statement.

Acting on specific intelligence, DRI officers launched surveillance after receiving information that a Kenyan national was travelling by bus from Indore to Mumbai to allegedly deliver a consignment of narcotic drugs to a Nigerian national.

According to the agency, DRI officials intercepted the Kenyan woman along with a Nigerian national who had arrived in Mira Road to receive the suspected drug consignment.

During the examination of the Kenyan national's bag, officers recovered two packets marked "LV". The packets contained a white crystalline substance with a combined weight of 547 grams. The substance was tested using an NDPS field-testing kit and was found to be positive for cocaine/methaqualone, the DRI said.

The recovered substance has been seized, and both individuals have been arrested under the provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985. The agency said further investigation into the case is currently underway.

In its statement, the DRI said, "This operation reflects DRI's continued commitment to intelligence-led enforcement against the trafficking of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, thereby disrupting drug trafficking networks and safeguarding public health and society from the menace of narcotics."

The agency said such operations are aimed at identifying and disrupting organised networks involved in the illicit movement and distribution of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances. Intelligence-led surveillance, it added, remains an important component of efforts to prevent illegal drug trafficking and curb the circulation of narcotics.

The DRI also linked the latest enforcement action to the broader government campaign against drug abuse and illicit narcotics. The agency said sustained enforcement efforts contribute to the Government's vision of a 'Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan' by reducing the availability and illegal circulation of narcotic drugs.

The seizure in Mira Road comes as enforcement agencies continue to intensify efforts against drug trafficking networks operating across state and international boundaries. The DRI's investigation is expected to establish the source of the seized substance, its intended destination and the wider network, if any, connected to the two arrested individuals.

DODA, Aug 29: District Magistrate Doda, Krishan Lal and Senior Superintendent of Police Doda, Kartik Shrotriya today jointly chaired a meeting of the District Level Committee under the National Coordination Committee for Drug Law Enforcement (NCORD) to review measures being taken to curb drug abuse and strengthen enforcement against the illegal drug trade in the district.

The meeting held a detailed review of the prevailing drug situation, enforcement activities, preventive measures, awareness programmes and inter-departmental coordination to tackle the menace of drug abuse.

During the meeting, various issues were discussed including installation of CCTV cameras at vulnerable spots, action against drug peddlers, strengthening of surveillance and intensification of awareness programmes.

District Social Welfare Officer, Doda briefed the chair about the detailed Action Taken Report on the directions issued during the previous NCORD meeting. He also highlighted the achievements under the anti-drug drive including training of counsellors, Information, Education and Communication (IEC) campaigns and other initiatives undertaken under the Anti-Drug Abuse Campaign.

The District Magistrate stressed the need for a coordinated and sustained approach involving all concerned departments to prevent drug abuse, particularly among youth. He directed the officers to intensify awareness activities in educational institutions and vulnerable areas and ensure effective implementation of measures aimed at making the district drug-free.

SSP Doda stressed the need for strict action against illicit cultivation, possession, transportation and supply of narcotic substances. He directed that information regarding illicit cultivation and the transportation of narcotic substances through courier services be promptly shared with the concerned

officers and SHOs. He called for enhanced surveillance, intelligence sharing and close coordination among enforcement agencies to identify and dismantle drug networks.

The DM and SSP called upon all stakeholders to work collectively towards creating a safe and drug-free environment in the district, with special focus on protecting young people from the harmful effects of substance abuse.

The meeting was attended by ACD Doda, DSWO Doda, concerned BMOs, Narcotics Officers, Agriculture Officers and other concerned officials. ADC Bhaderwah, SDMs, Tehsildars, BDOs and Police Officers participated virtually.

Jaipur, Aug 29 (IANS) The Rajasthan Police have taken major action under 'Operation Trinetra' against assets allegedly acquired through drug trafficking, police said on Saturday.

Police have frozen movable and immovable properties worth around Rs 2.82 crore belonging to history-sheeter and alleged hardcore criminal Ajab Khan of Devaldi village, under Arnod police station.

Police said that 14 criminal cases, including charges related to attempted murder, drug trafficking and illegal weapons, are registered against Khan in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh.

The action was taken under Section 68F(1) of the NDPS Act following directions from Rajasthan Director General of Police Rajeev Kumar Sharma.

Under the direction of Pratapgarh Superintendent of Police (SP) Vishal Jangid and supervision of Additional SP Jaydev Siyag, Arnod police prepared a proposal for freezing the alleged illegal assets.

The documents were submitted to the competent authority and administrator under SAFEMA and the NDPS Act in New Delhi.

Following the hearing, the competent authority approved the freezing order on August 28, 2026, and made it permanent.

According to the police, Khan was allegedly involved in a case involving 796 kg of illegal doda chura (refers to a narcotic substance poppy straw or poppy husk).

On June 16, 2020, Lohawat police in Phalodi district recovered 796 kg of the substance from a truck.

During the investigation, the arrested truck driver allegedly told police that the consignment had been loaded by Ajab Khan, son of Amirgul Khan and a resident of Devaldi under Arnod police station.

The Phalodi Superintendent of Police had announced a Rs 25,000 reward for information leading to Khan's arrest.

After remaining absconding for nearly six years, Khan was arrested by Arnod police on March 28, 2026, and subsequently handed over to Lohawat police. He is currently in judicial custody at the Jaisalmer District Jail.

Police records describe Khan as a history-sheeter and alleged hardcore criminal of Arnod police station.

A total of 14 cases are registered against him in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh under various provisions, including the NDPS Act, attempted murder, assault, drug trafficking, Arms Act, SC/ST Act, gambling and obstruction of government officials.

According to the police investigation, Khan allegedly acquired movable and immovable assets over the past six years using proceeds from drug trafficking.

