NCB Organizes Nationwide Nasha Mukt Pakhwada (fortnightly) a campaign against drug abuse

As part of its nationwide awareness campaign leading up to the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking (26 June), the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) has been observing Nasha Mukt Pakhwada (fortnightly) since 11.06 2025. The initiative has reflected strong public resolve and unity in promoting a Drug-Free India, with active participation from enforcement agencies, youth volunteers, banking institutions, NGOs, and citizens across the country.

As part of the Nasha Mukt Pakhwada, a series of impactful events—including Walkathons, Cyclothons, and Bike Rallies—were organized with enthusiastic participation from renowned personalities, NGOs, Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), school and college students, and members of the public.

On 22 June 2025, NCB organized a series of Cyclothons and Bike Rallies across its zonal units. In New Delhi, the Cyclothon was flagged off from the National Police Memorial by Director General, NCB, who also led the rally alongside over 1,000 participants including personnel from NCB, Delhi Police, CAPFs, Brahma Kumaris, and community groups. Olympian Sarita Mor and senior officials from NCB and Delhi Police were also present. Speaking on the occasion, DG, NCB emphasized that the fight against drug abuse requires not only enforcement but collective societal commitment, including from families, youth, and institutions.