Police said several properties were registered not in Khan's name or the names of his immediate family members, but in the names of distant relatives and acquaintances.

Investigators allege that although the properties were formally registered in other names, they were being used and controlled by Khan and his family.

The frozen immovable assets in Devaldi village include a farmhouse, garage, buffalo farm, residential house, poultry farm, goat farm and a tin shed constructed on around four bighas of land.

Police have estimated their current market value at around Rs 2.50 crore.

The investigation also identified several vehicles allegedly purchased in the names of relatives and acquaintances. These include a Thar jeep and Maruti Swift car, a motorcycle, a Mahindra tractor, a Splendor Plus Xtec, two other motorcycles and a TVS Apache.

Taking into account the estimated current market value of the vehicles and immovable properties, police have assessed the total value of the frozen assets at around Rs 2,82,80,000.

Police said their investigation found that one parcel of land on which a farmhouse and houses were constructed was registered in the name of Gulor Khan, son of Afzal Khan, although investigators allege that Ajab Khan had purchased and was using the property.

Similarly, another parcel of land was reportedly registered in the names of other individuals but was allegedly under Khan's possession.

Police suspect that registering the assets in the names of relatives and acquaintances was intended to keep them beyond the immediate reach of legal action.

Police said the proposal to freeze Khan's alleged illegal assets was submitted to the competent authority on July 30, 2026, following financial verification and examination of relevant documents.

After the hearing process was completed, the competent authority approved the freezing order on August 28 and made it permanent.

Pratapgarh Police said the action is part of its ongoing efforts under 'Operation Trinetra' to identify and target assets allegedly generated through drug trafficking and other organised criminal activities.

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Accused In ₹70-Crore MD Drug Case Arrested After 5 Years On The Run By Indore Crime Branch

Indore Crime Branch has arrested Akran Khan, wanted since 2021 in a major drug case involving the seizure of 70 kg of mephedrone worth around Rs 70 crore and Rs 13.03 lakh cash. Police are questioning him about the drug source, suppliers, financial transactions and others allegedly linked to the network.

Indore (Madhya Pradesh): City Crime Branch arrested Akran Khan, wanted in a high-profile 2021 case involving 70 kg of mephedrone (MD) worth around Rs 70 crore. Police had also seized Rs 13.03 lakh in cash in the case.

According to DCP (Crime) Rajesh Kumar Tripathi, the case dates back to Jan 6, 2021, when the Crime Branch arrested several accused during an illegal MD drug deal on Sanawadiya Road.

A total of 70 kg of mephedrone and Rs 13.03 lakh in cash were seized. A case was registered under various sections of the NDPS Act, IPC and IT Act.

Khan, a resident of Panchsheel Nagar in Nashik, Maharashtra, had been wanted since then. He works in the scrap business. The Crime Branch finally arrested him after efforts to trace him.

Police are questioning Khan about his alleged role, the source of the drugs, suppliers, financial transactions and others linked to the network. Police said he also has a criminal case registered against him in Maharashtra.

Tripathi said the arrest was part of Indore Police's continued action against drug trafficking.

Tripathi said that in 2026, the City Crime Branch has registered 62 cases under the NDPS Act and arrested 129 accused.

Police seized 2.958 kg of MD, 28.338 kg of ganja, 500 kg of bhang, 268.58 grams of brown sugar and 10 grams of cocaine. Drugs and vehicles worth around Rs 3.57 crore were seized in these cases.

Shimla police nab drug peddler trying to flee to Abu Dhabi at Ahmedabad airport

The Shimla police have arrested three major inter-state drug peddlers and seized 1.1 kg of high-grade heroin at Shoghi. One of the suspects, Azad Singh—a resident of Naraingarh in Ambala district—was intercepted at Ahmedabad airport while preparing to flee to Abu Dhabi.

According to the police, the investigation uncovered that Azad is linked to another previously arrested accused, Shubhkarman Singh. They said that Azad was preparing to flee the country for Abu Dhabi and had already obtained a passport and a tourist visa.

Azad was produced before a court in Ahmedabad to secure transit remand and was brought to Shimla and a three day police remand has been obtained.

According to the police, the three accused —Vijay Kumar, Shubhkarman Singh (alias Sultan), and Azad Singh—used the 'Signal' app to communicate, thereby keeping their activities hidden from the scrutiny of investigative agencies.

According to the investigation, the heroin consignment provided by Shubhkarman alias Sultan, of Tarn Taran district, Punjab, was to be forwarded through various members of the network. The consignment was passed from Shubhkarman to Vijay via Azad; the accused, Vijay, had arrived in Shimla with this 1.1 kg consignment of heroin, which was subsequently intercepted and seized by the Shimla police's special cell.

With the arrest of Azad Singh, a total of three accused have now been arrested in this case. Vijay was arrested near Shoghi on August 3 with 1.1 kg of high-grade heroin.

Drug supplier arrested from Ambala

In a separate case, the Jubbal police station has busted an inter-state heroin supply network and arrested Sunny Singh from Ambala. Investigations have revealed that the network's links extend to Punjab and Haryana, in addition to Himachal Pradesh.

The case stems from an FIR registered on July 15, 2026 under Sections 21 and 29 of the NDPS Act at the Jubbal police station, following the seizure of 9.57gm of heroin from the possession of the accused, Ravindra Kumar a resident of Ghumarwin, District Bilaspur.

During police interrogation, Ravindra revealed that he had procured heroin from Sunny Singh in Zirakpur. The questioning also uncovered a location-based delivery module used by the network. A total of 24gm of heroin has been recovered so far in connection with the case.

Absconding accused arrested

In a third case, police station sadar Shimla arrested Karan, a resident of Amritsar, Punjab, who had been absconding in connection with a heroin smuggling case. This case was registered on December 25, 2025 under Sections 21 and 29 of the NDPS Act. In the said case, 6 gm of heroin had previously been recovered from the possession of an accused named Ankush alias Sudama. During interrogation, Ankush had said that he obtained the contraband from Sagar. Ankush, Praveen Chauhan alias Bobby, and Sagar were arrested during the course of the investigation.

A financial investigation into the case revealed that Sagar had transferred a sum of ₹3 lakh to Karan's HDFC bank account and other accounts. Based on this financial link, it was established that Karan was the key kingpin of this heroin smuggling network.

Chilli powder attack helps heroin accused flee police custody

Chandigarh: A man arrested by the Khanna CIA in a heroin seizure case allegedly escaped from police custody after he and his relatives threw red chilli powder into the eyes of police personnel during a search of his Sector 38 residence on Friday evening.

The accused, Deepak Thapa, a resident of Sector 38, was arrested by the Khanna CIA on Aug 26 based on information obtained during the interrogation of another accused, who was allegedly found in possession of around 500 grams of heroin.

According to a complaint filed by the Khanna CIA team with Maloya police, Thapa revealed during questioning that the heroin was concealed at his residence. Acting on this information, a CIA team took him, in handcuffs, to his house around 6pm on Friday to recover the contraband.

Punjab Police personnel alleged that after entering the house, Thapa requested permission to use the bathroom and asked the officers to remove his handcuffs. As soon as the restraints were removed, he allegedly joined hands with his relatives and threw red chilli powder into the eyes of the policemen accompanying him.

Caught off guard by the sudden attack and resulting confusion, the police personnel were unable to prevent Thapa from fleeing the spot.

Following the incident, the Khanna CIA team informed Maloya police and lodged a formal complaint. A case has been registered against Thapa and others allegedly involved in helping him escape. Police teams have launched a search operation to trace the accused.

The incident has also raised questions about coordination between Punjab Police and Chandigarh Police during inter-state investigations. According to Maloya police, the Khanna CIA team did not inform the local police station before bringing the accused to Chandigarh and conducting the search at his residence. Local police were reportedly informed only after Thapa had escaped from custody.

Police records indicate that Thapa has a criminal history and has previously been named in cases under the NDPS Act, Arms Act and a murder case. He has reportedly been jailed multiple times.

His name has also surfaced in investigations involving Nigerian nationals arrested with heroin in Chandigarh.

Police are now conducting raids at Thapa's suspected hideouts and questioning persons who may have provided him shelter or assistance after the escape. Investigators are also trying to determine how the accused managed to evade the police team and whether others played a role in facilitating his escape.

CBN seizes 66.8 lakh psychotropic tablets in interstate drug diversion bust under Operation Vajra 2.0

Gwalior (Madhya Pradesh) [India], August 29 (ANI): The Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN) has seized 66,79,980 psychotropic tablets during a two-day operation under "Operation Vajra 2.0" on the Chandigarh-Baddi route in the Punjab-Himachal Pradesh corridor, officials said on Saturday. The seized consignment comprised 59,08,100 [Alprazolam](#) tablets, 7,47,780 [Tramadol](#) tablets, 23,700 [Nitrazepam](#) tablets and 400 [Clonazepam](#) tablets. One person has been arrested, and the truck allegedly used for transporting the consignment has been seized. According to CBN officials, the operation was launched by its Madhya Pradesh Unit based on intelligence developed by its Neemuch team regarding the movement of a large illicit consignment of psychotropic medicines.

A special team maintained an overnight watch on the Chandigarh-Baddi interstate route before intercepting a suspicious truck bearing Uttar Pradesh registration on August 27, officials said. The vehicle and its driver were taken to a secure location, where officers conducted a detailed search and recovered 120 master cartons containing controlled substances hidden in cargo. During examination, officials found that batch numbers, manufacturing dates and expiry dates had reportedly been erased from a large number of blister strips and boxes. The CBN said several medicines were also marked "Not to be sold in Punjab Haryana State", yet were being transported into the region. The consignment was allegedly being transported without valid invoices, bills, or e-way bills, raising questions about the legitimacy of the shipment, officials said. The inventory and sealing process took more than 14 hours, following which the entire consignment and the truck were formally seized under the provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985. The CBN said one suspect has been arrested under the NDPS Act and further investigation is underway to trace the manufacturing sources and distribution network allegedly involved in the diversion of pharmaceutical drugs and identify other persons connected with the case. The seizure forms part of the CBN's enforcement efforts under the "Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan". According to the agency, it has registered 197 cases, arrested 272 people and dismantled six clandestine drug-manufacturing laboratories across the country so far in 2026. The agency said its enforcement actions during the year have also resulted in the seizure of around 51,000 kg of narcotic drugs and more than 12.7 crore psychotropic tablets and capsules nationwide. Two held for selling codeine-based cough syrup in Shravasti

Lucknow: A joint team of the drug enforcement department and police seized a large quantity of prohibited medicines, including codeine-based cough syrup, during a raid at a medical store and arrested two accused in Shravasti district. The action followed the circulation of a video showing the sale of codeine-containing syrup from a house in Badla Baijnathpur village under the Hardatt Nagar Girant police station area. ASP Chandrakesh Singh said the authorities had received confidential information about the sale of prohibited medicines. Following the tip-off, drug inspector Shrikant Gupta and Hardatt Nagar Girant police station in charge Mahilanath Upadhyay, along with their teams, conducted the raid. During the operation, officials recovered 437 bottles of 100ml Anrex syrup containing codeine and 121 bottles of Choco DX syrup. A total of 558 bottles of the prohibited syrups were seized. The team also recovered 11,280 ProxiHom Spas capsules packed in 47 boxes, 2,160 Semplux Plus tablets packed in nine boxes and 3,600 Alprazone 0.5 tablets packed in six boxes. According to the police, all the recovered syrups and medicines fall under the category of prohibited or restricted drugs.

The seizure is being examined as part of the investigation into their alleged illegal sale and distribution. The two men arrested in connection with the case have been identified as Shivaji, a resident of Panditpurwa in Jot Chandpara village under Hardi police station in Bahraich district, and Bharat Kumar, a resident of Gosainpurwa, also in Bahraich. An FIR has been registered against the two accused. They were subsequently produced before a court and sent to judicial custody. Police and drug enforcement officials are now investigating the source of the prohibited medicines and determining whether the accused were part of a larger network involved in the illegal supply and distribution of codeine-based syrups and other restricted medicines.

Jammu and Kashmir is facing a growing battle against drug addiction, a crisis that is no longer confined to a few individuals or isolated communities. The increasing availability of narcotics, particularly heroin and other opioids, has made drug de-addiction an urgent priority, demanding a response that combines strict action against traffickers with accessible treatment, rehabilitation and social reintegration.

The seriousness of the problem has become increasingly visible in recent years. A government survey conducted in 2022 across ten districts of the Kashmir Valley estimated around 70,000 people affected by substance use, including nearly 50,000 heroin users. While these figures are not a current census and must be interpreted cautiously, they provide an indication of the scale of the challenge. Earlier national data had also identified Jammu and Kashmir as a region with a significant burden of opioid use.

Behind every statistic is a human story. Addiction can begin with experimentation, curiosity or peer pressure and gradually turn into dependence. For some young people, unemployment, emotional distress, family problems, social isolation and frustration can make drugs appear to offer temporary escape. What begins as occasional consumption can eventually damage physical and mental health, education, employment, relationships and family stability.

The most disturbing aspect of the situation is its impact on the younger generation. Jammu and Kashmir has a large and energetic youth population whose potential is vital to the region's future. When young people become trapped in substance abuse, the loss is not limited to the individual. Families suffer emotionally and financially, communities lose productive members and society pays a long-term price.

The drug problem is also changing. Heroin and opioids remain major concerns, but cannabis, pharmaceutical medicines and other substances are also part of the wider picture. This means that prevention strategies cannot focus on a single drug. Healthcare institutions, schools, parents and law-enforcement agencies must remain alert to changing patterns of substance use and intervene before experimentation becomes dependency.

Jammu and Kashmir has taken several important steps to confront the challenge. De-addiction and treatment facilities have expanded across both divisions, while government-supported Addiction Treatment Facilities and District De-Addiction Centres are providing medical care, counselling and rehabilitation services. De-addiction services have also been made available at the district level, helping bring treatment closer to communities.

The growing number of people approaching treatment centres is significant. Government-supported facilities have recorded a sharp increase in people receiving treatment for drug addiction in recent years. This rise should not automatically be viewed only as evidence of worsening addiction. It may also indicate greater awareness, improved access to treatment and a growing willingness among families and individuals to seek professional help. The fact that more people are coming forward can therefore be seen as both a warning and a sign of changing attitudes towards recovery.

The ongoing Nasha Mukta Bharat and Nasha Mukta Jammu and Kashmir campaigns have further strengthened the preventive response. Awareness programmes are being conducted in schools, colleges, villages and urban communities, with increasing participation from youth, parents, teachers, religious leaders and civil society. The administration has also strengthened district-level coordination to connect prevention, enforcement, treatment and rehabilitation.

But awareness alone cannot cure addiction. A person dependent on drugs may understand the dangers perfectly well and still find it extremely difficult to stop. Addiction affects behaviour, physical health and psychological functioning, making professional intervention essential. Treatment must therefore be accessible, confidential, affordable and sustained over time.

This is where rehabilitation becomes the heart of the response. De-addiction should not end when a patient stops consuming drugs or completes detoxification. Recovery is a long-term process. After leaving a treatment centre, a recovering person may face cravings, anxiety, unemployment, family conflict, social pressure and the possibility of relapse. Without continued support, the individual can easily return to the environment in which addiction developed.

Rehabilitation must therefore be about rebuilding lives. Counselling, family therapy, education, vocational training, employment opportunities, peer support and community participation can help recovering persons regain confidence and independence. A person who has overcome addiction needs more than a certificate of treatment; he or she needs an opportunity to live a meaningful and productive life.

The government's growing focus on rehabilitation and socio-economic reintegration is therefore encouraging. Employment deserves particular attention because meaningful work provides income, dignity, routine and purpose. Vocational training and livelihood support can help recovering individuals become financially independent and reduce the social and economic pressures that can contribute to relapse.

Families are equally important in the recovery process. Unfortunately, stigma remains one of the greatest barriers to treatment. Many families hesitate to acknowledge addiction because they fear criticism from relatives, neighbours or the wider community. Some attempt to conceal the problem until it becomes severe. Such attitudes can delay professional intervention and make recovery more difficult.

Addiction should not be treated as a source of family shame. Seeking treatment is an act of responsibility. Families need counselling and support so that they understand the nature of addiction and learn how to help a recovering member without either abandoning or enabling them. Communities, too, must stop permanently labelling people who have completed treatment. A recovering person deserves the opportunity to rebuild his or her identity.

Schools and colleges have an equally important preventive role. Anti-drug education should go beyond occasional lectures, rallies and posters. Students need continuous guidance about substance abuse, peer pressure, emotional well-being and healthy decision-making. Teachers and counsellors should be trained to identify early warning signs and direct vulnerable students towards appropriate support.

At the same time, prevention must be linked to opportunity. Young people need education, employment, sports, entrepreneurship, cultural activities and meaningful participation in community life. A youth policy that creates hope and purpose is also a powerful drug-prevention strategy.

Law enforcement remains another essential pillar. Jammu and Kashmir's geographical location has made it vulnerable to narcotics trafficking and organised networks. Recent seizures, arrests and action against trafficking networks demonstrate that authorities are intensifying the fight against the illegal drug trade. Such action is necessary because those who profit from addiction must face the full force of the law.

There is also an urgent need for reliable, regularly updated data on drug use across Jammu and Kashmir. Better district-level information would allow policymakers to identify emerging trends, vulnerable populations and gaps in treatment services. Rural and remote areas deserve particular

attention because distance, stigma and limited awareness can prevent people from reaching specialised facilities.

The fight against drugs is ultimately a fight for the future of Jammu and Kashmir. Every person who recovers represents more than an individual victory. It means a family restored, a livelihood regained, a child protected from the consequences of addiction and a productive citizen returning to society.

Jammu and Kashmir therefore needs to move towards a culture of prevention, treatment and recovery while maintaining firm action against traffickers. The goal should not merely be to make “Nasha Mukht Jammu and Kashmir” a slogan, but to turn it into a sustained social mission.

Shimla News: चरस के साथ पकड़े दोषी को दो वर्ष की कठोर कैद

चौपाल में बस से पकड़ा गया था दोषी

विशेष न्यायाधीश प्रवीण गर्ग की अदालत का फैसला संवाद न्यूज एजेंसी

शिमला। चौपाल क्षेत्र में एचआरटीसी बस में यात्रा के दौरान चरस के साथ पकड़े दोषी को दो साल के कठोर कारावास और 20,000 रुपये जुर्माने की सजा सुनाई है। यह फैसला विशेष न्यायाधीश प्रवीण गर्ग की अदालत ने सुनाया। दोषी से 199.050 ग्राम चरस पकड़ी थी।

जुर्माना न भरने पर दोषी को तीन महीने की अतिरिक्त साधारण कैद भुगतनी होगी। अभियोजन पक्ष के अनुसार, 16 फरवरी 2025 को पुलिस थाना चौपाल की टीम गश्त पर थी। सुबह के समय चौपाल गैस एजेंसी के पास चौपाल की तरफ से आ रही एचआरटीसी बस को चेकिंग के लिए रोका गया। बस की तलाशी के दौरान सीट पर बैठे नेरवा निवासी दोषी श्याम सिंह पुलिस को देखकर घबरा गया। संदेह होने पर पुलिस ने बस के कंडक्टर और एक सहयात्री को स्वतंत्र गवाह के रूप में शामिल किया। दोषी की गोद में रखे पिट्टू बैग की तलाशी लेने पर उसमें नमकीन, परफ्यूम और कोल्ड ड्रिंक की बोतल के नीचे एक पाउच में 199.050 ग्राम चरस बरामद की गई। पुलिस ने मौके पर सभी कानूनी औपचारिकताएं पूरी करने के बाद आरोपी के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा 20 के तहत मामला दर्ज किया। अदालत में सुनवाई के दौरान बचाव पक्ष ने तर्क दिया कि बैग बस के ऊपरी रैक में रखा था और दोषी को झूठा फंसाया है। हालांकि अभियोजन पक्ष ने 16 गवाहों के बयान और एसएफएसएल से प्राप्त फॉरेंसिक रिपोर्ट पेश कर अपराध को बिना किसी संदेह के साबित किया। अदालत ने अपने फैसले में कहा कि बरामद चरस की मात्रा छोटी मात्रा से अधिक और व्यावसायिक मात्रा से काफी कम है। दोषी के आपराधिक रिकॉर्ड और पारिवारिक स्थिति को ध्यान में रखते हुए अदालत ने दो साल के कारावास और जुर्माने की सजा सुनाई।

जागरण संवाददाता, मोहाली। चंडीगढ़-बढ़ी हाईवे पर एक ट्रक में छिपाकर ले जाई जा रही नशे की दवाओं की खेप ने जांच एजेंसियों को भी हैरान कर दिया। केंद्रीय नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो की टीम ने कार्रवाई करते हुए ट्रक से करीब 67.80 लाख साइकोट्रोपिक टैबलेट और कैप्सूल बरामद किए।

खेप को 120 मास्टर कार्टन में रखा गया था। कार्रवाई के दौरान ट्रक चालक को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया। नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो को इस खेप के बारे में पहले से सूचना मिली थी।

इसके बाद टीम ने 27 अगस्त को चंडीगढ़-बढ़ी अंतरराज्यीय मार्ग पर नाकाबंदी कर उत्तर प्रदेश नंबर के संदिग्ध व्यावसायिक ट्रक को रोक लिया। ट्रक की तलाशी शुरू हुई तो एक के बाद एक कार्टन से नशीली दवाएं बरामद होने लगीं।

विज्ञापन हटाएं सिर्फ खबर पढ़ें

जांच में कुल 59,08,100 अल्प्राजोलम टैबलेट, 7,47,780 ट्रामाडोल कैप्सूल, 23,700 नाइट्राजेपाम टैबलेट और 400 क्लोनाजेपाम टैबलेट मिलीं। सीबीएन के मुताबिक, दवाओं को ले जाने के लिए जरूरी वैधानिक दस्तावेज भी नहीं थे।

दवाओं की पहचान मिटाने की कोशिश

तस्करी के तरीके ने जांच टीम का ध्यान खींचा। कई दवाओं की ब्लिस्टर स्ट्रिप और पैकेट से बैच नंबर, निर्माण तिथि और एक्सपायरी डेट मिटाई गई थी। इससे आशंका है कि खेप को नियामकीय जांच से बचाकर आगे खपाने की तैयारी थी।

कई दवाएं बिना वैध बिल और परिवहन दस्तावेजों के ट्रक में भेजी जा रही थीं। बरामद सामग्री की गिनती और सीलिंग की प्रक्रिया पूरी करने में टीम को 14 घंटे से ज्यादा समय लगा। इसके बाद जब्त की गई दवाओं की कुल संख्या करीब 67.80 लाख यूनिट सामने आई।

अब सप्लाई चेन की तलाश

सीबीएन ने ट्रक और पूरी खेप को एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत जब्त कर लिया है। चालक से पूछताछ के आधार पर अब जांच का फोकस इस खेप के स्रोत और उसके अंतिम ठिकाने पर है। टीम यह पता लगाने में जुटी है कि दवाएं कहां से लाई गई थीं और इन्हें आगे किस नेटवर्क के जरिए सप्लाई किया जाना था।

मोबाइल से नेटवर्क खंगाल रही पुलिस

पुलिस तस्करी के इस नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की भूमिका की भी जांच कर रही है। आरोपियों के पास से बरामद मोबाइल फोन और पूछताछ के आधार पर पुलिस को तस्करी के पूरे नेटवर्क से जुड़े महत्वपूर्ण सुराग मिलने की उम्मीद है। पुलिस यह भी पता लगा रही है कि आरोपी इससे पहले कितनी बार मादक पदार्थ की सप्लाई कर चुके हैं।

स्कॉर्पियो वाहन की पिछली सीट के नीचे और पिछले हिस्से से 37 बंडलों में कुल 36.500 किलोग्राम अवैध गांजा बरामद हुआ। अभियुक्तों के पास से पांच मोबाइल फोन, 550 रुपये नकद और एक किया कार की चाबी भी मिली। बरामदगी के आधार पर रॉबर्ट्सगंज थाने में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज कर आगे की कानूनी कार्रवाई की जा रही है।

पूछताछ में अभियुक्तों ने बताया कि वे आपस में मिलकर अवैध गांजा की तस्करी करते हैं। उन्होंने बताया कि बलिया निवासी एक अज्ञात व्यक्ति उन्हें ओडिशा से गांजा लाने के लिए वाहन, धनराशि और आवश्यक निर्देश उपलब्ध कराता है।

अभियुक्तों के अनुसार, उन्हें संबलपुर, ओडिशा के पास से गांजा प्राप्त कर बलिया में निर्धारित स्थान तक पहुंचाने का काम सौंपा जाता था, जिसके एवज में प्रत्येक व्यक्ति को करीब 15,000 रुपये मिलते थे।

तस्करों ने यह भी बताया कि वे गांजा तस्करी के लिए वाहनों का उपयोग करते हैं और रास्ते में पुलिस चेकिंग से बचने के लिए व्हाट्सएप कॉल और लोकेशन के माध्यम से एक-दूसरे से संपर्क बनाए रखते थे।

हर खेप पहुंचाने पर 15 हजार रुपये तस्करों को मिलते थे।

आरोपियों ने बताया कि बीते 27 अगस्त को दो वाहनों से सम्भलपुर, उड़ीसा से गांजा लेकर वापस आ रहे थे। रास्ते में छत्तीसगढ़ पुलिस द्वारा चेकिंग किये जाने पर वे पुलिस से बचने के लिए वैकल्पिक मार्ग से भागने लगे। इसी दौरान रास्ता समाप्त हो जाने पर विधिचन्द्र यादव एवं आदित्य जायसवाल द्वारा किया कार को मौके पर छोड़कर उसकी चाबी अपने पास रख ली गयी तथा बाद में स्कॉर्पियो वाहन में सवार साजिद अली एवं रईस खान के साथ आगे की ओर चल दिए।

आरोपियों ने बताया कि पुलिस से बचते हुए वे सोनभद्र जनपद में हाईवे के किनारे जंगल क्षेत्र में रुककर रात में आराम किये तथा 28 अगस्त को आगे जाने के लिए निकले। हिन्दुआरी के पास पुलिस द्वारा चेकिंग किये जाने के दौरान स्कॉर्पियो वाहन में गांजा होने के कारण पकड़े जाने के भय से उन्होंने वाहन को वापस मोड़कर भागने का प्रयास किया, लेकिन पुलिस टीम द्वारा घेराबंदी कर चारों अभियुक्तों को गिरफ्तार कर लिया गया।

Central agency swiftly reacts to ‘specific intelligence’, seizes a consignment of 66,79,980 psychotropic tablets

Acting upon specific intelligence regarding the movement of a massive illicit consignment of psychotropic medicines along the Punjab–Himachal Pradesh corridor, a specialised preventive team of the Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN) MP Unit mounted sustained surveillance and strategically positioned itself on the Chandigarh–Baddi interstate route, under Operation Vajra 2.0 on 27-28 August 2026.

The operation resulted in the seizure of a massive consignment of 66,79,980 psychotropic tablets, comprising Alprazolam, Tramadol, Nitrazepam and Clonazepam, which was being transported without the requisite statutory documentation. One person has been arrested, and one SML Isuzu Sartaj truck has been seized.

After maintaining overnight vigilance, on 27.08.2026, the team intercepted a suspicious SML Isuzu Sartaj truck bearing Uttar Pradesh registration and shifted it to a secure location for a detailed search.

A thorough carton-by-carton examination of the cargo led to the discovery of 120 master cartons containing controlled psychotropic substances. The consignment comprised Alprazolam, Tramadol, Nitrazepam and Clonazepam tablets, with a total quantity of 66,79,980 tablets.

Preliminary examination revealed several deliberate measures apparently adopted to conceal the illicit supply chain and evade regulatory tracking. Batch numbers, manufacturing dates and expiry dates had been erased from a substantial quantity of blister strips and boxes.

Further, substantial quantities of medicines bearing the marking “Not to be sold in Punjab Haryana State” were found being transported into the region without valid supporting documents such as invoices, bill of lading or E-way bills.

The detailed inventory, examination and sealing proceedings continued for more than 14 hours through the night. The entire consignment of 66,79,980 psychotropic tablets, along with the SML Isuzu Sartaj truck used for transportation, was seized under the relevant provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985.

One Suspect has been arrested under the relevant provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Intensive follow-up investigation is underway to identify and dismantle the upstream manufacturing and supply channels as well as the downstream distribution network involved in this major inter-state pharmaceutical diversion racket. The investigation will also seek to identify other persons and entities associated with the illegal diversion and trafficking of these psychotropic medicines.

The Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN) remains firmly committed to the vision of a “Safe use of drugs or medicines” and “Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan (NMBA)” and continues to undertake intelligence-driven enforcement actions against the illegal trafficking and diversion of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances.

During the current calendar year 2026, the Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN) has demonstrated exceptional anti-smuggling performance by successfully booking 197 cases and arresting 272 persons involved in illicit drug networks. Demonstrating aggressive enforcement against synthetic manufacturing operations, the bureau effectively busted 6 clandestine laboratories. Furthermore, the agency’s extensive enforcement actions intercepted a massive volume of contraband, resulting in the seizure of approximately 51,000 kg of various NDPS drugs along with an additional staggering haul of 12,72,00,000 tablets and capsules of psychotropic medicines.

443kg ganja worth Rs 2.2cr seized in Palamu, 2 brothers arrested

Daltonganj: Police seized 443 kg of ganja, estimated to be worth Rs 2.2 crore, and arrested two brothers during a crackdown under the ongoing Operation Prahar in Palamu district's Naudeeha Bazar on Friday night.

The accused, identified as Jamshed Alam and Ali Raza, both residents of Mahuraon village, were sent to judicial custody on Saturday under relevant provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

Palamu SP Kapil Chaudhary said the house where the accused lived was allegedly being used to store ganja for smuggling into neighbouring Bihar. Police suspect that a Harihurganj-based conduit procured the contraband from Odisha and stored it at the house before distribution.

The operation began when a police team on routine night patrol spotted a truck parked under suspicious circumstances. A search of the vehicle led to the recovery of two bags of ganja concealed beneath a consignment of green coconuts. The subsequent investigation resulted in the seizure of 443 kg of ganja packed in 424 packets kept in 16 bags. A drug-detection test confirmed the substance as ganja.

Police also seized the Odisha-registered truck and a Bihar-registered tempo. Chaudhary said efforts were under way to arrest the alleged supplier and identify other members of the smuggling network.

रांची के चौपारण थाना क्षेत्र में हथिया बाबा मंदिर के पास पुलिस ने अफीम की कथित खरीद-फरोख्त और हथियारबंद आरोपियों के खिलाफ कार्रवाई की। छापेमारी के दौरान पुलिस के अनुसार एक आरोपी ने फायरिंग की, जिसके बाद जवाबी कार्रवाई में अजय सिंह घायल हो गया।

पुलिस पर फायरिंग का दावा, जवाबी कार्रवाई में आरोपी घायल

पुलिस का दावा है कि जंगल की ओर भागने के दौरान आरोपी ने पुलिस टीम पर फायरिंग कर दी। इसके बाद पुलिसकर्मियों ने आत्मरक्षा में जवाबी कार्रवाई की। इस दौरान आरोपी के पेट में गोली लग गई और वह घायल होकर मौके पर गिर पड़ा। घायल आरोपी की पहचान अजय सिंह के रूप में हुई है। पुलिस के मुताबिक, अजय सिंह बिहार के गया जिले के बाराचट्टी थाना क्षेत्र के चापी गांव का रहने वाला है। पुलिस ने उसे तत्काल बरही सामुदायिक स्वास्थ्य केंद्र

पहुंचाया। वहां प्राथमिक उपचार के बाद उसकी गंभीर स्थिति को देखते हुए चिकित्सकों ने उसे रिम्स, रांची रेफर कर दिया।

दो पिस्टल, कारतूस और अफीम बरामद

पुलिस ने घटनास्थल से दो देसी पिस्टल, जिंदा कारतूस और फायरिंग में इस्तेमाल किए गए खोखे बरामद किए हैं। इसके अलावा पुलिस ने अफीम भी जब्त की है। हालांकि, बरामद अफीम की कुल मात्रा की आधिकारिक जानकारी फिलहाल पुलिस की ओर से नहीं दी गई है। पुलिस के मुताबिक, बरामद हथियारों और अन्य सामान को कब्जे में लेकर मामले की जांच की जा रही है। मुठभेड़ के दौरान फायरिंग की परिस्थितियों की भी जांच की जा रही है।

गिरफ्तार दोनों आरोपियों की पहचान अभी उजागर नहीं मामले में गिरफ्तार किए गए दोनों आरोपियों की पहचान पुलिस ने फिलहाल सार्वजनिक नहीं की है। थाना प्रभारी पंकज कुमार ने कार्रवाई की पुष्टि करते हुए बताया कि मामले में आगे की कानूनी प्रक्रिया जारी है। पुलिस अब यह पता लगाने में जुटी है कि अफीम की कथित खरीद-फरोख्त और हथियारों से जुड़े इस नेटवर्क में और कौन-कौन लोग शामिल हैं। साथ ही आरोपियों के आपराधिक रिकॉर्ड और पूरे नेटवर्क के बारे में भी जानकारी जुटाई जा रही है।

पटना ब्यूरो : राजेंद्र नगर रेलवे स्टेशन पर दो साल पहले लावारिस हालत में मिली प्रतिबंधित कोडिन युक्त कफ सीरप की खेप के मामले में रेल पुलिस ने अब प्राथमिकी दर्ज की है। वर्ष 2024 में जब्त की गई 487 बोतलों के मामले में करीब दो साल बाद एफआइआर दर्ज होने से रेल पुलिस की कार्यशैली पर सवाल उठ रहे हैं।

मामला **27 सितंबर 2024** का है। उस दिन राजेंद्र नगर स्टेशन के प्लेटफार्म नंबर चार स्थित पश्चिमी फुटओवर ब्रिज की सीढ़ियों के पास गश्ती दल को तीन बड़े बैग और एक झोला लावारिस हालत में मिला था। तलाशी लेने पर इनमें कोडिन युक्त कफ सीरप की **487 बोतलें** बरामद हुईं। इतनी बड़ी मात्रा में प्रतिबंधित नशीली दवा मिलने के बावजूद उस समय रेल पुलिस ने आपराधिक प्राथमिकी दर्ज करने के बजाय सनहा दर्ज कर कार्रवाई पूरी कर दी थी।

बरामद सीरप के नमूनों की जांच के लिए पुलिस ने औषधि विभाग को पत्र भेजा था। औषधि निरीक्षक ने जांच पूरी कर **25 मई** को रेल पुलिस को रिपोर्ट सौंपी। इसमें जब्त सीरप के नशीला और प्रतिबंधित होने की पुष्टि की गई। रिपोर्ट मिलने के करीब तीन महीने बाद **24 अगस्त** को राजेंद्र नगर रेल थाने में बिहार मद्यनिषेध एवं उत्पाद अधिनियम की धारा 30(ए) के तहत प्राथमिकी दर्ज की गई। अब पुलिस मामले में प्रतिबंधित दवा की खेप स्टेशन तक पहुंचाने वालों की पहचान करने में जुटी है।

सारण जिले को मादक पदार्थों और अवैध नशे के चंगुल से मुक्त कराने के उद्देश्य से समाहरणालय सभागार में एक उच्चस्तरीय समीक्षा बैठक आयोजित की गई। बैठक की अध्यक्षता जिला पदाधिकारी वैभव श्रीवास्तव ने की। बैठक में वरीय पुलिस अधीक्षक रोशन कुमार सहित जिले के तमाम वरीय प्रशासनिक पुलिस पदाधिकारी प्रत्यक्ष रूप से उपस्थित रहे, जबकि नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो (एनसीबी), पटना के वरिष्ठ पदाधिकारी वीडियो कॉन्फ्रेंसिंग के माध्यम से जुड़े। बैठक में जिले भर में जारी नशा विरोधी अभियान की प्रगति, चुनौतियों और भावी रणनीतियों पर बिंदुवार विस्तृत चर्चा की गई।

जिला पदाधिकारी वैभव श्रीवास्तव ने स्पष्ट शब्दों में कहा कि नशा समाज को खोखला करने वाली एक गंभीर बुराई है, जिसे जड़ से समाप्त करने के लिए बहुआयामी रणनीति पर काम करना होगा। उन्होंने पुलिस और उत्पाद विभाग के अधिकारियों को निर्देश दिया कि मादक पदार्थों के तस्करों की पूरी सप्लाई चेन की सूक्ष्मता से पहचान कर उस पर निर्णायक और प्रभावी कानूनी कार्रवाई की जाए। केवल खुदरा विक्रेताओं तक सीमित न रहकर इसके मुख्य सप्लायरों और नेटवर्क को ध्वस्त करना प्रशासन का मुख्य लक्ष्य होना चाहिए।

संवेदनशील इलाकों और रेल मार्गों पर बढ़ेगी निगरानी

बैठक के दौरान डीएम ने जिले के संभावित हॉटस्पॉट एवं डार्क एरिया (अंधेरे व सुनसान क्षेत्र) को प्राथमिकता के आधार पर चिह्नित करने का निर्देश दिया। उन्होंने कहा कि ऐसे क्षेत्रों में असामाजिक तत्वों और नशा कारोबारियों की गतिविधियों पर पुलिस की विशेष नजर होनी चाहिए।

इसके अतिरिक्त संवेदनशील स्थलों, सीमाओं और विशेष रूप से रेल मार्गों पर चौबीसों घंटे निगरानी बढ़ाने को कहा गया, ताकि बाहर से आने वाली मादक पदार्थों की खेप को सीमा पर ही पकड़ा जा सके।

नशे के खिलाफ लड़ाई में जागरूकता को अहम हथियार बताते हुए डीएम ने निर्देश दिया कि विद्यालयों में आयोजित होने वाले ""साइबर मंगलवार"" कार्यक्रम, जीविका दीदियों के स्वयं सहायता समूहों तथा पंचायती राज संस्थाओं के माध्यम से सुदूर ग्रामीण इलाकों में सघन नशा विरोधी अभियान चलाया जाए। युवाओं और छात्रों को नशे के दुष्प्रभावों से अवगत कराकर उन्हें जागरूक नागरिक बनाने पर जोर दिया गया।

दवा दुकानों की औचक जांच और नशा मुक्ति केंद्र की स्थापना डीएम ने स्वास्थ्य एवं ड्रग विभाग को सख्त हिदायत दी कि जिले की सभी दवा दुकानों और ड्रग स्टोर्स की नियमित व औचक जांच की जाए। किसी भी परिस्थिति में प्रतिबंधित या नशे के रूप में इस्तेमाल होने वाली दवाओं की अवैध व बिना पर्ची के बिक्री न हो। नियम उल्लंघन करने वालों के लाइसेंस रद्द कर कड़ी कार्रवाई की जाएगी।



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
